I agree with the attached draft reorganization scheme for the Civilian Supply Division with the following exceptions:

1. The duties of the Agricultural Division could be better stated as follows assuming the confirmation of the allocation of responsibility for rationing and retail price fixing of articles of food to the Economics and Supply Division.

Agricultural Division: This Division will be responsible for all activities which were the concern of the former Italian Ministry of Agriculture and Forests with the exception of the rationing and retail price fixing of commodities for human consumption. Specifically, it will be responsible for cropping and production, methods for improvement of agriculture and processing of agricultural products, and, in collaboration with the Economics and Supply Division, collection, distribution, rationing and price fixing of specified edible commodities.

2. I have already stated my opinion on the question as to which Division shall control rationing and price fixing of food, and have submitted reasons for my conclusions. It may be of interest to mention that Col. Evans of the A. C. C. has informed me that he proposed to recommend the acceptance in this respect of such a division of responsibilities as I suggest.

REASONS FOR RETENTION OF RATIONING OF FOODSTUFFS UNDER AGRICULTURE.

1. It was the method adopted by the Italian Government ever since rationing was introduced into Italy.
2. The system we adopt should be one which can be handed back to the Italians and should be preferably similar to that previously in force. It should not be amended without very strong reasons.
3. The economy of Italy is peculiar in that it is normally almost self-supporting in foodstuffs. Such imports as were previously necessary formed a very small part of the total consumption. The combination of agriculture with rationing was considered the arrangement best suited to the Italian economy.
4. Taking the whole of the Kingdom, the only articles which will need to be imported in quantity are wheat and coffee. The main staple foods are grain products and olive oil.
5. The control of the production of all grains and olives, the main staple products and their conversion into foodstuffs and their subsequent distribution to the community is very complicated. A decision to divide these lines of control from producer to consumer would result in considerable difficulties.
6. It is easier for the agricultural system to take over wheat and coffee imported than it is for that system to hand over at various points, control of all other edible commodities.
7. The present arrangement in the Civilian Supply Division is unsatisfactory because it means almost continuous contact between sub-divisions. This has been at times almost impossible with the result that I was unaware until I discovered recently by accident, that a decision on rationing had been made without reference to me. Other similar decisions had been taken on matters which directly affected the agricultural sub-division without reference. This confirms the argument in paragraph 5. The divided control would also make for additional work and collaboration in detail between sub-divisions which would be unnecessary under the scheme suggested.
8. The agricultural sub-division is the obvious one for the collation of all statistics concerning food production. It is therefore in the best position to recommend or decide lines of action on rationing and cognate matters.
9. The continuation of the present arrangement will lead to increasing difficulties and if my suggestions are not agreed it will be urgently necessary, in order to avoid confusion, to decide in detail at what points agriculture and rationing will be separated. This will be a complicated and difficult matter and will probably necessitate detailed examinations of the production and consumption chain for each year.

1. The former Ministry of Agriculture in Italy controlled not only agriculture and forestry, but also the distribution and rationing of all foodstuffs. In the case of wheat, the main staple food, it was controlled from sowing to consumption.

2. It is suggested that the general system of agricultural control formerly in existence should be followed and that AMGOT's agricultural officers should concern themselves also with rationing. If my suggestion is accepted, the feeding problem becomes practically the sole concern of the Agricultural sub-division.

3. The question of food provision and distribution has been recognized as one of AMGOT's most important functions and Gen. McSherry has recently given the matter his personal attention.

4. Furthermore, the agricultural set-up is very defined, self contained, and has comparatively few matters in which liaison with other divisions are necessary.

NOTES ON CONFERENCE C.C.A.O., D.C.C.A.O. AND C.S.O. RE
REGIONAL ORGANIZATION

1. It was agreed that the entire provinces of Siracusa, Ragusa, Agrigento, Caltanissetta and Trapani should be placed directly under the M.G.; the portion of the province of Catania south of a line Scordia-Mirabella and of the province of Palermowest of a line Cefalu-Santa Caterina-Villarosa were likewise to be placed directly under the M.G.
