ORDERS FOR REAR DETACHMENT, HQ A.S.
(Palermo)

Reference Special Orders No. 31 Dated 6 December 1943.

1. Command

In accordance with Special Order No. 32, Paragraph 21, Lt. Colonel Rogers will, after the departure of H.Q. of S. and Subordinate Officers, be in command of the Palermo Detachment, Hq A.S., and will appoint an acting Hq Commandant, Rear Party. Lt. Col. Brown, S-4, will also remain with Rear Party pending orders from Hq A.S.

2. Headquarters

Hq A.S. remains at Palermo until notification by cable is received of date it will open at Naples. (Probably about 22nd December). Exact date will be notified by Commandant, Rear Detachment, to all concerned as soon as cable is received.

3. Title of Rear Party

After Hq A.S. opens at new station (see paragraph 2 above), the Rear Party will be known as Hq A.S. (Rear Detachment), changing to Hq A.S. (Rear Detachment) as soon as Hq A.S. becomes Rear Hq A.S.

4. Application of Orders

All existing orders issued by Hq A.S. (for example the memorandum on Travel Orders and the orders regarding days off) will continue to apply.

5. Movement of Officers to Naples and Palermo.

Forward movement of officers may be authorized by C.S. Rear Detachment if the responsible head of the Section or Sub-Commission concerned considers their presence at Naples or Palermo necessary or if the officer has been ordered forward by Hq A.S. (A.S.).

6. Officers arriving

Officers arriving to join the Rear Detachment, whether on temporary duty or permanent change of station will report to the A.S. office and sign in. A.S. will publish their names in Orders.

7. Correspondence and Orders

will, after the departure of D.C. of S. and Executive Officers, be in command of the Palermo Detachment, Hq 4.6, and will appoint an acting Hq Commandant, Rear Party. Lt. Col. Brown, 8-4, will also remain with Rear Party pending orders from Hq AHC.

2. Headquarters

Hq AHC remains at Palermo until notification by cable is received of date it will open at Naples. (Probably about 22nd December). Exact date will be notified by Commander, Rear Detachment, to all concerned as soon as cable is received.

3. Title of Rear Party

After Hq AHC opens at new station (see paragraph 2 above), the Rear Party will be known as Hq AHC (Rear Detachment), changing to Hq ACC (Rear Detachment) as soon as Hq AHC Naples becomes Rear Hq ACC.

4. Application of Orders

All existing orders issued by Hq AHC (for example the memorandum on Travel Orders and the orders regarding days off) will continue to apply.

5. Movement of Officers to Naples and Salerno.

Forward movement of officers may be authorized by C.O. Rear Detachment if the responsible head of the Section or Sub-Commission concerned considers their presence at Naples or Salerno necessary or if the officer has been ordered forward by Hq AHC (AHC).

6. Officers Arriving

Officers arriving to join the Rear Detachment, whether on temporary duty or permanent change of station will report to the ACC's office and stay in. AHC. will publish their names in Orders.

7. Correspondence and Cables

(a) Passing my contrary orders. Official mail addressed Hq AHC arriving here will be opened by the ACC. If the matter can be dealt with here, it will be referred to the appropriate section or Sub-Commission. If it obviously cannot be so dealt with, it will be forwarded by air letter or courier or Army Courier Service (see paragraph 7 (a)) to Hq at Naples. If in doubt AHC will refer to the appropriate officer, or to the Commanding Officer.

(b) Orders will be similarly dealt with. The official cable address of Hq Naples is AHC.

(c) Authority HQ Cable No. 12206 dated 19 December 1943. "Purge" remains cable address of Rear Detachment, Palermo. Cables addressed to Rear Party which have not been requested to Hq will not be opened unless all necessary action can be taken by Rear Detachment.

(d) In appropriate cases, copies of letters and cables despatched by Rear Detachment will be sent to Hq at Naples. Copies of all routine orders and all Orders of Section concerned will similarly be sent to Hq at Naples. Vital notification that has been opened at Naples is received (see para 2, all such

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communications will be addressed "H. A.C. Forward Division, Confidential, the name of an officer if possible".

3. Office Hours, Office and Organization

(1) Office hours will continue to apply (except in so far as this may not be possible owing to the withdrawal of personnel, for the present). Even officers will if necessary be issued by Commanding Officer, Near Detachment, when there has been an opportunity of judging the volume of work.

(2) The following Near Party Sections: Sub-Commissions, etc. will be attached as shown below and will not receive separate copies of orders, letters etc. or be included in regular distribution lists. The Section, etc. to which attached will be responsible for informing them or bringing to their notice all matters which concern them:

4. Postal Arrangements

(a) Official mail will be despatched in bags as in paragraph 7 under arrangements of 40 and 41 (Translocation).

(b) Private mail of personnel who have gone forward will be collected from the Post Office and forwarded to Naples or Salerno by air and arrangements for this have already been made.

10. Relocation of Offices

(a) The bases of Tulla and Via Sottano Offices will be completely vacated, and all offices except those. Sub-Commission on 217 Via Sottano and part of Finance Sub-Commission at Museo del Lavoro are concentrated at Via Sottano. Offices are reallocated as shown in Attachment "A" attached. Move to new offices will be completed by 0000 hrs. on day following move of main body. Offices moving will ascertain from the Sottano Post Office what furniture, if any, is required to be brought to Via Sottano.

(b) Some of all occupied offices will be re-labelled on the outside.

(c) In no circumstances will offices be changed without permission from the Commanding Officer, Near Detachment.

(d) The AG will prepare and issue a new telephone directory as soon as possible.

11. Vacated Offices

(a) An officer wishing to move to a billet nearer to Ag. Near Detachment, will inform the AG Commandant, who will arrange accordingly.

9. Postal Arrangements

- (a) Official mail will be despatched in bags as in paragraph 7 under arrangements of 25 and 24 (Transportation).
- (b) Private mail of personnel who have gone forward will be collected from the Post Office and forwarded to Naples or Salerno by air and arrangements for this have already been made.

10. Relocation of Offices

- (a) The offices of Italia and Via Settimo Offices will be completely vacated, and all offices except Admin. Sub-Commission at 217 Via S. Agostino and part of Finance Sub-Commission at Piazza del Lavoro are reallocated as shown in Appendix "A" attached. Move to new offices will be completed by 0900 hrs. on day following move of main body. Offices moving will ascertain from the Admin. Sub-Commission what furniture, if any, is required to be brought to Via Bari.
- (b) Floors of all occupied offices will be re-labeled on the outside.
- (c) In no circumstances will offices be changed without permission from the Commanding Officer, Admin. Sub-Commission.
- (d) The AG will prepare and issue a new telephone directory as soon as possible.

11. Repacked Bunkers

- (a) An officer dealing to move to a billet nearer to the Admin. Sub-Commission, will inform the AG, Commandant, who will arrange accordingly.
- (b) Sufficient accommodation for an additional 50 officers and 75 AGs will be obtained pending orders as to disposal of the AGs, that those near Party, (c) After the arrangements in (a) and (b) above have been concluded, particulars of the remaining vacated billets or other unneeded accommodation will be notified to the AG, and if not required by them, will be de-requisitioned.

12. Officers' Mess, Sports Club

A separate memorandum is being issued to those concerned.

SUBJECT: Transport Instructions

TO : OC "A" and "B" Transportation Companies.

1. All vehicles will remain, when not required in their respective garages.
2. All drivers awaiting orders will service and clean their vehicles.
3. A Daily Task sheet will be maintained for each vehicle, each task including car cleaning both exterior and interior, will on completion, be initialed by the Driver.

4. ORs and EM will be detailed to a specific vehicle - only if sick or off duty will another be allowed to drive. The driver's name will be posted in a prominent position in each vehicle - when a temporary change is made - the new driver will carry a letter to the effect that he has been detailed to drive the vehicle.

5. One, only, emergency pool car, will be stationed in Via Bari. The driver will be told that under no circumstances whatsoever will he carry any passengers unless they hold, an order signed by the Duty Transportation Officer, immediately the D.T.O. has authorized the journey, he will telephone for another car, when the first car returns, it will be ordered to report to the garage.

6. OCs "A" and "B" Transport Companies will maintain a log of all vehicles IN and OUT, with detailed description of passengers, journeys, goods, authority for journey, etc.

7. OC "A" and "B" Transport will not accept any instructions in connection with Headquarters Transportation matters, unless they are issued by the HQ Commandants office except as laid down in para 8.

8. After normal office hours, the Night Duty Officer only, will be allowed to authorize the use of vehicles.

9. A car and driver will be available every night from 1800 hours to 0800 hours for night emergency calls. Responsibility for providing this transport will be in accordance with the following schedule.

SUBJECT: Instructions for telephoning or passing phonograms to Senior Civil Affairs Officers

TO : ALL Senior Civil Affairs Officers & Headquarters Staff

1. In many cases speech may be so faint as to necessitate message relaying.

2. CALTANISSETTA:

Through CADET direct
Through CLOVER

ENNA: Caltanissetta ask for M.T.O., Enna (Telephone is in R.T.O.'s Office, Enna) and leave message for S.C.A.O.

TRAPANI: Call 'Attack', ask for SCAO Trapani

STRAGUSA: Through Catania. If too faint, relay message.

RAGUSA: (a) Ask for 'Avenger' then 'Tally-ho', then 'Comiso'; ask for Ragusa.

(b) Catania to 'Tally-ho'; ask for Comiso, then Ragusa.

AGRIGENTO: Direct. Ask for 'Avenger'

MESSINA: Through Catania or relay

3. The surest and most secure method of relaying a "phonogram" is to first write the message on a message form correctly and concisely. Then dictate the text clearly to the receiving operator and get him to repeat it back.

4. Senior Civil Affairs Officers may communicate with this Headquarters by the above procedure reversed.

5. Senior Civil Affairs Officers should inform this Headquarters of their Telephone numbers as military exchanges are not always familiar with them. e.g. Catania has No. 15050 for its Civilian Supply Section, and 14780 for Provincial Headquarters.

I -- RELIEF FROM ASSIGNMENT

Effective 7 December 1943, Brigadier General FRANK G. MCSHERRY is relieved from his assignment as Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer and Deputy Chief of AMQOT, and Administrative Memorandum Number 42, this Headquarters, CG, is accordingly rescinded; he is further relieved from his assignment as Chief of Headquarters, Allied Military Government and so much of Section III, Administrative Memorandum Number 89, this Headquarters, CG, as refers to him is accordingly rescinded.

II - ASSIGNMENT OF CHIEF OF HEADQUARTERS ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT

Announcement is made of the assignment, effective 7 December 1943, of Colonel CHARLES M. 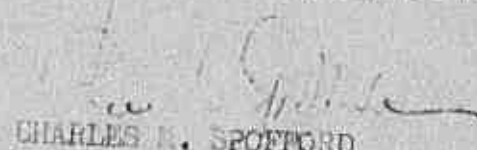

c. The personnel to fill Regions VIII and IX and regions beyond (so far as they come from personnel under command of "AMG Command") will be selected by Headquarters, AMG 15 Army Group.

d. Such preference as is possible in selection of personnel for Regions VIII and IX should be given to officers who have already been provisionally assigned to these Regions, particularly in the Headquarters and Specialist Groups.

e. On a decision to hand over territory to Italian administration, the allocation of appointments under command of "ACC Command" in such territory will be made by Military Government Section. Personnel equivalent in rank, qualification, and nationality will be selected by Headquarters AMG 15 Army Group for transfer under command "ACC Command".

6. Personnel, vehicles and equipment, will not be transferred from "ACC Command" to "AMG Command" or vice versa without the approval of Military Government Section.

7. A separate order will be issued in respect of the personnel now provisionally assigned to Region V.

d. Such preference as is possible in selection of personnel for Regions VIII and IX should be given to officers who have already been provisionally assigned to these Regions, particularly in the Headquarters and Specialist Groups.

e. On a decision to hand over territory to Italian administration, the allocation of appointments under command of "ACC Command" in such territory will be made by Military Government Section. Personnel equivalent in rank, qualification, and nationality will be selected by Headquarters AMG 15 Army Group for transfer under command "ACC Command".

6. Personnel, vehicles and equipment, will not be transferred from "ACC Command" to "AMG Command" or vice versa without the approval of Military Government Section.

7. A separate order will be issued in respect of the personnel now provisionally assigned to Region V.
