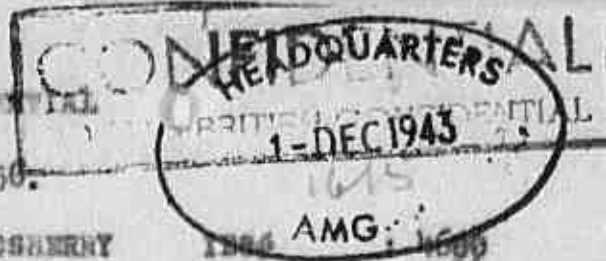

1. It is planned to move this Headquarters to the Naples area in the near future as follows:

a. Advance Party - one officer of each Sub-Commission, Directorate and Section staff and an Executive Officer, and a small housekeeping group from Headquarters Commandant, including provisions for the Officers' Mess.

b. Main Body - remainder of Headquarters except one responsible staff officer from each: the Communications Section, the Economic Directorate and the Administrative Directorate and an Executive Officer and a small housekeeping detail.

c. Rear Party - all remaining personnel.

2. Each Section, Directorate, Sub-Commission and Branch will list by name the officers to be included in the Advance Party and Rear Party and the number of officers in the Main Body. Lists will be completed on the attached forms and turned in to the Executive Officers by Section, Directorate and Branch Staff at the earliest and not later than Monday, 29 November 1943.

3. Each Section, Directorate, Sub-Commission and Branch will promptly eliminate non-essential materials and equipment. A committee, under direction of G-4 branch, will visit all offices to estimate quantities and weights of equipment and supplies to be moved. The committee, also, will arrange for marking and numbering.

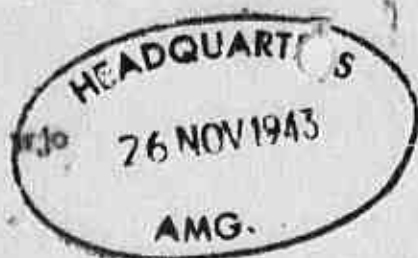

Subject: Civil Administration in 8th Army Area
 R.C. 15 Army Group, C.A.F.

General Officer Commanding in Chief,
 15 Army Group

1. I have, with my American Deputy, Colonel H.S. Henry, been for a time on tour to 8th Army Area.

2. With the exception of certain incidents to which I am referring in a separate report, I have no particular comment to make. On Capt. Hansen's staff, who the addition of staff from H.M.A. Section IV, which has been called forward, have set up an administration in forward Eighth Army area up to the front line.

3. This area is fortunate in having an adequate food supply and in the case of some districts, a certain surplus. The difficulties therefore which have confronted me in Sicily and Calabria find no parallel in this happy area. It is indeed lucky that this should be so, since means of transport among the civil population hardly exists. The only deficiency reported, apart from requisitioned requisitioned such as clothing and boots, is salt in the western parts of Campobasso Province. This has been made good by bringing salt from the coastal districts. With the corps in 8th Army have been most helpful in making available military transport to move local stocks of grain to villages where local shortages exist.

4. With the exception of the incidents referred to in the report which I am submitting separately, law and order has been good. Summary Courts have dealt with the usual petty crime under Proclamation No. 2. Only one more serious crime has been reported, namely an alleged case of sniping at Montefiore; a General Court is being set up to try the accused under the warrant issued by you to C.O.G. 8th Army.

5. The principal problem in Puglia and Campobasso is that of refugees and displaced persons, on which subject I shall be addressing you separately. While the situation is not easy, it appears to be in hand, and nothing has occurred to affect the operations of your troops.

6. The advent of the Allied Air Forces in Puglia and surrounding villages is having very considerable repercussions. A number of difficulties have arisen in connection with billeting and requisitioning which are at present under discussion, and I prefer to make no further reference to the subject until certain points have been cleared up. The Prefect of Puglia, Major General Picchi, formerly second in command of the Carabinieri for the whole of Italy, has recently been transferred to Bari under the instructions of Marshal Badoglio to take up the appointment of C.O.G. the Carabinieri for the whole of Italy. His place has been taken by Major General Ottaviano who arrived in Puglia on 11th November. It is necessary to ensure efficient liaison with the Allied Military Commission

3. This area is fortunate in having an adequate food supply and in the case of some districts, a certain surplus. The difficulties therefore which have confronted us in Sicily and Calabria find no parallel in this happy area. It is indeed lucky that this should be so, since means of transport among the civil population heavily exists. 6. The advent of the Allied Air Forces in Poggia and surrounding villages is having very considerable repercussions. A number of difficulties have arisen in connection with billeting and requisitioning which are at present under discussion, and I prefer to make no further reference to the subject until certain points have been cleared up. The Prefect of Poggia, Major General Tedde formerly second in command of the Carabinieri for the whole of Italy, has recently been transferred to Bari under the instructions of Marshal Badoglio to take up the appointment of S.C.A.O. the Carabinieri for the whole of Italy. His place has been taken by Major General Ostrand who arrived in Poggia on 14th November to assume office without prior consultation either of S.C.A.O. S.C.A.O. 8th Army or myself. I am taking up with the Allied Military Commission at Brindisi the question of appointments by the Italian Government in territories under the jurisdiction of S.C.A.O. 15 Army Group. While I am not advised of any reasons to object to the new appointment to the Prefecture of Poggia, I am taking the line with the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi that any appointment which the Italian Government desires to make within the area administered by S.C.A.O. 15 Army Group must be referred to me in the first place.

7. I am also taking up with S.C.A.O. the responsibility of Italian 7th Army Orders in the area administered by S.C.A.O. 15 Army Group. While these orders of the 7th Army, which have in certain instances been posted with or without permission, are primarily military in character and therefore do not concern S.C.A.O. one Order has been made calling of recalling men to the colours, which would have had the effect in the Cuneo area, if carried into execution, of bringing up two very important labour gangs working on roads in 13 Corps area. After discussion with S.C.A.O. 8th Army, S.C.A.O. S.C.A.O. 15 Army Group has been instructed to inform the Italian civil authorities at Cuneo that the call up notice under the Italian 7th Army order is to be disregarded in that area.

2.

8. The health of the population in 8th Army area is generally very good with the exception of a few cases of typhoid here and there. There are no signs of epidemic conditions, even among the refugees or displaced persons. Medical evacuation civil use as well as hospital accommodation owing to the occupation of hospitals by military patients have been very short but not critical; a supply of medical stores for civil use has now arrived and is in process of being distributed.

9. Certain difficulties have arisen in one or two areas in the supply of water to towns and, more so, for milling wheat by the failure of electric current. This is in many cases not due to war damage of power lines but to the use of power lines for signal purposes by signal units of the Eighth Army. The subject is under discussion between C.C.C., Eighth Army and Signals Eighth Army and I understand is in process of being settled.

Rotation rosters will be maintained so that noon duty does not fall continually on any one. Offices in which there is only one enlisted man assigned, are exempt from the provisions of this order.

All personnel this headquarters will be required to take one full free day per week. Each chief of sub-commission and staff section will insure that every officer and OR/EM has a free day weekly and that a sufficient working force is on duty daily (including Sunday). Offices in which only one officer or OR/EM is on duty will comply through arrangement with the A.G.

4. Duty Officer and Clerk.

There will be an officer and clerk on duty in this Headquarters between the hours of 1800 and 0830. In addition to the above, there will be a clerk-typist on duty each night between the hours of 1800 and 2100.
