1. I submit a draft directive defining the duties of the R.C. & M.G. Section. It is direct and I hope avoids ambiguity - which if Regional control is to be successful, must be avoided. I have tried to describe the Section as your executive machine for carrying out the advice tendered to you and to the Italian Government by the Vice Presidents and their Subcommissions.
2. I have stressed the "command" position because I believe that this will be welcomed by the Regional organizations who are apprehensive of having to serve two masters.
3. I have been moderately rigid about channels of communication for the same reason.
4. I have added a further duty of ensuring military liaison (vide para 9). I think it essential that all military formations should know that they have one section only to deal with if they are in trouble. I propose to attach Liaison Officers (under control of Regions) to all the larger military formations.
5. I should like to attach the Displaced Persons Subcommission to this Section - not because I am greedy but because I know from experience the host of problems of detail and liaison which it will face, and which must be dealt with executively. And I want to safeguard your being bothered by them.

ACC/AMG DEVELOPMENTS

1. Regional Organization.

Owing to paucity of communications, it will be probably necessary to retain a regional organization for some time, particularly in areas remote from Hq. ACC. In the case of territories near Hq. ACC it may be possible to control provinces direct from Hq. ACC and dispense with regional headquarters at an earlier date than in more remote areas. It must be remembered that even when territories are handed over to the Italian Government, a certain amount of Italian governmental traffic may have to be handled over ACC communications.

2. Regional Boundaries.

The boundaries between the present III and IV Regions are inconvenient from the point of view of communications. A better boundary would be drawn up the spine of Italy including on the east the provinces of Foggia, Campobasso, Chieti, ~~Aquila~~, Pescara and Teramo. *and the compartment of Abruzzi and Molise*

The forward limit of static regional operations will be the rear boundaries of the 5th and 8th Armies. In front of this line AMG 5th and 8th Armies will operate directly under Hq. ACC. Additional personnel as may be required will be attached to AMG 5th and 8th Armies from the Regions concerned.

3. Outline Plan.

Headquarters No. V Region will take command of Foggia Province and will work up the east side of Italy on the right of the boundary mentioned in paragraph 2, as far as inclusive the ~~present~~ *Marcato* Region V (Marches).

Region III will remain as at present in command of the Provinces of Naples, Benevento, and Avellino and will be gradually reduced in strength when this Region is handed over to the Italian Government.

Region IV will take command of the provinces of Viterbo, Rieti, *Ponza, Terni*, Roma, Frosinone and Littoria.

Region VIII and IX headquarters will remain in being and continue to study their assigned areas.

Headquarters Region III will, in due course, be moved to take command of the Region containing the provinces of Piemonte and Liguria and will plan for that task. The present provinces of Region III will, in due course, either be absorbed by Region II or Region IV or will be governed direct by the Italian Government/Hq. ACC.

4. Initial Stages.

The following will be the initial stages for the integration of ACC/AMG consequent upon the abolition of AMG 15th Army Group:

Stage One - As from 25 January 1944. 1093

ACC - The provinces of Bari, Taranto, Brindisi and Lecce, and Region VI.

AMG - Regions I, II, III, IV (Foggia and Campobasso Provinces only) and 5th and 8th Armies.

Stage Two - Headquarters Region V takes over Foggia and Campobasso provinces from Region IV.

Stage Three - On the handing over of territories to the Italian Government -

ACC - Regions I, II, VI (Region II includes the provinces of Bari, Taranto, Brindisi and Lecce).

AMG - AMG 5th and 8th Armies, Region III and parts of Regions IV and V.

Stage Four -

ACC - Regions I, II, III, VI and parts of Regions IV and V.

AMG - 5th and 8th Armies.

5. Requirements.

A directive to be prepared by the Executive Officers will be issued on the above lines after approval by all concerned. In amplification of this directive a statement will be used to show in broad terms the process of reducing personnel in southern territories and building up personnel for northern Regions. It is expected that headquarters for the last two Regions in the far north (between Milan and Trieste) can be found by the abolition of regional headquarters farther south, possibly headquarters IV and II or V Regions.

2. I submit that Region IV Adm. Hq. should be abolished forthwith regardless of the ultimate destination of Puglia Province. Its disadvantages seem to outweigh its advantages by far.
3. I agree with Brig. Corr about the possibilities of Region IV - the only possible Regional combinations seem to be;

1. The question of having an advanced or other branch HQ on the East side of Italy has been considered in the light of experience.

It is true that the Advanced HQ, now at Trani, has relieved the Main HQ of certain work connected with the Province of Puglia, and has enabled some few matters to be dealt with more expeditiously than by reference to Main HQ at Naples.

Generally speaking, however, the Advanced HQ acts as a post office. Questions dealt with are normally not of sufficient urgency to preclude reference to Naples.

It is considered that the volume and nature of the work does not justify continuance of the present Advanced HQ with only the single Province of Foggia under Region 4 control.

2. The matter of having a branch HQ on the East side of Italy, is sound up with the whole question of the control by one Regional HQ, of ~~the~~ ten provinces (five in Lazio, including Rome, and five in Abruzzi) of Region 4.

In a small branch HQ were considered necessary now, a large branch HQ would be essential when the whole of Abruzzi comes under the control of Region 4.

3. The HQ of Region 4 has not, in my opinion, the staff or vehicles to enable it to maintain a branch HQ on the East side of Italy. Moreover, owing to the difficulties of communication (see para 4 below), it seems doubtful whether such splitting of HQ's would be a solution to the problem.

1. The question of having an advanced or other branch HQ on the East side of Italy has been considered in the light of experience.

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If a small branch HQ were considered necessary now, a large branch HQ would be essential when the whole of Abruzzi comes under the control of Region 4.

3. The HQ of Region 4 has not, in my opinion, the staff or vehicles to enable it to maintain a branch HQ on the East side of Italy. Moreover, owing to the difficulties of communication (see para 4 below), it seems doubtful whether such splitting of HQ's would be a solution to the problem.

4. I view, with considerable concern, the lack of communications which appear to be inevitable and which will make control over the whole of the territory of Region 4, by its HQ established at Rome, a matter of exceptional difficulty. If road and signal communications across the central Apennines are in general disrupted, communications will presumably be via Southern Italy.

Conferences of all S.C.A.O.'s will be a matter of extreme difficulty, if not impossible, and correspondence and co-ordination of policy may be subject to great delay.

In this connection, however, it is not known to what extent the lay-out of the military organisation(s) destined to cover the area and its communications, will assist.

5. The removal of the Province of Foggia from the control of Region 4, will reduce the size of the Region, but does not minimize the exceptional difficulties of control which ^{the} barrier of the Appennines will impose when Region 4 takes over its whole territory.

It is considered that these difficulties can be overcome only by a reorganisation of Regions. This matter has been discussed with your HQ.

If the original area and boundaries of Region 4 are to remain, every endeavor will be made to overcome the difficulties outlined above.

b. As in existing circumstances the Advanced HQ at Trani appears to serve no useful purpose, it is recommended that permission be granted for it to close.

I have, during the last few weeks, tried to co-ordinate L.O. 9 the efforts of the three administrative authorities governing that party of Italy not under German occupation, viz., Italian Government, AMG-H.Q., and AMG, 15 Army Group, in so far as decisions which affect the whole territory are concerned. H.Q. has now issued an instruction that no decisions which affect salaries and wages of civil servants, prices of basic commodities, wage rates, etc., are to be made without previous consultation with the three authorities concerned.

2. I wish the same principle to be applied within AMG, 15 Army Group. Unilateral decisions on matters which will affect other Regions, or commands, will not be made without reference to these H.Q. who will consult the other R.C.A.O's and S.C.A.O's and make the decision. As an example I should expect an R.C.A.O. to refer to these H.Q. before issuing orders on the following:-

- (a) Matters likely to affect occupied territory as a whole, as opposed to the specific region (e.g. price, wage and ration scales).
- (b) Matters involving some relationship with other Regions (e.g. inter-regional shipments, inter-regional supply movement, movement of refugees).
- (c) Matters which raise legal, political or ecclesiastical questions of a character which may require handling by this H.Q. or higher headquarters (e.g. policy as to internees and foreign nationals, matters affecting ecclesiastical personnel, royal or suspension of Fascist Laws).
- (d) Matters involving a substantial change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than of local application (e.g. modification of social insurance systems, agricultural control, tax structure, labour laws).
- (e) Matters involving policy affecting institutions organised or operating on a national basis (e.g. banks, insurance companies).

There will be other matters not on this list which I leave to the discretion of the R.C.A.O's and S.C.A.O's.

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- (d) Matters involving a substantial change in Italian law or administrative procedure, other than of local application (e.g. modification of social insurance systems, agricultural control, tax structure, labour laws).
- (e) Matters involving policy affecting institutions organised or operating on a national basis (e.g. banks, insurance companies).

There will be other matters not on this list which I leave to the discretion of the R.C.A.O's and S.C.A.O's.

3. This strucks of centralisation; but the need for co-ordination in administering over forward combat areas is so great that I believe that you will find this degree of centralisation to help rather than a hindrance.
4. An administrative instruction dealing with this question more fully will shortly be issued. The above is a general statement of policy.

1. Administrative Memorandum Number 67, this headquarters, cs, outlines the new administrative organization on the mainland of ITALY.

2. Effective 24 October 1943, AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon will be set up in the NAPLES Area. The short title and telegraphic address of this organization will be FLAMBO, and its head is entitled Deputy Chief Administrative Officer FLAMBO (short title D/CAO). Its duties are to exercise control of general administration on the mainland of ITALY.

3. Effective 24 October 1943, HQ No. 2 District will be separately established for purely local administration. The telegraphic address of No. 2 District will be "NO. 2 DISTRICT", whereas the telegraphic address FORTBASE will be abolished effective 24 October 1943.

PREDVIOUS A.P.M.C. INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The effect of this instruction is to separate local from general administration (see A.P.M.C. Administrative Memorandum No. 11) by removing ~~2000~~ 63 responsibility for general administration from H.Q. No. 2 District.
2. A.P.M.C. Administrative Memorandum No. 63, cs, remains undisturbed in principle. Where it conflicts in detail with this memorandum, the provisions of this memorandum shall stand.
3. A.P.M.C. Administrative Memorandum No. 60, cs, remains unaltered. Where it conflicts in respect of nomenclature or other detail with this memorandum, the provisions of this memorandum shall stand.
4. A.P.M.C. Administrative Memoranda Nos. 60 and 63, cs, will be amended in due course.
5. This Memorandum sets up on the Mainland of Italy an organization to be known as "A.P.M.C. Advanced Administrative Section."
6. The short title and telegraphic address of this organization shall be "PLATO."
7. The head of the organization is entitled Deputy Chief Administrative Officer PLATO (short title D/C.A.O.)
- FUNCTIONS - GENERAL.
8. The Manning List (U.S.) and U.S. (Fr.) will be published separately and together will provide for an administrative staff analogous to that of A.P.M.C.
9. The functions of PLATO as the Advanced Echelon of A.P.M.C. are:
 - a. To coordinate on the Mainland of Italy all matters of general

FUNCTIONS - GENERAL.

9. The functions of FLABCO as the Advanced Echelon of A.P.H.Q. are:

- a. To coordinate on the Mainland of ITALY all matters of general administration including through movements, use of ports, acreage of shipping and allocation of tonnages between ground and air. For these purposes, in accordance with policies advised by A.T.H.Q. it will act in the name of, and with the authority of, A.T.H.Q.
- b. On its British side, to control and direct all British general administrative matters on the Mainland of ITALY in accordance with relevant appendices to this Memorandum (see par. 15). For these purposes Heads of Service at A.P.H.Q. will deal direct on Service matters with their identities at FLABCO. For comparable U.S. arrangements see relevant Appendices.
- c. In dealing with the ITALIAN GOVERNMENT, to represent A.T.H.Q. on military administrative matters in accordance with the separate instructions governing such relationships.
- d. To make the necessary administrative arrangements to support the operations of 15 Army Group and W.A.A.F. respectively or, where adequate arrangements cannot be made, to inform A.P.H.Q. and the appropriate RECORDEDLY.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF D/C.A.O.

12. The D/C.A.O. in addition to his duties as head of PLATO will also act as personal administrative adviser to the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, 15 Army Group.

13. The D/C.A.O. will maintain at N.C. 15 Army Group such U.S. and British representatives as are mutually agreed with the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, 15 Army Group as being adequate for this purpose.

OTHER ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS.

14. Chief Engineer, 15 Army Group.

The Chief Engineer, 15 Army Group, in addition to his other duties, will act on the Mainland of ITALY as Deputy for the Chief Engineer, A.T.M.C. for British Engineering matters his relationship with the D.D. of U. PLATO will be that normally obtaining in a British Headquarters between a Chief Engineer and a Director of Works carried on the same establishment.

15. The Chief Signal Officer, 15 Army Group, in addition to his other duties, will act on the mainland of ITALY as deputy for the Chief Signal Officer, A.T.M.C.

CHANNELS FOR MAINTENANCE.

16. The channels of communication for maintenance will be those established in A.T.M.C. Memorandum No. 6C, cs, the general administrative duties allotted therein for Passage II to No. 2 District being now performed by PLATO (see par. 4).

SECURE CHANNELS.

17. Detailed instructions on channels of communication for the subjects shown below will be issued as appendices to this memorandum by this headquarters:

19. The organization intended is outlined at Appendix A.



- (b) Referring to reinforcements, the scale to be held in Italy will be laid down by AFHQ after consultation with H.Q. 15 Army Group. Reinforcements to maintain what holding will be despatched from North Africa, or Indochina under arrangements made by AFHQ. On arrival in Italy they will pass into Corps Reinforcement Unit's under control of FLIBO. It will be the responsibility of FLIBO to send forward these reinforcements to formations in accordance with the priority decided by H.Q. 15 Army Group.
All extraordinary demands for reinforcements will be passed by Fifth Army, Eighth Army, or No. 2 District, to FLIBO. If FLIBO are unable to provide the reinforcements, and H.Q. 15 Army Group agrees that they are necessary, they will forward the demand to AFHQ.

1. Eighth Army, and other British formations under command 15 Army Group, will deal direct with AFHQ except on those M.S. Matters which have been reserved by Commander 15 Army Group for his decision, in which case they will deal with M.S. 15 Army Group.

CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION RELATING TO ORDER OF BATTLE, 1075

1. DATE - Effective 24 October 1943, and until such time as this headquarters shall move to ITALY, the following channels of communication are prescribed for matters relating to:

- a. Order of Battle (Troop List)
- b. Priorities for issue of vehicles and equipment in short supply (Controlled Stores)
- c. Priorities for movement of units and vehicles into ITALY.

2. a. Order of Battle - BRITISH

- (1) Separate Orders of Battle will be prepared at this headquarters for such subordinate formations, districts or other bodies as may from time to time be necessary.
- (2) Transfers from one Order of Battle to another will be authorized only by this headquarters.
- (3) Recommendations for alterations in Orders of Battle will be submitted to this headquarters -
 - (a) For combat units through command channels.
 - (b) For administrative units through command channels on the recommendation of AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon.
- (4) In circumstances which prevent reference to this headquarters, HQ 15th Army Group will act in the matter in consultation with the D/CAO on behalf of this headquarters and will report the action taken as early as possible.

b. Troop List - U.S. No change from present procedure.

c. Transfer of units and/or equipment between British and US Forces.

The provisions of AG 400-3(GEN)GCT-AGM, this headquarters, dated 10 September 1943, apply.

3. a. Equipment - BRITISH. Demands for vehicles and Controlled Stores from Fifth Army (for British units) and Eighth Army will be passed to 15th Army

Group, who will state their requirements to AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon giving priorities where necessary, and destinations for the vehicles and stores. Similarly, demands by districts will be passed through AFHQ Administrative Echelon to 15th Army Group. These requirements will be implemented by the Advanced Echelon, who will decide from which depot or park the vehicles and stores are to come, and will arrange issue from ITALY or SICILY. If requirements cannot be met from ITALY or SICILY, the Advanced Echelon will demand on this headquarters, who will release from NORTH AFRICA or arrange issue from the MIDDLE EAST if the material is available there. This headquarters will arrange with its Advanced Echelon what target of replacement vehicles and Controlled Stores is to be established in ITALY. This will be broken down by the Advanced Echelon into quantities to be held at various locations.

- b. Equipment - U.S. Through normal U.S. channels.
- c. Signal Supplies. See Appendix "C".

4. a. Movements.

- (1) Priorities for movements of all units and vehicles into the mainland of ITALY, ground and air, will be selected by 15th Army Group, who will prepare an overall priority list and keep it up to date at all times, furnishing copies to this headquarters and other headquarters concerned. Requirements of No. 2 District will be submitted through AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon.
- (2) Except from SICILY, all moves into the mainland of ITALY will be controlled by this headquarters.
- (3) Moves within the mainland of ITALY and from SICILY to the mainland of ITALY will be controlled by AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon according to policy prescribed by 15th Army Group.

b. Channels of communication for the U.S. Base Section will be as prescribed in General Orders No. 6, Hq NATOUS, dated 14 February 1943.

c. Detailed instructions have been issued to those concerned under letter, this headquarters, HSD/193, dated 10 October 1943.

5. For all subjects, except as prescribed in paragraph 1 above, channels of communication for Air Forces shall be normal.

1. The Engineer, 15th Army Group will act as the Deputy for the Chief Engineer Allied Forces.

2. Communication between the Chief Engineer, Allied Forces and the Deputy will be direct on both British and U.S. matters. The channel of communication between number 2 District and A.P.H.Q. on the subjects of engineer operations, training, intelligence, supply duties and personnel will be through Chief Engineer 15 Army Group acting in the position as Deputy. Chief Engineer, FLANCO. All communications from FLANCO to higher headquarters will be sent through A.P.H.Q.

3. On British Engineering matters the relationship between the Deputy for the Chief Engineer and the D.D.W. FLANCO will be that normally obtaining in a British Headquarters between a Chief Engineer and a D.W. The technical direction of works in base ports and in 2 Districts generally will be dealt with between D.W., A.P.H.Q. and D.D.W. FLANCO direct. Demands for stores will follow the channel first formations to D.D.W. FLANCO and thence to D.W., A.P.H.Q.

4. Decision on question of command and staff appointments which have previously been referred to A.P.H.Q. will be reserved for A.P.H.Q. decision heretofore.

5. Survey - Under U.S. organization Survey or Engineer Responsibility. Questions concerning maps and surveys (U.S.) which are brought to the attention of the Deputy for the Chief Engineer will be referred by him to the Chief Engineer except in case of such pressing emergency that time does not permit such action.

6. Airfield Construction. - In airfield construction matters the Deputy for the Chief Engineer is authorized to deal direct with the Chief Engineer, A.A.F. The allocation of U.S. Engineer Ground Troops to H.Q. for airfield construction will be authorized by A.P.H.Q. only.

7. Petroleum Distribution Facilities. (Piping and Tankage) - The number of troops available for piping and tankage construction, operation, and maintenance and supplies and materials required therefor are so limited that all construction of this character is really best be under A.P.H.Q. control. No pipeline, or central storage construction project will be undertaken, nor will any major modification or addition to an existing project be made, without prior A.P.H.Q. approval. Piping and tankage including all accessory materials and supplies are controlled items whether held in Britain or U.S. depots. The release of such stores for construction must be authorized by A.P.H.Q. All matters pertaining to the above will therefore, be referred to the Chief Engineer, Allied Forces who will take the necessary steps to obtain authority for proposed projects and releases for the required stores. The above restrictions are not construed as limiting the issue of maintenance supplies for existing projects. Adequate stocks will be held to maintain reasonable levels.

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for the Chief Engineer and the D.D.W. PLATO will be that normally obtaining in a British Headquarters between a Chief Engineer and a D.W. The technical direction of works in Base ports and in 2 Districts generally will be dealt with between D.W., A.E.M.C. and D.D.W. PLATO direct. Demands for stores will follow the control British formations to D.D.W. PLATO and thence to D.W., A.E.M.C.

4. Decision on question of command and staff appointments which have previously been referred to A.E.M.C. will be reserved for A.S.C.C. decision heretofore.

5. Survey - Under U.S. organization Survey's are an engineer responsibility. Questions concerning maps and surveys (U.S.) which are brought to the attention of the Deputy for the Chief Engineer will be referred by him to the Chief Engineer except in case of such pressing emergency that time does not permit such action.

6. Airfield Construction - In airfield construction matters the Deputy for the Chief Engineer is authorized to deal directly with the Chief Engineer, M.A.F. The allocation of U.S. Engineer Ground Troops to M.A.F for airfield construction will be authorized by A.S.C.C. only.

7. Forwards Distribution Facilities - (Pipeline & Trunkage) - The number of troops available for pipelines and tankage construction, operation, and maintenance and the resources and materials available therefore are so limited that all construction of this character in Italy must be under A.S.C.C. control. No pipeline or patrol storage construction project will be undertaken, nor will any major modification or addition to an existing project be made, without prior A.S.C.C. approval. Pipelines and tankages including all accessory materials and supplies are controlled items whether held in transit or U.S. depots. The release of such stores for construction must be authorized by A.S.C.C. All matters pertaining to the above will therefore be referred to the Chief Engineer, Allied Forces who will take the necessary steps to obtain authorization for proposed projects and releases for the required stores. The above restrictions are not construed as limiting the issue of maintenance supplies for existing projects. Maintenance stocks holding on the mainland of Italy will be held to minimum reasonable levels.

To Deputy for the Chief Engineer will be responsible for the local coordination of pipeline and tank construction with the Airforce Engineer construction program.

8. Engineer Troops (U.S.) - The transfer of engineer troops (U.S.) between I.S.P. Army Groups and District Number 2, Naples, also Section (U.S.), or M.A.F. or between any other of those establishments may be accomplished only on order from A.S.C.C. All questions relating to such transfer of troops will be referred to the Chief Engineer, Allied Forces who will obtain the necessary decisions. The above is not to be construed as limiting the temporary use of troops when most needed in case of urgent emergency, but troops so used will be returned to their original assignments as soon as the emergency has passed.

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APPENDIX D. Administrative Memorandum No.

U.S. Supply Areas

1. Supply of U.S. Forces based on Naples (and other western coast ports).
The U.S. Base Section in Naples is responsible for the supply of common items for U.S. Forces (Ground, Air and Navy) in the Naples Area. Such supplies, except POL products (Class III) and coal, will be furnished by SOS Italy. Based on troop strength, status of equipment reports and special requisitions, ~~Navy~~ is responsible for supplies peculiar to U.S. Air Forces supplied through Naples and/or western ports. 157½
2. Supply of U.S. Forces in Italy Area.

MACF is responsible for all supplies, peculiар and common, for U.S. air (and supplementary ground) forces in the Naples Area, which is defined as the complement of 200,000 and adjacent areas used by U.S. Air Forces. Supplies common to Air and Ground, except POL products (Class III) and coal, will be furnished by SOS MACFA.

3. POL products (Class III) and coal.
The U.S. Base Section in Naples (Paragraph No. 1) and MACF (Paragraph No. 2) will submit requirements to MACFA for POL products (Class III) and coal needed to supply the U.S. forces for which MACFA is responsible, stating areas in which required. MACFA will arrange for supply of those items, which are to be recorded on a common pool for use of U.S. and British military forces in Italy.

4. Civilian supplies for Italy.

The procedure outlined in letter, this Headquarters, AG 400-1 (WFO) GDS-AGM, subject: "Civilian Supply in Occupied Countries", dated 31 August 1943, will apply, except that AG is responsible for preparation of phased lists of minimum essential civilian supplies. These will be forwarded through MACFA who is responsible for coordination of requirements and the allocation of priority for movement of such supplies.

5. Allotment of tonnage for transport.

- 5a. Convoy direct from the United States.

SOS MACFA, under appropriate instructions from higher Headquarters, will arrange for the loading of ships in the U.S. for supply direct to U.S. forces in Italy based on forecasts of requirements and troops strength. Until stocks in Sicily and North Africa are reduced to minimum requirements for U.S. troops thereon, direct shipments from the United States will be made only where required to meet needs of forces in Italy.

- 5b. Supply to North Africa.

Under prevailing conditions (Paragraph 2 of Administrative Memorandum No. 90, WFO) ships will be loaded in North Africa to reduce stocks therein as stated in 5a above. Thereafter, shipment of supplies from North Africa

3. POL products (Class III) and coal. The U.S. Base Section in Naples (Category No. 1) and Haifa (paragraph No. 2) will submit requirements to FLAED for POL products (Class III) and coal needed to supply the U.S. Forces for which each agency is responsible, starting areas in which required. FLAED will arrange for supply of these items, which are to be regarded as a common pool for use of U.S. and British military forces in Italy.

4. Civilian Supplies for Italy.

The procedure outlined in letter, "His Excellency, AG 400-1 (WHT) SOS-AGM, subject: "Civilian Supply in Occupied Countries", dated 31 August 1945, will apply, except that U.S. Forces for which each agency is responsible, starting lists of minimum essential civilian supplies, these will be forwarded through FLAED who is responsible for coordination of requirements and the allotment of priority for movement of such supplies.

5. Allotment of tonnage for maintenance.

a. Convoy direct from the United States.

SOS E.T.O.U.S. under appropriate instructions from Higher Headquarters will arrange for the loading of ships in the U.S. for supply direct to U.S. Forces in Italy based on forecasts of requirements and troop strength. Troop stocks in Sicily and North Africa are reduced to minimum requirements for U.S. troops therein, direct shipments from the United States will be made, only where required to meet needs of forces in Italy.

b. Supplies by North Africa.

Under prevailing conditions (paragraph 2) administrative memorandum No. 80, WHT) ships will be loaded in North Africa to reduce stocks therein as stated in 5 a. above. The reactor, aircraft, and part of supplies from North Africa will be supplied and most appropriations in U.S. convoys for the supply of U.S. Forces in Italy. Ships in accordance with General priorities established by FLAED (see paragraph 6). Ships will be required to move to FLAED for all classes of supply for U.S. Forces in the Mediterranean (see paragraph 2). FLAED will advise SOS (G-4, Naval & DH) and make arrangements account for U.S. Ground and Air Forces in the Mediterranean. Navy will then arrange for shipment of all U.S. supplies to the local ports. For supplies peculiar to U.S. Air Forces which are to be shipped overseas through Naples or other Navy ports, Navy will bid required tonnage to both FLAED and the U.S. Base Section in Naples.

c. Calling forward of ships from North Africa.

FLAED is responsible for calling forward to Italian ports all ships loaded for discharge in Italy, either U.S. or in North Africa. Manifests and breakdown showing contents of all supply ships for U.S. Forces in Italy, will be furnished to FLAED to assist in determining priority of movements and unloading of ships in Italy.
