6. There is real need for 10 competent enlisted men, at least half of whom can speak some Italian and at least one of whom can speak it well, and including two stenographers. Otherwise it will be impossible to handle the volume of court work which now amounts to approximately 200 cases; makes it necessary to write all reports in long hand in the first instance; and, therefore, greatly decreases the capacity of the senior officers to turn out work.
