Thank you for your AMG/34/42 of 15 January.

As you know, the coloured troops of the U.S. Army are an integral part of the Army organisation, and the coloured man has equal rights of citizenship. I am afraid that it would serve no purpose to take this question up with the U.S. authorities.

As regards the coloured troops employed by the British Army, it is, generally speaking, the policy to employ these troops outside the towns where drink is particularly tempting. We shall continue this policy, but we are not, I am afraid, able to substitute civilians in all cases for native labour. It may be of interest to you to know that the record of these native troops both for crime and for disease is remarkably low.



Dear General Joyce:-

I wish to inform you of the matters I discussed in Naples with General Basso who was later to take them up with Col. Hume:

1. The necessity of removing colored troops from Naples. In this city, due to the great poverty, there is a great deal of prostitution. The colored soldier who is able to possess a white woman will be a dangerous element for your country, when he returns to the United States.

If colored troops constitute labor battalions, employ them right behind the lines.

2. Up to date 15,000 Italian soldiers are still employed as port workers. It would be more convenient not to avail yourselves of these soldiers, but to employ civilians; such a move would alleviate to some extent the great unemployment problem which exists in Naples.

3. Col. Kinkaid pointed out to me that, with a certain amount of work, the hotels of Naples could be put back in order. I believe that the Society of Grand Hotels should be contacted so that this may be done; the state would help out with loans. There would thus be available billets for the Allies, consequently decreasing the burden upon the inhabitants.

Thank you for your letter dated 27th December 1943,
in reply to AMG/34/25.

It is appreciated that refusal to allow the Prince of Piedmont to travel in other than King's Italy has been partly based on his action in visiting Italian troops. Nevertheless, Count Sforza is in Naples, and if one considers the present behaviour of this politician I find your ruling difficult to reconcile.

Would you be prepared to allow the Prince of Piedmont to visit this A.M.G. Region, provided that he confined himself to the area of Naples City only?

The Prince of Piedmont had from all reports not contented himself with staying in Naples but had gone to the Fifth Army front, notably to the Italian unit engaged there without a permission of the Army commander. This matter was discussed with General Rennell when he was in Algiers who concurred in the action taken and assured me that General Alexander would prefer not to have the Prince of Piedmont in that area of Italy where Italian sovereignty has been suspended.

I refer to your telegram 1508 of 17th December 1943.

2. I should be glad to know the policy underlying the removal of the Prince of Piedmont from Naples and the retention there of Count Sforza. From the Administrative point of view (and A.M.C. 15 Army Group concerns itself with administration rather than politics) the presence of the Prince in the Naples area was not undesirable. It is true that he resisted eviction from his villa but he has presented no administrative problem. Count Sforza, on the other hand, has a tendency to make utterances and write articles directed against the King and his present government which, in an operational area such as Naples, cannot but disturb tranquillity and might create disorder.

3. Soh being the case, and in view of our avowed intention of allowing the Italian people free to make their own choice in the matter of their rulers I find difficulty in understanding the policy of removing one and allowing the other to remain.

1. It is notified for your information that the Office of Strategic Service, War Department, Washington D.C., has instructed its representatives in Algiers and London substantially as follows:-

"As far as practicable and in accordance with instructions which you have from the Theater Commander, it is desired that you collaborate with Civil Affairs Officers in your Theatre. This collaboration should be undertaken directly when appropriate. In other cases it should be effected indirectly through Army channels already established. Liaison with the Chief Civil Affairs Officer in our Theatre should be established by you, and you should advise him of our willingness to be of any possible aid. Give instructions to your subordinates in the Intelligence Sections to this effect."

2. Officers of AMG, A.G., and of the Allied Military Mission may at any time approach local OSS representatives on matters of mutual interest, and may be assured that they will receive co-operation. Positive intelligence, and information of subversive activities, obtained by the OSS may also be obtained through G-2 of any echelon. Similarly every assistance should be afforded by AMG, AG, and the Allied Military Mission to representatives of the OSS in the execution of their duty.

3. It is known that effective liaison has already been made with the OSS in the Field, and this has been noted with satisfaction by their representative at this H.Q.

PLANNING DIRECTIVE No. 11

1. Scope & Purpose.

(a) This Directive deals with the reorganization of the Planning Center, the mobilization and training of the Allied Commission, priorities as regards personnel and equipment, and miscellaneous matters, affecting both A.C. and A.C.

(b) Recent decisions have rendered some of the instructions in the last three PDs out of date. This Directive contains certain specific amendments to PD No. 9 - any portions remaining unchanged will be regarded as superseded where they conflict with this Directive, in the normal manner. This also applies to PD No. 10.

2. References.

References in brackets after paragraph headings are to the appropriate previous PD.

3. Advance Party, A.C. (No. 8 cont'd.)

(a) Operation "Cerailier" having been canceled (AC/1017/1 dated 6 Oct. 43), PD No. 9 dated 4 Oct. 43 is no longer applicable. Copies will, however, be retained in view of para. 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 & App. "A", which may prove of value in later A.C. All other paragraphs are hereby canceled.

(b) AC/1017/1 dated 4 Oct. 43 ("Planning Order - Move of A.P. to Allied Commission") is hereby canceled in toto.

4. Organization - Allied Commission.

This remains the same, as laid down in PD No. 6.

5. Organization - Holding Center, and Planning Center.

The structural organization & chain of command which will come into operation forthwith subject to para. 12(a)(4) below) is shown in diagrammatic form at App. "A" hereto. The main features are as follows:-

(1) Two Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) are introduced directly under ATHQ. They will command the present School & Holding Center, the H.Q. of the Allied Commission (JCS) and a new organization to be known as the AMG Planning Section. (See (ii) below).

(b) Recent decisions have rendered some of the instructions in the last three PDs out of date. This Directive contains certain specific amendments to PD No. 1 - any portions remaining unchanged will be regarded as superseded where they conflict with this Directive, in the normal manner. This also applies to PD No. 10.

2. References.

Differences in brackets after each heading are to the appropriate previous PD.

3. Assistance Party, A.C. (No. 3 para. 2)

(a) Operation "Cavaller" has been cancelled (AC/107/1 dated 6 Oct. 43), pd No. 9 dated 4 Oct 43 to no longer applicable. Copies will, however, be retained in view of events 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 & 20, n.n., which may prove of value at a later date. All other paragraphs are hereby cancelled.

(b) AC/1017/1 dated 4 Oct. 43 ("Planning Order - Move of parts of Allied Commission") is hereby cancelled in full.

4. Organization - Allied Commission.

This remains the same, as laid down in PD No. 6.

5. Organization - Planning Center, and Planning Center.

The structural organization & chain of command which will come into operation shortly, th us, pursuant to Sec. 12(a)(2) below) is shown in diagrammatic form at APP. 1A hereto. The main features are as follows:-

(1) Two Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) are introduced directly under AMG. They will command the present Schaeff & Holding Center, the H.Q. of the Allied Commission (AMC) and a new organization to be known as the AMG Planning Section. (See (1) below).

(2) With effect from morning tomorrow, 9 Oct. 43, a E.O. to be known as the AMG Planning Section (AMC(1)) will be instituted, and will be based on the strength of AMG, L. P. J. (See para. 6). It will deal with all operational questions at JCS level - all questions hitherto dealt with by JCS in so far as Zermatt, whether motivated or not, are concerned. Activated Regts will not, therefore, in the future, deal with AMG AMG direct, but, finally with reactivated Regts, will refer all questions to AMG Planning Section - no longer to JCS. Para. 8(b) & (c) of PD No. 10 are surperced accordingly - such correspondence will be addressed to AMG Planning Section. This is惟for the last official Directive, which will be issued to Regts by A.C.

6. Organization - AMG.

(L) A H.Q. AMG is being formed in Sicily, and will be directly under AFHQ(AMC). It will be known as "AMG, L. of C." It will have under its command all Regts not under command AMG, in Army Group (See (b) below).

(2) A H.Q. AMG has been formed in Italy under command 16 Army Group. It will be known as "16, 15 Army Group", and will have under its command all Regiments in Italy in the Army Group Combat Zone such as are not, by order of the C-in-C, handed over to AMG, L. of C.

(c) The reason for the above organization is that the state of Italy, and in particular of its present Government render it impossible, for the present, for the Allied Commission to function for certain areas as hitherto contemplated. This will probably not be possible until the Italian Government is established in Rome. L.C. will then take over from AMG, L. of C., such Regions as are then under its control, & AMG, L. of C. will cease to exist.

7. Allied Commission - Organization.

(a) The Allied Commission is stationed for the time being at Villa Quaranta, and will be known as such. The abbreviation "A.C.", NorthWest ACN will therefore be used.

(b) (1) A W/E (British) for "Armistice C.C." has been approved, the formation letter has been received, and copies are being issued to all concerned. This Establishment is somewhat out of date, being based on Paper No. 7 and the old Special Divisions. It will later be replaced by a W/E,embracing the whole of the Allied Commission. Meanwhile the existing W/E, will be worked to for the purposes of personnel & equipment. This means that A.C. is (on the British side only) a legal unit having a separate existence from the School & Holding Center. G-1 and H.Q. Comdt. will, from a date to be arranged with the Holding Center, undertake the reporting of casualties and all personnel matters in respect of personnel taken on the strength. (See Papers. 16 & 17).

(ii) Developments on the American side are awaited and will be notified as soon as decided.

B. Allied Commission - Detachment.

(a) In order that officers of A.C. may obtain active experience in the field, it has been decided that a detachment of some 50 officers, generally all from Sub-Commissions, will proceed to Sicily at an early date, when shipping is available. Officers to be detailed are the key personnel of Sub-Commissions, provided the total does not exceed about 50. At least one responsible officer from each Sub-Commission will remain as rear link. Further detailed orders regarding numbers to proceed will be issued.

(b) The detachment will be under the command of a British Detachment Commander (Lt. Col. Moss-Wormen, who is already in Sicily) and an American Detachment Executive (to be appointed) for the purposes of (c) below.

(c) The detachment will be under the command General Corps of H.Q. AMG, L. of C. for purposes of training & local administration only. For all purposes of internal unit administration it will remain under H.Q. A.C., with whom the Detachment Commander will correspond direct on such matters.

The Allied Commission is established for the time being at Tunis
Guzzu, and will be known as such. The abbreviation "A.C." NOT "Rear A.C."
will therefore be used.

(b) (1) A.W/E (British) for "Armistice C.C." has been approved, the
format in letter has been received, and copies are being issued to all
concerned. This Establishment is known out of date, being based on
Paper No. 7 and the old Special Division. It will later be replaced

(viii) It is emphasised that allotments & reports must come from the Holding Center through one channel only. This channel is the Executive Officer, for both EM and ON. He will consult the Ass't. Comdt. as necessary in respect of O.R.



ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT : ALLIED COMMISSION.





MEMORANDUM:

TO : General McSherry - Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer -
AMGOT HEADQUARTERS

From my discussions with Sicilians who are aligned with the ⁹⁰² Liberal and democratic parties, it appears:

1. General Badoglio is tolerably well considered as head of the government in this transitional period of active combat in Italy, inasmuch as Badoglio has many ardent adherents in the Army and also enjoys the full confidence of the Navy. But it is agreed that political activity should recommence as soon as possible so that the people can choose their own government. They don't want Badoglio for too long.
2. The King is very badly considered. He is talked of in the most contemptuous terms - a King who prostituted himself, who lacks courage and intelligence. The liberal and democratic parties are also opposed to the King's son. They believe the institution of a King should be discarded and a republic instituted. If a plebiscite were taken, the people would be against retaining Italy as a Kingdom and would be preponderantly opposed to traffic with the present King.

I have seen Richard Thorne Thorne's letter to you, AL/341 dated 5 Oct and wish to add a few words to try and keep you in touch with what is happening.

I am waiting to see General McSherry here in a day or two and hear from him what he learned at A.F.H.Q., but as I see the position developing it looks as if my plan for restricting ANGOT proper to the two mobile parties behind 5th and 8th Armies and at 15 Army Group should come off. This means handing over all the areas behind the two Armies, including Sicily, to A.F.H.Q. for static administration. You will have seen my interim telegram to Julius Holmes which comes to you by the same mail and I need not enlarge on this.

In any event if the situation does not change immediately, it must change as soon as we get to Rome. Moreover, it must, I think, change in much the direction which I have indicated.

How the whole personnel question will pan out remains to be seen but I guess if this development takes place in much the form I have indicated, I, at any rate, will no longer be required in my present capacity.

My tour which concluded with Bari was of very great interest and value. The functioning of the ANGOT machine has been very remarkable and most satisfactory. I am writing some notes on Calabria which you may send on to A.F.H.Q. I am not sending a copy direct, partly because I want these things to pass through Headquarters so long as it exists and partly because I do not know what you may already have said.

My route to Bari was as follows: - Erice, Catania, Messina by way of Linguaglossa and Barcellona, Reggio, Vibo Valentia, Catanzaro, Crotone, San Giovanni In Fiore, Cariati, Corigliano, Taranto, Brindisi.

While I was in Calabria, Con Benson was busy hauling out officers to staff the next forward move of 8th Army. While the staff in Reggio Province was adequate, Catanzaro and Cosenza had already been cut down to a mere handful but the Provinces were more or less under administration. Benson had set up Region 2 Headquarters at Corigliano because there was adequate accommodation and it was then near Army Headquarters. I am asking Harvey Gerry to come up and see me because Headquarters cannot

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Benson had set up Region 2 Headquarters at Corigliano because there was adequate accommodation and it was then near Army Headquarters. I am asking Harvey Gerry to come up and see me because Headquarters cannot now stay at Corigliano any longer and I think even in the interim period, Region 2 less Apulia, had better be run from some more accessible place like Cotenna. In any event there will have to be a re-grouping of Regions and Provinces. If A.P.H.Q. do not agree to our handing over of the area included in No.2 Military Area to the King and his Government, No.2 Region will have to take on Salerno Province from No.3 Region. No.2 Military Area will then have to deal with Military Mission for Apulia and No.2 Region for all the other provinces within the area, but No.2 Area proposes to have nothing in and nothing to do with the three Calabrian Provinces.

I do not believe that in the long run we can have an AMOT Government in the three Provinces where there is literally no Allied Military authority but where there is an Italian Corps, incidentally under a very good man. We can probably carry on in Calabria for a fortnight or three weeks but not more under the present circumstances when the balance of the Allied troops at Reggio and Crotone have been removed. But by then I hope that the whole situation will have changed by the occupation of Rome.

Calabria is singularly beautiful country and with the exception of the situation at Reggio is less unhappy than I had expected. Reggio is definitely short of food, if alone on account of cut communications. I reckon that the rest of Calabria can manage to scrape along for some weeks. The same applies to Apulia and Laccania.

We should be out of the wood on supplies for Naples fairly soon, since there is a substantial stock of wheat at Foggia and in Puglia province. Some of it is already on the railroad - but not moving - towards Naples. This can be moved as soon as railroad communications are restored.

Law, order and health are good but the Italian population is undoubtedly still suffering from the presence of many fascists who have not yet been weeded out. If there is no King's Government we shall have to sit down to do this weeding ourselves but then we shall probably need a garrison for Calabria.

The position in Apulia is as I told you. Our military authorities are not very happy because they have not got an ANFOR to deal with and they are all clairouuring for one. Even some of the most difficult officers via a visit to the personal appointment of Bedoglio and is reported to be outstandingly the best Italian official yet encountered. Our proclamations have been posted in Foggia but I have, with the agreement of General Alexander and at the instance of both Mason MacFarlane and Montfort, agreed to allow Foggia to be considered as part of the King's territory, at any rate as far as Foggia town is concerned. Benson's officers are still in charge in the Northern part of the Province which is well within 8th Army area. I flew over to Naples yesterday with General Alexander to see Ilme. I only had about three quarters of an hour with him because we had to land at Salerno and motor in and out. Ilme is very happy but the position is exceedingly difficult because there is no water and no electricity. The water supply will take about three weeks to restore; it is not yet known if the generating station is or is not, beyond repair.

Ilme, as well as the Commanding General, 5th Army, both want to continue the present team so far as it can be as 5th Army ANFOR party on the

The position in Apulia is as I told you. Our military authorities are not very happy because they have not got an ANOT to deal with and they are all clamouring for one. Even some of the most difficult officers vis a vis ANOT are amongst the most vindictive concerning the absence of ANOT. I spend most of my time explaining that the position in Apulia is similar to that which obtained in France and that they cannot requisition or enforce the legal provisions of proclamations which have not been posted in an area where we have accepted the defacto existence of an Italian Government.

There is a possibility of Poggia town and the neighbouring air-fields being made into a Military enclosure and until this has been decided I propose to leave the position as vague as I have indicated.

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Thus, as well as the Commanding General, 5th Army, both want to continue the present team so far as it can be as 5th Army ANOT party on the analogy of Benson. It seems to have been a great success but this is a subject which I propose to discuss with McSherry when he arrives.

Literally things go well. There is a slight pause on this side for recuperating and supplying. But happily Bari is intact and has a great capacity. Brindisi and Taranto are working full blast but they are both very difficult places for off take by road.

We have had a few days heavy rain in these parts though not actually at Bari, which will make communications difficult. I am going to Potenza and Metaponto tomorrow and to Naples by road, I hope with McSherry, after the meeting on the 9th.

My Dear

I have just read Richard's letter to you which I will ^{Y.S.} supplement only by adding the plan for Region 2 as known at present.

The four Southern Provinces of PUGLIA remain under the Italian Government and as Richard had told you, the remaining province of FOGGIA is divided for the time being between the King and 8th Army.

CALABRIA is now being denuded of troops but AMGOT is to continue on a hand to mouth basis until the handing over of Calabria to the King following the occupation of Rome. Meantime, 31 Corps Italian Army remains in that area and looks after our L of C. This arrangement will probably be extended to LUCANIA at a later date.

In these circumstances and in view of the demands already submitted for supplementing the staff of Region 2, it is probably unwise to assign to that Region all the high ranking officers in the amended establishment. If A.F.I.Q. are to take over the Region later, they may wish to do so; and it may be worthy of reference to H.G.S. if and when such transfer is to be effective.

Dear Ruck,

1. You will have got General Remond's signal regarding the set up of a Forward AMGOT H.Q. with 15 Army Group at BARI. I attach copy for easy reference. The C.C.A.O. has left it^t you in most cases to decide what officers and the number of clerks, cooks, orderlies, etc. that you can spare to send with the officers coming over to form the Advance H.Q. He asked me to stress that the important thing is that there should be sufficient O.R. personnel to enable the H.Q. to function if necessary as a mobile unit.

2. As I understand it, the position is that AMGOT H.Q. for the time being should function in two echelons; the Forward echelon with 15 Army Group, the main echelon at Palermo, until such time as Rome is occupied and/or it is possible to call forward the Main H.Q. I understand that for the time being the C.C.A.O. wishes you to remain and carry on with the directing of Main H.Q. at Palermo until such time as the future of Sicily and the new lay-out is clearer.

3. Grafftey is writing to you regarding the set up of Region 2. The position briefly is that Corry will administer the Region until such time as Allied troops and establishments are withdrawn from that area. It then may be possible to withdraw AMGOT and hand over to the Badoglio Government. As regards Apulia, all of this will come under the Allied Military Mission at Brindisi except the Northern part which is still a combatant zone. Benson will keep officers in the forward Apulia area until 8th Army is willing to hand it over. The Prefecture of Foggia will come under the Allied Military Mission, Benson and Montfort working out together the best method of administering this area in present circumstances.

4. Lord Remond may deal with matters of policy irrespect of A.P.H.Q. and Regions 2 and 3 direct from here. Other matters will be dealt with by you direct. Any signals sent direct from here will be repeated to you for information.
