I have discussed with Col TATE, G-4, FIFTH ARMY, the Army's understanding of the arrangements made with respect to food for the civil population of ROME. He made the following points:

1. The calling forward of supplies from ROME will be by telegram from General CLARK based on information obtained by you from the Provincial Administrations and other local sources. The points they will be called forward to will not be landing points under Army control, such as ANIC, but points which must be developed by ASD. G-4 suggests PISAPIANO or the mouth of the TIBER, in neither of which the Army is interested.
2. These landing points must be developed completely by ASD, using local Italian labour. No assistance can be promised by the Army, because their facilities are inadequate for military maintenance alone. Barges must be found and manned by Italian personnel entirely, if adequate quay space cannot be found and barges are required for off-loading the schooners or sampans in midstream.
3. Trucks must be found locally. If local sources prove inadequate and diversions must be made from Army sources, this decision will be made on the ground by the Army Commander.
