1. Composition of AVC Hq ROVT.

After occupation of ROVT and so long as ROVT remains the responsibility of SCMC, AVC FIFTH ARMY, AVC activities in ROVT, including the Governorate, will be administered by an AVC Hq commanded by Colonel Rume, Senior Civil Affairs Officer, AVC Fifth Army, and formed from Hq AVC Fifth Army and Section 4, supplemented by officers, W/Os and transport provided by AVC 15 Army Group, AVC 8th Army, and 1st AF Hq.

The organization of ROVT AVC Hq is given in diagrammatic form in Appendix A.

2. Officers Available.

Provisional list of officers available for special divisions at AVC Hq Rome is given at Appendix B.

Provisional list of additional C.O.s expected to be available is given at Appendix C.

3. Responsibility regarding Army Area and ROVT.

Chiefs of Divisions allotted responsibility for ROVT (see Appendix E) will note that this includes the area of the Governorate (see Appendix D). Responsibility for the area within Fifth Army boundaries but outside ROVT Governorate falls under the Senior Officer of each division of AVC Fifth Army Hq as given in Appendix D, with the exception of Public Safety Division.

1. Composition of AFG Hq ROT.

After occupation of ROT and so long as ROT remains the responsibility of SOG, AFG Fifth Army, AFG activities in ROT, including the Governorate, will be administered by an AFG Hq commanded by Colonel Hume, Senior Civil Affairs Officer, AFG Fifth Army, and formed from Hq AFG Fifth Army and Region 4, supplemented by officers, W/ORS and transport provided by AFG 15 Army Group, AFG 6th Army, AFG and AF Hq.

The organization of ROT AFG Hq is given in diagrammatic form in Appendix A.

2. Officers Available.

Provisional list of officers available for special divisions of AFG Hq Rome is given in Appendix B.

Provisional list of additional COOs expected to be available is given in Appendix C.

3. Responsibility regarding Army area and ROT.

Chiefs of Divisions allotted responsibility for ROT (see pp 2) will note that this includes the area of the Governorate (see pp 2) (pp D). Responsibility for the area within Fifth Army boundaries but outside ROT Governorate falls under the Senior Officer of each division of AFG Fifth Army Hq as given in Appendix B, with the exception of Public Safety Division.

4. Transportation.

Transportation and drivers, and clerks where necessary will be provided for all officers by the Hq to whom they presently belong.

Transportation assigned to AFG Fifth Army is hereby requested for this detachment and will not be available for attached officers.

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The transportation officer of the Fifth Army will coordinate and control allocation of vehicles and also be responsible for the arrangements for the move of the Fifth Army and all attached personnel (including Region 4).

5. Accommodation. The allotment and control of accommodation for the Fifth Army, Region 4 and SCG in RCT will be the responsibility of the Adv Hq Detachment of Region 4, under the direction of Senior Civil Affairs Officer, the Fifth Army. Further instructions on this matter will follow.

6. RCT Districts.

For the purpose of the administration of RCT, the city is divided into ten districts corresponding with existing Italian police districts:

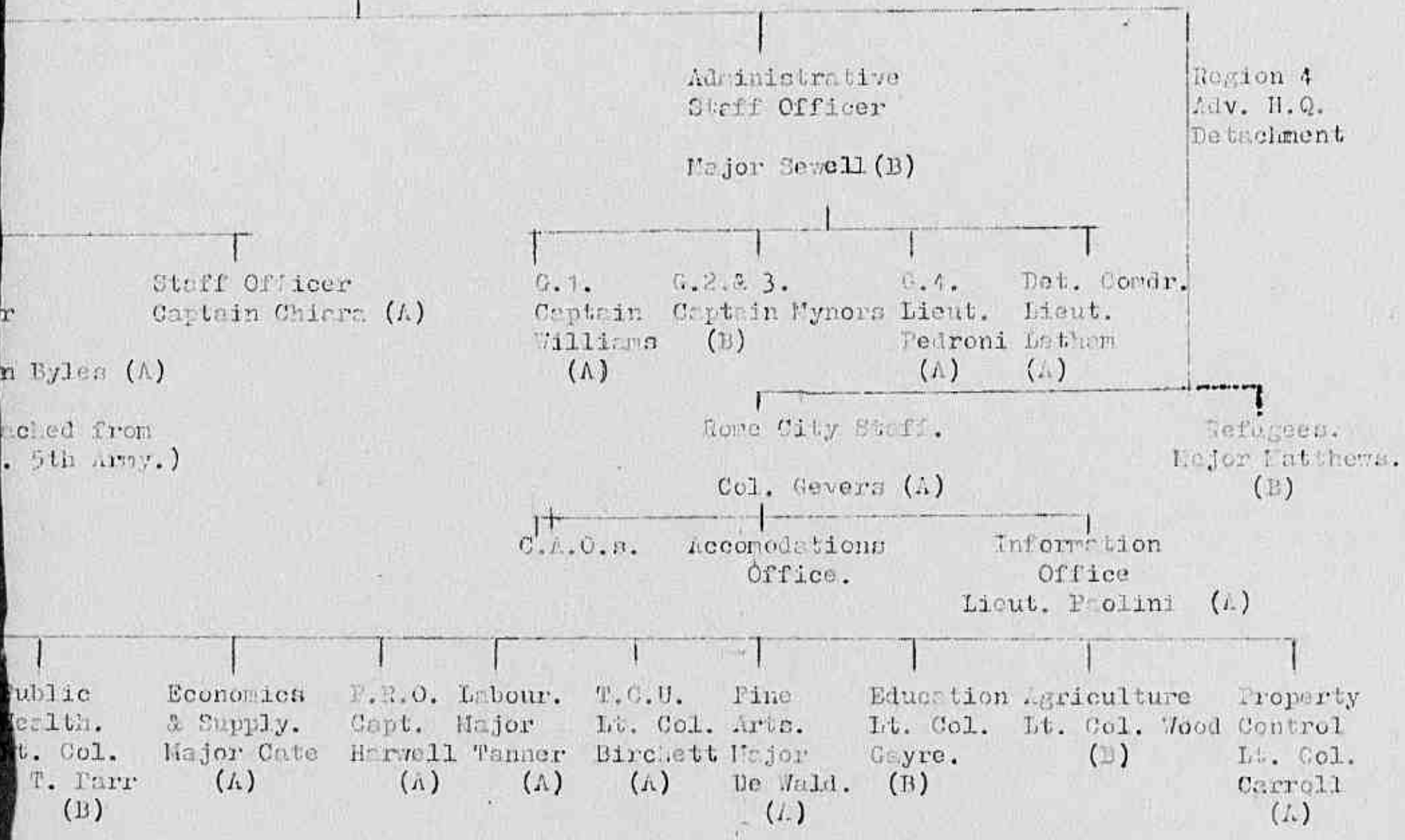

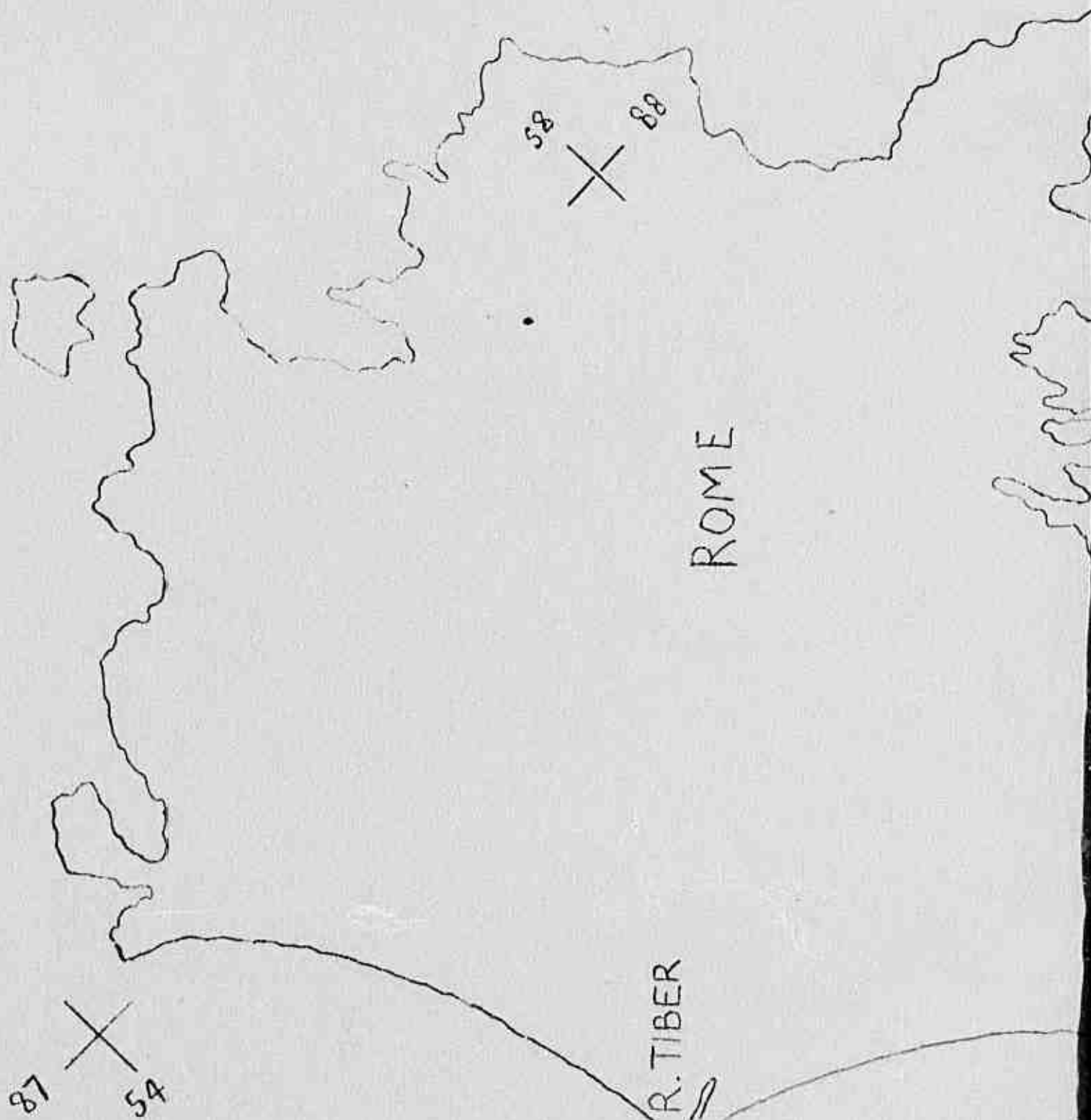

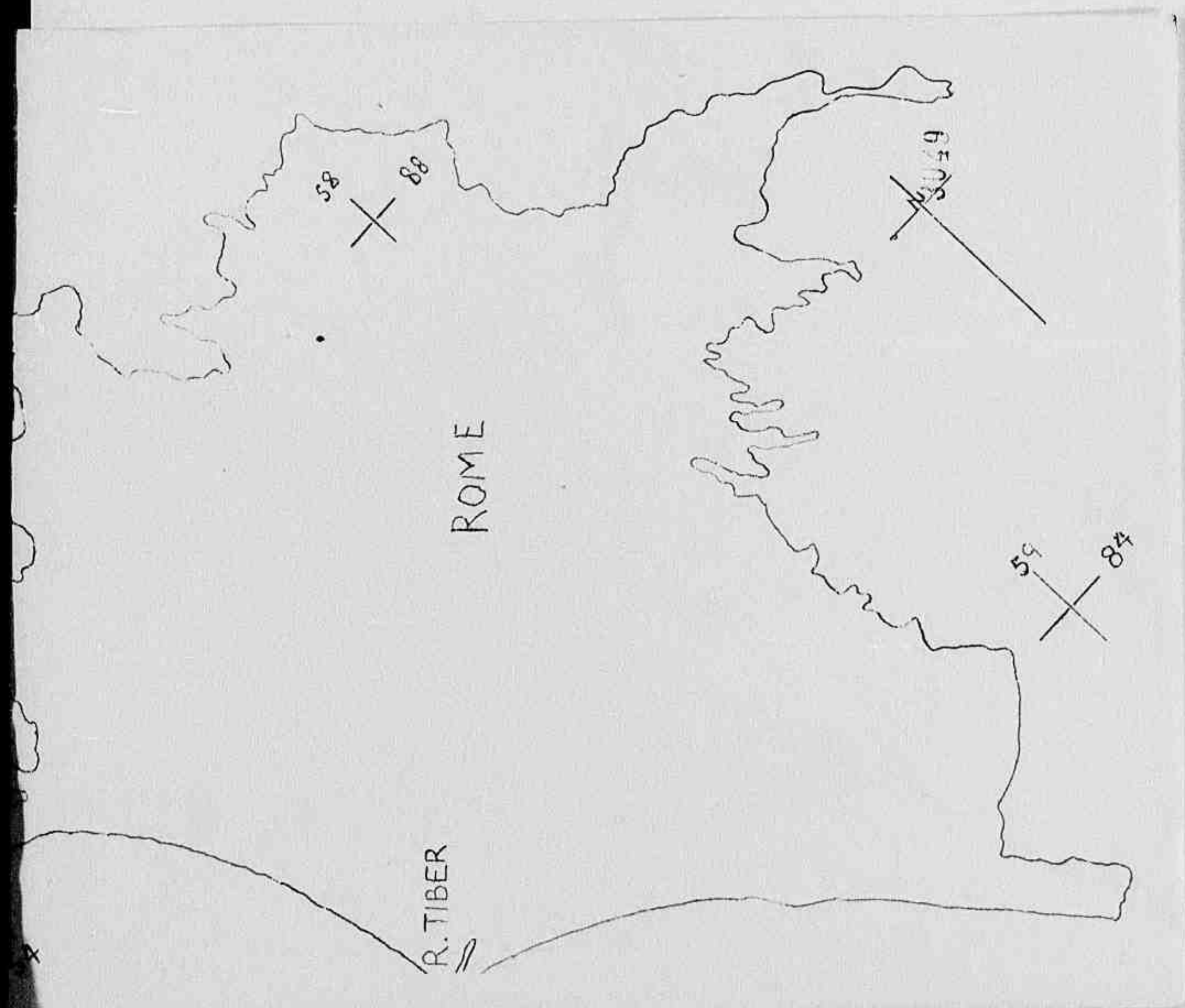

ACTION BY PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION AND CAPO

PRIOR TO OCCUPATION OF ROME.

1. Carabinieri in central Rome are reported to have been disbanded and City is being partly policed by P.I.I. (Polizia Italia Italiana) with strong Fascist influence, collaborating with enemy, and unacceptable to allies. 2,500 Carabinieri augmented by 700 Finance Guards are being collected for duty in Rome and prepared for immediate police duty in Rome as soon as the City is occupied by allies.

2. Command. All Carabinieri and Finance Guards concerned will be instructed as to the chain of command. All are subject to orders of the Commander, through Colonel HJH and Public Safety Division, under their own officers.

3. Political. Police detailed for duty in Rome will be clearly instructed that they must carry out their duties in impartial manner, without any POLITICAL BIAS or FAVORITISM WHATSOEVER.

4. Outline of Proposed Police arrangements.

(a) Rome City is divided into TEN police districts, each of which is controlled by a specially allotted CAP in the early stages. CAPS' headquarters shown in Appendix 2.

(b) Carabinieri and Finance Guards to be brought into Rome will be organized into TEN separate Companies, plus THREE groups held for reserve purposes at convenient places (Locations in Appendix).

(c) Radio TRO TTY transmitting sets provided by Signal Section Fifth Army will be available at CAP Headquarters, with mobile transmitters, the Police Central Control Point, situated at the Headquarters of the Commander and Colonel HJH. Necessary Radio sets will also be available at Police Reserve Headquarters. Signal Section Fifth Army providing the Radio personnel necessary to give 24 hours' service until ordinary telephone facilities are provided by Signal Section. By

2. Command. All Carabinieri and Finance Guards concerned will be collected for duty in Rome and prepared for immediate police duty in Rome as soon as the City is occupied by allies.

3. Political. Police detailed for duty in Rome will be clearly instructed that they must carry out their duties in impartial manner, WITHOUT ANY POLITICAL BIAS or PARTISAN TENDENCY.

4. Outline of Proposed Police Arrangements.

(a) Rome City is divided into TEN police districts, each of which is controlled by a specially allotted C.O. in the early stages. C.O.s' headquarters shown in Appendix 2.

(b) Carabinieri and Finance Guards to be brought into Rome will be organized into TEN separate Companies, plus THREE groups held for reserve purposes at convenient places (Locations in Appendix).

(c) Radio TFC BY transmitting sets provided by Signal Section Fifth Army will be available at C.O. Headquarters, with a mobile transmitter; the Police Central Control Point, situated at the Headquarters of the Commander and Colonel H.M.B. Necessary Radio sets will also be available at Police Reserve Headquarters. Signal Section Fifth Army providing the Radio personnel necessary to give a 24 hours' service until ordinary telephone facilities are provided by Signal Section. By this means, C.O. Headquarters will be in constant touch with District T.O.s and certain other Headquarters. Special short wave-length with fully limited radius of transmission to prevent interception and code words will be used. Anything of a highly secret or confidential nature will be transmitted by other means and not by radio.

(d) Motorcycles are being provided with by Military Police Carabinieri and attached to central Headquarters and each District T.O.

(e) Maps have been prepared and every place and building requiring special protection noted by district.

(f) Detailed instructions have been prepared for each of the Tenth District C.I.P.O.s with list of all banks and financial institutions to be closed, places to be guarded and places requiring special attention, vulnerable points, essential services, etc.

(g) Numbered and stamped arm bands are being prepared ready for issue to all Carabinieri, Guardia Finanza, Questurini and Metropolitan Police.

(h) Necessary transport is being arranged for movement of all police, as well as rationing.

5. Maps, Proclamations and Orders. Chief Public Safety is obtaining copies of all maps, books of passes and permits, proclamations, orders, notices, office equipment, rubber stamps, direction signs, handbills, maps for issue to district C.I.P.O.s with instructions. "Situation Report" and "Schedule Personnel" will be printed and issued to all C.I.P.O.s. Orders recalling disbanded Carabinieri are being prepared.

6. Mission with "S" Force.

(a) Public Safety Division and C.I.P.O.s will work in closest cooperation throughout with "S" Force under command of Colonel Smith (A). "S" Force will perform in initial stages certain intelligence tasks, arrest enemy agents and sympathizers, seize and safeguard documents, archives of intelligence interest, etc. "S" Force will also continue to search for guarding intelligence targets, engineers to deal with mines in booby traps which menace the Force or its targets, and men - identified later for civilian prisoners, etc. Representatives of all interested intelligence agencies, CG, G2, G1, CIC, FSS, etc., are working under control of "S" Force and collaborating with Public Safety Division.

(b) Chief, Public Safety will arrange to provide "S" Force with the necessary numbers of selected Carabinieri and Guardia Finanza assisting to protect and guard "S" Force targets and specified buildings, men on "D" Day road blocks which will be established on main arteries about 5 miles out from centre of city to specified points so as to prevent civilian movement in and out of Rome except through essential cases, clearing the roads of non-essential civilian cars and motors, etc.

(h) Necessary transport is being arranged for movement of all offices, as well as rationing.

5. Maps, Proclamations and Orders. Chief Public Safety is obtaining all maps, books of permits and permits, proclamations, orders, offices, office equipment, rubber stamps, direction signs, hurricane maps for issue to district CPOs with instructions. "Situation Report" and "Schedule Person in" will be printed and issued to all CPOs. Offices recalling disbanded Carabinieri are being prepared.

6. Prison with "S" Force.

(a) Public Safety Division and CPOs will work in closest cooperation throughout with "S" Force under command of Colonel WITH (L). "S" Force will perform in initial stages certain intelligence tasks, arrest enemy agents and sympathizers, seize and safeguard documents, archives of intelligence interest, etc. "S" Force subunits contain sections, for guarding intelligence targets, engineers to deal with mines and booby traps which menace the Force or its targets, and men to enter for civilian prisoners, etc. Representatives of all interested intelligence agencies, CG, G2, SI, CIO, FSI, etc., are working under control of "S" Force and collaborating with Public Safety Division.

(b) Chief, Public Safety will arrange to provide "S" Force with the necessary numbers of selected Carabinieri and Carabinieri Finances for assisting to protect and guard "S" Force targets and specified buildings, men on "S" Force road blocks which will be established on main routes about 5 miles out from center of city at specified points so as to prevent civilian movement in and out of Rome except in vital essential cases, clear the roads of non-essential civilian carts and motors, etc.

(c) Lt Harris (E), "S" Force, has been detailed to act as prison officer between "S" Force and MG; he is to report daily to Chief, Public Safety and supply for information of Colonel HUIE and Head Divisions concerned an up-to-date "Black" list of cart in office and persons in Rome who will either be arrested or subject to control locking. All information or proposed action affecting civilian officials will be passed to him by "S" Force officer and vice versa. All set goals and by this means it is hoped to ensure smooth working.

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7. Military Police. A number of Military Police will be directly under General Clarke. Public Safety Division will operate closely with Provost Marshal is to insure that military and civil police units are coordinated. Notices not to be requisitioned by military will have passed on them to that effect.

It has been agreed to interpose a Carabinieri and Police. Guards with military police personnel to guard certain buildings and places, special patrols, etc.

8. Guard of Food Dumps. Public Safety Division in collaboration with Supply and Economics Section will arrange necessary civil police force for all food dumps and warehouses, loading and unloading of food, of dumps in forward areas, schools which will be utilized for food deposit.

9. Vietnam. Arrangements will be made by Public Safety Section in conjunction with Provost Marshal for provision in the course of necessary outside guards, must be out of Viet Nam, provocation of Viet Nam property, wherever located, and carry out any special instructions of Colonel HUM in this respect.

10. Civilian Motor Traffic. The circulation of civilian motor vehicles will be restricted to the minimum in the early phases, and limited to essential purposes. Chief Public Safety is preparing instructions to the public, permits and hand signs and labels for issue through D-20 of the District where applicant resides.

11. Disbandment of Police. American Italian. Notices are being prepared instructing all members of the P.A.I. and other civil agencies report immediately at their respective headquarters for instructions. Prevent any possible clashes, etc. will be discussed by JAG Public Safety officers and NOT by the Carabinieri.

12. Civil Defense. Fire, law, etc. Fifth Army Reserve Air Force Section is supplying certain fire-fighting equipment, but Chief Public Safety is preparing orders for Civil Defense and planning to the full use of any civilian appliances available.

13. Curfew. Period of curfew 1900 hours to 0600 hours. Chief, Public Safety has arranged with Chief of Police for provision of necessary orders to be issued to District CLDs for posting.

14. Prevention of Riots. Arrangements are being made for training of necessary personnel: "CUT OF THROAT" and "OFF LIMITS", "NO ENTRY" etc.

9. Victim. Arrangements will be made, by Public Safety Section in conjunction with lowest level for provision in the course of carrying out the duties, as last tenant of Police Bureau, protection of victim property, wherever located, and carry out any special instructions of Colonel HULL in this subject.
10. Civilian Motor Traffic. The circulation of civilian motor vehicles will be controlled to the minimum in the early phase, and limited to essential purposes. Chief Public Safety is preparing instructions to the public, permits and instructions for issue, through the CAO of the District where applicant resides.
11. Dispersal of Police Officers. Notices are being issued instructing all members of the P.M.I. and other civil agencies to report immediately to their respective Headquarters for instructions, to prevent any possible clashes, P.M.I. will be dispersed by the Public Safety officers and HQ by the Carabinieri.
12. Civil Defense, Fire Prevention, etc. Which may involve the Police Section is supplying certain fire-fighting equipment, but Chief Public Safety is preparing plans for Civil Defense and planning to a full use of any civilian appliances obtainable.
13. Curfew. Period of curfew 1900 hours to 0600 hours. Chief, Public Safety has arranged with Chief Legal Officer for provision of necessary orders to be issued to District CAOs for posting.
14. Preparation of Notices. Arrangements are being made for printing of necessary notices: "OUT OF BOUNDS" and "NO ENTRY", "NO ENTRY" and "SUSPECTED AREA - ENTRY PROHIBITED", "FIRE FIGHTING HQ", "FIRE FIGHTING HQ", also "Situation Reports" forms for issue to District CAOs.
15. Books and Financial Institutions. Check with Chief Finance, list of banks, etc., to be closed or guarded. List of such cases to be prepared and issued to CAOs.
16. Protection of Historic Monuments, Works of Fine Art 3446
Chief, Public Safety will keep in close contact with the head of this Division and check the list of places requiring special guards and patrols. Arrangements will be made by Public Safety Division for posting of Notices by Carabinieri other than those posted direct by the Arts Division. Chief, Public Safety will supply District CAOs with full list of all places to be guarded in order of priority.

17. Witnesses. While on duty, witnesses will be assigned to various locations for duty in plain clothes. They will be instructed by the following instructions in plain clothes to playing innocent and to a variety of positions, including with any political movement, checking of staff, etc. including records, etc.

18. VOE Section. Chief Public Safety will maintain a VOE with all of all buildings, public, and structures in Rome in which VOE Section is especially interested in which are to be placed out of bounds to groups, and where there must be placed in a variety of notices posted. Necessary notices will be obtained from VOE Section and supplied to CAPO concerned for necessary action in the course of the matter.

19. Instructions to District S. Os. Chief. Chief, Public Safety is hereby detailed with instructions for the CMO of each district before leaving for Rome, and supplying each with a number of S. Os. personnel.

3. ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY DIVISION FROM PLAIN CLOTHES

1. Chief Public Safety and his officers will enter with senior officials of "3" Force and Signal Office and set up a temporary "old" wireless control in South West side of "Victor's Memorial" monument. The radio control will be set up to the HQ building and District CAPO will proceed at once to the respective HQ as in Appendix "A".

2. Plans will be maintained, communications and general orders posted and orders placed daily thereinafter in order of priority.

3. Personnel will be assigned to "3" Force and prevent a rush for road blocks, make for a road building, etc., check and guard along banks, etc., and Public Safety personnel assigned to CAPO, CAPO, and CAPO, Metropolitan HQ and to Chief of CAPO, CAPO, CAPO.

4. Subject to other instructions issued by Colonel H. L. on Senior Public Safety personnel will go to all cases to various City, in possible with the CAPO personnel and ensure that necessary outside personnel in position, quickly re-instate the CAPO guards if necessary and

19. Instructions to District 24 Co. Chief, Public Safety is preparing detailed written instructions for the CPO of each District before leaving for Rome, and supplying each with a number of Special Personnel.

3. ACTION BY PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION UPON RECEIVED INFO RMR.

1. Chief Public Safety and his officers will enter with senior officials of "3" Force and Signal Officer and set up a temporary toll wireless control on South West side of "Victorio Reservoir" monument. This radio control will later transfer to A-9 Hq building and District Office will proceed at once to their respective Hqs as in Appendix "A".

2. Plans will be prepared, recommendations and general orders posted and carried along by Special Personnel in order of priority.

3. Personnel will be assigned to "3" Force and Provost Marshal for road blocks, guards for special buildings, etc., along and guard main building, etc., and Public Safety personnel assigned to Question, De-Militarized Hq and Metropolitan Hq and to Chief Legal Officers located

4. Subject to other instructions issued by Colonel H. B. on, Senior Public Safety Officer will go on once to Vatican City, if possible with the CPO Drastavara and ensure that necessary outside guard are in position, quickly re-instate. The Chief Guards in necessary and take any essential action without delay.

5. Radio contact will be established with each District CPO and general situation in all areas ascertained. Report will be made to Colonel H. B. on.

- (a) Status of public order, health and morale.
- (b) Road situation.

7. In conjunction with "C" Force and Provost Marshal, District Public Safety--all located the Governor's Prefect, in senior civil, including the police officials, and after an inquiry conducted by "C" Force with possibly that of its HQ for interview by senior Command and Colonel and the heads of divisions concerned as soon as it is available.

9. Officers and institute strong mobile and foot patrols of Garbiniert and all available civil police to reveal locations and possible lists of voters, availability of local distribution centers. One public meeting of four will be held to discuss directly with the head of Broncho and Family division to learn what sufficient persons are and where required to vote training. Prompt and efficient measures must be taken to subject to citizens law and order.

11. Plain clothes public security agents, will be assigned, only authorized being allowed to remain their arms.

12. Banks, etc. A service office of Public Safety will personally close the Banco Británico, the Mercaderes (if not already closed), place strong guards there, making no IVI or Chief Finance officer. All other financial institutions will be closed and guarded as early as possible, issued that the place of the printing establishment are properly attended to prevent sabotage.

14. Submit the hourly "edition reports" to Army Commander and General HRP (and other AFE Juntas) an approved form for first 24 hours, then at 0800 hours at 2300 hours daily thereafter.

15. Restrict civilian movement and motor traffic to minimum areas first 24 hours, by issue of official permits. Assume that district PCs have sufficient men to man effectively the 9 main road blocks to prevent movement of civilians in and out of the city except in bona fide cases.

16. Enforce rigidly curfew orders.

17. Community and Civic Affairs. A quick survey to be made by Public Security office to ensure that there are sufficient guards on local historic monuments, etc., in accordance with special lists supplied to District CAPCO.

18. Immigrants, etc. Public Security Division, in conjunction with Postal Service will place necessary Military/Civil Police guards on all bridges and Canal etc, also form Precinct Headquarters and other post and buildings liable to wilful damage by civilians.

19. Brothels and Prostitutes. If Army Commander so directs, Provos should be to be prepared to take following action in conjunction with IAF, Public Safety, etc.

(a) Obtain from Superior, all names and addresses of every known prostitute, brothel and prostitute.

(b) With the aid of necessary number of selected Quasturini and Military Police, close IMMEDIATELY every registered or unregistered brothel.

14. Submit two hourly "situation reports" to Area Commander and Colonel W.H. (and other A.C. House) on a pre-printed form for first 24 hours, then at 0800 hours and 2000 hours daily thereafter.

15. Restrict civilian movement and motor traffic to minimum level first 24 hours, by ISSU of SPECIAL ORDERS. Advise that district has been authorized on to and effectively the 9 main road blocks to prevent movement of civilians in and out of the city except in bona fide cases.

16. Enforce rigidly earlier orders.

17. Comptroller and Director. A quick survey to be made by Public Safety Officer to ensure that there are sufficient funds on file in historic monuments, etc., in accordance with special lists applied to district CAPS.

18. Ambulance, etc. Public Safety Division, in conjunction with West Branch will place necessary Military/Civil police wards on all buildings and Concessions, also former President headquarters and other points in buildings liable to wilful attack by civilians.

19. Brothels and Prostitutes. If Area Commander no direct, Provost Marshal is to be prepared to take following action in conjunction with Public Safety, etc.

(a) Obtain from structures and addresses and addresses of every known district brothel and prostitute.

(b) With the aid of necessary number of selected Quarantine and Military Police, close IMMEDIATELY every registered and unregistered bro or house of prostitution.

(c) Convey all prostitutes to the Quarantine and other selected centers under sufficient guard for military action.

(d) All districts or suspected districts appointed to be 30/4/46. Report out of the City for medical treatment at some institution not less than 50 kilometers from Home City. To be re-registered and served with a written notice that they must in no circumstances return to Home City unless certified in writing that they are free of infection. If

they return to Rome contrary to written orders, they will be prosecuted in Allied Military Court under Procl 2, Art II, Sec. 44 or 45.

(e) Prostitutes not diseased to be re-registered, served with written order that they must submit to medical exam not less than twice weekly and results of such exams clearly indicated on a medical inspection card. These women to be subject to very strict caution as to the contacts and hygiene.

(f) Every brothel will be put out of bounds or "Off Limits" to troops, and notices posted outside to this effect for first few days. Military Police are to be stationed outside with Carabinieri guard to prevent entering of troops.

(g) Prostitutes found soliciting in street will be either arrested or ordered to leave the City and "touts" arrested under Sect. (15) of proclamation 2, article II.

(h) If any registered brothels for troops are to be allowed, they will be supervised and inspected daily by Military Police and Carabinieri.

Military Police are to be stationed outside with Carabinieri guard to prevent entry of troops.

(5) Prostitutes found soliciting in street will be either arrested or ordered to leave the City and "touts" arrested under Sect. (15) of proclamation 2, article II.

(11) If any registered brothels for troops are to be allowed, they will be supervised and inspected daily by Military Police and Carabinieri
