Cables - G-1 - "For Action" personnel cables to G-1. "Information" to other people concerned.

For Action - To be agreed on both sides. In doubt consult.

Displaced Persons Sub-Commission

Major Driffield-White returned. Report to be issued. Commission to be at Naples not Salerno.

H.Q. Commandant

Motorcycles without drivers but only one car. Effort to raise more transport.

Salerno Courier - To report to dispatcher for passengers. Car to be provided. Increasing passenger demands.

Parking - Abolished in front of building. Four car space allotted between Post Office and this building.

Naples Operations.

Sub-Commissions were reminded that they were not to operate in Naples and were in no way responsible for what happened in the city.

Accommodation.

It was reported that a collage was vacant with room for offices, mess, and sleeping quarters for 100 officers and 200 clerks. A mess was available behind the Municipio and could be completed in a week for 150 people. Villa, bed, and furniture situation was satisfactory but office furniture was still difficult. The Volturro and Post Office buildings would be finished by the end of the month when the Palermo party should have arrived. Castellammare was being explored by Major Scoggins for further accommodation. Limit of 100 officers in the Economic & Administrative Section for Naples-Salerno, this figure not to include those assigned to FLAME and those in the field.

Fixtures.

Permanent a matter for engineers, moveable for G-4. It was reported that electric heaters were impracticable at SALERNO in the Palace of Justice.

Transport.

Pool was reported on and personal assignments limited. Organization of Italian truck companies was suggested as Italian drivers were not to drive military vehicles. Shortage of drivers and not vehicles.

Shipping Sub-Commission.

Capt. PM, to keep in touch with Capt. Stone regarding developments.

Industr. & Commerce Sub-Commission.

Was to conform with the Italian Government formation. Letter to be held in abeyance.

NAPLES MOVE

Sorrento Party - to move direct to Sorrento and not via Naples.

Transport - Sufficient also to move Brindisi to Sorrento. Col. Brown reported that ISS will place vehicles bound for 5th Army at our disposal, had tentatively spoken for fifty. Chance of sea transport remote to Naples owing to Army movements. AFHQ to be wired for Transport Officer. One at Naples and one at Sorrento necessary. More accommodation reported by Captain Peebles at Salerno than Sorrento.

Equipment - Nothing at Naples owing to Allied Advisory Council demands. Not to strip Palermo office but seek in town. Furniture must be taken. Telephones possibly available in Naples owing to destruction of Telephone Exchange. Officer to be sent immediately in reconnaissance.

Adjutant General's Office - To be split and to absorb Brindisi. Col. Clough to base between Naples and Sorrento.

Interpreters - Difficulties. Four officers and OAs to join Sorrento party. Emphasis on a sound knowledge of both languages and a high cultural standard.

CABLES - Memorandum from IBS regarding form to be examined by Col. Rathbone, in light of British and American procedure.

Brig. Guterbock reported that the serious situation was fully understood at Brindisi. There was a great discrepancy as to figures of requisitioned wheat between AFHQ and Regions and it was requested that exact figures of requisitioning by Regions I and II be produced forthwith.

No announcement made in the press as to their sanction. It was so early to all regions and was solely because the Garibiniieri were armed forces. Regions and 15th Army Group and Brindisi to be informed.

Increased Taxes

Proposals were generally accepted with modifications to conform with the USG.

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Food

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Increased Rations to Cerabinieri

No announcement made in the press as to their sanction. It was to apply to all regions and was solely because the Cerabinieri were armed forces. Regions and 15th Army Group and Brindisi to be informed.

Increased Wages

Proposals were generally accepted with modifications to conform with the ~~Brig.~~
dogline schedule. A general wage increase for civil servants was to be published.
Copies to Brindisi and 15th Army Group.

Other Measures

Information was awaited as to the result of the recent levy of 50 kg on producer in Region I. The suggestion of house to house searches was made and an offer to loan officers and transport was made for that purpose. Brig. Guttercock hoped something was being done and it was suggested that officers meet Col. Follett to formulate a plan.

Black Market

The formation of this Committee had been approved in Brindisi.

PORTS OF APULIA

Difficulties were reported and the despatch of six officers was urgently desired to supervise unloading of stores. Lt. Col. Monfort also wanted advice on currency.

Personnel to Brindisi

Were not to be sent without prior acceptance.

Coal

A confused situation. Mining Division was a sub-section of Industry and Commerce. The Fuel sub-section was to become inactive and the Fuel sub-commission reorganised by AFHQ. A policy for the Sardinian Mines was to be worked out and Petroleum was to be handled in the same way as that situation was confused also. Brig. Hamlyn suggested that G-1, Economics and Shipping enquire into the matter.

Payment of Italian Troops

A problem for AFHQ decision. No specific instruction had been received. This had been asked to apply for authority. Payments were to be made only in case of military necessity. Negotiations should be hastened with Italian Banks to see if advances could be made by them to the Government. It seemed that the printing of Allied Military notes was likely to be placed in private hands instead of the U. S. Treasury. Payments had been made to Italian Troops.

Italian Ministry of Communications

Had been formed and were to conform to the Italian structure, which meant the amalgamation of Posts and Telegraphs. Further information was awaited. Capt. Stone was at Brindisi as Chief of Posts and Telecommunications.

Railways

The situation produced by recent AFHQ directives requires classification. Col. Wynne Davies and Lt. Col. Denmore were dealing with the matter.

Telecommunications

A great amount of work being done. Naples-Bari cable with a reservation of six circuits for the Italian Government was hoped to be restored in three weeks. (15th Army Group). Naples-Peloponneso cable was being repaired and the Italian Government had permission to restore and lines in No. 2 Region. Intelligence and Communications were to produce a sorship embodying dual Government Policy. Correct Italian Government communications at present were through AFHQ for official purposes only - Regions to be advised, when arrangements have been made.

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Telecommunications

A great amount of work being done. Naples-Bari cable with a reservation of

only - Regions to be advised, when arrangements have been made.

PROCEDURE OF ALLIED COMMISSION

Planning only done in Palermo. Advance Command Post, Brindisi was functioning.
Need for closest co-operation and officers should be prepared for frequent move-
ment. We had offered Brindisi help in the matter of Transport but Colonels Farren
and Parkin were to be consulted before two officers were sent to organise it.
Administratively, Brindisi is a detachment. Operationally, Brindisi is the HQ.

Operations and Plans

AMG to conform to ACC long term plans. Take over by Italian Government not
known. Gen. Joyce to be consulted before issue.

Directives

Sub-commission chairs to go to Brindisi for approval of directives must consult
Gen. Maxwell Taylor. Plan of issue under discussion but suggested that Naval, Land

Air Forces, Prisoners of War, War Material Disposal, Foreign and Internal Affairs, Internees and Displaced Persons and Telecommunication, be issued in Brindisi.

Regions - Issue of Orders

Status of Regional Orders - revised. Col. Sparrow to produce a letter dealing with the matter.

To be convened with conditions in subordinate districts.

Maple Leaf

Doubtful as to room for the two Governments. Italian Departments to be pulled, Education, Justice, Public Welfare, Finance, Agriculture, Foreign Affairs, Industry and Commerce, Communications, War, Marine, Finance and Industry needed high grade men. Of a maximum of 80 officers it is doubtful that more than 20 to 25 will be available on sub-commissions. It was presumed that Italian "Public Safety" came under Ministry of Justice. (Later Note - accommodation for additional officers may be available).

Brindisi Party

Industry and Commerce: Col. Murray, Mr. J. Mestry, Poste, Lt. Col. Brodgers, Lt. Col. Thickbrey, Labor: Capt. Albright. Education, Public Works and Finance were to send best available men. Capt. Stone and Col. Henderson at Brindisi were to take on ACC strength, Lt. Col. Wynne Davies (Rhodes) for whom (FHQ is being asked). Naval, Land, Air Forces, Political Section were already there. For H.Q. Administration, one British and one American officer trained in S-1 and S-4 duties were needed. Brindisi was short of transport. 7th Army asked to provide vehicles. AM to inform Brindisi from whence Italian drivers were to be sent to the vehicles to Brindisi.

Education, Justice, Public Welfare, Finance, Agriculture, Foreign Affairs, Industry and Commerce, Communications, War, Marine. Finance and Industry needed high grade men. Of a maximum of 80 officers it is doubtful that more than 20 be available on sub-commissions. It was presumed that Italian "Public Safety" came under Ministry of Justice. (Later note - recommendation for additional officers may be available).

Brindisi Party

Industry and Commerce: C-1. Murry, Maj. Weskrey, Poste: Lt. Col. Frudges, Legal: Maj. Thuckrah, Labor: Capt. Albright. Education, Public Works and Fisheries were to send best available men. Capt. Stone and Col. Henderson at Brindisi were to be taken in ACC strength, Lt. Col. Ymer Davies (Railways) from FHQ was being asked. Naval, Land, Air Forces, Political Section were already there. For HQ, Administration, one British and one American officer trained in S-1 and S-4 duties were needed. Brindisi was short of transport. They may ask to provide vehicles. Maj. to inform Brindisi from whence Italian drivers were to be sent to take the vehicles to Brindisi.

Lt. Col. Monfort's Party

Lt. Col. Monfort to be shown on T/O of ACC HQ, remainder on T/O of No. 2 Region, detached to work under Advance Command Post ACC.

DISPLACED PERSONS SUB-COMMISSION

To make headquarters at Bari under supervision of Brindisi. Lt. Col. Vacca should be called to report to Brig. Gen. Maxwell Taylor, Jr. Caccia and Maj. Cave, Intelligence. Foreign accredited representatives not to be called without permission of Deputy President. Major Cave's intelligence organization is sufficient and no intelligence officers to leave Palermo. Capt. Tate in Bari. Emphasis on G-1 and G-4 readiness to depart. Financial instructions being prepared by Brig. Hamlyn. All proposals accepted by Political Section.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

Directives of sub-commission submitted to Brig. Gen. Maxwell Taylor should be functions and delegations of ACC and not AGC. Copies of Regional CGAO orders to provinces would be helpful. Reorganisation of Italian Merchant Marine was being handled by North African Shipping Board. A report from Col. Densmore was awaited.

Travel Orders - Request must be in writing and if scheduled trip is not taken, Transport Officer to be notified. Adjutant General to confirm all orders. This was stressed by Col. Clough.

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Officers concerned were requested that on Monday and Thursday at 0900 hours, there is a Staff Conference and that their regular attendance was desired without notice. The Executive Conference is at 1500 on Friday, G-1 and G-4 do not attend. The meeting was adjourned at 1045 hours.
