SECURITY PLAN FOR PALERMO AREA

REF. MAP - TOWN PLAN OF PALERMO.

1. MISSION. The purpose of this plan is to provide protection to military personnel, equipment and supplies in the event of an emergency, such as an amphibian landing, attack by parachutists and civil disorders.

2. RESPONSIBILITY. No. 1 District is responsible for the ground defense and general security of the whole of Sicily, including the Island Base Section Area. In the event of civil disorders, it is the responsibility of the Carabinieri to maintain law and order. If they are unable to deal with the situation, then the military may be called to restore control. Troops will be withdrawn when the civil administration has regained control.

3. CONTROL. The Commanding Officer, Island Base Section, will command all troops, including the 119th Infantry Brigade, 46th Infantry Regiment of the Sabauda Division and all American Troops, except those used to guard Seventh Army Headquarters Installations.

4. COMMUNICATIONS. In the event of an alert or warning order, each unit included in the plan will immediately send a messenger mounted in a jeep or on a motorcycle to their respective assembly area. The following units will send a liaison officer and a messenger to Headquarters, Island Base Section (Map Ref. B 439-467) upon an alert or warning order. The commanding officers of the units listed below will command all troops assembling in their respective areas and all unit messengers will report to them.

The IBS Dispatcher shall notify the Motor Pool and call ten (10) C & R vehicles or jeeps to IBS Headquarters for use during the emergency.

6. DISPOSITION OF TROOPS. Troops in the number listed in the column entitled "Initial Force", will be moved to and held in readiness at the assembly area listed opposite the name of the unit, upon the sounding of an alert or upon receiving orders to do so. In no event will starting the movement to the assembly area be delayed more than 30 minutes after the alert or designated time for starting the movement. The "Reserve Force" will be alerted, but will not move from their bivouac area until ordered to do so by the assembly area commander or higher authority.

Seventh Army units will protect Seventh Army Installations. Headquarters, Seventh Army will be contacted for any assistance necessary.

7. SPECIAL UNITS. Eight (8) light tanks and twenty-four (24) half tracks will be combat loaded and manned by the 83rd Ord Co (HM) upon call from the Commanding Officer, Island Base Section.

8. ALERT SIGNAL. The Alert Signal will be an undulating note sounded on the air raid sirens or notification to assembly area commanders by telephone or by messenger. (The undulating note will be produced by turning the electric current to the sirens off and on at short intervals, depending on the characteristics of each siren).

9. AMMUNITION. All units will have full TBA allowance of ammunition on hand, ready for any emergency. Ammunition may be obtained at the Ordnance Base Depot near Piazza Olivuzza (Map Ref. B 422468). The use of grenades, gas and smoke against civilians is prohibited.

I was instructed to supervise the movement of the above convoy on 14/10/1965, and accordingly to report for duty at the Officer's Mess, 101 Via Stabia, at 0600 hours.

1. Vehicles.

At 0615 hours all vehicles were lining the roadway facing in the direction of the move off with the exception of the following: Vehicle No 7/01 C.S.B. Der Lucien reported at 0605 hours Vehicle No 7/42 2 1/2 Ton Truck and trailer Der De Congo and Truck No 7/42 Der Pinto and Truck No 7/04 Der Violetto and, Truck No 7/13 Der Coll.

These were unable to be moved from the car park until 0600 hours owing to the fact that the ignition keys of the trucks were in possession of a Lt. who did not arrive until that time. Truck No 7/05 Der Magister did not report for duty until 0630 hours.

2. Personnel

Considerable delay was brought about through the lateness of arrival of Officers.

The Lt. sent in from "A" Coy did not arrive until 0630 hours.

3. Summary

Save again Officers' baggage at 0630 hours was still lying on the sidewalk as no previous instructions were to have been given as to where Officers' should risk or their kits be loaded. The result was complete chaos.

Eventually at 0645 hours the convoy was finally lined up and moved off at 0645 hours.

INTRODUCTORY

1. General

(a) Reference is made to Allied Control Commission Directive No. 1 dated 10 November 1943, forwarded under Memorandum of same date (Subject: Operations of Regions.)

(b) It has not been found possible to operate a Joint Headquarters AG and ACC as then contemplated. The position is at present that two Headquarters AG have been constituted under AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 69 dated 16 October 1943 as amended by No. 75 of 8 November 1943.

- (i) AG 15 Army Group with under command Regions 3 and 4. Headquarters AG (Palermo) with under command Regions 1 and 2. This Headquarters includes a number of officers who will later join Headquarters Allied Control Commission.
- (ii) AG 15 Army Group is responsible for all territory north of the Provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari. Headquarters AG is responsible for all territory (including Sicily) south of the northern boundaries of the above mentioned Provinces. The Province of Salerno has been transferred to control of Region 2 under General Order No. 4 dated 9 November 1943.

2. Allied Control Commission

The Headquarters of the Allied Control Commission (Brindisi) has under command personnel in the four provinces now administered by the Italian Government. Region 6 remains for the time being under the direct command of AFHQ but will in due course come under ACC.

3. Chiefs, AG and AG

The respective chiefs are as follows:

D. C. A. C. and Chief Headquarters AG - Brigadier General F. J. McHenry

(b) It has not been found possible to operate a joint Headquarters A.G. and A.C.C. as then contemplated. The position is at present that two Headquarters A.G. have been constituted under AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 69 dated 10 October 1943 as amended by No. 73 of 6 November 1943.

- (i) A.G. 15 Army Group with under command Regions 3 and 4.
- (ii) Headquarters A.G. (Palermo) with under command Regions 1 and 2. This Headquarters includes a number of officers who will later join Headquarters Allied Control Commission.
- (iii) A.G. 15 Army Group is responsible for all territory north of the Provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari. Headquarters A.G. is responsible for all territory (including Sicily) south of the northern boundaries of the above mentioned Provinces. The Province of Salerno has been transferred to control of Region 2 under General Order No. 1, dated 3 November 1943.

2. Allied Control Commission

The Headquarters of the Allied Control Commission (Brindisi) has under command personnel in the four Provinces now administered by the Italian Government. Region 5 remains for the time being under the direct command of AFHQ but will in due course come under A.C.C.

3. Chiefs, A.G. and A.C.C.

The respective chiefs are as follows:

C.O.A.O. and Chief A.G. 15 Army Group: Major General Lord Rennell of Rodd
D.C.C.A.O. and Chief Headquarters A.G. - Brigadier General E. J. McSherry.

(AFHQ Administrative Memo No. 73 dated 2 November 1943)

4. Military Governor

General Sir Harold Alexander remains Military Governor of all Italian territory under Allied Military Government.

MILITARY ORGANIZATION

5. Sicily

(a) No. 1 District (British), Headquarters Catania includes the whole island for defense and internal security purposes, and for the administration of British troops.

(b) Island Base Section (IBS) (American) Headquarters, Palermo, is responsible for Administration of U. S. troops.

6. Mainland

No. 2 District (British) and Peninsula Base Section (American) have similar responsibilities in Southern Italy. Jurisdiction of No. 2 District extends as far north as rear boundaries of 15 Army Group.

7. Relationship between Military Commanders and AIG Officers

Following extracts from JHQ letter JG 01/1-1 GCM 441 dated 12 November are embodied in Appendix 'A' hereto.

8. American Side

(a) The TO and TI for the 2675th Regiment have been approved. All American personnel of AIG - JGC in this theater will be held on the strength of the TO.

(b) Colonel H. Perkin has been assigned as Commanding Officer of the Regiment.

9. British Side

(a) Personnel are at present held on the strength of one or other of the following WEs:

- (i) Pool at Military Government School and Holding Center.
- (ii) Aristocratic Central Commission National Headquarters (No. 11/147/1 dated 16 September 1943).
- (iii) AIGCT WE dated 24 June 1943 which includes Regions 1 and 2.
- (iv) Regions 3, 4, 5, and 6.

The above are separate self-accounting units, each with its G1096. There is no separate WE for Headquarters AIG 15 Army Group (see (b) below).

(b) A 'global' WE (and G 1098) has been prepared which it is hoped to issue shortly. On the strength of this WE will be held all British personnel of AIG - JGC in this theater including those allotted to AIG Headquarters, 15 Army Group (including detachments with Fifth and Eighth Armies).

(c) The unit for which the above WE and G1098 have been prepared will be known as "AIGAG" (AIG - JGC) and will be administered, in routine personnel and equipment matters, by a British Administrative Headquarters of which Colonel Warren has been appointed acting Chief.

2675TH REGIMENT AND BRITISH ADMINISTRATIVE HEADQUARTERS

10. Authority

The authority for the organization, location and functioning of these

(a) The TO and TE for the 2675th Regiment have been approved. All American personnel of AMG - JCC in this theater will be held on the strength of the TO.

(b) Colonel E. Parlin has been assigned as Commanding Officer of the Regiment.

9. British Side

(a) Personnel are at present held on the strength of one or other of the following JEs:

- (i) Pool at Military Government School and Holding Center.
- (ii) Justice Control Commission National Headquarters (No. 14/147/1 dated 16 September 1943).
- (iii) AMGOT JE dated 24 June 1943 which includes Regions 1 and 2.
- (iv) Regions 3, 4, 5, and 6.

The above are separate self-accounting units, each with its G1098. There is no separate JE for Headquarters AMG 15 Army Group (See (b) below)

(b) A 'Global' JE (and G 1098) has been prepared which it is hoped to issue shortly. On the strength of this JE will be held all British personnel of AMG - JCC in this theater including those allotted to AMG Headquarters, 15 Army Group (including detachments with Fifth and Eighth armies).

(c) The units for which the above JE and G1098 have been prepared will be known as "AMGOT" (AMG - JCC) and will be administered, in routine personnel and equipment matters, by a British Administrative Headquarters of which Colonel Farren has been appointed acting Chief.

1. This directive defines the relationship between Military Commanders (British District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area and Garrison Commanders and U.S. Base Section and District Commanders, and AG officers, in the area which is under Headquarters Allied Military Government for military purposes.
2. a. Allied Military Government personnel will be under command of the Commander of the Base Section, District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area or Garrison concerned for disciplinary purposes, subject to the provisions of Administrative Memorandum No. 11, AFHQ, cc, (Revised to 21 October 1943).
b. In cases of military emergency, the Allied military commander responsible for defense and security will assume full command of Allied Military Government personnel and will issue such orders to them as the situation demands.
c. In special circumstances, e.g., where there is a very small garrison under a commander junior to the Allied Military Government officer, or where an Italian commander is responsible for the administration, defense or security, special instructions will be issued by this headquarters.
3. It will be the duty of the Regional Civil Affairs Officer to assist military commanders in his region in their dealings with the civil population. Similarly it will be the duty of the military commander to assist the Regional Civil Affairs Officer, and to uphold this authority in the civil sphere, by military action if used be.
4. Military commanders and Allied Military Government officers will maintain liaison at all times and will carry out their respective functions in close cooperation. Any difference which may arise between them will be promptly reported to this headquarters. If however an immediate decision is required, the military commander will make that decision and Allied Military Government Officers will comply with his orders, pending receipt of instructions from this headquarters.

2. a. Allied Military Government personnel, District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area or Garrison Commander of the Base Section, District, Sub-District, Area, Sub-Area or Garrison concerned for disciplinary purposes, subject to the provisions of Administrative Memorandum No. 11, JFHQ, cc, (Revised to 21 October 1943).

b. In case of military emergency, the Allied military commander responsible for defense and security will assume full command of Allied Military Government personnel and will issue such orders to them as the situation demands.

c. In special circumstances, e.g., where there is a very small garrison under a commander junior to the Allied Military Government officer, or where an Italian commander is responsible for the administration, defense or security, special instructions will be issued by this headquarters.

3. It will be the duty of the Regional Civil Affairs Officer to assist military commanders in his region in their dealings with the civil population. Similarly it will be the duty of the military commander to assist the Regional Civil Affairs Officer, and to uphold this authority in the civil sphere, by military action if need be.

4. Military commanders and Allied Military Government officers will maintain liaison at all times and will carry out their respective functions in close cooperation. Any difference which may arise between them will be promptly reported to this headquarters. If however an immediate decision is required, the military commander will make that decision and Allied Military Government Officers will comply with his orders, pending receipt of instructions from this headquarters.
