1. As from the 1st of February 1944, the distribution of all petroleum products to civilians in Region 1 will be controlled, not by A.M.C., but by the Petroleum Section of A.I.H.Q., which a new organization called C.I.F., as the distributing agency. Signor GIACOMELLI will be in charge of C.I.F., for Region 1 and he will utilize most of the regular personnel and all of the plants and property formerly used by A.G.I.F.

2. From the above date A.M.C., will take no further part in the distribution of petroleum products. C.A.O.'s will cooperate with C.I.F., whenever necessary, but their duties in connection with F.O.I., after 1st February will be purely advisory, and after a short period even this should no longer be necessary.

3. All petroleum stocks will be turned over to C.I.F., on the 1st of February, or soon after as possible. This includes stocks now held by A.G.I.F., and any stocks in any way under the control of A.M.C., except for such small quantities as may be required to be left in hand at A.M.C., garages, or for current operations of C.A.O.'s vehicles. 1. AFHQ Adv. Adm. Echelon 4/2 IS 17 Jan 44 asks that the following prices of residual oil be published at once effective 15 Jan 44.

For motor use	10 Lire per kilogram
For furnace or boiler use	8 " " "

These complete the schedule forwarded to you by Central Economic Committee 14 Jan 44.

2. The calculation is based on an estimated C.I.F. cost of 4.50 lire, distributing cost of from 3 to 3.50 lire, and taxes of 2.36 lire. When sold for burning under boilers, the buyer is entitled to a tax exemption under Italian law of approximately 2.28 lire, making this retail price approximately 2 lire lower for such consumer.

1. Through the kind offices of the bearer of this letter, Squadron Leader Johnstone, I am hoping to arrange for you to enter some on B.L. as part of "B" force. Squadron Leader Johnstone will explain to you the setup and when you have heard it I think you will agree that you will be in closest touch with the persons responsible for personnel and archives and therefore in the best possible position to look after the interests of law and justice in Italy.

2. Your chief tasks are:

(a) To assist in the location and preservation of local archives,

(b) To assist in the location and arrest and registration of Italian legal officials and to furnish their names to the SOI (legal sub-commission) as soon as communications and security relations permit.

(c) Specially to assist in the collection of all information which may be of assistance to the Minister of Justice in the reforming and organisation of his staff, records and archives.

3.5 You will, for all tactical and disiplinary purposes, be under-
"3" Forces Commander and you will be responsible through me to HQ for
the proper discharge of your functions set out in para 2, always subject to
orders given you for reasons of military necessity by "1" Forces Commander.

b You will of course act in the closest possible contact with Squadron leader Johnstone and other officers whose activities bear on your work.

4. You will not be responsible to or under the orders of AGO and you will probably enter the city sometime ahead of their representatives. It will not be any part of your functions to assist them in the opening of the city.

2. Your chief tasks are:-

- (a) To assist in the location and preservation of legal archives.
- (b) To assist in the location and screening and registration of Italian legal officials and to submit their names to HQ AGC (Legal Sub-commission) as soon as communications and security regulations permit.
- (c) Generally to assist in the collection of all information which may be of assistance to the Minister of Justice in the reforming and organization of his staff, records and archives.

3. a. You will, for all tactical and disciplinary purposes, be under "S" force Commander and you will be responsible through me to HQ AGC for the proper discharge of your functions set out in para 2, always subject to orders given you for reasons of military necessity by "S" force Commander.

b. You will of course act in the closest possible contact with Squadron Leader Johnstone and other officers whose activities bear on your work.

4. You will not be responsible to or under the orders of AGC and you will probably enter the city sometime ahead of their representatives. It will not be any part of your functions to assist them in the opening of Civil Courts and in other matters properly the function of AGC on entering a town. If your functions under para 2 are for the time being completed you will no doubt render AGC all assistance in opening Civil Courts, etc., but I do not want this work to interfere with your primary functions under para 2 above.

5. You will keep me informed as closely as possible of the progress of events having regard to security regulations.

6. If your departure is for any reason delayed please keep in touch with AGC HQ (Naples) and return there if possible.

7. I hope to obtain a letter authorising your departure with "S" force from the Deputy President AGC. This will be sent under separate cover.

1. It is requested that definite instructions be issued to all concerned, regarding the handling of petroleum products for civilian consumption by C.I.P. (Comitato Italiano Petroli) the civil organization recognized by this Headquarters for petroleum distribution.
2. This request is necessitated by the fact that this Headquarters Administrative Instructions Nos. 6, 9, 11, and 12 issued on 10, 19, and 27 November and 1 December respectively, have evidently not reached down to C.A.O.'s or even S.C.A.O.'s. It is further known that in cases where C.A.O.s and S.C.A.O.s were called upon by officers of this Headquarters for the purpose of explaining fully the functions of C.I.P. that due to change of officer personnel and A.M.G. Provincial reorganization, C.I.P. representatives were not recognized.
3. An even more serious point is the fact that notwithstanding this Headquarters Administrative Instructions and the visits to S.C.A.O.s in all provinces of officers of this Headquarters that in more than one case action was later taken to introduce local petroleum rationing.
4. It is further requested that action be expedited to put into effect the issue of vehicle permits and petroleum ration coupons as laid down by this Headquarters. Supplies of all forms already being in the hands of the Regions.
5. Appendix "A" attached gives names and addresses of C.I.P. representatives appointed to date.

JUNG'S POSITION IN REGARD TO GASOLINE PRICES IS THAT GOVERNMENT CANNOT SUBSIDIZE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN RECOMMENDED PRICE OF 11 LIRE AND FAVORED PRICE OF 18 LIRE PER LITER. DISTRIBUTION OF CIVILIAN PETROLEUM REQUIREMENTS.

1. It is essential that civilian use of petroleum products be controlled so as to assure the minimum consumption compatible with military necessity and a sound civilian economy. Such control must be uniform in all portions of the Kingdom of Italy thus far occupied and similarly extended to other areas as they fall under Allied influence.

Motor Vehicles

2. All civilian motor vehicles, whether publicly or privately operated, shall be allowed to circulate only on permit and shall be furnished petroleum products only upon presentation of coupons valid for the month of issue. Petroleum coupons and circulation permits will be issued only against applications properly made on Form PET-FUEL No. 1, copy of which is attached. Circulating permits must be numerically synchronized with petroleum permits.

3. The provision of paragraph 2 above are not intended to modify the procedure outlined in paragraph 10 of Administrative Instruction No. 9, this Headquarters, with respect to the furnishing of petroleum to civil contractors working for military account.

4. Vehicles requisitioned by the Military for Military purposes operated by Military personnel will not be issued petroleum coupons or civil circulating permits. Such vehicles shall clearly display the name of the military unit by which they are used and petroleum supplies therefore shall be issued by the military and included in military requirements.

5. Civil applicants for motor vehicle permits and petroleum supplies may obtain form PET-FUEL No. 1 from any Allied Military Government office or from any C.I.P. representative or such other places as may be designated. Application forms when completed in duplicate shall be given by the applicant to the nearest A.C.C. A.C.G. or C.I.P. representative. In the latter case the C.I.P. representative will pass the application in duplicate with his comments to the proper A.C.C. or A.C.G. office or agency designated by them (Provincial Economic Councils, etc.) in various localities for approval or denial. Approval will be granted in consistency with the principles laid down in Schedule "A" attached as from time to time amended. The duplicate copy of the approved applications showing quantity approved and serial number of permit issued will be returned to the local C.I.P. representative and through him to C.I.P. zone office.

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Motor Vehicles

2. All civilian motor vehicles, whether publicly or privately operated, shall be allowed to circulate only on permit and shall be furnished petroleum products only upon presentation of coupons valid for the month of issue. Petroleum coupons and circulation permits will be issued only against applications properly made on Form PET-APPL No. 1, copy of which attached. Circulating permits must be numerically synchronized with petroleum permits.

3. The provision of paragraph 2 above are not intended to modify the procedure outlined in paragraph 10 of Administrative Instruction No. 9, this Headquarters, with respect to the furnishing of petroleum to civil contractors working for military account.

4. Vehicles requisitioned by the Military for Military purposes operated by Military personnel will not be issued petroleum coupons or civil circulating permits. Such vehicles shall clearly display the name of the military unit by which they are used and petroleum supplies therefore shall be issued by the Military and included in military requirements.

5. Civil applicants for motor vehicle permits and petroleum supplies may obtain form PET-FUEL No. 1 from any Allied Military Government office or from any C.I.P. representative or such other places as may be designated. Application forms when completed in duplicate shall be given by the applicant to the nearest AOC, AEG or CIP representative. In the latter case the CIP representative will pass the application in duplicate with his comments to the proper AOC or AEG office or agency designated by them (Provincial Economic Councils, etc.) in various localities for approval or denial. Approval will be granted in consistency with the principles laid down in Schedule "A" attached as from time to time amended. The duplicate copy of the approved applications showing quantity approved and serial number of permit issued will be returned to the local CIP representative and through him to CIP zone office.

6. Civilian circulation permits shall be made only in accordance with Form PET-FUEL No. 2 (copy attached) and will be issued simultaneously with coupon Forms PET-FUELS, 3 or 4 (for petrol or diesel oil respectively) copies attached. Forms Nos. 2, 3, and 4 shall be valid only for monthly periods or such other periods as may from time to time be determined by Petroleum Section, FLTAEC.

Industrial and Off-The-Road Users

7. Applicants for petroleum products destined for non-vehicular use will submit application Form PET-FUEL No. 5, copy attached. Such applicants include, but are not limited to, non-highway agricultural users, marine and fishing users.

Petroleum Issues to Civilians.

1. The following categories of civilian petroleum users are eligible for issue of petroleum products.
 - a. Agricultural vehicles or machinery.
 - b. Commercial fishing boats.
 - c. Common carriers of goods and passengers.
 - d. Public utilities, including essential vehicles. (water, gas, electricity, postal, telephone, telegraph, etc.)
 - e. Public health and safety. (physicians, fire, police, ambulance, motor hearses, etc.)
 - f. Essential state and municipal government officials.
 - g. Industrial vehicles or plants considered essential to a minimum public economy. Each included industry will be reported to this headquarters by A.C.C. Headquarters, A.P.C. and A.M.G. 15th Army Group.
 - h. Dealers in kerosene, wax, candles, and pharmaceutical oils essential for household consumption.
2. Not all applicants in the above categories will necessarily be given petroleum permits. Individual cases must be scrutinized for essentiality and quantity applicable to each instance.
3. Every effort shall be made to conserve fuel by the local pooling of vehicles.

1. Attention is invited to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 20 (Revised 4 November 1943) dated 12 February 1943.

2. A Petroleum Section has been set up as a staff section of this headquarters to supervise the importation of petroleum products and their containers, to coordinate the storage and distribution of these products and to advise the DCAO in all matters affecting them. The organization of this staff section does not relieve the service organizations of their ultimate responsibilities. The Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section and D.D.S.T., FLAMBO are responsible for ensuring an adequate supply of petroleum products and containers to the troops with whose maintenance they are charged. If for any reason they foresee difficulty in fulfilling their responsibility in this respect, it is their right and duty to represent the matter personally to the DCAO. The above principle is equally applicable to the Air Force Service Command in regard to supply to the Air Forces.

3. The Petroleum Section this headquarters will:

- a. Consolidate the demands of the users and services and present one POL bid at the Tonnage Bidding Meeting.
- b. Be the sole agency for the coordination of communications from the Mainland of Italy concerning the importation of Army and Air Force petroleum products and the movements of ocean tankers.
- c. Control through Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section and the D.D.S.T., FLAMBO, base stocks of petroleum products except Naval Fuel Oil, at Italian Base ports in excess of local

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- b. Be the sole agency for the coordination of communications from the Mainland of Italy concerning the importation of Army and Air Force petroleum products and the movements of ocean tankers.

k. Control civilian distribution, production and refining.

Petroleum Bulletin No. 1

SUBJECT: Italian Civilian Petroleum Organization.

1. As of November 4, 1943, a group was formed by members of the Italian petroleum industry to represent that industry collectively vis-a-vis military or other recognized authorities. It is called the Comitato Italiano Petroli (short name C.I.P.).

2. The C.I.P. has constituted itself so as to be able to contract on behalf of its members for services rendered to military organizations, as well as to receive and account for the disposition of products placed at its disposal to meet Italian civilian requirements. As Italian petroleum personnel and property are increased by the further occupation of territory, their inclusion in C.I.P. becomes automatic.

3. The organization of C.I.P. consists of a Board of Directors of five persons by whom Dott. G. Cola of Naples has been elected president. Functional duties have been divided into five sub-groups dealing specifically with (a) general administration, (b) technical distribution and refining administration, (c) lubricants, asphalt, waxes and specialties, (d) motor fuels and fuel oils, (e) accounting and auditing. The headquarters of C.I.P. are at Via del Chicastro, 9, Napoli.

4. To facilitate field contacts and operations, the Directors of C.I.P. have divided the area presently under control into three zones. Zone A covers Sicily with headquarters at Palermo, manager to be announced. Zone B with headquarters at Bari covers Puglia and Matera, manager Mr. L. Margherita. Zone C with headquarters at Naples covers Campania, Calabria, Molise, and Potenza, manager Dott. G. Cola. For the time being the C.I.P. representative in Salerno

2. The C.I.P. has constituted itself so as to be able to conduct on behalf of its members for services rendered to military organizations, as well as to receive and account for the disposition of products placed at its disposal to meet Italian civilian requirements. As Italian petroleum personnel and property are increased by the further occupation of territory, their inclusion in C.I.P. becomes automatic.

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5. C.I.P. is generally prepared to represent the interests of its members on any matter affecting the petroleum field of endeavor. Attention invited to Administrative Instruction No. 6 dated 10 November, 1943 this headquarters as paragraph 1, wherein Petroleum Section, AFHQ Advance Administrative Echelon is designated as the coordinating office for contact with C.I.P.

PETROLEUM PRODUCTS FOR ITALIAN MILITARY AND CIVIL USE.

I Military Requirements.

1. Army units serving with Allied Armies will be supplied with petroleum products, as required, by the Allied Army Commanders with whom they are monthly to the Petroleum Section, FLAMEC.

2. Army units not included in paragraph 1 above, will be supplied petroleum products as follows:

- a. The British Military Mission will submit monthly to the Petroleum Section, FLAMEC, estimated requirements for the four succeeding months.
- b. The British Military Mission will submit to Petroleum Section, FLAMEC, by the 20th of each month the firm requirements for the succeeding month. These demands will be by territorial departments and will show the number of vehicles for which required.
- c. This Headquarters will transmit monthly to D.D.S.T., FLAMEC, and the C.C., P.B.S., allocations authorizing the release of approved quantities to the C.I.P. (Comitato Italiano Petroli).
- d. D.D.S.T., FLAMEC, and the C.C., P.B.S., will report monthly to this Headquarters the releases made against these allocations and transmit to the Petroleum Section, FLAMEC, the receipts of the C.I.P., signed as agent for the Italian Army.
- e. The C.I.P. will deliver to the Italian Army on a contractual basis charging for the cost of service only and not for the cost of the products.

3. The Navy and Air Force will be issued special orders as directed by C.I.P.

I Military Requirements.

1. Army units serving with Allied Armies will be supplied with petroleum products, as required, by the Allied Army Commanders with whom they are serving. Where practical, records of issues will be maintained and transmitted monthly to the Petroleum Section, FLABO.

2. Army units not included in paragraph 1 above, will be supplied petroleum products as follows:

- a. The British Military Mission will submit monthly to the Petroleum Section, FLABO, estimated requirements for the four succeeding months.
- b. The British Military Mission will submit to Petroleum Section, FLABO, by the 20th of each month the firm requirements for the succeeding month. These demands will be by territorial departments and will show the number of vehicles for which required.
- c. This Headquarters will transmit monthly to D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.G., P.B.S., allocations authorizing the release of approved quantities to the C.I.P. (Comitato Italiano Petroli).
- d. D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.G., P.B.S., will report monthly to this Headquarters the releases made against these allocations and transmit to the Petroleum Section, FLABO, the receipts of the C.I.P., signed as agent for the Italian Army.

e. The C.I.P. will deliver to the Italian Army on a contractual basis charging for the cost of service only and not for the cost of the products.

3. The Navy and Air Force will be issued special petroleum products as directed by C-in-C, Mediterranean and C-in-C, M.A.F., respectively. Records of issues will be reported monthly to the Petroleum Section, FLABO.

4. The Navy and Air Force will be issued Army POL on the request of C-in-C, Mediterranean and C-in-C, M.A.F., respectively, through the same procedure as detailed in paragraph 2 c, d, and e above, for the Army.

II Civilian Requirements.

5. Civilian requirements for petroleum products will be determined by Petroleum Section, FLABO, in conjunction with Headquarters, M.A.F., and M.I.C., 15th Army Group.

6. Allocations for civil use will be transmitted monthly by this Headquarters to the D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.C., P.B.S., authorizing the release of the stated quantities to the C.I.P. These allocations will specify the sole agency authorized to make releases in a particular area.
7. D.D.S.T., FLABO, and C.C., P.B.S. will obtain receipts from the C.I.P. which will be transmitted at the end of the month to the Petroleum Section, FLABO. Consolidated receipts will be transmitted to the Headquarters, A.M.C. for collection from the C.I.P. Headquarters, A.M.C. will in turn give the Petroleum Section, FLABO, a receipt.
8. Where local stocks are impeded by the allotments made, or where other questions arise in a particular allotment, the matter will be referred to this Headquarters for decision.
9. D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.C., P.B.S. will submit to Petroleum Section, FLABO, a report each month of all releases to C.I.P. In addition to releases made in accordance with paragraph 6 above, the report will include all such products as have been placed at the disposal of D.D.S.T., FLABO, or C.C., P.B.S. by the C-in-C, Mediterranean or any other source in accordance with allocations issued by this office.
10. Civil Requirements for Military Account.
 - a. Requirements of civil contractors working for military account will be drawn from C.I.P. No direct issues to contractors or to civilian owned motor vehicles working for military account will be made from Allied military stocks.
 - b. The D.D.S.T., FLABO and C.C., P.B.S., after verification of requirements, will issue to the contractor a letter authorizing him to draw petroleum products during the current month in a designated quantity.
 - c. The contractor will present this letter to the regional administrator of C.I.P. who will in turn, make arrangements for the delivery at the required points at the official civilian price, including such Government taxes as may be authorized by the Allied Governments.
 - d. The regional administrators of C.I.P. will forward monthly to the Headquarters of C.I.P. a detailed summary of quantities delivered against authenticated letters. The submission of regional reports will be forwarded in triplicate to Petroleum Section, FLABO, on or before the 10th of the month. This submission will be used as a basis for the allocation of an amount equal to the amount issued. Copies of the submission will be sent by Petroleum Section to the D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.C., P.B.S. to be checked against letters

9. D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.G., P.B.S. will submit to Petroleum Section, FLABO, a report each month of all releases to C.I.P. In addition to releases made in accordance with paragraph 6 above, the report will include all such products as have been placed at the disposal of D.D.S.T., FLABO, or C.G., P.B.S. by the C-in-C, Mediterranean or any other source in accordance with allocations issued by this office.

10. Civil Requirements for Military Account.

a. Requirements of civil contractors working for military account will be drawn from C.I.P. No direct issues to contractors or to civilian owned motor vehicles working for military account will be made from Allied military stocks.

b. The D.D.S.T., FLABO and C.G., P.B.S., after verification of requirements, will issued to the contractor a letter authorizing him to draw petroleum products during the current month in a designated quantity.

c. The contractor will present this letter to the regional administrator of C.I.P. who will in turn, make arrangements for the delivery at the required points at the official civilian price, including such Government taxes as may be authorized by the Allied Governments.

d. The regional administrators of C.I.P. will forward monthly to the Headquarters of C.I.P. a detailed summary of quantities delivered against authenticated letters. The submission of regional reports will be forwarded in triplicate to Petroleum Section, FLABO, on or before the 10th of the month. This submission will be used as a basis for the allocation of an amount equal to the amount issued. Copies of the submission will be sent by Petroleum Section to the D.D.S.T., FLABO, and the C.G., P.B.S., to be checked against letters of authority issued under paragraph 10 b above.
