Subject: Handing over Regions 1 and 2 to the Italian Government.

To : Major General Kenyon Joyce.

1. Before the final step is taken in handing over territories to the Italian Government, may I draw your attention to a matter of some importance. By a series of quite logical steps we have landed ourselves in a situation whereby at almost the same moment

- a. the military authorities are assuming increasing and detailed economic control of the "foot" of Italy; and
- b. this same territory is being handed over to the ~~responsible~~ government of Badoglio.

2. The ways in which the military authorities are trying to increase their economic control may be exemplified as follows:

- a. the appointment by AFHQ Advanced Administrative Section (PAHS) of the Central Economic Committee with wide powers (see AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 92). While the C.E.C. may not in fact exercise the powers provided for in paragraphs 3 and 7 of the above administrative memorandum, they may at any time invoke them and enforce detailed orders regarding prices, wages, etc., on the Italian Government, through the Allied Control Commission, as a matter of military necessity without violating the armistice and terms of surrender.
- b. the recent Allies price conference, in regard to which AFHQ Advanced Administrative Section directed that our views should be submitted through the C.E.C.
- c. the shipping directive submitted under AFHQ (MOS) letter dated 24 Dec 43.
- d. AFHQ Advanced Administrative Section letter 59/3 - dated 26 Dec 43 regarding elective power

3. As the result of this trend the Italian Government will probably have very little control of many vital economic functions of government on which depend such matters as whether their people are fed, have money in their pockets and can buy at reasonable prices. When the closeness of the Allied

S.E.C.R.E.T

financial control is also taken into consideration, it appears that the powers of government left to the Italians themselves will be restricted to very few matters such as control of political meetings, legal affairs and education.

4. Furthermore, the closeness of the control which the military authorities, particularly the Central Economic Committee, may require you to exercise over the Italian Government, is hardly compatible with the spirit of your directive (General Instructions dated 1 Nov 43) or with the devolution of governmental powers envisaged at the Moscow Conference.

5. I do not wish to raise the question of the consequences to A.G.C. of the military authorities assuming responsibilities and powers of this nature, as I understand Col. Spofford is dealing with you in regard to these matters. But I suggest that we should consider two other angles at which the matter should be viewed:

- a. Are the Italian government aware of the detailed restrictions which may be imposed on them after the territories have been handed back?
- b. Are the Advisory Council aware of the encroachment of the powers of the Allied Control Commission and of the assumption of wide powers by FLAMO, a military headquarters which is unlikely to welcome that surveillance which the Advisory Council might expect to exercise over the Allied Control Commission?

6. It would be unfortunate if either the Italian Government or the Advisory Council were to realise these facts for the first time after the territories were handed over. The former might consider it a breach of faith. The latter might raise the issue on a high level and embarrass the Commander in Chief. I therefore suggest for your consideration that it would be advisable to acquaint the Italian Government and the Advisory Council before the territories are handed over, and to inform A.P.M.C. accordingly.



BADOGLIO REPEATED TONIGHT VERY URGENTLY HIS PREVIOUS REQUEST THAT SOME ITALIAN TROOPS MIGHT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER ROME AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE AFTER OUR AGES REACHED CITY. HE SUGGESTED THAT THESE TROOPS MIGHT BE QUARTERED IN ROME WHICH WOULD SET FREE SEVERAL HUNDRED OF THEIR LONGERS TO FETCH FOOD FOR THE CITY FROM THE SEA. IT BEING POSSIBLE THAT THE LATER SUGGESTION MIGHT BE IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES USEFUL.

ARMELLINI REPORTS FROM ROME THAT BONGI HAS MODIFIED THE TERMS OF BADOGLIO'S INSTRUCTIONS IN A COMMUNICATION TO THE 6 PARTIES OF ROME WHICH READS AS FOLLOWS. "FOR INFORMATION, ALLIED HEADQUARTERS HAS REQUESTED US THAT THERE BE NO OPEN POLITICAL ACTIVITY IN ROME BETWEEN DEPARTURE OF GERMANS AND ENTRY OF ALLIED TROOP." ARMELLINI ALSO REPORTS THAT THE PARTY OF ACTION HAS VOTED THE FOLLOWING ORDER OF THE DAY. "IT AFFIRMS DECIDED INTENTION OF EXPRESSING ALSO IN ROME IN THE MOMENTO EVACUATION BY THE ENEMY THROUGH ITS OWN MEN THE WILL OF NATIONAL RESURGENCE." ARMELLINI HAS REQUESTED BADOGLIO FOR VERY SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS WHICH CAN BE COMMUNICATED TO THE POLITICAL LEADERS. I GAVE BADOGLIO THE FOLLOWING DRAFT TELEGRAM FOR BADOGLIO TO SEND TO ARMELLINI. "MY TELEGRAM 128 CONTAINS A PRECISE ORDER I RECEIVED FROM ALLIED HEADQUARTERS. I REPEAT THAT ALLIED HEADQUARTERS WILL NOT TOLERATE ANY OPEN POLITICAL ACTIVITY AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF THE GERMANS UNTIL AUTHORIZED BY THE ALLIED MILITARY COMMANDER IN ROME. ROME WILL BE CONSIDERED AS IN THE ZONE OF OPERATIONS AND THEREFORE UNDER ABSOLUTE CONTROL OF ALLIED MILITARY COMMAND."

2. GUIDANCE FROM CCS FOR TREATMENT OF THIS PROPERTY IS GIVEN IN OUR 15980 OF 18 DECEMBER, PARA C.

3. OUTSIDE OF ROME VILLA BABERINI IN TOWN OF CASTEL GANDOLFO, PROVINCE OF ROME, SHOULD BE ACCORDED SAME TREATMENT.

4. A SPECIAL ATTEMPT SHOULD BE MADE TO SPARE THE FOLLOWING VATICAN PROPERTIES FROM DAMAGE IN VIEW OF THEIR RELIGIOUS AND HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE: THE BASILICA OF THE HOLY HOUSE (SANTA CASA) AT LORETO, PROVINCE OF ANCONA. THEY SHOULD BE ADDED TO THE LIST OF MESSAGE G-36285 OF 4 NOVEMBER AND 25722 OF 8 JANUARY AS THE FOLLOWING SERIALS: HOLY HOUSE 8; SAINT FRANCIS 9; 10 SAINT ANTHONY. THE BASILICA OF SAINT FRANCIS AT ASSISI, PROVINCE OF PERUGIA. THE BASILICA OF SAINT ANTHONY AT RADYA, PROVINCE OF PADUA.

5. YOU SHOULD AVOID REQUISITIONING OR CONVERTING TO YOUR USE OTHER VATICAN PROPERTY THROUGHOUT ITALY WHICH EXISTING OCCUPANTS CLAIM TO BE PROPERTY OF HOLY SEE. IF URGENT OPERATIONAL NEEDS REQUIRE OCCUPATION REPORT SHOULD BE MADE EARLIEST TO THIS HEADQUARTERS.

6. LETTER OF 10 JULY TO POPE. PRESIDENT STATED CHURCHES AND RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS WILL BE SPARED DEVASTATION OF WAR TO EXTENT WITHIN OUR POWER AND VATICAN CITY AND PAPAL DOMAINS WILL HAVE NEUTRAL STATUS RESPECTED.



THE SECOND DOCUMENT PRODUCED BY THE KING CONTAINED A SUMMARY OF HIS POLITICAL INTENTIONS IN 7 POINTS. THESE WERE AS FOLLOWS.

"1. THE PRESENT CABINET WILL REMAIN IN CHARGE UNTIL THE GOVERNMENT RETURNS TO ROME.

2. AS SOON AS ROME IS FREED FROM THE GERMANS, A NEW CABINET A NEW CABINET SHALL BE FORMED ON A WIDE BASIS INCLUDING REPRESENTATIVES OF ALL PARTIES AND WITHOUT PARTICIPATION OF MEN IN ANY WAY COMPROMISED WITH FASCISM.

1. This is in reference to the meeting held on January 7, 1944, between Brigadier General Taylor, Lt. Col. comfort and the writer and the decision reached at the meeting that all communications between the Badoglio Government and Italian officials in Region I must channel through the A.G.A.

2. As to the time of writing no further instances of interference have occurred.

3. For your information, however, the following three incidents have now come to light, all of them originating prior to the meeting referred to in paragraph 1 above.

(a) During December an order was issued by the Italian Government, concerning the mailing price of snuff tobacco without any reference to the A.G.A., Region II or to these Headquarters. The order was ignored. (AF/AMC/165 of 11 January refers)

(b) On January 4, 1944 the Italian Government approved a new Director of Post and Telegraph Service in Reggio without any reference to the A.G.A., Region II or these Headquarters. The S.O.S.C., Reggio Province was instructed to confirm or ignore the appointment at its discretion depending on the suitability or otherwise of the man for the post.

(c) On January 10, 1944 an attempt was made to requisition vehicles in Region II on the basis of an order dated 28 November 1943 and signed by the Chief of Staff, 9th Italian Corps, without reference to the A.G.A., Region II or these Headquarters.

SUBJECT: Interference with Region II by Badoglio Government

TO : Advanced HQ A.G.C., Brindisi

1. Reference is made to letter of this office dated January 1, 1944, on the subject of the appointment of alleged Fascists and the contents thereof.

2. As part of the purge of Fascists in Potenza Province, a committee of AMG officers and Italian officials and civilians reviewed the records of 221 individuals. Forty-nine serious cases were found. The SGAO recommended that six of these men be deported to Africa and that the other forty-three be given "confino," that is be ordered to change their residence and be kept under close supervision by the Carabinieri.

3. Information of these recommendations reached the Badoglio Government, which through its Ministry of the Interior, sent the attached letter to the questore at Potenza directing that these men be sent to the Apulian provinces as listed.

4. Since this would remove them entirely from AMG control, as well as because the order has no validity, the SGAO has, of course, directed that it be ignored and those not held for deportation will be sent to Calabria.

5. Attached is a copy of a letter delivered to the Provveditore Agli Studi of Matera Province on or about 21 December, ordering a certain Dr. Nicola Minervini to assume the presidency of the Liceo Ginnasio of Matera on 1 January. This order was issued without prior consultation of any sort with any AMG official in Region II.

6. It is suggested that the head of the Government be informed that dealings and communications of this character between the Government and Italian officials in occupied territory are not countenanced and must be discontinued.

1. Reference is made to letter of this office dated January 1, 1944, on the subject of the appointment of alleged Fascists and the contents thereof.

2. As part of the purge of Fascists in Potenza Province, a committee of AMG officers and Italian officials and civilians reviewed the records of 221 individuals. Forty-nine serious cases were found. The SCAD recommended that six of these men be deported to Africa and that the other forty-three be given "confino", that is be ordered to change their residence and be kept under close supervision by the Garabinieri.

3. Information of these recommendations reached the Badoglio Government, which through its Ministry of the Interior, sent the attached letter to the Questore at Potenza directing that these men be sent to the Apulian provinces as listed.

4. Since this would remove them entirely from AMG control, as well as because the order has no validity, the SCAD has, of course, directed that it be ignored and those not held for deportation will be sent to Calabria.

5. Attached is a copy of a letter delivered to the Provveditore Agli Studi of Matera Province on or about 21 December, ordering a certain Dr. Nicola Minervini to assume the presidency of the Liceo Ginnasio of Matera on 1 January. This order was issued without prior consultation of any sort with any AMG official in Region II. It is one of a series of similar actions taken by various officials of the Badoglio Government.

6. It is requested that the head of the Badoglio Government be required to inform his subordinates that all dealings and communications between the Badoglio Government and Italian officials in occupied territory will be handled through the R.C.A.O. of the Region involved.

7. It is believed that the importance of the acts of indiscretion to which reference has been made cannot be overestimated and that R.C.A.O. Region II was fully justified in the action which he has taken in the matter.

SUBJECT: Appointments of Alleged Fascists.

TO : Advanced Control Post, Allied Control Commission, Brindisi

1. Reference is made to letter of this office dated 27 December 1943 on attitude of certain officials of the Italian Government toward A.M.G. appointees.

2. Complaints have come to the attention of these Headquarters that certain representatives of the Badoglio Government have been interfering with the operation of military government in the occupied areas and that certain former Fascist officials dismissed by A.M.G. were being re-appointed to important positions in the Badoglio Government.

3. The efficient Prefect found at Matera upon the arrival of A.M.G. was transferred to Lecce at the request of the Badoglio Government, with the approval of Maj. Gen. Lord Horne, during October. After several weeks trial the Vice-Prefect, Signore Giovanni Boscali, was removed on November 15 and returned to the territory under control of the King. It has now been reported that Sig. Giovanni Boscali is now President of the Council of Ministers. It is also reported that Dr. Fulice Vito, removed as revveditore agli studi because of his connection with the Fascist Party, is now serving the Minister of Education. The allegations with names and specifications were made by Avvocato Milillo who is employed by the legal staff, Headquarters, A.M.G., English II.

4. Upon the recommendation of the provincial C.C.A.O., Dr. Guido Tamburro, then Chief of the provincial Cabinet and Commissioner of the city of Matera, was appointed Prefect. Dr. Tamburro is a career official with a family dependent upon his earnings. He has informed the Provincial C.C.A.O. that officials of the Badoglio Government, in conversation and correspondence, have intimated to him that he was jeopardizing his career by occupying the position of Prefect and discharging its duties efficiently and in accordance with A.M.G. instructions.

5. Enclosed is copy of letter received by Dr. Guido Tamburro, the tenor of which appears to be threatening and objectionable.

6. In addition Dr. Guido Tamburro has, it is reported, received several friendly warnings from officials to the effect that if he continues to consider himself as a Prefect he will possibly suffer banishment from Matera when this territory is turned over to the Italian Government. 3492

7. It is not believed that Signor Boscali should have written at all to Prefect Tamburro, much less that he should have made the statements contained in his letter.

8. It is requested that appropriate action be taken at a high level with the Italian Government to rectify the situations described in this letter. It is also requested that, if possible, this office be notified as soon as possible of the action taken.

ITALIAN LEGAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The following resolutions of the Italian Legal Advisory Committee established by Order of the Allied Military Government AGO/1 dated 19 August 1947 are hereby directed:

1. The Italian Legal Advisory Committee for the Section of Italy shall henceforth be composed of the three "First Presidents" and the Procurator General of the Courts of Appeal officially.
2. The President of the Bar Association of the Court of Appeal in which the Committee shall from time to time meet shall not be a member of the Committee with respect to legal questions of appeal jurisdiction and with respect to procedure for charges of appeal and procedure.
3. The son or daughter shall be President of the Committee and shall represent the same and vice of its meeting and manner of conducting its business. In the first election of the President, no busines of the Committee may be conducted by less than the full number of members.
4. This Charter will receive effect from the first moment and the procedures generally of each District Court, Court of Appeal, and Procurator General, and paragraph 3 of this Charter shall affect only that district only.

MEMORANDUM

ARRANGEMENTS FOR TURN OVER OF REGIONS I & II
TO THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

1. It is agreed that the date for the turn over should be the earliest practicable.
2. It is agreed that for Region I a Regional Italian Commissioner will be required who should by the time of turn over have the nucleus of a cabinet or a working staff. These should include Supply, Finance, Communications, and Transportation. Col. Melotti now has regional officials as follows:

Regional Finance Officer
Regional Police Inspector
Regional Public Works Officer
Regional Postal and Telegraph Director
Regional Railroad Director
Regional Concierge
Regional Agriculture Inspector

These officials, if acceptable to the Bedoglio Government, should form the greater part of the required Italian regional staff.

3. In order to inform the Bedoglio Government of the existing set-up and to discuss the ways and means of turn over, Col. Melotti will go to Brindisi as soon as possible, reporting to General Joyce and attend the forthcoming conference. He will attempt to procure the appointment of a Regional Commissioner and if possible return with him.

4. General Holmes and Col. Chanler will go to Algiers November 25 to present the three basic turn over documents now in draft and approved by General Joyce and tentatively approved by General Alexander to the C-in-C. If approved by the C-in-C an advice will be cabled to the Combined Chiefs of Staff of the substance of these documents and the decision to effect the prompt turn over on these terms.

5. If these basic documents are acceptable to the C-in-C he will procure from General Alexander his final comments or approval. Arrangements for the presentation of these documents to the Bedoglio Government will be made by the C-in-C.

6. In addition to the basic documents, decrees will be necessary containing either permanently in some cases and temporarily in others certain of the existing provisions of proclamations and orders of the Allied Military Government. For example, the permanent reservation of the rights of the Controller of Property; temporarily to continue the price and wage levels and like matters. Col. Upjohn is preparing decrees, copies of which will be submitted to General Jagoe, General Holmes and Col. Ross as soon as available for discussion and clearance.

7. The exact date of turn over depends on promptly accomplishing all of the foregoing steps. It is hoped that the turn over can be accomplished by December 6, 1945.




