General Routine Order No. 676, Serial No. 47, dated 17 Dec 43, is re-

published for the information of all concerned:-

1. A scheme has been approved by which Army personnel who have been wounded (other than trivially) three times since 3 Sep 40, may be returned to U.K. and retained for at least six months.
2. Individuals claiming, at the date of this order, desirous of returning to U.K., should make application to their Commanding Officers who will forward the applications to G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon, B.N.A.F.
3. G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon, will verify applications and decide which are substantiated. Arrangements will be made by G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon for the return to U.K. of personnel whose claims have been substantiated.
4. Return to the U.K., will not be regarded as automatic, or as a right, but will be granted only if and when passages are available.
