I write to acknowledge the receipt and to thank you for your letter HQ/2010 of 6. November. 43 in which you relate the history of the wage movements at the salt works at Maripierita di Savoia.

2. With reference to your sixth paragraph, I am informed by S. S. Colonel GIUSEPPE JESI, that the continued collection of salt is essential as (a) the salt will otherwise be ruined by rains; (b) Maripierita di Savoia is one of the few sources from which the country is supplied; and that the estimated stock of 250,000 tons will all be required. In areas where judg slaughtering is now in progress, salt is in very short supply and is sold up to ten times the official price. (c) It is in the interest of the Allies to permit the maximum revenues to accrue to the Italian Government.

3. Insofar as the Manager of Salt Works has received no authority for the increase in wages to his employees, I presume that he will be held responsible for such action. Although you do not state so specifically, do I understand that the workers would otherwise have transferred to Army employment at the higher rate?

I refer to your telegram PHS 2325 of 15th December. From the last sentence of which I understand that the Temporary Wage Adjustment Order, a draft of which was shown to me in Naples by Lt. Col. Lane, has been signed and promulgated.

2. When Lt. Col. Lane showed me the order I made it clear that any adjustment of wages must be comprehensive to all occupied territory and must be correlated with wage adjustments in Region II and Apulia. I added that the order, if approved, would be issued by these H.Q.

3. If my presumption expressed in paragraph 1 is correct, I should be glad if you could explain why the order has been issued without reference to these H.Q. You should enclose a copy of the order for my information.

Instructions are being obtained by this Headquarters as to the manner in which British merchant seamen who commit offenses ashore in occupied territory shall be dealt with.

2. It is possible for British merchant seamen to be dealt with by Naval Courts and a copy of the appropriate sections of the Merchant Shipping Act is enclosed herewith.

3. In respect of any ordinary criminal offenses committed ashore by British merchant seamen, the procedure will be to contact H.Q.L.C. at the port concerned and ascertain whether he will take full charge of the case under the above Act. If H.Q.L.C. will not do this, reference will be made to this Headquarters with full details.

4. In respect of any proclamation offenses, an immediate report will be made to this Headquarters, with details of the charges and full particulars, before any trial is held.

5. A further directive will be issued as soon as the instructions mentioned in para 3 above have been received.

6. The definition of "British Merchant Seamen" will be noted in the enclosed extract from the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

The above mentioned subject was discussed recently with you at Brindisi and you arranged to ascertain the experience of Region II in applying the Rules for conduct of Italian Military Tribunals drafted by you and then you were to reconsider same.

2. The Italian Military Tribunal at Naples now desires Bando No.1 to be published, and directions have been requested from this Headquarters by Region III.
3. It appears to me that a considerable amount of victimization can take place under Bando No.1 and I would prefer to see Italian Military Tribunals confined more to dealing with disciplinary offences within the Italian Army. Sabotage and other similar offences should in my opinion be tried by Allied Military Courts.
4. The matter is further complicated as, under a recent directive received by signal from A.P.H.Q., the policy would appear to be that only offences by Italian soldiers who are NOT in a unit operating under our military orders will be dealt with by A.M.Courts.
5. I shall be obliged by hearing from you as soon as possible.

Subject: British Merchant Seaman

1. Considerable difficulty is being experienced over the question of the trial and imprisonment of British Merchant Seaman. The question arises in occupied territory in Italy and in non-occupied territory, but this Headquarters is only concerned with the former type of territory.

2. A British Merchant Seaman is not subject to the Army Act or the Naval Discipline Act when he is on shore, and he can therefore not be tried by Army or Naval Court martial, or be imprisoned lawfully in a military or naval establishment.

3. It is my opinion that a British Merchant Seaman, like all other civilian persons in occupied territory, is subject to the jurisdiction of the Military Government and, therefore, to his proclamations and orders. This was recognized in Madagascar and, also, in Tripolitania and possibly other British occupied territories.

4. Under the proclamations in Italy at present in force, a British Merchant Seaman could be tried by an Allied Military Court in occupied territory for offenses committed therein against the proclamation and orders of the Military Government. It is also, in my opinion, desirable in the ordinary course of the territory as he is not a member of the Allied Forces and as such exempt under international law.

5. It is recognized that it would be desirable and impracticable to try a British Merchant Seaman in an Italian Court, but an offence against Italian law could properly be tried in an Allied Military Court under a transfer of jurisdiction in accordance with the provisions of Proclamation No. 6. An Allied Military Court can also properly try a British Merchant Seaman for an offence created by proclamation or order of the Military Government.

6. Since the War Office, London, agreed in occupied territories in the Middle East and elsewhere that British Merchant Seamen are liable to the jurisdiction of British Military Courts, by which they are tried so far as is possible in accordance with English law, I propose, unless I receive to the contrary, to try such offenders by Allied Military Courts.

3. It is my opinion that a British servant woman, like all other civilian persons in occupied territory, is subject to the jurisdiction of the Military Governor and, therefore, to his regulations and orders. This was recognized in Indagator No. 1000, in Tripolitania and possibly other British occupied territories.

4. Under the regulations in Italy at present in force, a British servant woman could be tried by an Allied Military Court in occupied territory for offenses committed therein against the regulations and orders of the Military Governor. It is also, in my opinion, desirable to the ordinary courts of the territory as he is not a member of the Allied Forces and as such exempt under international law.

5. It is recognized that it would be unwise and impracticable to try a British servant woman in an Italian Court, but an Italian soldier Italian law could properly be tried in an Allied Military Court under a transfer of jurisdiction in accordance with the provisions of Regulation No. 1000. An Allied Military Court can also properly try a British servant woman for an offense created by regulations or orders of the Military Government.

6. Under the War Office, orders, agreed in occupied territories in the Middle East and elsewhere that British servant women are liable to the jurisdiction of British Military Courts, by which they are tried as far as is possible in accordance with English law, I propose, unless I receive instructions to the contrary, to try such offenders by Allied Military Courts, arranging wherever possible that the Court shall in such cases be composed of British Officers.

7. If it is decided that trial of offenses committed in occupied territory by British servant women shall take place in Allied Military Courts, the further question arises as to service of terms of imprisonment which may be imposed. All persons convicted by Allied Military Courts serve their sentences in Italian Gaols. It is considered that it would be unjust and add to the punishment if a British subject were made to serve a term of imprisonment in the goal of an occupied country where the language was unknown to him, where gaol conditions were contrary to British conceptions of maintenance and where victimization might result.

8. It is not possible under existing law for a person sentenced to imprisonment by an Allied Military Court to serve such imprisonment in a local or Military establishment. It is also not possible for him to be sent to a goal in British territory unless the law is amended or directions can be given by the British Government which will allow this to be done. The maintenance of a special prison under the control of the Military Governor is legally possible, but not practicable as personnel would probably not be available and no terms might extend beyond the period of occupation. It is recommended that the law be altered so that directions be given which will enable a British

Prisoners appear to serve a sentence in a naval or military establishment or in a civil pool in British territory (e.g. Malta).

9. The whole matter is very urgent as cases are constantly occurring and, whilst serious charges like murder can be dealt with under the War-time Shipping Acts by sending the accused for trial to Malta or some other convenient British territory, this is impracticable in the ordinary day to day cases.

1. The problem of evacuation of refugees from forward areas is daily assuming greater proportions and the provision of transport from the forward areas to a railhead is a serious drain on Army transport.
2. The possibility of sea evacuation has lately been under consideration at this Headquarters, and with the continued onward advance along the East Coast of Italy this method appears to be one which could be utilized with an attendant economy of road transport, as well as railway rolling stock.
3. At present TRIESTE could be utilized as a port and in the near future it is likely that PESCARA could similarly act as a port of embarkation.
4. The organization for the handling of refugees has been successfully tried out in the handling of some 20,000 refugees from the 8 Army area, and this organization is competent to undertake the embarkation of refugees.
5. It is recommended therefore that two L.C.Is. with crews be placed at the disposal of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission personnel now lent to and under command of MG 15 Army Group for the purpose, and that permission be accorded by the appropriate authorities for these craft to ply between TRIESTE and later PESCARA and BARI and/or BRINDISI, which act as Reception and Distribution Centres for refugees under the Italian Government and the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, A.C.C.
6. If L.C.Is. are not available or cannot be authorized for this, it is requested that authority be given for the employment of a suitable Italian steamer for the purpose.



The above CIVIL HOSPITAL was established by decree on the 10th, December 1946 for the purpose to receive and cure the poor who have no possibilities to cure themselves at their own expense.

It has a hospital and a medical department to which the infirmity department was added on the 1st January 1970, the latter being obtained to, principally, by the specialist Dr. Paolo Giamprini, and his files and books used for the infectious diseases.

The hospital kept originally 2 beds, the medical Dept. 20 beds, the maternity Dept. 7 beds and the other rooms 3 beds. There is also the anti-venereal institutions.

The CIVIL Hospital holds the sum of this sum and for this year one received an annual fund sum of 25,000 lire. For all people from other places are also medical specialist payment or free, according to the number of beds available.

For the ill people of the various cities towns, this hospital receives a daily fee as follows: 200 lire twenty-two for medical institutions, 100 lire for medical cases and 100 lire twenty-two for the women who are included in the maternity Dept.

The patients admitted against payment, pay a daily fee of sixteen lire if accompanied in the hospital (for others). 100 lire twenty-five in 2nd class and 100 lire thirty-five in 1st class rooms; 100 lire daily fee, 100 lire for a clinical fee of 100 lire if they use the hospital beds, the cost of medicines and laboratory material, plus the doctor's fees.

The Civil Hospital admits the sum of this term and by this per use
proceeds on annual basis of 15,000 lire. For all people from other

At a meeting with Admiral BARGHI, who is the Italian Minister of the Navy, he declared that he had no motorised vessels, either under 300 tons or of the larger type that could be put at the disposition of AMC. He said that all vessels had already been requisitioned by the British Royal Navy with the exception of 15 sail and motor ships, averaging 150 tons, which are being used by the Italians for the movement of salt from the east coast of Italy to NAPLES and nearby ports.

He pointed out that most of the smaller ships (under 300 tons) which are under the control of the British Navy, are lying idle in nearby ports. He suggested that I call on him at 1200 hours tomorrow, and that we would both approach Admiral ROBINSON, the senior officer of the British Navy on the peninsula, and ask him to release 20 of the smaller transports to AMC, 15 ARMY GROUP.

BARGHI feels rather confident that ROBINSON on hearing our story will be disposed to help us out. However, should we not be successful, BARGHI says that he will turn over to us the ships carrying salt upon a written request from this headquarters.

One coaster, the FERDINANDO II, is to go to NAPLES, and is to report to Major CASE, AMC, Region IV.

Thank you very much for your letter on the Typhus problem of 10th December. We here much appreciate your interest and help on this, and I was particularly glad that ~~you yourself~~ happened to be in Naples at the time and was able to participate in our conference.

It was very difficult to get everybody one wanted to have at that conference which I intentionally rushed in order that action might be initiated immediately, for the local handling had been none too good. There was still an atmosphere of "because electric light and gas had gone no disinfection was possible." I intended that Lt. Col. Chalke should represent Naples area.

There were a large number of American officers present in addition to Lt. Col. Roboe, who up till then had been head of Region III. A. M. G. Fifth Army was represented and Col. Hase, with whom I was living in Naples, was kept in close touch. P. R. S. was not represented.

I welcome the representatives of the U.S. Typhus Commission and experts from the Rockefeller Institute. I go to Naples tomorrow and have called a conference for Saturday, and will endeavour to have this fully representative.

Very latest information is that possession of the CUPRESSO hospital was effected on the 12th December. DDT powder is available. Squads are being instructed in its use. Doctors are being lectured on Typhus - Diagnosis and Control.

I was glad to have Crichton with us - a man of experience, initiative and full of push. May I say that people with Army active service experience are what we want on this forward A. M. G. work in this group, where ability to improvise and get things going at once and not sometime in the future is what counts.

I have received your V. R. report and a report of mine on the situation at Naples seems to have crossed. Here again there is much to be done and the C. C. A. G. has sent off a cable stressing the importance of an early meeting between Brindley Lees and me, which I hope can be arranged very soon, as on the clarification of a few points will depend

the legislation which will be possible. Our Legal and Public Supply people will help, I know.

Other problems of great interest are on evacuation. We have already evacuated over 20,000 refugees from Eighth Army area. It looks as if 20,000 will have to come out of Foggia to make room for MAF as well as on Public Health grounds. Naples region may similarly come into the refugee picture but everything is being laid on.

I hope it will be possible get an Italian medical unit to be at my disposal in the forward areas to look after civil wounded. We cleared 120 out of Eighth Army by train to-day - all seriously wounded. Minor wounded go only as refugees as necessary.

I will let you have a further official, as well as a 'private' report if I may, on my return from Naples, and a few days later I hope to go round the forward area in the Fifth Army. I feel that contact with administrative Medical Officers, American and British, is of the highest importance, so that they can know what A.S.C. medical aims are, even if attainments often fall far short of our expectations.

With best regards and all good wishes to you and your Staff for Xmas and the New Year.

The position as regards hospital accommodation in MOGIA is extremely difficult.

2. This town, with a population at present of some 45,000 civilians, has only one small improvised hospital of 50 beds. The population may be reduced by an evacuation scheme now being undertaken but present proposals only cover some 10,000 - 15,000 persons.

3. At present the Military Forces, including the R.A.P. and A.A.F., occupy buildings which formerly accommodated some 350 civil patients. These are:-

- (a) The Maternity & Infants Hospital now being used as billets for 14 U.K. Field Ambulance presently to be relieved by 151 Field Ambulance;
- (b) The Ospedale Riuniti on the opposite side of the street which accommodates the balance of the personnel of the 14 U.K. Field Ambulance, a section for treatment of sick patients and the staff and patients of the 5 V.D. treatment centre.

4. It is requested that the accommodation of this group be considered and, if it is at all practicable from the military point of view, that a portion of these buildings be liberated for use as a civil hospital to augment the present facilities which are meagre in the extreme.

5. At our recent interview you were kind enough to intimate that problems such as these would have your consideration especially in the light of the probability of typhus fever occurring in the civil population, as it has already in NAPLES, when efficient hospitalisation of cases must be considered of primary importance, not only in the interests of the civil population but also in the interests of the health of the troops and military operations.

1. My Agricultural Division informs me that it is vitally necessary for the hemp Consorzio to retain the use of at least half of the warehouse at Marchionese. Originally, the Quartermaster, P.B.S., thought he would be able to manage with half of the warehouse concerned, but since he has decided he must have it all. General PENCE has ruled it is a military necessity to do so.

2. As it is quite impossible to find any other suitable store in the vicinity large enough to handle the estimated quantity of hemp (up to 5,000 tons) in this area, I consider it vital that one half of the building in question be freed for collection of this strategically vital crop.

3. London and Washington are both greatly interested in our collecting the maximum possible quantity.

4. Owing to the loss of Manila, good hemp as grown in this Region is extremely scarce, and is of extreme importance to the Allies.

Brigadier H. S. Lush, C.M.F., U.S. has taken over command of A.M.S., 15 Army Group with effect from 7th December as Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer. Colonel Spofford was appointed Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer for Regions I and II on 7th December. While I remain, for what I expect will only be a brief period, Chief Civil Affairs Officer 15 Army Group, effective control of Allied Military Government affairs has been assumed by Brigadier Lush and Colonel Spofford under whose administrative direction will therefore fall the officers under your command and those attached to your formations.

In the handing over to two Deputy S.C.A.O.s, my direct association which began with so many A.M.S. officers at Chreva comes to an end. During the past nine months an organization was created, a plan for the military government of occupied territories was evolved, and the government of these territories was set up on a basis hitherto untried in the modern world. Under the instructions received from our Commander in Chief, A.M.S. and to be a Joint Anglo-American enterprise: and this indeed it became. I intended that there should be no difference between American and British officers, and except that certain senior appointments were originally made by the Combined Chiefs of Staff of American and British officers, the successful failure to distinguish between the officers of the two sides has been preserved. In result, A.M.S. has become the most completely fused Anglo-American organization in the Allied Central Mediterranean Forces. I like to think that this tradition is now so well rooted that no wind or weather will uproot the young tree. The credit for establishing the plant is due to all the officers at Chrusa who made the plan and organization of A.M.S.: it is for them and their successors to see that the tree is kept alive to grow and flourish in this and other theatres of war and peace. I myself was satisfied that this could be done; I am satisfied that it has been done, and I am satisfied that the effect may be very great in the years which are to come and far beyond the limits of the Allied Military Government of Italy.

I warned those of you at Chrusa of the difficulties which you would encounter. I laid particular stress on the need for mutual sympathy and understanding and for the necessity of avoiding criticism of each other. I said that the whole was more important than any of the parts and the whole is Anglo-American; not British or American. To the warning about criticism I would now like to add one other; the warning against officers seeking to take credit for their own nationality without giving full measure to the other. That A.M.S. and done has been done by A.M.S. and not by either American or British officers. No one nation can win this war alone; no one nation alone can attempt to reconstruct Europe or even a country. A.M.S. is the first necessary stage in reconstruction by establishing stability in the wake of battle but it is a joint responsibility and enterprise.

A.M.S. has been the subject of some praise and the object of some attack. I believe that the first principles laid down in the instructions issued for the guidance of A.M.S. officers were well served. I quote the opening paragraphs of General Administrative Instruction No. 1:-

2. The formal commands to which you, as a British or American officer are attached, may at any time be either an American or British officer. Your superior Civil Affairs Officer may equally be either American or British. You must understand that there are differences in procedure, custom and outlook between the two sides of which you form a part. It will be for you to see that these differences do not affect the efficiency of your work and in the circumstances form the subject of complaints or scolding. A serious view will be taken by your superior officers of any idle chatter or criticism of any member of the other Force. This Administration constitutes the first attempt at a joint Allied Administration and it is your work, your efficiency, and your attitude of mind which will make the Administration a success or a failure and will serve as a model or a warning for the other Administrations which will have to be built up in other parts of the world.

3. You will be guided in your attitude towards the local population by the policies laid down by the two Governments which are summarized in General Administrative Instruction No. 2.

The general line which will be adopted towards Italian institutions, the Italian people and the Italian Government, is not your concern. It is the concern of your superior officers and then only at a high level. Your job is to administer and not to frame policy or talk politics. You are not to discuss political matters with local Italians. You are not to discuss religious matters.

4. You will administer to the best of your ability with a sense of impartiality and justice, without fear or favour. In administration and especially in the administration of justice, all men and women must be equal for you. You must learn to disregard the nationality of the people whom you are administering, if you are going to be a good administrator. The principles of good administration are the same in all countries and for all people. They are the preservation of law, order and justice, the prevention of disease and disaster, the removal of fear and the creation of co-operation and peace. To these, for a military government, is added as the first duty, to assist in the prosecution of the war by enabling the High Command to reduce garrison troops for use elsewhere and to provide, within the resources of the country whatever materials are available, which will assist in the prosecution of the war. For obvious reasons economic development must take a second place and can only occur within the limits of transport and of military requirements.

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I do not believe that any of our critics can impugn these principles and that, therefore, the personnel of A.M.G. which has followed these principles need be in no fear of attack. But if these principles are wrong or if the directives about their application have been wrong or insufficient, then the fault is mine since I myself wrote those paragraphs and gave the directions concerning their application.

In the senior officers who remain directly in charge of A.M.G. operations I have complete confidence that they will carry on the same traditions as have hitherto obtained. I leave in their hands the care of the officers who began with us in Creva and the way I do not know who have since joined, with the knowledge that they will be cared for and helped. I have known Brigadier Lush and Colonel Spofford long enough to be confident that A.M.G. is in good hands.

I shall be glad if this letter can be brought to the attention of all officers serving under your command.

The Italian Admiral of the Marine Reg in Crotone has advised us that on the basis of an "accurate and up to date" chart, the harbor of Crotone can accommodate one ship of 8,000 tons, 5 of 6,000 and 1 of 3,000 at the same time. The maximum depth along the quay side is said to be 31 ft. The senior ASST officer at Crotone stresses the fact that this information is from Italian sources only and suggests that fresh soundings be taken, preferably by the Royal Navy, before attempting to bring in ships of considerable draft.

I refer to your telegram 1508 of 17th December 1943.

2. I should be glad to know the policy underlying the removal of the Prince of Pleasant from Naples and the retention there of Count Sforza. From the Administrative point of view (and A.M.C. 15 Army Group concerns itself with administration rather than politics) the presence of the Prince in the Naples area was not undesirable. It is true that he resisted evulsion from his villa but he has presented no administrative problems. Count Sforza, on the other hand, has a tendency to make utterances and write articles directed against the King and his present government which, in an operational area such as Naples, cannot but disturb tranquility and might create disorder.

3. Such being the case, and in view of our avowed intention of allowing the Italian people free to make their own choice in the matter of their rulers I find difficulty in understanding the policy of removing one and allowing the other to remain.

Proclamation 14.

Afternoon your letter 28/11/52 of 11 Dec, I agree that Proclamation 14 leaves a gap as far as D.L.O.s in Army Area are concerned. This was unavoidable as the form of the Proclamation was brought to me more or less as a 'fait accompli' by Col. Chandler and Co. Majors and it would have meant entirely new drafting to meet the situation in Army Area.

2. The 1944 Act, in law, the power of examination of all records where the retention does not exceed two years or 10,000 lbs, and, I believe I am correct, Col. Chandler delegated his powers to you in Army Area. I have no intention of disturbing that delegation, which is still a fact. I have not given the same delegation to D.L.O. 4 Army as he himself has on many of the cases, and if you should try any cases in future, they should be sent here for examination. The statute of 28 Nov therefore stands good.

3. The alteration to Article 3 of Proclamation 14 was made at the express wish of General Alexander when it was submitted to him for signature. I think that it will be best to reprint Proclamation 14 as amended by Article 3 of Proclamation 14. It will have to be reprinted again. Will you and Miller undertake the printing in Naples as the facilities are layless here? I think we should have 15,000 copies.

1. From paras. 3 and 4 of your letter it seems that there has been a misunderstanding over the question of Lt. Col's appointments at your H.Q. I can find no record here that this question was discussed when C.C.A.C. 8 Army visited this H.Q. and there was no note made against Major Millard's name. When your GSO.1 left here he was given a memo of all notes which had been made and Major Millard's name was not included on that.
2. However, when the total global W.E. for AMG is approved application will be made for your allocation therefrom to include one additional British Lt. Col. in place of one American Lt. Col., such alteration to be ante-dated to the effective date of the W.E.
3. With regard to para. 7 of your letter, the discrepancy between the numbers of British and American officers at AMG 5 and 8 Armes occurs mainly in the lower ranks. 





Lord Rennell has asked me to reply to the letter which you sent to him on 7th December, reporting certain observations which General Picche of the Carabinieri brought up when you met him that day.

With regard to the question of responsibility and the division thereof between the Carabinieri and the Questori, I have spoken to Lieut-Colonel Pollock, who states that the matter is fully recognised. In practice it normally works out satisfactorily. As regards the future, no difficulties other than local troubles which we have had up to the present are anticipated.

With reference to paragraph 3 of your letter, dealing with interference by Allied Forces among the police, this has unfortunately happened in a certain number of instances. It is difficult to prevent the Armed Forces acting on their own, particularly in forward areas. The case of the Naples promotion is being dealt with by Lieut-Colonel Pollock.

I am obliged to you for bringing up these various matters and have had, since you wrote, a good talk with General Picche on future planning, when we were also able to consider some of his troubles which you mention in your letter.

3. We have no officer at this Hq. we can spare for this work and I suggested that if you thought suitable you should endeavour to obtain Lt. Burrows from AMG 8 Army. I understand that he is mentally unsuited for work with AMG 8 Army and that, I have no doubt, would be willing to loan him to you.
