With reference to DO/30/DAG, dated 16 Jul 43, regarding Wardresses to be supplied in Sicily.

1. Wardresses were employed in Eritrea and Tripolitania by the B.M.A. These women were recruited from the local population and were generally the wives of the Police or other Officials and volunteered for the jobs. There was apparently no difficulty in obtaining all women required.

It is suggested this method should be adopted in Sicily.

2. The Welfare Workers referred to were wives of Italian Govt Officials in Eritrea and also three or four British women brought from East Africa, but their job was the care of women and children prior to the repatriation to Italy and was far removed from that of Wardresses.

They were given a contract and paid 22 per month, free rations and accommodation and given all facilities to purchase from EFI and other advantages enjoyed by British Officers. They could not possibly be employed as Wardresses in Sicily.

Reference my 141F/7972/0A of 7.Jul.43.

In telegram No.18113 of 21.Jul.43, Fast Africa state that they have a welfare worker, Mrs.Angus, and possibly one or two more, now available in Middle Fast. East Africa ask that we should signal earliest if these welfare workers are required, otherwise they will be returned to Nairobi.

We have not yet heard whether women welfare workers will be required in Sicily but I think it is more than likely. I suggest that you telegraph immediately to East Africa suggesting that these welfare workers are held in Middle West to be sent forward directly they are required.

Please let me know what action you have taken on this.

Reference your memo. of 29th Apr. on the above subject, I am not clear whether you are asking us to recruit W.W.W. for you in Egypt or whether your demand is for the transfer of the few experienced workers we are at present employing in Eritrea.

2. If the former, I doubt if any can be obtained unless you are prepared to take non British women. If the latter, it is impossible to say whether they would be available when required by you, until the arrival date of the next flight of Italian ships at Massawa is known. As you may be aware, this departure from Italy of the next flight of ships has been delayed on account of a "technical hitch" whatever that may mean.
