3. The cash in all branches of the Bank of Italy must be treated as "blocked" for the present as the release of a credit balance to any one bank would be a preferential treatment of such bank when banks all over the Island, for all practical purposes, have their pro-rata right to such cash on hand in the Bank of Italy.

SUBJECT: Armbands for Civil Police

TO : D.C.O.A.U.

As you will see from the minutes of our S.C.A.P.O. conference (see p. 2) the necessity for uniformed Civil Police to carry armbands has rather diminished under existing circumstances, and I would recommend that authority be given for their discontinuance except where civilians are employed as special police in plain clothes as opposed to police officers on plain clothes duty. To give the latter armbands would stultify the object of putting them on duty in plain clothes.

If this recommendation is approved, the armband for special police in plain clothes could be a single one in white with the word "POLICE" embroidered or woven on the

1. The attached is a report in connection with shooting in the town of Enna on 5 Sep 43. The shots were fired by Allied soldiers when forcing the driver of the motor vehicle to take them towards Leonforte. More shots were fired near Pirato.
2. A steel helmet and cartridge cases left behind in the vehicle are also forwarded herewith.
3. Notices at the approaches to the town of Enna state that:-
 - (a) the town is out of bounds to all allied troops, and
 - (b) no military vehicle is permitted to enter the town unless conveying troops on duty in the town.

The truck driver Barbera Antonio (a Fiat No 28) has reported that on 5 Sept. at 2045 hrs. re-entering from town's service, in Via Roma at the Cafe Rosso he was stopped by two Allied soldiers who enquired where he was directed to, when they were informed that he was going towards the cemetery to the garage, they got in. (This happened before the INC. PANEZIONE and the labourer DI PASQUALE).

In reaching the garage the Allied soldiers forced the driver to take towards MORNIGLI, offering two dollars and some cigarettes, but the driver refused for many reasons also because the truck was out of order. The soldiers fired a few shots up in the air, and pointing a revolver (or rifle) at him they compelled him to go back up the truck.

One of the soldiers sitting at the steering wheel drove the truck towards the railroad. After going through for a while he gave up the steering wheel to the driver, who, running into an obstacle near Pirato (the car was not provided with lights), went off the road. Meanwhile a firemen car driven by ENGAJALI was coming up from the opposite direction. The soldiers went down the truck and ordered this other driver to take them towards MORNIGLI. At his refusal they began to shoot.

During all this confusion the truck driver BARBERA ENT away and hid himself, only at daybreak was he able to get on the truck and take it to the garage.

The Allied soldiers left behind in the vehicle a steel helmet and cartridge cases.

To confirm this present report it is signed by the driver BARBERA.

1. S.C.A.O. Messina has replied as follows :

" I agree with the S.C.A.O. Enna Province that the comune of Capizzi now in Messina Province should be administratively transferred to Enna Province.

I also suggest the similar transfer of the comune of Cesaro' to Enna Province for the following reasons :

It is difficult to get at from the Messina direction. Its principal line of communication passes through Enna Province in an easterly-westerly direction and it is much more accessible from Enna than from Messina.

If the arrangement for the transfer of the administration of these two communes to S.C.A.O. Enna can be effected, I would give my hearty approval. "

2. The C.G.A.O. has approved the transfer to Enna Province of both these communes. You should contact Messina Province as soon as possible in order to make the necessary arrangements.

3. Your suggestions reference Rosuttino and Mirabella Tripaccari have been settled - AMCOR/3/HQ of 29 Aug. and CAS/16/4 of 26 Aug. (copy to you) refer.

4. This leaves outstanding the question of Pistruzzola and Castelfranco - a reminder has been sent to Caltanissetta Province.



For that Dott. Alfonso Piro, after examining the above documents, takes delivery of the assets and liabilities, following the included list (all. N°3/a - 3/b - 4 - 5 - 6 - 7 - 8 - 9 bis 10).

Subject: PRIVATE INSURANCE COMPANIES.

Reference 2507 F.

To: Major J. J. Knight, A.R.I.

With reference to the memorandum submitted to you on 27 August and 10 September regarding the general position of private insurance companies in Sicily, we are now working on some kind of a general directive, and hope to put something before you in the next few days.

In the meantime we have tabulated the information which we have been able to collect up to date from some of the principal agencies. This information is in many cases very scanty, but the general impression gained from a study of what figures are available is that until and unless we gain control of the head offices of the companies, it is hopeless to try to do anything towards the re-opening of the agencies or the renewal of any of their operations. The available assets of the companies are so small as to be negligible.

The attached table shows the figures that have come to hand concerning seventeen agencies. The totals at the end of the statement have really no meaning because we have not been able to get identical information for each of the agencies covered, but two of the totals are well worthy of attention, firstly, The amount of outstanding claims of Lire 13,377,375. This is a sum that would almost certainly have to be paid within a few weeks of the re-opening of the agency. It is also a sum that would almost certainly speedily increase with new claims, for during a period like the present when commerce is practically at a standstill, there is an immediate tendency for claims against insurance cover to show arise. As against this certain payment of more than thirteen million lire, there exists in the banks and insurance offices a liquid fund of Lire 1,769,274,76.

It is evident from this that the companies in Sicily are quite insolvent, and unless AGOP is prepared to consider wholesale financing of their operations, they are certainly not in any position to re-open the work.

J.O.

With reference to the memorandum submitted to you on 27 August and 10 September regarding the general position of private insurance companies in Sicily, we are now working on some kind of a general directive, and hope to put something before you in the next few days.

In the meantime we have tabulated the information which we have been able to collect up to date from some of the principal agencies. This information is in many cases very scanty, but the general impression gained from a study of what figures are available is that until and unless we gain control of the head offices of the companies, it is hopeless to try to do anything towards the re-opening of the agencies or the renewal of any of their operations. The available assets of the companies are so small as to be negligible.

The attached table shows the figures that have come to hand concerning seventeen agencies. The totals at the end of the statement have really no meaning because we have not been able to get identical information for each of the agencies covered, but two of the totals are well worthy of attention; firstly, the amount of outstanding claims of Lire 13,377,375. This is a sum that would almost certainly have to be paid within a few weeks of the re-opening of the agency. It is also a sum that would almost certainly speedily increase with new claims, for during a period like the present when commerce is practically at a standstill, there is an immediate tendency for claims against insurance cover to show a rise. As against this certain payment of more than thirteen million lire, there exists in the banks and insurance offices a liquid fund of Lire 1,769,777,30.




It is evident from this that the companies in Sicily are quite insolvent, and unless AGOC is prepared to consider wholesale financing of their operations, they are certainly not in any position to re-commence work.

1. Reference your letter of September 11 submitting copy of letter from Bank of Italy, the following shall apply:

a. No payment of obligations due by banks can be enforced until credit balances are released. The legal right of offset - (loans against credit balances) exists but is not to be effected until credit balances released or until further notice.

b. G.O. No. 6 should be strictly interpreted and no transactions of whatsoever nature, except Royal Treasury transactions, may be conducted by the Bank of Italy.

c. Voluntary payments in full or in part may be accepted by it from debtors and renewals accepted not to exceed 90 days. See 1055 S.A.I. Finance No. 5.

d. Voluntary liquidation of loans by debtors implies return of securities pledged and this release of such pledged securities is permitted.

e. Interest on loans accrues during existence of loans and while unpaid. Likewise, interest accrues on credit balances and is to be credited via book entry only. See S.A.I. Finance No. 5.

f. Collection of loans may be enforced against debtors other than banks up to but not exceeding 5000 Lire per loan.

2. Bills of Exchange and other loan documents may be presented for payment by banks recognized for business under G.O. No. 6 irrespective of account for protection under protest provisions and requirements but collection cannot be enforced in any amount exceeding 5000 Lire per loan. However, it is the opinion of this office that Bills of Exchange and loans over 5000 Lire retain protest rights until the moratorium is lifted on such debts over 5000 Lire. Such instruments may then be protested for non-payment and the banks' rights protected.

1. The organization of various entities for resuming production and shipments of sulphur has been completed as follows:

- (i) Allied Military Government, acting through the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, is the regulating authority, replacing for this purpose the Ente Zolfi Italiani, (Headquarters in Rome) formerly acting under the supervision of the Italian Government. All matters of policy or any deviation from the procedure outlined herein must be approved by the C.C.A.O.
- (ii) As the channel of business between the purchasers of sulphur and the producers, the Sicilian branch of the Ente Zolfi Italiani has been renamed Ente Zolfi Siciliani and required to work independently of EZI whose activities have been suspended due to war conditions. (Certain activities of the old EZI have been suspended, particularly the Social Assistance program.) All business of the EZS will be supervised by the representative of the AMG for the present.
- (iii) The Consorzio per i Magazzini Generali Della Sicilia is continued in operation in the same manner as before the occupation.
- (iv) The functions of the Mining Section, Banco di Sicilia are continued. However, a moratorium has been declared on certain liens which the Bank holds against property of the producers in lieu of (1) sulphur destroyed during hostilities and (2) proceeds of sulphur sales collected by EZI in Rome and never transmitted to Sicily. Also a limitation has been established on the percentage of gross proceeds due any producer for sulphur sold which can be taken by the Bank to satisfy other old loans and advances.
- (v) With the exceptions noted above, the relations of the producers to the various other agencies will be as before the occupation. Their only direct contact with AMG will be insofar as representatives of AMG may feel it expedient to assist or advise them.

It is contemplated that the producers will be allowed to reorganise their Association. An Executive Board to advise AMG

ix. Its relations with E.S.S. will be maintained by the Association. This Board might eventually be allowed to take control of E.S.S. for the producers, supplanting A.M.C. in this regard. (The E.S.S. was supposedly responsible to the producers, but actually had been dominated of recent years by the Fascist Government).

2. Minimum prices for sulphur guaranteed to the producers by Ente Zolfi Siciliani have been set as follows, f.o.b. cars or trucks at ports designated by ANGOT:

Gialla Superiore	1400	IAre per metric ton.
Gialla Inferiore	1390	" " "
Buono	1378	" " "
Corrente	1368	" " "

"Fedi di Deposito" for the above amounts will be issued by the Consorzio per i Magazzini Generali della Sicilia on delivery at the ports, as in the past. Also a "Certificato di Saldo Presso" will be issued as previously, entitling the holder to his pro rata share at the end of the year of any additional revenue that may accrue to E.S.S.

3. The following ANGOT policy with respect to sulphur has been approved:

- To make available at the ports as early as possible, the sulphur now "on the planes" at the mines.
- To encourage and assist the producers to preserve their mines and resume production as soon as possible.

Means should be sought to implement this policy, including the use of trucks not essential to other activities for the transportation of sulphur from mines to rail stations.

4. The warehouse of the Consorzio in Porto Empedocle is ready to receive sulphur. All sulphur should be sent there until further notice. Railway facilities will be made available as rapidly as possible, beginning immediately.

5. Our Mining Engineer is commencing a tour of visits to the mining areas and will be available to the S.C.A.O.s addressed for consultation.

Reference your memo PUS/602 of 30 August 1943:

1. The C.O.A.O. does not approve of entertainment allowances, and is unable to see how his Touring Notes could have been constituted as in any way authorizing the use of ANZOC funds in the manner described by C.O.A.O. Auguste. No part of this expenditure will be accepted as a charge against ANZOC funds.

Article 9 of the Geneva Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of the Wounded and Sick (1929) provides as follows:

"The personnel engaged exclusively in the collection, transport and treatment of the wounded and sick, and in the administration of medical supplies and establishments, and civilians attached to armies, shall be respected and protected under all circumstances. They shall, into the hands of the enemy, they shall not be treated as prisoners of war.
Doctors specially trained to be employed, in case of necessity, as auxiliary nurses or stretcher-bearers for the collection, transport and treatment of the wounded and sick, and furnished with a 'most' of hospital, shall enjoy the same treatment as the permanent medical personnel if they are taken prisoners while carrying out these functions."

Article 12 of the same Convention provides:

"The personnel mentioned in articles 9, 10 and 11 may not be required after they have fallen into the hands of the enemy.
In the absence of an agreement to the contrary, they shall be sent back to the belligerent to which they belong, as soon as possible for their return shall be open and military considerations permit.
Before their return they shall continue to carry out their duties under the direction of the enemy; they shall preferably be engaged in the care of the wounded and sick at the hospital to which they belong.
On their departure, they shall, with their effects, instruments, arms and means of transport belonging to them."

Article 13 of the same Convention further provides:

"In consequence of the personnel mentioned in articles 9, 10 and 11, who in their hands, the same food, the same lodgings, the same allowances and the same pay as are granted to the corresponding personnel of their own armed forces.
At the outbreak of hostilities the belligerents will notify one another of the names of their respective medical personnel."

In discussing these provisions the U.S. Medical Manual 27 - 10, "Rules of Land Warfare," says, in part, as follows:

"Article 13: The foregoing article (1.3. Art. 12 set out above) excludes reasonable measures to prevent such personnel, upon their return to their own army, from carrying information of strategic or tactical value. Their movements and activities may be restricted as far as reasonably necessary to prevent their acquisition of such information, and if they should become possessed thereof, their return to their own army is delayed until the

Article 12 of the same Convention provides:

"The persons designated in articles 9, 10 and 11 may not be detained after they have fallen, and the laws of the country, if the donee of an agreement to the contrary, they shall be sent back to the belligerent to which they belong as soon as a route for their return shall be open and military considerations permit.

"Pending their return, they shall continue to carry out their duties under the direction of the country, they shall preferably be engaged in the care of the wounded and sick of the belligerent to whom they belong. On their departure, they shall unite with them the effects, instruments, arms and means of transport belonging to them."

Article 13 of the same Convention further provides:

"Belligerents shall procure to the prisoners mentioned in articles 9, 10 and 11, while in their hands, the same food, the same lodgings, the same allowances and the same pay as are granted to the corresponding personnel of their own armed forces.

At the conclusion of hostilities the belligerents will notify one another of the names of their respective medical personnel."

In discussing these provisions the U.S. Delegation, 27 - 10, "Notes of Lord Balfour" says to us of Inter-Allied:

"Writing in the foregoing article (i.e. Art. 12 set out above) provides reasonable measures to prevent such personnel, upon their return to their own army, from carrying information of strategic value. Their movements and activities may be restricted as far as reasonably necessary to prevent their acquisition of such information, and so they should receive no possession thereof, their return to their own army may be delayed until the information has ceased to be of strategic value."

It follows that selected personnel and chaplains are not and cannot be treated as prisoners of war at all. They are "selected personnel who are entitled to certain privileges and whose movements may be restricted and who may be compelled, if their movements are thus restricted, to confine in the exercise of their functions preferably in the care of the wounded and sick or their own armaments, or in the case of chaplains, to minister to the religious wants of prisoners of war of their own nationality.

"Under article 12 condition it is evident that medical personnel within the lines of the capturing power must immediately obtain valuable military information. It is evident, however, that no regular medical personnel can use their services as above outlined. This is further of importance because of the obvious danger which would be incurred on the part of any personnel taking care of prisoners of war, if it could not only upon captured medical personnel and chaplains to look after the wants of the prisoners of war.

In fact, it would seem that it has now become an accepted custom to use such personnel for these purposes, without particular regard to the question of

whether or not their retention is necessary in order to prevent the communication
of military information.

It follows that protected personnel of the enemy may not be "passived" as has
been suggested in some quarters, not being instruments of war, there is no basis
for requiring them to give "short" parole. The only way to control them is by
giving them directions restricting their movements.

If allied personnel or civilians captured in friendly areas residents of friendly
and our own forces, they will be subject to the same protections and orders of the
Allied Military Government in the same manner as all other persons in the territory.

The British War Office has issued rules for the treatment of "protected
personnel" and I have no doubt that the American War Dept. has done likewise.
These should be carefully followed. Protected personnel are, until released or
repatriated, a responsibility of "our" government, as the case may be,
and not of ours.

1. This HQ has received a report from the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of the Province of Buna to the following effect.
2. The conduct of the troops belonging to the 47 Q.M.C. is disorderly.
3. Although the officers are well aware that the town of Buna is out of bounds to troops not on duty they appear to be quite indifferent to breaches of this order and it would almost seem as if they encouraged their men to disregard it.
4. Apart from the extreme disorderly conduct of the men when they are in Buna there are other troubles arising from their presence. A shop was recently discovered where in which U. S. Q.M.C. stores were being retailed to the local population. There were no isolated lots of "C" Rations or cigarettes but crates and cases of merchandise which the locals said were brought up in military trucks belonging to the unit in question and openly traded to them by the Soldiers who said they were authorized to do this.

On the 1st August, 1943, an investigation disclosed that two Carabinieri from the City of Caltanissetta - Vice-Brigadier Carlo MARIANI and Private Giovanni PALAZZO - had participated in looting a dump of U.S. military equipment, and brutally beating the guard appointed to watch the property.

The Carabinieri were apprehended, admitted their guilt and were turned over to the Military as prisoners of war, to be forwarded to Africa.

On 20th August, it was learned that these men had been improperly released, and re-admitted to the Carabinieri, and on 27th August the C.C.A.O. gave directions that they were to be re-arrested, and sent as prisoners of war to North Africa forthwith.

The S.C.A.O. Caltanissetta was instructed accordingly, and the direction is being carried out so far as PALAZZO is concerned. In the case of MARIANI, however, it has been pointed out that this man has since been transferred to Palermo Province, and you should therefore order his immediate arrest and arrange through the appropriate channels for his evacuation to North Africa.

1. With reference to your letter of 15 September, it is clearly laid down in G.O. No. 6 that the Bank of Italy cannot engage in ~~any~~ banking transactions other than the Royal Treasury.
2. They are, therefore, not permitted to exchange yellow seal dollars and P.M.L. notes for the account of other banks or any other transactions with other banks.
3. Regarding Bank of Italy letter dated 16 September 42, a copy of which you submitted to this Headquarters, the answers to their questions are as follows:
 - a. They are not permitted to effect payment of any obligations due from banks in any amount until and unless credit balances of such banks with Bank of Italy are released. The right of offset of obligations against credit balances exists but not to be put into effect now.
 - b. Voluntary payments may be accepted from banks or other debtors over 5000 lire and partial payments may likewise be made but no payments can be enforced against banks with credit balances. See S.A.I. Finance No. 3.
 - c. Loans other than to banks, if any, may be collected in an amount not to exceed 5000 lire per loan. See G.O. No. 1. 309
 - d. Bank of Italy cannot accept payments or deposits into accounts of banks or private individuals against deposit of State securities or any other security. See G.O. No. 6.
 - e. Please refer to S.A.I. Finance No. 3 and interpret G.O. No. 6 strictly in accordance with its terms. In doing so, most of your questions will be answered.

Further to instructions set out in para. 4 of the Temporary Modifications to Italian Penal Procedure published in "Sicilia Liberata" of 6 Sept. 1943, reading as follows:-

"The Court and Prosecution to have the right to grant provisional liberty even in cases set forth in Article 253 of the Code of Penal Procedure, whenever the offence is not serious or the circumstances in which the act has been committed do not justify the continuous detention of the accused".

This provision applied only to offences committed since the occupation. It has now been decided that Procuratore delle Leggi may also grant provisional liberty in cases of prisoners sentenced to a term of imprisonment by the Italian Courts before our occupation. In this instance, however, the decision of the Procuratore must be submitted to and approved by the S.C.A.O. of the Province.

Subject: Discipline - Allied Troops.

To General Officer Commanding in Chief,
15 Army Group.

1. As a result of a recent meeting of my Senior Civil Affairs Police Officers from the provinces, the subject of indiscipline by Allied Troops in Sicily was discussed. The attached minute was submitted to me by the head of the Public Safety Division.

2. I have already discussed the subject with you on more than one occasion and I am aware of the action you have taken. The acts of indiscipline are too numerous and the reports too consistent to represent merely isolated cases; but I am principally concerned by the fact that there does not appear to be any improvement since active military operations ceased. I find myself in the quandary of rarely being able to ascertain details of the names, units and times of the events in as much as the reports received by my officers are mainly from Italians who are not in a position to supply essential facts to enable disciplinary proceedings to be instituted against individuals concerned. When such details are available reports have of course been made to the higher formations concerned, but no information is then made accessible to my officers to shew what disciplinary action has been taken. They, therefore, remain under the impression that no action has been taken. It would be a matter of great gratification if formations were to report the action they have taken.

3. I entirely concur in Colonel Bolles plea for more military police or failing this the use of unit regimental police whenever units are in or near towns visited by troops.

1. There are in the custody of the Italian prison authorities some 211 Arab natives of Libya who were brought to Sicily as P.O.W. by the Italians. Of these 163 are at Caltanissetta and 48 at Modica.

2. The G.C.A.O. wishes these Arabs to be returned to North Africa at earliest possible moment. A message has been sent to MIREAST regarding their reception there and instructions have also been issued for the making out of nominal rolls by territories.

3. Meanwhile the men are an embarrassment to the prison Dept. apart from the fact that they would seem to merit better treatment than it is possible to give them in a prison. To liberate them in the island before repatriation is obviously out of the question. In the circumstances you are requested to approach 15 A.G. to see whether these men could not be accommodated in a P.O.W. cage until such time as they can be repatriated.

4. I may well be that security may wish to process these men before they are repatriated and this could be done more ~~conveniently~~ from a cage.

5. It will be necessary to ask you to take steps to obtain transport for these men as soon as numbers and destinations are known.





The bearer of the attached pass, Sig. CAPUANO Carlo, Singer Coy representative, was stopped by one of my staff whilst in Catania for the purpose of checking the identity of his two passengers. Neither of them, although they came from PALERMO, was in possession of a pass. From Sig. CAPUANO's statement it would appear that he had been told by the CAO who issued it that

- a. He could travel all over Sicily with the attached document,
- b. It was unnecessary for him to hold any other pass to cover his passengers.

According to the instructions given to this Provincial H.Q. such a procedure is entirely incorrect, and the action taken would have been

- a. Issue of a Special Pass to Sig. CAPUANO authorising travel, within a specified radius, and, if necessary stating ALL Sicily
- b. A permit to use his own car,
- c. A pass for each of his passengers either to cover individual journey or to cover an unlimited number of journeys within a stated radius.

May I please be informed if the regulations relative to the issue of passes have been relaxed to such an extent that documents such as the attached are all that is necessary now.

1. A copy is attached of the minutes of a conference held at Palermo on 13 Sept. These minutes were apparently forwarded to MAPCOM through 15 Army Group.
2. It will be observed that the recommendations contained in these minutes are at variance with those arrived at in the second conference held at HQ, Seventh Army on 2 Sept. at which Brigadier Fellowes and Brig. General Carl H. Gray (OGAS, AFIS) were present.
3. It will also be observed that four out of the six officers attending the conference on 13 Sept. also attended the 2 Sept. conference. My representative, Capt. Minard, was called to this meeting on 13 Sept. by telephone and could accept no responsibility on my behalf.
4. I do not accept the recommendations of this committee of 13 Sept., and I consider that the matter can be put right only by a direction from you to HQ, Seventh Army to the effect that the arrangements agreed at Brigadier Fellowes' conference will stand.
5. I cannot accept the proposal in paragraph 8 b of the minutes of the 2 Sept. conference which means in effect that Military Traffic will be carried entirely at the cost of AMGOT. AMGOT is not authorised to maintain or contribute to the maintenance of Allied Armed forces. In territories previously occupied, the principle has been adopted that Armies should contribute to Civilian railways their share of expenses; and I can see no reason why this principle should be abandoned.

Reference your 4902 of 14th September just arrived, I should like to make the following comments:-

Ref Para. 1.

- (a) The system evolved was a compromise to circumvent the restrictive regulations of the U.S. Finance Division.
- (b) As stated in my 2002/F of 8th Sep, neither Colonel Tillman nor Lieut-Colonel Hayes was aware that details of such \$ expenditure had to be submitted to NATOUS. Copies of such instructions and of Form 46 are still awaited.
- (c) As the funds drawn from Colonel Tillman have now been repaid and a copy of the receipt sent to M.G.S. for onward transmission to NATOUS, may it be assumed that Region I is now cleared? If this is the case, the need for the special instruction at A.F.H.Q. of an American officer in the accounting intricacies of the missing form 46 would not appear to be necessary.

Ref Para. 2.

- (d) The facility is certainly no longer necessary in Region I nor ever arose in Region 2 where the system with the British Paymasters worked smoothly. In so far as advances of Yellow seal dollars were made in North Africa to certain officers of Region 3, I presume that they have received the full instructions and copies of Form 46, showing in detail the information necessary to the Chief Finance Officer NATOUS. My own relations with this party do not exist, as I cannot correspond with them. If M.G.S. considers that the Region 3 officers are not fully aware of what accounts should be submitted, may I suggest that you send a warning order to Lieut-Colonel Barrett.
- (e) But owing to dispersion I feel the difficulties may recur, and I prefer the suggestion in ~~my~~ penultimate para of my 2002/F of 8 Sep.
- (f) In so far as other Regions are concerned, and now that a supply of Allied Military Lire is available, I strongly advise against any continuation of issuing Yellow seal dollars to S.C.A.O.s, as I consider that the mechanism necessary for such transactions will always lead to trouble.
- (g) Lieut-Col. Bernstein is aware of the position and may be able to mollify ~~the~~ C.P.O. NATOUS.

1. The transport situation in Sicily is acute, for many reasons. One of the contributory causes is the lack of tyres, and the condition of such tyres as are available, extremely bad roads cause rapid wear, and it is feared that the general situation will become worse as a result of this.
2. Can you please say if there are facilities for re-treading tyres in Cefalvo, and if so to what extent we could make use of these? Some indication of the existing facilities and of the times necessary to re-tread tyres would also be useful.
3. This is a matter of urgency since a tyne must be removed for re-treading before the rubber wears down to the canvas.

1. "Al portatore" or bearer pass-books of deposit account are subject to similar withdrawals.

2. No adequate way exists to control or restrict movement of bearer pass-books from one person to another.

3. Your method appears as satisfactory as any to be applied in the circumstances; and your action incidental thereto is confirmed.

4. The same principle applies with one person having individual accounts with several banks. Such person entitled to withdrawal from each account. Likewise each pass-book in effect a separate account.

5. Perhaps this type of account is an undesirable feature of the banking system, but it is an established practice similar to Postal Savings and enables banks to compete with Postal Savings.

6. New deposits of this nature are to continue to be accepted by the banks.

If my understanding is correct, I see no objection to the draft.
2. I have spoken to Lt. Col. Densmore and understand that a Directive to Garrotenuto as manager will be prepared and agreed before his appointment. In my opinion, the Directive should define his powers and duties, provide for termination of his employment and for his salary. The proposal to pay a salary of "5% of gross cash collected from customers" is a little vague and it should be made clear whether this includes pre-appointment debts, and whether Garrotenuto gets any remuneration for cash collected after termination of his employment in respect of the Company's earnings during his employment. It should also be made clear whether he is to devote the whole of his time to the job, or not.

3. There is no objection whatever to your visiting towns and villages in Sicily in the course of carrying out your duties, provided that you can obtain the necessary means of transport, but it is regretted that military exigencies make it impossible to furnish means of transport to you.
4. If you will give this Headquarters particulars of the Methodist Schools which were in existence at the date of the occupation, the ~~resumption~~ of teaching by personnel of your Church will be considered on the same basis as has been done in the case of Catholic Schools. No new schools may, however, be opened at the present time.
