Subject: Telephone message from Brig. Gueterback to Captain Stone.

1. AMG 15th Army Group appear to be trying to move us out of the Provincia Building. They require space for some planning.
2. With considerable difficulty we have established ourselves in the Provincia Building which we have repaired. We are also repairing various office accommodation in surrounding buildings, all of which are required for our rear party from Salerno. We have at considerable trouble secured and repaired (or are repairing) various accommodation near these offices for the housing of officers and other ranks. This work has been proceeding actively since the first of December.
3. We had in addition secured the Ospedale Militare and Scuola Elementare at Acerra, but have had to give that up for a French hospital on the demand of 15th. We had also secured in Naples the Institute Le Figlia di Popolo as an office, but have given that up to Regia III on their urgent demand. We have thus given up two big buildings which we had secured. While we have been actively seeking and repairing fresh accommodation with some success, it would appear that the local AMG Headquarters, subordinate to AMG 15th Army Group might have secured additional accommodation for some planning had it acted with equal energy.
4. I must emphasize that we from the Provincia Building are carrying on the actual government of Regions I and II. This work has necessarily been interrupted severely during the move from Salerno for a period of nearly a month. Should we have to make another move there would again be a serious interruption of work.
5. We are at the moment doing our best to cooperate with AMG 15th Army Group and the Central Economic Committee regarding the economic government of the mainland of Italy. We have provided a number of officers for combating typhus in Naples. We have had to assist No. III Region in the receipt, warehousing and movement of several hundred tons of public health stores with which they were unable to cope.
6. General Robertson agreed when I came here on the 3rd of December, that we should establish our Economic and Communications Sections and our housekeeping staff at Naples. This has been done.
7. Working on the above plan I have made arrangements at Salerno for only a portion of the whole Headquarters AMG and for the Italian Government. There is now no room at Salerno to establish the rest of Headquarters AMG there.

8. If we have to move out of Naples altogether, we should have to take on the accommodation at Salerno which has been reserved for the Italian Government, and this would upset the move from Brindisi completely.

9. If we have to move out of the Provincia Building into other accommodation in Naples, there will be a serious break of say three weeks in our functioning of economic government. Furthermore, we shall be permanently unable to carry on as efficiently at Naples as we could have done with our present compact setup.

10. Finally as I have stated, the necessity for Rome planning is no new matter. I had agreed with Brig. Lish to leave Region IV occupying the whole of one floor of the Provincia Building in order to enable them to do Rome planning there. Had they required any further accommodation they could themselves have secured another office, for example the Istituto di Fidia di Popolo which we only found in the first week in January.

11. I propose to refuse to move out of the Provincia Building without direct orders from the Deputy President AGC, and I should like him to be aware of the above factors before he makes any decision which may be officially requested.

SUBJECT: Report on Office Space and Billeting
Accommodations in NAPLES.

TO: Brig. E. Gueterbock.

1. In accordance with your instructions, I am submitting herewith a report on office space and billeting accommodations for Headquarters and Headquarters, AMG, personnel in the NAPLES area.

2. On November 17, the forward party of Headquarters, AMG, composed of the undersigned and four (4) assistants, arrived in NAPLES for the purpose of requisitioning accommodations for Headquarters, AMG, in NAPLES, and for the AMG school, in ACERRA.

a. For office accommodations, the following sites were requisitioned:

- (1) Provincia building
- (2) Thirty rooms in the Post Office building
- (3) Thirty rooms at 51 Via S. Brigida
- (4) Six rooms in Banca del Lavoro

b. For officer and enlisted personnel, the following billets were requisitioned:

- (1) Hotel Toledo Regina (officers)
- (2) Volturba building (officers)
- (3) Villa Giulia (senior officers)
- (4) 17 Via S. Strato (senior officers)
- (5) Villa Improta (Mr. Grady's group)
- (6) 17 Via Medina (officers)
- (7) 63 Via Medina (officers)
- (8) 373 Via Roma (officers)
- (9) Parco Hotel (arrangements made with Chief of Staff, PMS, for transient senior officers on a temporary basis)
- (10) Hotel Patria (20 rooms for transient AMG officers)
- (11) Numerous other rooms and apartments throughout the City of NAPLES (officers)
- (12) 61 Via Medina (for Headquarters Company, American, and Headquarters Company, British)

c. Motor Park adjacent to 61 Via Medina suitable for parking approximately 100 vehicles. 3792

3. Requisitioning of the above office accommodations required following action:

a. PROVINCIA BUILDING. - Because of the Post Office explosion, the Provincia building was badly in need of repairs. Practically all of the glass had to be replaced. A large number of windows and doors, particularly on the second, third and fourth floors, had to be replaced, as they were blown out by the explosion. Some walls had collapsed and had to be erected. Plumbing, toilet facilities, and lighting throughout the building was badly in need of repairs. Partitions were constructed; vast stocks and tons of files belonging to the Province of Naples had to be removed from the building. To get the Provincia building ready for occupancy, it required thousands of man hours by both Italian workmen, and the supervising officer and enlisted personnel of this Headquarters.

(1) Except for the first floor, occupied by Region IV, the remainder of the building was practically devoid of furniture. Most of the furniture now in the Provincia building was secured at 61 Via Medina and from several other sources. Furniture in NAPLES is scarce. To get what we have was no little job.

b. POST OFFICE BUILDING. - The work started at the Post Office early in November and has been continuous since then. Continued supervision has been given, and the thirty (30) rooms that we have are now partly occupied, and the remainder will be ready for occupancy by not later than January 20. These rooms were badly in need of repairs because of the explosion. Most of the rooms had to be completely rebuilt. All glass had to be requisitioned and was very difficult to secure.

c. 61 VIA MEDINA. - This building, formerly occupied by the 82nd Airborne, previously by Russian prisoners and also Germans, presented a most disorderly sight. To thoroughly clean this building entailed a great deal of work. Please refer to Inclosure No. 1, a copy of report submitted to me by Capt. Charles P. Benatti, GNC, then commanding the enlisted detachment.

d. MOTCH PARK SITE. - This site was a mass of debris which had to be leveled off and covered with hard rock, dirt and sand. All of this work was performed by the enlisted personnel of our group, supervised by officer personnel of our group.

e. HOTEL TOLEDO REGINA. - The only available hotel in the City of NAPLES at that time that we were able to secure. Badly damaged by an explosion set off by the Germans when they were occupying NAPLES, the hotel required remodeling practically from top to bottom. This entailed a great deal of work at a considerable expense. Work was continuous from date of requisitioning to include the third floor. Officers and non-commissioned officers of our group were placed in the hotel to supervise the work.

f. VOLTURNO BUILDING. - The Volturno building was requisitioned on 19 December 1943. Badly in need of repairs, work has been continuous since requisitioning date; can be partially occupied this date, and the whole portion of the building requisitioned will finally be ready for entire occupancy on 19 January 1944. This building has no furniture. One hundred beds were secured 9 January 1944, and additional furniture is being spotted.

g. OSPEDALE MILITARE AND SCUOLA ELEMENTARE AT ACERRA. - This hospital site was requisitioned at ACERRA early in November for the AMG school at TIZI-OUZOU. Much work was necessary and considerable repairs were needed. A detail of fifteen enlisted men, including four non-commissioned officers, was sent to the hospital site for the purpose of cleaning, supervising the laborers conducting the repairs, and for getting the place ready for occupancy. On or about December 2nd, when the hospital was finally completed and ready for occupancy, General Pence, PBS, ordered that we were to release the hospital for the use of the French Army. After an unsuccessful attempt to retain the site for the AMG school, on December 2nd I formally turned over the hospital to the French Army to the senior officer present.

h. ALL OTHER BILLETS. - All other billets have required a great deal of work to be made ready for occupancy, which included general repairs, plumbing, lighting fixtures, glass, etc. As most billets contained very little furniture and other necessary items, they all had to be secured from other sources.

4. Scarcity of beds and mattresses in NAPLES has also presented a very difficult problem.

- b. Particularly necessities which have still to be provided are:

Beds and bedroom furniture
Extra officers mess at Naples
Office furniture

3. Accommodations for British and American Regimental Headquarters may have to include a holding centre for 100 officers and 150 EM/ORA. Possibilities in NAPLES are being investigated by Lt. Col. Richards and outside NAPLES by Major Seroggins (G-4).

ANNEX A

Par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31, c.s.

GENERAL

1. On 11 Dec. 1943, at 0730 hours HEADQUARTERS ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT will be moved from present station to New stations, "N", and "S".
2. Postal address for both U.S. and British Officers will remain unchanged until further instructions are issued.
3. It is the responsibility of individual officers to have all required inoculations and vaccinations before departure. The 10th Port of Embarkation Dispensary, 52 Via Roma, will serve AMG medical needs. Officers are reminded that typhoid inoculations are effective for 6 months.
4. Officers will not remove army cots which have not been specifically issued to them, from their billets. Electric light bulbs will not under any circumstances be removed from billets. Officers will turn over keys to their billets to office of Headquarters Commandant.
5. After 0730 hours 11 Dec. 1943, no officer not previously ordered to new station "N" on permanent change of station, will be dispatched on permanent transfer to "N" without prior cabled acceptance from HQ, AMG, Naples.

II. TRANSPORTATION

1. All officers EM/OR's designated to change station and named in par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31, or any amendment thereto will move overland by motor vehicle convoy, which will depart from convoy assembly point at Officer's Mess on Via Stabile 11 December 1943 at 0730 hours.
2. Lt. Col. R.R. CLEPPS is designated as CONVOY COMMANDER. He will immediately prepare convoy march orders, (obtaining details from G-4 Branch) and will designate subordinate commanders, police, supply and security officers. All officers other than those designated as convoy officers will be considered as passengers and will not issue orders or take part in the operation thereof, except under emergency conditions.
3. All personnel designated by par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31 will be considered alerted immediately on publication of this order and shall prepare baggage: (a) Baggage shall be clearly marked with paint, on each piece, with name and serial number of owner and "AMG-HQ". (b) Each officer must personally advise Headquarters Commandant Office his correct billet address. There are no EM/OR's available for performance of messenger duties to summon officers who do not have correct addresses on file. Before 0900 hours 10 December 1943 all officers on Land Convoy will place their baggage, packed and marked for shipment, near the main.

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2. Lt. Col. R.R. CRIEPPS is designated as CONVOY COMMANDER. He will immediately prepare convoy march orders, (obtaining details from G-4 Branch) and will designate subordinate commanders, police, supply and security officers. All officers other than those designated as convoy officers will be considered as passengers and will not issue orders or take part in the operation thereof, except under emergency conditions.

3. All personnel designated by par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31 will be considered alerted immediately on publication of this order and shall prepare baggage: (a) Baggage shall be clearly marked with paint, on each piece, with name and serial number of owner and "AMC-100". (b) Each officer must personally advise Headquarters Commandant Office his correct billet address. There are no EM/OR's available for performance of messenger duties to summon officers who do not have correct addresses on file. Before 0900 hours 10 December 1943 all officers on Land Convoy will place their baggage, packed and marked for shipment, near the main door of their billet, to be picked up, with the exception of bedding rolls, shelter halves and mess kit bags. Bedding rolls will be rolled, marked and ready for shipment at the main door of the Officers' Billets not later than 0600, 11 December 1943. Prescribed uniform:

1. It is planned to move this Headquarters to the Naples area in the near future as follows:
