In Taranto you will contact A.C.C. officers and such other officials as you may determine in order to obtain full information on the cause and extent of the disturbances and any measures, immediate or otherwise, which it may be necessary to employ. You will make inquiries as to the reason for the failure of this headquarters to be advised other than through Italian Government channels of the incidents in question.

SUBJECT: Field Rations.

TO : All Units, this Headquarters.

The following information pertaining to U. S. Army field rations is published for the guidance of all concerned:

1. War Department Circular No. 208, 13 September 1943, establishes, effective, 1 October 1943, the reimbursement of field rations at seventy-five cents (75¢) per day.
2. A Theater circular will be published at an early date requiring that officers, warrant officers, flight officers, WAC officers, and members of the Army Nurse Corps, have deducted on their pay vouchers for the month following that in which rations are drawn the sum of seventy-five (75¢) cents for each day's stay in this Theater, except that upon entering or leaving the Theater, when less than three meals are consumed, deductions will be made at the rate of Twenty-five (25¢) cents per meal.
3. Pending receipt of such circular, deduction for field rations should be made as outlined herein. Necessary collection should be effected from all personnel involved on next pay voucher for underdeduction for field rations for the months of October and November.

PROMOTION OF OFFICERS

Circular Number 183, Section I, Circular Number 196 and Section VI, Circular Number 199, all this headquarters, cs, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

1. Authority has been given to the Commanding General, North African Theater of Operations, United States Army, to make temporary promotions of officers in the Army of the United States to include the grade of colonel. This authority is limited to making promotions to fill existing position vacancies in current tables of allotment and current Tables of Organization.

2. AIR FORCE. (AUS-AC)

a. Pursuant to War Department letter, 26 October 1942, file AG 210.2 (10-22-42) FO-P-A, subject: "Decentralization of Promotion under Public Law 455, 77th Congress", to Air Force Commanders, authority is hereby granted to the Commanding General, U. S. Army Air Forces, MATOUSA, to promote Army Air Force officers to grades from first lieutenant to major AUS - AC, both inclusive, under the provisions of Army Air Force Regulations 35-13, 21 May 1943.

b. Any officer having been promoted under the provisions of Army Air Force Regulations 35-13, 21 May 1943, who later qualifies under the provisions and restrictions as set forth in this circular, may be recommended for promotion in the Army of the United States.

3. ARMY OF THE UNITED STATES (AUS)

a. The following policy with regard to temporary promotions of officers in the army of the United States (AUS) will normally apply in this theater:

(1) No officer will be promoted until he has demonstrated clearly his qualifications for promotion. These qualifications must have been demonstrated by efficient performance of past duties and also by efficient performance in the position vacancy to which he is to be promoted for a period of at least three (3) months. Normally no officer will be promoted until he has served a minimum period in his present grade as follows:

(a) For promotion to the grade of Colonel, 12 months.

(b) For promotion to the grade of Lieutenant Colonel, 2 months.

(c) For promotion to the grade of First Lieutenant, Captain and Major, 6 months.

(2) No officer will be promoted more than one grade at a time.

b. Second Lieutenants of field forces, who have demonstrated in combat their fitness for promotion, and are fully qualified therefor, may be promoted to the grade of First Lieutenant, regardless of Table of Organization vacancy. However, the resulting total of First Lieutenants will not exceed the authorized combined total of First and Second Lieutenants provided in the T/O or allotment of the recommended officer's unit. A statement will be made by the recommending officer in these recommendations that the officer concerned has demonstrated his worthiness for promotion in actual combat.

c. Certain commanders may recommend promotions to include the grade of Lt Colonel, AUS, and Lt Colonel, AUS-AC, whichever the case, to fill authorized vacancies without regard to time in grade or time in position vacancy, based on observation of the performance of duty in combat; this authority does not apply to "under combat conditions" or "while the unit was in combat".

4. CHECK LIST

a. The Theater Commander has, in every way possible, attempted to indicate the thought and study which must be made incident to a recommendation for promotion. In this re-publication of standing orders, certificates concerning ability to maintain discipline are no longer required. It will be assumed that every commanding officer through whose hands the recommendation passes will do his utmost to insure that only deserving men are recommended for promotion.

The following check list is submitted as reminders to commanding officers and should be considered by them when a recommendation for promotion is submitted.

- (1) Does officer meet mandatory requirements?
 - (2) Has relative rank been considered?
 - (3) Does authorized vacancy exist?
 - (4) Has officer demonstrated his worthiness for promotion? (See Par. 3 a (1), above)
 - (5) Is another officer of appropriate grade and arm or service available in the Command for assignment to the position? (See par. 4 b (3) below)
- b. (1) All indorsements will indicate approval or disapproval of the commander concerned.

(2) Each recommendation for promotion to the grade of Lieutenant Colonel or Colonel will be indorsed as a separate communication. Recommendations for promotion to all other grades may be indorsed as groups, where appropriate.

(3) The following statement will be included in each basic recommendation for promotion to major, lieutenant colonel, and colonel and in the first forwarding indorsement only:

"The relative rank of this officer has been considered, and to the best of my knowledge and belief he is the best fitted officer available in this command for the grade and position for which promotion is recommended."

5. SIGNATURES

a. Each basic recommendation and first indorsement will be signed by the Commander concerned.

b. Each succeeding indorsement may be signed by an appropriate staff officer, except for recommendations to the grade of colonel which will be signed by each commander concerned.

6. FORMS

a. Promotion recommendations for all officers will be prepared in accordance with the form indicated in ANNEX No. 1, and will be forwarded to this headquarters through proper command channels, except as provided in paragraphs 9, c, and 10 below.

b. Recommendations for promotion of Air Corps officers in the AUS and to Lt Colonel and Colonel AUS-AC will be submitted in the form prescribed by AAF regulations 35-19, 21 May 1943, and in addition, the form required in 6 a above.

c. Recommendations for promotion to the grades of lieutenant colonel and colonel will include a true extract copy of "Section 15" of the officer's Qualification Card, Form 66-1.

7. LIEUTENANT COLONEL AND COLONEL

All recommendations for promotion to grade of lieutenant colonel and colonel, including promotion in AUS-AC, will be referred to this headquarters, except promotions to the grade of Lt. Colonel made under the authority granted certain commanders to make battle field promotions.

8. MEDICAL CORPS, DENTAL CORPS, CHAPLAINS' CORPS.

Any first lieutenant, Medical Corps, Dental Corps, or Chaplains' Corps, assigned to a unit or activity operating under a Table of Organization or an allotment, who otherwise meets all the requirements for promotion, after having served the required time in grade may, upon recommendation that he is fully qualified therefor, be promoted to the temporary grade of captain. Such authority does not extend to first lieutenants of these Corps who are assigned to replacement pools or who are attached to units and activities as a temporary overstrength. The intent of these instructions is to place first lieutenants of these Corps assigned to units and activities operating under an approved Table of Organization or Table of allotment under the policy as announced by the provisions of paragraphs 1 b and 2, Section IV, Circular No. 122, War Department 1943.

9. NURSES

a. To provide for the promotion of nurses who have demonstrated their merit and fitness in forward areas of this theater, and who are otherwise qualified, the following policy governs.

b. Nurses in field hospitals, evacuation hospitals and air evacuation squadrons which are or have been assigned or attached to combat forces or who as individuals have been or are now actually engaged in forward areas may be promoted from 2d Lieutenant to 1st Lieutenant without regard to position vacancies, provided they have served at least 6 months in grade, three months of which have been in this theater of operations. Nurses assigned to Surgical Auxiliary Group Teams which have been attached to field or evacuation hospitals while engaged in forward areas are included in the provisions of this policy. Promotion to the grade of 1st Lieutenant will in no way change their duties as nurses except when the promotion is to fill a position vacancy as Chief Nurse. In any T or O unit the total number of positions for lieutenants, ANO, must not be exceeded, and not more than 50 per cent of these positions may be accorded the grade of 1st Lieutenant.

c. All nurses recommended for promotion under this policy must have demonstrated their fitness for promotion, must be otherwise qualified, and must possess the capabilities and potentialities of serving as a Chief Nurse if it were to become necessary at some time in the future. These promotions are not to be considered as a reward, but as an evidence of demonstrated ability.

d. No promotions should be initiated under this policy until all position vacancy promotions authorized within the unit have been acted upon.

e. Recommendations for the promotion of all nurses will be transmitted by the unit commander direct to this headquarters.

10. HOSPITAL UNITS IN COMMUNICATIONS ZONE

All promotions recommended under paragraph 8 above submitted by hospital units in communications zone will be forwarded direct by the hospital commander to this headquarters.

REPORT ON ATTACHMENT TO 15th ARMY GROUP
OF CAPT E.A.C.S. BAILEY.

On Dec. 18th 1943 Col Macaffery R.C.A.O. Region II told me that Col. Gerry had asked him to release me to organise ships to take food to the Tiber. He told me that he proposed to assign me temporarily but thought it improbable that I should return to Region II. (attached is copy of my posting order).

ON arrival at NAPLES I reported to Col. Gerry who was exceedingly nice but did not seem to have any clear specific idea of what I was to do. He told me to report next morning to Col Merrill to whom he would in the meantime speak.

ON Tuesday Dec 21 I reported to Col Merrill who knew nothing of my coming. He offered the explanation that plans had been changed and that this was why there was now no job for me but that there might be later. He referred me to his 2nd in Command Major Caite who was exceedingly nice but quite clearly of opinion that he would have no job to offer me then or later but it was arranged that I should remain about for a few days and then return to Calabria if nothing attractive turned up.

I had a look around and fixed up a temporary job with the Shipping Sub Commission from which I subsequently applied to be released for reasons already reported in writing. ~~Annhhm~~ While with the Shipping Sub Commission I remained attached to Lt C.R. Merrill's organisation.

I brought my interpreter from Calabria with me. Before doing so I spoke to Major Fricker G.S.O.I. Region II. This interpreter has been with me two months and was with me throughout my previous voyage. He would therefore have been

of great value in my new work altogether apart from his services as interpreter.

This morning I have been assigned on a temporary mission to Sicily which involves leaving the interpreter behind. May he please be paid the wages which he has earned during December as a servant of Amgot. Also I would be most grateful if he could temporarily remain as an employee of Amgot until after my return to Naples, when it would be possible for me to arrange for his future. Amgot brought him to Naples and one can hardly leave him stranded or without payment of his wages.

My own personal position is quite plain. I did not ask to be sent for and it was nothing to do with me that there was no work for me available. On the other hand as I would greatly prefer work of a more exciting nature than is likely to be found in Calabria under the now static conditions I have naturally taken advantage of the opportunity of seeking such employment while at Naples and should greatly appreciate it if it were offered me.

The reason I have put in this report is that I am very worried about the future of my interpreter now that I am called away suddenly (I propose to see him right financially for December if Amgot are not prepared to pay him and leave the matter for later discussion. But I cannot of course provide for his future employment in Naples while away). Also I realise that I am tending to be somewhat of a nuisance which is not in the circumstances really my fault.

1. It is my understanding that the Information Sub-Commission, of which I have been Acting Director, is soon to be abolished. That will require my reassignment. There appears to be no need for my services as a public relations specialist in the Italian theater.
2. I understand that a cadre is being formed, in or near London, for civil affairs work in France. This is an area in which I am far better qualified to serve usefully than in any other, especially in public relations. I say this for the following reasons:
 - a. I am a graduate of the School of Military Government, Charlottesville, where I prepared specifically for public relations work in France.
 - b. Have had 20 years of experience in news and public relations work in the United States, Great Britain, and France. Have worked as a newspaperman in London and in Paris, among other places, and have a knowledge of the French language.
 - c. Have had extensive experience in foreign news handling. Possess special knowledge of problems and methods of correspondents, and of press practices, especially in the Franco-British area. Have written what is recognized as the most authoritative book on this general topic (published in both New York and London), and have lectured on the subject for more than ten years in leading universities.
 - d. Lack any comparable qualifications for work in Italy, or any other area.
 - e. Obtained leave of absence from civilian position as Chairman of Department of Journalism, University of California, and family has made sacrifices and adjustments, in expectation of doing specialist work in public relations in French area.
3. Since I must be reassigned, in any case, and in view of the above facts, I request that I be assigned to the work for which I am especially prepared. Specifically, I ask that I be ordered to proceed to London without delay for assignment to the group being formed there, for work in public relations in France.

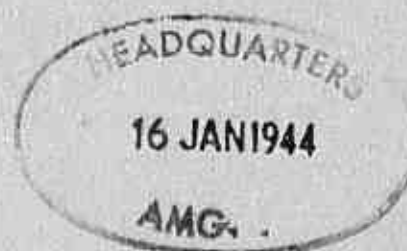

1. I have your memorandum of 14 January enclosing a clipping from the Bethlehem Globe. This, in a sense, adds insult to injury.

2. On the subject of promotions generally, I am not satisfied that NATCUSA Staff Memorandum No. 26 is final, and I am preparing for resubmission a number of promotions which have been disapproved as well as certain new promotions. I plan to take the matter up again with AFHQ through General Holmes, and ultimately of getting relief through Col. Chanler in Washington if we are unsuccessful in the theatre.

3. I know we will not be able to satisfy everyone concerned, but I agree entirely with you that certain promotions for men in the field are essential, both as recognition of a job well done and in many cases to permit them to fill positions of greater responsibility for which they have proven themselves qualified.

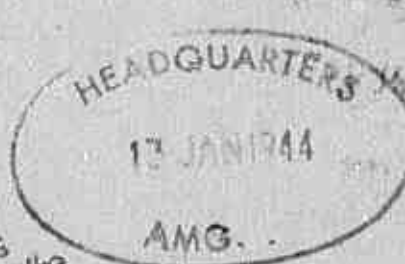

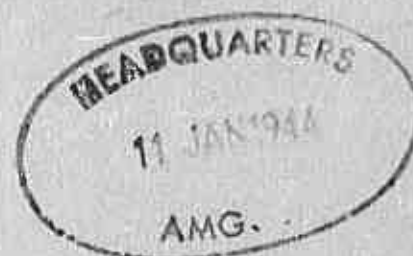

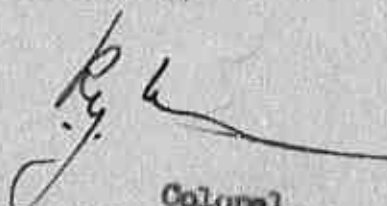

Subject: Farewell Message

To: All men and women serving in or with Allied Forces in the
Mediterranean Theater

Soon I leave this theater to assume other duties assigned me by the Allied Governments.

I take my leave of you with feelings of personal regret that are equalled only by my pride in your brilliant accomplishments of the year just past. Although tempted to review again the many advantages that have accrued to the Allied cause through your bravery and fortitude. I believe all these will come home to you if you will merely compare your present position and prospects in this great conflict with your position and outlook in the late Fall of 1942. Then the Eighth Army was making its final preparations to attack the enemy, who was standing only a short distance west of Cairo. Vast Allied armadas were approaching North-west Africa in complete ignorance as to whether good fortune or complete disaster awaited them. Battered Malta was being defended only by the bravery of her almost entirely isolated garrison. No Allied ship could transit the length of the Mediterranean. Our fortunes appeared at a low ebb.

All this is changed—changed by your skill, your determination and your devotion to duty. Enemy action against our convoys in the Mediterranean is limited to harassing and submarine efforts. You have established yourselves on the mainland of Europe. You are still advancing.

You, along with the other Allied Forces fighting on many fronts, have already achieved the certainty that, provided every soldier, sailor and airman, and every citizen in our homelands continues incessantly to do his full duty, victory will be ours.

Altogether you comprise a mighty fighting machine, which, under your new Commander, will continue, as a completely unified instrument of war, to make further inroads into the enemy's defenses and assist in bringing about his final collapse.

Until we meet again in the heart of the enemy's continental stronghold, I send Godspeed and good luck to each of you, along with the assurance of my lasting gratitude and admiration.

TO : Military Government Section, AHHQ (3 copies)

1. Reference your cable Number 12362 dated 11 December 1943 and note in reply Number 1279 of 13 December 1943. It is considered most desirable that the HQ AOC Rear Party, including HQ 2675th American Regt and British Admin. Bty should be sent forward as soon as circumstances permit remaining personnel at Tizi Ouzou being constituted a detachment under your command.

2. There appears to be no object now in sending the party to Palermo to join the Rear Detachment unless with your knowledge of the transportation situation, you consider this advisable as facilitating their onward move to Naples/Salerno in due course. There is no difficulty about accommodation at Palermo.

3. The party should therefore proceed direct by sea to Naples where they can be accepted any time after 24 December. Officers dispatched independently and unaided of the Main Party can be accepted at any time. (See para. 6 and 7 below)

4. It is not known whether transportation conditions will admit of the party being sent en bloc as assumed above, or whether it will be a matter of sending personnel forward by twos and threes by air or other means as opportunity offers. In any event, it is requested that personnel already asked for as urgently required should be sent forward independently of the Main Party.

5. Apart from the HQ AOC Rear Party proper (i.e. the party referred to in your cable Number 8458 FPMG dated 2 December 1943) additional officers are required to fill vacancies in HQ AOC to which officers have never been assigned. It is requested that such officers be provided from the "pool" at Tizi Ouzou - i.e. those officers originally assigned to Regions 8 and 9.

6. In order to provide for the situation outlined in paragraphs 4 and 5 above, it is necessary to indicate in order of priority, and as the officers whom it is desired should be sent forward independently ahead of the Main Party, should the intention be to use the latter in bloc. (In this connection, while it is noted in taken of your Circular No. 82 dated 10 December 1943, it may be observed incidentally that it has been the experience of many officers in this organization that aircraft seldom travel without eight seats.)

7. The priority referred to above is given in Apps. A and B attached.

3. 4. It is not known whether transportation conditions will admit of the party being sent en bloc as assumed above, or whether it will be a matter of sending personnel forward by twos and threes by air or other means as opportunity offers. In any event, it is requested that personnel already asked for as urgently required should be sent forward independently of the Main Party.

5. Apart from the Hq 400 Rear Party proper (i.e. the party referred to in your cable Number 2458 PS/SS dated 2 December 1943) additional officers are required for the various vacancies in Hq 400 to which officers have never been assigned. It is requested that such officers be provided from the "pool" at Tizi Ouzou - i.e. those officers originally assigned to Regions 6 and 9.

6. In order to provide for the situation outlined in paragraphs 4 and 5 above, it is necessary to indicate an order of priority and also the officers whom it is desired should be sent forward independently ahead of the Main Party, should the intention be to move the latter en bloc. (In this connection, while due note is taken of your Circular No. 62 dated 10 December 1943, it may be observed incidentally that it has been the experience of many officers in this organization that aircraft seldom travel without empty seats.)

7. a. The priority referred to above is given in this A and B attached.

b. Appendix A consists of requests for officers by appointment, more required for urgent duties, largely in connection with the various movements pending. They include a number of administrative appointments. It will be appreciated that the division of Hq 400 into so many separated echelons greatly increases the number of administrative officers required. In two cases, names have been suggested.

8. Appendix B consists of a nominal roll (in order of priority) of specialist officers who are urgently required for the Sub-Commissions shown. It is taken precedence after Appendix A. The first six officers on the list should be sent independently and ahead of the Main Party - if possible by air. They have been marked with a cross.

9. In the case of both Appendices, the officers named are believed to

be at Tizi Ouzou, though not necessarily in the ACO War Party proper (see para. 5 above.) You will realize, however, that it may well be that some are in Italy and others have been dispatched on other assignments. All officers dispatched independently and ahead of the Main Party should be sent to Naples.

2. After demands in Apps. A and B have been satisfied, the next priority is all officers of the original ACO Rear Party (see para. 5) not included in Apps. A and B. After that, it is considered that officers will be required with the qualifications and in the order shown below:

- (2) Officers for the Administration of Civilian Supply.
- (3) Trained Staff Officers.
- (4) Engineers.

6. Will you please say, as early as possible, to what extent the demands in paragraph 7 above can be met and how it is proposed to move the personnel.

SUBJECT: Additional Personnel for Labor Sub-Commission

TO: Lt. Col. Purgold, G-1

1. A detailed memorandum was submitted through Colonel Adams to Colonel Spofford outlining the dire need of competent labor personnel, both for this Sub-Commission and for the regional offices. Colonel Spofford agreed that we should have additional personnel and that assignments of qualified officers could be made from Tizi Cuzou. Colonel Adams concurred.

2. In conformance with your suggestion of yesterday, we urge that you send a signal to Tizi Cuzou ordering the following personnel forward by plane to Palermo for assignment to this Sub-Commission, and in certain cases, for possible reassignment to the Regions:

a. Major Foden (E). Now assigned to Region 5 as Engineer, but has for the past 3 years served as Chief Labor Officer for the Ministry of Supply in northwestern England; is expertly qualified for labor work, and is anxious to make his contribution in this field.

b. Lt. Gilbert Carlson (A). Now assigned to Region 8 as a CAO. Lt. Carlson is a lawyer who has done exceptionally fine work handling wage disputes for labor unions in the United States. He is well qualified for our work.

c. Major Raymond M. Fisher (A). Now assigned to Region 8. Has had 10 years experience with Workmen's Compensation Commission in New York, which background makes him very desirable for service with our Commission.

d. Lt. Fleming (A). Now assigned to Region 9 as Labor Officer. Has had long experience with the War Labor Board in the United States with the adjustment of wage disputes, and has made a special study of the Italian labor problems.

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c. Major Raymond M. Fisher (A). Now assigned to Region 8. Has had 10 years experience with Workmen's Compensation Commission in New York, which background makes him very desirable for service with our Commission.

d. Lt. Fleming (A). Now assigned to Region 9 as Labor Officer. Has had long experience with the War Labor Board in the United States with the adjustment of wage disputes, and has made a special study of the Italian labor problems.

3. Our enlisted men staff is practically nil. We therefore also request forwarding the following men:

SUBJECT: Requisition for Major Walker

To: Colonel Spofford, Act. Chief of Staff

1. It is recommended that G-1 be requested to order Major Hamilton WALKER, American, now attached as an extra finance officer to Region VIII, to ACC Hq for assignment to the Industrial Planning Staff.

2. Colonel Butterworth, MCS-AMHQ, recommends him highly as per attached letter to Colonel Evans, but Col. Evans has suggested that he be assigned to Industrial Planning, rather than Industry and Commerce. Major Walker is the type needed for planning rather than operations, as he has a statistical (CPA), analytical, and industrial research background. He was in the Production Division, HQ. ASF, and would fit into development of requirements for ACC-AMG presentation to the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) BOARD. Later on, should Industrial Planning become correlated with Italian industrial rehabilitation boards or similar agencies, his experience would be very helpful.

3. He is unattached and probably looking for work now at Tizi-Ouzou. Industrial Planning Staff needs him badly as representatives of ACC on Local Resources Board work, as we have not yet developed any ACC-AMG requirements for submission to the Board. The Regions have not the personnel nor time for an over-all requirement picture.

4. Captain Austin has been loaned for resources work to us by Colonel Evans. Upon arrival of ACC at Naples, Capt Austin will be recalled to Industry & Commerce. The transfer of Major Martino for resources operations had been requested previously, with the consent of Col. Adams.

5. It is requested that these two officers be assigned to Industrial Planning Staff, and that they be implemented with a clerk, preferably with some typing ability and possibly Italian translation capabilities.

Dear Mac:

I believe that at last we have got this business of administration, etc. sorted out and Albright will bring a plan which General Joyce has approved. I am anxiously awaiting news of the reconnaissance of Sorrento and shall immediately try for high-priority for the movement of TIZI OUZOU. The CAO offers no objection to our use of the facilities in Sorrento, provided it is cleared with General Bryan Robertson on the spot. I am working on the authorization to use Italian civilians or soldiers as drivers and shall get you something in writing on this head as soon as possible.

and The Chief of Staff sent for me yesterday and asked me how soon you expect to go to England. He told me that he felt you should remain longer and gave instructions that you do stay until General Joyce feels that matters ~~well~~ far enough advanced for you to leave. I have talked with General Joyce who has asked me to say that he anticipates that this will be about a month. General Smith having come fresh from Washington did not feel that there was great urgency about your arrival in England. I shall notify General Hildring.

A telegram has just come in from Hildring in which he makes reference to conversation which both Mr. McCloy and he had with General Smith in Washington, at which time the latter agreed to send Chanler to Washington for service as Deputy Chief, Civil Affairs Division, and also to send at least two other experienced AMG officers for instructions at Charlottesville. Before replying to General Hildring's telegram, I should like your estimate as to when Chanler ~~maybe~~ available and also the nomination at least two officers to fill the instruction requirement. Would Colonel Bolles be suitable for one of the latter?

Plans are all made and approved for the activation of the Commission on November 10, with General Joyce as Acting Deputy President. Until that time, General MacFarlane will continue as head of the Military Mission.

I enjoyed my visit with you and your good hospitality more than I can say. Please give my best to Chuck, Bill and the others.
