This report is being prepared by Lt. Col. The Honourable Peter Rodd. As I was not sure if I would get the text from AFHQ in time to have copies printed and distributed in the ships' bags, I drafted "Do's and Don'ts" to print if the official text did not arrive. I attach a copy of this draft.
- (3) I had the official text printed and divided amongst the ships' bags of the convoy carrying the 1st Cdn. Div., but issue was stopped most mysteriously.
- (4) It is essential in my view to give all the troops some pre-"D" day directions regarding their relations with the local inhabitants and my experiences in the island have only confirmed and strengthened my view.

DO'S AND DON'TS

DO

1. **Remember** that the Italians are not Germans and many of them dislike the Germans almost as much as we do. But remember the Italians have ill-treated Allied prisoners of war.
2. **Remember** that the Italians have millions of relatives in U.S.A. where they have learned to value the liberty they have lost in Italy; and that the British fought to help Italy gain her unity and independence.
3. **Remember** that the Allies don't want to destroy Italy, but to deliver the people from the Fascist regime which let them into the war.
4. **Remember** that the Italians who don't know U.S.A. or Britain will judge **your** country by **your** behaviour and that of **your** troops.
5. **Be firm and polite**, bad manners are not a sign of toughness.
6. **Respect private and public property** as you would your own. Plant and machinery is necessary for the Allied War Effort and must not be damaged.

ON ENTERING A TOWN

7. **Post guards** on power stations, warehoused goods, banks, post offices, museums, etc., to prevent looting. Remember that when there is disorder the local population may try its hand at looting. Bank and treasury safes and buildings with public records, are to be locked up. The bank staff must not have access to remove valuables. Take the keys and give them to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer or to the Provost Marshall or Military Police.
8. **Let shops and markets reopen** as soon as possible. The population must eat, and if they can't get their food, we shall have to give them some.
9. **Remember** that all the people who will offer their assistance are not necessarily disinterested. The best people are not the turn-coats and the traitors.
10. Essential services and the local machinery of government must be kept going. Don't make this more difficult. Certain officials will be arrested or interned; it is not your business to decide which.
11. Consult your nearest Civil Affairs Officer about buying or requisitioning.

DON'T

1. Don't fraternise with the population, male or female. The Italian Army is still fighting you.
2. Don't talk politics or religion.
3. Don't believe all the stories you will hear from Italians about their undying friendship for the Allies.
4. Don't allow, or close your eyes to looting, theft or trafficking in money, works of art, or valuables.
5. Don't destroy or allow to be destroyed or removed any archives, documents or books in any premises you may enter. They will be needed for the Allied Government of the country.
6. Don't occupy any Government Office if you can avoid it. The Allied Government of the country will need the offices to govern from. Use as offices hotels, business premises, apartment houses, etc.
7. Don't requisition goods "which may come in useful." Don't remove bits of machinery or loose tools, if it can be avoided; we may need the equipment as a whole and the removal of one piece or certain tools, may destroy its utility.
8. Don't allow favouritism to individuals. Don't let them try to bribe you by presents, entertainment or "bargains." Don't accept presents from anyone.
9. Don't requisition motor transport without higher authority. If you take all the trucks, food can't be brought into the markets.
10. DON'T FORGET WE ARE FIGHTING FASCISM IN ALL ITS FORMS.

9. Do prevent looting of any goods or property by any person. Unattended warehouses and shops in which supplies are stored should be closed, and wherever possible guarded against pilferage.

Don't appropriate any property just because it does not seem to have an owner, and don't allow anyone else to do so.

10. Do remember that anyone committing a crime is entitled to a proper trial before the Military Courts which will be established by the orders of the Commander-in-Chief.

Don't take the law into your own hands. Killing civilians, unless it is in self-defence or to protect your own forces, is murder.

11. Do remember that the local officials will have been instructed to continue at their posts and may be authorized by the Military Government to continue to perform all their normal duties.

Don't hinder these local officials in their everyday work. It is NOT up to you to decide whether they should continue in office.

12. Do remember that it is the aim of the occupying forces to restore law and order amongst the civil inhabitants as soon as possible.

Don't cause unrest amongst the people or disturb them unnecessarily if they are going about their private business peacefully.

13. Do remember that all civilian machinery, plant and tools will be required for the resumption of the normal life of the community and the eventual well-being of the occupying forces.

Don't remove essential parts or interfere in any way with installations or machinery of any kind without proper authority.

14. Do remember that it is intended to make the maximum use of all the available resources of the occupied territory.

Don't seize or requisition any material without reference to higher authority. What may be just useful to you might be essential for some other purpose.

15. Do remember that billeting and accommodation should be effected

Don't take over State buildings,

in their everyday work. It is NOT up to you to decide whether they should continue in office.

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14. Do remember that it is intended to make the maximum use of all the available resources of the occupied territory.

15. Do remember that billeting and accommodation should be effected with the least possible upheaval of the local inhabitants.

16. Do remember that local foodstuffs are almost certain to be in short supply. You have your own rations.

17. Do remember that rates of exchange for currency have been fixed.

18. It is imperative that rates of wages for civilian labour should not be inflated.

Don't cause unrest amongst the people or disturb them unnecessarily if they are going about their private business peacefully.

Don't remove essential parts or interfere in any way with installations or machinery of any kind without proper authority.

Don't seize or requisition any material without reference to higher authority. What may be just useful to you might be essential for some other purpose.

Don't take over State buildings, hospitals or religious institutions for accommodating troops unless there is no other possible accommodation available.

Don't buy or trade your own rations for local supplies.

Don't enter into unofficial exchange transactions with the local inhabitants or speculate in foreign currency.

Don't pay exorbitant wages if casual labour is employed in the early stages. Wages should be adjusted in relation to pre-occupation rates and the cost of living.

9. Do remember that many of the civilians will spread false rumours or even instructions which, they will pretend, come from proper authorities.

20. Do remember that the military Government wants to preserve intact all monies and securities in banks, treasuries and post-offices.

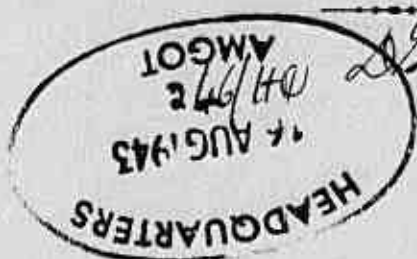
21. Commanders of formations occupying any places where there are banks will take immediate steps to ensure that the premises are closed and if possible guarded until a Civil Affairs Officer arrives. In addition to closing and guarding the premises, all access of enemy bank officials to bank premises should be prohibited and the keys removed and handed over for custody by the Civil Affairs Officer.

22. THE REPUTATION OF THE UNITED NATIONS FOR JUSTICE AND FAIR PLAY, AS A HAPPY CONTRAST TO THE CONDUCT OF OUR ENEMIES IN SIMILAR CIRCUMSTANCES, WILL DEPEND IN ITS PRACTICAL EXPRESSION UPON YOUR CONDUCT. PROOF OF THIS REPUTATION WILL HAVE POLITICAL CONSEQUENCES AND MAY CONTRIBUTE TO THE FINAL SETTLEMENT OF THE WORLD AFTER THE CESSATION OF HOSTILITIES.

Don't encourage the inhabitants to indulge in gossip calculated to cause alarm, or believe everything you hear.

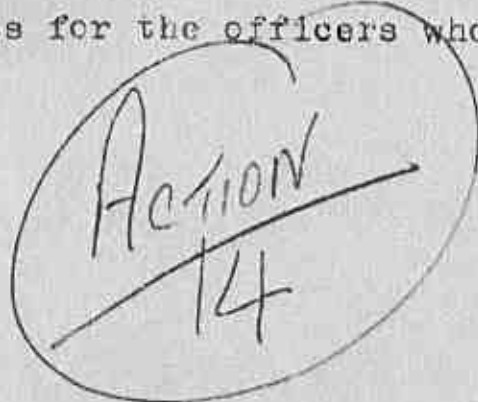

SUBJECT: Books of Instructions

1. Late in June the 9 officers attached to the 3d Division of 343 Force received copies of a mimeographed book of AMGOT plans and instructions. Since that time no additions or amendments have been received, except General Administrative Instructions No. 14. From various discussions with officers from AMGOT Hqs. it seems clear that there have been changes and additions which have not reached Agrigento Province.

2. Of the 16 officers who have reported here within the last two weeks, not one has had these instructions.

3. Obviously it is impossible for these men with little school instruction and no reference material; or that which is out of date, to follow uniform policies in the field or for the Provincial office to give them correct information and guidance under such conditions.

4. It is earnestly recommended that this Province be supplied as promptly as possible with eight sets of changes and additions to the original book of instructions and thirteen complete sets for the officers who have never received them.
