1. Reference your 124/HQ dated 24 Oct 43.
2. The matter has been taken up with G-2, AFHQ who reply as follows:

"The A. C. of S., G-2 has considered the matter and feels that the procedure you outline might severely hamper our ability to obtain intelligence. He therefore cannot accept the proposal. As far as this section is concerned, we will guarantee that only books required for intelligence purposes will be taken and that these will be kept to a minimum. We can co-ordinate this with other sections if you desire it."

3. In view of this reply and owing to the fact that the collection of information is a G-2 responsibility it would appear that we can do nothing further in the matter.

1. A number of requests have been reaching these Headquarters from A.F.H.Q. to requisition Italian books, manuals and other publications, and it is considered that the position needs clarification.

2. It is felt that every effort should be made to avoid denuding the Public Libraries, Museums, etc. of books and the following suggestions are made:

(a) No book to be requisitioned until a thorough attempt has been made to purchase the book from shops in Palermo, Naples and other big cities under Allied Control.

(b) If a particular book cannot be purchased in the open market and it is considered essential for war purposes to procure it, a specific order to requisition such book to be made by AFHQ and a proper receipt be given, specifying for what office the book is destined and how enquiry may be made for its return after the war.

3. Your comments on the above and a directive on the subject will be appreciated.

1. This Office has received various requests recently for Italian books and annuals. On two previous occasions, Officers came to this Hq. with orders from AFHQ to requisition certain books directly from Libraries and other Institutions in Palermo. One Officer, an American, apparently made no effort to record the books but the English Officer said that he would do his best to see that the requisitioned books were returned after the war. Naturally, once they get absorbed into Algiers, Washington, or London, the chance of anybody bothering to return them is slight. However, if the exigencies of war demand that these books be taken, this Office must bow. In the recent cases, however, there were no specific orders that the books should be taken from Libraries and this Office took the attitude that, without such specific orders, the implication was that the said books should be purchased and not requisitioned from Institutions. This Office regards itself as, in a certain sense, trustee (under the Property Controller) for such Institutions with an obligation not to allow their deterioration (any more than that of monuments) by abstraction of books.
2. It is requested that a clarification of policy be made on this matter with AFHQ. and the following lines are suggested.
 - (a) In event of a book being requested, every effort should be made to purchase it on the open market either in Palermo or in Naples and requisitioning books from Libraries should not occur before the search has been made at least in these cities, and any citie. of corresponding size hereafter recovered, to get the book without depriving an institution.
 - (b) Dissolved Fascist Institutions, as Corporations, Syndicates, etc., shall be regarded as fair game for the simple confiscation of books.
 - (c) In event that a book cannot be gotten in either of the methods (a) and (b) above, every effort shall be made either to have competent persons examine the necessary books on the spot and have passages copied or to have books photographed before they are taken from Institutions.
 - (d) If it is absolutely essential ~~that~~ ~~the~~ ~~books~~ ~~be~~ ~~taken~~ ~~for~~

these books be taken, this Office must bow. In the recent cases, however, there were no specific orders that the books should be taken from Libraries and this Office took the attitude that, without such specific orders, the implication was that the said books should be purchased and not requisitioned from Institutions. This Office regards itself as, in a certain sense, trustee (under the Property Controller) for such Institutions with an obligation not to allow their deterioration (any more than that of monuments) by abstraction of books.

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(a) In event of a book being requested, every effort should be made to purchase it on the open market either in Palermo or in Naples and requisitioning books from Libraries should not occur before the search has been made at least in these cities, and any cities of corresponding size hereafter recovered, to get the book without depriving an institution.

(b) Dissolved Fascist Institutions, as Corporations, Syndicates, etc., shall be regarded as fair game for the simple confiscation of books.

(c) In event that a book cannot be gotten in either of the methods (a) and (b) above, every effort shall be made either to have competent persons examine the necessary books on the spot and have passages copied or to have books photographed before they are taken from Institutions.

(d) If it is absolutely essential ~~that a book be removed from an Institution~~ for war purposes that a book removed from an Institution, Library, Museum, University, etc. this shall be done only on specific orders from AFHQ. and a detailed receipt shall be given to the proper Italian authority, specifying for what office the book is destined and how enquiry may be made about its return after the war.

(e) When AFHQ receive requests from Washington or London for books, it shall endeavor to ascertain the urgency, i.e. whether some other book will do as well, whether the book is so essential that if not found in the open market it should be removed from libraries, etc.

3. In view of the changed relations with the Italian State, it seems to this Office more essential than before that the Allied Governments exercise caution in removing books or documents, since this will expose them to the same sort of propaganda already being disseminated (falsely) with respect to the removal of works of art.

4. It occurs to this Office that the National Library of Palermo would be a fit depository for material relating to the activity of AMGOT in Sicily and permission is requested to collect such material for eventual deposit in the Library in order that future scholars may be able to evaluate on the spot the work of AMGOT and its successors. Naturally such material cannot include correspondence etc. but it might include mimeographed and printed material now available. Such material would also, naturally, be submitted to inspection of the Security Officer to see if it was suitable for deposit in the Library and, if necessary, held until such time as security restrictions on it ceased to prevail. In this connection, permission is requested to reserve one or two copies of the "handbooks on Sicily and Italy for this purpose, subject to permission of the War Office for their declassification and release.

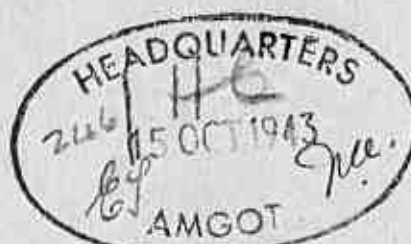

THE LOCATION IN ITALY OF PUBLISHED INTELLIGENCE
MATERIAL RELATING TO ITALY AND OTHER COUNTRIES.

As requested in our recent conversation I am sending herewith some notes on the existing pre-war machinery for locating Italian and foreign books and periodicals in Italian libraries.

With regard to efforts being made already by other departments, I understand M.I. 8 hope to procure telephone books and P.I.D. Library has already obtained a 1942-3 copy of the Annuario Generale d'Italia. (The Air Ministry has been trying incidentally to obtain a copy in this country to send out to the Near East, not a procedure to be emulated).

It is important to remember that Italian libraries might be expected to be less ill equipped with Central and Eastern European material than were British libraries. If necessary lists of the key Eastern European directories and of the main Italian directories and year books can be supplied so that anyone responsible can know what was likely to be available.

The following notes on the Italian library system (without which any attempt to find useful books is likely to be as disappointing as the attempt in North Africa, is extracted verbatim from J.H.P. Pafford Library Cooperation in Europe, 1935: - pp. 291-5.

"The National Centre" for Bibliographical Information is established at the National Central Library V.E.II at Rome. Its chief object is to help Italian and foreign students in their literary researches, and in particular to help them to locate books. The Centre will keep in close contact with similar centres abroad and will act as the intermediary for the exchange of bibliographical information.

The Centre is supervised by the above-mentioned committee and its Director is the Director of the National Central Library V.E.II. He is competent to appoint a professional staff and may also call on voluntary assistance. All state libraries and all other libraries open to the public must answer requests sent to them from the Centre which are of a bibliographical nature, and may not ask any payment for supplying these answers. The same applies to the Bibliographical superintendents and the honorary bibliographical inspectors.

The Centre is to draw up and keep up-to-date a list of institutes, societies and individuals having sources of information or knowledge likely to be of use to the Centre. The title "Correspondent of the National Centre of Bibliographical Information" is to be conferred

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The Centre is to draw up and keep up-to-date a list of institutes, societies and individuals having sources of information or knowledge likely to be of use to the Centre. The title "Correspondent of the National Centre of Bibliographical Information" is to be conferred on these and they are to answer questions submitted to them by the Centre, on the same terms as libraries, mentioned above.

The Ministry of Education assigns annually, out of the funds for State Libraries, a grant to the Centre, quite distinct from that which it assigns to the National Central Library V.E.II. The Director of the Centre may receive money for the Centre from other sources but must account to the Ministry for the expenditure of all money from whatever source it is received.

The Centre works from printed catalogues and other reference books and also makes use of circular enquiries. It has the use of the collections in the National Central Library V.E.II. It does not compile bibliographies for applicants but will obtain photographic copies at cost price. Information, whether given personally or by telephone or by correspondence, is free.

As far as the loan of books is concerned the Centre does not, so

far, concern itself with loans between Italian libraries, but only with international loans when its agency is required for the purpose. This is because the practice of direct borrowing between Italian libraries has been long established and because of two important guides which are available for locating books in Italy. The first is the law of legal deposit. The National Library at Florence has received all books published in Tuscany since 1848 and all published in Italy since 1870. Since 1910 a second copy is also sent to the Ministry of Justice in Rome which passes on to the National Central Library V.E.II all those books it does not require; and a third copy is deposited in the State library nearest to its place of publication. Since 1886 the National Central Library at Florence has published monthly the *Bollettino delle pubblicazioni italiane ricevute per diritto di stampa*, which is a current national bibliography; and from the same date the National Central Library at Rome has issued quarterly the *Bollettino delle opere moderne straniere acquistate dalle biblioteche governative del Regno d'Italia*, which is a union catalogue of foreign books added to the state libraries. These are selective but include everything "of Value" and not only books, but periodicals and, in the Florence bulletin, since 1929, music. There is an author, and since about 1930, a subject index to each part, and annual cumulated author and subject indexes are also issued. The Rome bulletin also issues a decennial author index. The entries are done scientifically so that they can be, and are, cut out and pasted on cards for library catalogues.

In addition to those already mentioned there are no less than 20 printed union catalogues of periodicals B.53 including what was probably the first of this kind, the *Elenco dei giornali e delle opere periodiche esistenti presso pubblici stabilimenti a Milano*. Milan 1859, and among the more recent, the *Periodici stranieri che si trovano nelle biblioteche degli istituti scientifici italiani*. Roma, 1930, edited by G. Magrini for the "Consiglio Nazionale delle Ricerche".

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In addition to the bibliographical machinery outlined above it is hardly necessary to suggest the possibility of combining immediately as foreign chambers of commerce and likely Government Departments such as the Customs and private offices. It is probable that all requests from residents in Italy for German and other foreign telephone books for private business purposes were centralized through the Italian Post Office and if the records of such requests survive a good line would be given on exactly what Italian hotels and businesses procured this type of literature.

MINUTE SHEET

In a recent note I explained the peace time Italian library co-operation system in order to make less difficult the work of locating useful books in Italian collections. It is pointed out to me that it is hard for anyone outside to know what is useful. As a general definition all books and periodicals (other than weekly and daily publications) published in enemy or occupied countries since 1939 and of a technical scientific economic or statistical nature (but not those of a political, propagandist, religious or humorous nature) are likely to be useful especially if they contain detailed information about individual firms, places, regions or individuals.

I have therefore sent you a list of Italian almanacs, annuals and guides.

1. This may be of use for reference to administrators by giving them a line on available sources of information to deal with local questions that may arise.
2. Very few of these items are available in this country and almost any of them would be of importance to some department.
