



The following copy of letter received from AMG REGION 4 Adv is forwarded for information and appropriate action:

"The following report has been received from the SCAO FOGGIA Province.

Will you please instruct the Group concerned that they are not allowed to send transport into FOGGIA Province for the purpose of making purchases of this kind?

"On 28 Dec 43, at about 1400 hrs, S.C.A.O. and S.C.A.P.O. of this province stopped a 10-ton Italian Air Force truck No. RA 13331 in charge of Tenente TRIDICI, Cnlo, on the road between SANPAOLO CIVITATO and SORRECARICIGLIA. The truck was loaded with Salt and proceeding North. Tenente TRIDICI produced a document signed "COLONELIO GIVERZA, Gruppo Rifornimenti e Trasporti, 102 Squadrilla at LEGGE", authorising him to make purchases for the Officers and Under-Officers Mess in a large number of provinces not including FOGGIA.

Tenente TRIDICI had purchased salt for coal at MARGHERITA DI SAVOIA and stated he was going to CAMPOBASSO to buy flour, meat, vegetables and Olive Oil. He was sent immediately back to FOGGIA where he reported at the time stated. He was then given written instructions to leave the province by 1200 hrs 29 Dec and to make no purchases of any kind within the Province."

1. R.A.F. 2nd echelon letter 025/R/3 Gren Gds dated 14. 00. 43 (received here today via R.A.F. Region II) states that they require this man to appear before a Medical Board and, if found to be AF, he is to be posted immediately to 5 GRUEN.GRS.

2. The reasons given for boarding this soldier are that :

- (a) at a previous medical board he is alleged to have made a false statement about being wounded during evacuation from France in June 1940. In fact records show that he was repatriated from France in Feb. 40 as under age and that in June 40 he was serving with Holding Bn GRUEN.GRS., and
- (b) on 11 Mar. 42 he was convicted of "feigning infirmity" i.e. reporting to the M.C. that he was suffering from a pulled leg muscle when in fact he was fit."

3. You should therefore apply at once to ADMS 151 sub-area to arrange for Odsm STANFIELD to be medically boarded. Please inform this R.A.F. when this has been done.

I suggested he investigate on his return whether this supplementary ration had been allowed for in requisitions for flour filed by Region 3 through Lt. Col. Marwall with APHQ.
2. In view of the large arrivals in Region 3 in the later part of December and scheduled for January, the issuance of such supplementary ration should be possible.

Whereas by Proclamation No. 6 of the General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in Occupied Territory, a general limitation on wages was declared, and the Allied Military Government was given power in Article II thereof to alter rates of wage;

Now, therefore, I DECREE HEREBY, Colonel, General Staff Corps,
United States Army, Regional Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I

WAGE ADJUSTMENT FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES

(1) Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State Province, Commissariat, Public Estates, and Public Institutions and Concerns (Agencies) which are administered by any of the foregoing government units shall receive a temporary wage adjustment which shall be calculated upon the base of present total salaries (base plus ordinary and extraordinary indemnities which normally represent an integral part of their total salary) as described in Article IV below.

(2) The adjustment specified in paragraph (1) above shall become effective as of 1 December 1945.

ARTICLE II

REGULATORY WAGE ADJUSTMENT FOR PRIVATE EMPLOYEES

(1) Private employers may now grant increases in both salaries and wages with effect from the date of this order which shall not exceed the percentages described in Article IV hereof. Such increases shall be calculated upon the salaries and wages fixed by in the Collective Labour Contracts which were in effect upon the first day of September, 1942. However, within the limits of the city of Naples the said percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage so fixed plus the intensity of increases. These increases shall in no way affect or be effected by the economic position.

(2) Any increases of salaries and wages which were received by any employees after the first day of September 1942 shall not be included for the purpose of calculating the percentage increases specified in Article IV hereof which are permitted herein.

(3) Any disputes which arise between employers and employees under this Article

- (ii) The adjustments specified in paragraph (i) above shall become effective as of 1 December 1943.

ARTICLE II

INITIATIVE WAGE ADJUSTMENT FOR PRIVATE ESTATES

- (i) Private employers may now grant increases in both salaries and wages with effect from the date of this Order which shall not exceed the percentages described in Article IV hereto. Such increases shall be calculated upon the salaries and wages fixed by the Collective Labour Contracts which were in effect upon the last day of September⁴, 1942. However, within the limits of the city of Naples the said percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage so fixed plus the "incentivity of production". These increases shall in no way affect or be effected by the Accordi Partitari.
- (ii) Any increases of salaries and wages which were received by any employees after the first day of September 1942 shall not be included for the purpose of calculating the percentage increase specified in Article IV hereto which are permitted herein.
- (iii) Any disputes which arise between employers and employees under this Article shall be adjusted in accordance with the provisions of Regional Order No 1 for the region of Campania and Naples issued by the Allied Military Government and which become operative upon the 10th day of December 1943.

ARTICLE III

REDUCTION IN BUDGETS OF ALLIED FORCES

This Order does not apply to persons directly employed by branches of the Allied Armed Forces or by contractors rendering service to said forces.

ARTICLE IV

SCALE OF WAGE ADJUSTMENT

The foregoing provisions shall be applied in accordance with the following scale:

(44) In respect to salaries or wages which exceed L. 5,000 per month, no increase in excess of L. 1900 shall be granted.

ARTICLE V

PENALTIES

Any person violating any provisions of this order shall upon conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to punishment by imprisonment or fine or both.

ARTICLE VI

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Order will become operative in each of the provinces of Naples, Avellino and Benevento on the 11th day of December 1943.

Supply situation west side of APENNINES which was serious in late December has been eased by arrival of U.S. 26 and U.S. 35 with 10,300 tons of supplies of which 17,900 in flour. This represents one month's supplies for the 4,000,000 people in the RAISED VALLEYS area. 30,000 will continue to be supplied from RAISEN despite heavier traffic flow.

Supply situation on east of APENNINES based wholly on locally grown foodstuffs continues easy. Principal problem is basis for securing POZzuLA grain surpluses and shipping forward. AMG has requested return of all stocks from imported wheat/flour to U.S. We are surveying POZzuLA needs before replying. Need for soap and caustic soda continues acute. Italian C.I.P. organization established by Strategic Section, PLATOON, is not succeeding in effecting distribution of P.O.L., especially in forward areas.

The organisation of refugees from the forward areas is now under review here. In view of the increase in the number of refugees some reorganisation seems likely at hand, and it has been decided to create a new section in A.E. 15 Army Group to deal with this.

2. This section will be represented at Army and Regional H.Q. and all the officer personnel is being found from existing staffs, or from officers whose removal is imminent. These officers will come under the immediate command of S.C.C.U. and R.D.A.O. of Armies and Regions respectively.

3. The re-organisation further envisages the creation of Staging Centres in Army Areas and Large Camps at railheads. The establishment of these Centres is necessitated by the lengthening lines of communication, and the difficulty of sending railheads forward owing to destruction by enemy.

Up to the present it has been possible to utilise for forward staging Centres P.O.W. Camps in Army Areas, but it is felt here that it is desirable that the refugee organisation should be completely independent as regards tonnage, accommodation stores and camp personnel, from the P.O.W. organisations. It seems certain that with large number of P.O.W. refugees could not possibly be handled at the same time at the same place unless the numbers of refugees were negligible, which seems unlikely.

4. Therefore it is requested that authority be given to draw tonnage and accommodation stores from British or American sources for 2000 people. This should be divisible into four units of 500 each, two of which would be used in the 5 and 8 Army area respectively.

5. Intelligence and medical screening of these refugees is essential. Trained with the occurrence of typhus this medical screening assumes a paramount importance if a widespread epidemic is to be prevented. It is considered this can be done effectively only at some Staging Centres where the organisation for handling refugees is more complete. Such Centres must be sufficiently large to enable refugees to be retained sufficiently long for these screenings, but in addition the size must be governed by the fact that operational "Incoming Block" will occur due to losses in the arrangements for the reception of refugees in the back areas. This latter organisation will be the concern of the Director of Refugees A.M.G. Other additional areas which cannot be incorporated are

Corps in Army Areas, but it is felt here that it is desirable that the refugee organisation should be completely independent as regards tonnage, accommodation stores and camp personnel, from the P.O.W. organisations. It seems certain that with large number of P.O.W. refugees could not possibly be handled at the same time at the same place unless the numbers of refugees were negligible, which seems unlikely.

Therefore it is requested that authority be given to draw tonnage and accommodation stores from British or American sources for 20,000 people. This should be divisible into four units of 5,000 each, two of which would be used in the 5 and 8 Army area respectively.

1701

Intelligence has noted screening of these refugees is essential. Indeed with the occurrence of typhus this medical screening becomes paramount. In view of a widespread epidemic it is to be presumed. It is considered this can be done effectively only at some Staging Corps where the organisation for handling refugees is more complete. Such Corps must be sufficiently large to enable refugees to be retained sufficiently long for these screenings. In addition the size must be governed by the fact that occasional "leaving back" will occur due to hitches in the arrangements for the reception of refugees in the back areas. This latter organisation will be the concern of the Director of Refugees, A.C.C. Other difficulties which cannot be dissociated are such things as train interruptions for various reasons.

7. It is, therefore, recommended that accommodation in tonnage and/or latticing with requisition Camp stores, should be provided for a minimum of 5,000 and a maximum of 10,000 at each of two selected railheads, one in 5 and 8 Army Area (or convenient thereto), respectively. Stores be suggested for 8 Army Area and a site in the vicinity of, but not in, Naples in the case of 5 Army is now being explored. In the case of the 8 Army it is strongly recommended that accommodation now considered by 209 P.D. Unit should be released to A.D. 15 Army Group. In the case of 5 Army complete tonnage and accommodation stores for 5,000 people is requested.

8. Personnel for these Corps will be found from 100,000 sources.

9. There are many other factors to be considered in this reorganisation scheme, but the primary ones in so far as the forward areas are concerned, are those connected with administration and accommodation, and if these requests receive favourable consideration a grant stop forward will have been taken to facilitate the completion of these unhappy victims of circumstances.

Your letter of Jan 1 reached me today only.

1. From the security point of view I do not attach much importance to the news of the Bari Raid or the explosion at Naples. The details of the Bari Raid were broadcast by the R.B.C. in December and are at any rate common knowledge in King's Italy and I expect elsewhere. The explosion in Naples must be common knowledge everywhere (except at my HQ to which it has not yet been reported). You may allay any feelings of anxiety among the staff of PBS on this score.
2. The incitement to violence is an offence and should be dealt with under Section 21 of Article I of Proclamation 2, and should be dealt with accordingly.
3. Action should and must be taken on purely administrative lines for the preservation of public order. You should explain this shortly and succinctly through the Press etc. There is no discrimination against one party or the other and law and order must be maintained. On no account should the explanation be apologetic.
4. I am not in favour of seeking the intervention of the Advisory Council. This is an administrative matter, purely and simply, and there is no need to deal with it at any other level.
5. You should report the action taken and the result of judicial proceedings.

It will be remembered that Section 2, Article 2 of
Proclamation 5 reads as follows :

"Effect of Moratorium. During the period of the moratorium, obligations affected by this proclamation are suspended and extended for the said period. No rights or powers shall be exercised at any time with respect to such obligations solely by reason of their non-performance as a result of this proclamation, nor shall any interest accrue during the period of such moratorium. Subject to the extension hereby granted, all such obligations shall be of full force and effect upon the termination of such moratorium. The moratorium shall not apply to obligations entered into in any place within the occupied territory after the date on which this proclamation shall come into force in such place."

2. The provision that interest shall not accrue during the period of the moratorium has never failed to arouse considerable discussion among the staff of the Finance and Legal Divisions. The object of those who drafted the proclamation was to cause the minimum hardship and disturbance, but it is not certain that this laudable object has been achieved.

3. The wording of a proclamation is not sacrosanct; and if the existing ruling is wrong, it can and will be changed. In order to assess general opinion on the question, I shall be most grateful if you will inform me of your own views; and those of competent Italians representing both bankers and clients.

4. Will you state this situation to AGO and request the reiteration of their demand for the return of all seeds from imported flour to the U.S., at least until we have obtained enough seeds from imports to secure the PUGLIA surplus.

Referring to your 3092/13/A.1 of 3 Jan 44, we are fully aware of the burden and inconvenience which may be imposed upon the C.M.F. and C.I.D. by the attendance of their personnel at A.G Courts. We must, nevertheless, conduct the proceedings in accordance with the letter and spirit of the regulations of the Military Governor, and we are satisfied that the position of A.G's representative in Region 3, as it is described in your second paragraph, is the only permissible interpretation of those regulations.

2. The A.G proposal summarized in your third paragraph recognizes the importance of no administering the business of our courts so as to cause the least possible hardship to military witnesses. At the same time it avoids the unacceptable practice of receiving written evidence against an accused when the witness himself is available to testify. It should not be justified in altering procedures to any greater extent than has been suggested by Region 3.

The attached table shows a comparison of allocations of fuel made by GEP back from reports turned over to them under direction of Gen Sec., April 1944, Min Tech to the six provinces concerned, with the amounts actually delivered against this allocation.

It will be noted that there is no written variance between allocations and deliveries, but that in most cases deliveries are markedly below allocations. This is, I suppose, due to the administration of certain areas among the six provinces listed. In the case of POKA deliveries are consistently far below allocations. Only 32% of the gasoline was delivered, 9% of the kerosene, and 29% of the diesel.

A great number of reasons are cited by Stg. Marjoribanks 761, Director of GEP, POKA, for his failure to deliver as promised. It can not be denied, nor is it the function of this office to determine the validity of his claims. An investigation should be instituted by Petroleum Section A. G. Please see this is done. The full time services of a Petroleum Section representative at least to progress the shipment of fuel would facilitate the situation. Subject to the results of this investigation, it may be found necessary also to review the present director. The essential civil services of POKA require constant attention to operate without fail, and it is the responsibility of the Petroleum Section to see that the necessary supplies arrive.

1. The attached table gives a comparison of allocations of oil, made by OTC that have been turned over to them under direction of the Board, with the six "priorities" assigned, with the amounts actually delivered against this allocation.

2. It will be noted that there is no correspondence between allocations and deliveries, but that in most cases delivery has already belated allocations. This is, in resounding farce, a confirmation of OTC's signs assure the importers listed, in the order of priority, deliveries are consistently far below allocations. Only 31 of the supplies can delivered, 9 of the imports, and 29 of the others.

3. A recent number of reasons are cited by Mr. Margerison, Director of OTC, just, for his failure to deliver as promised, and not been possible, notwithstanding the promises of this Board, to meet with the validity of this claim. An investigation should be instituted by Petroleum Section Section 12, OTC, to determine whether or not the representations of OTC would agree with the statement of this investigation. It may be found necessary also to make a present investigation Section 10, and it is the responsibility of the Board to determine what action, if any, should be taken to redress the situation. Please see this to do. The Public Relations Department, OTC, should be advised of this situation.

1. I enclose copy of a letter addressed to the Commander in Chief, Mediterranean, by the Flag Officer, Western Italy.
2. I agree with his conclusions in paragraph 4 that circumstances arise when only immediate payment in cash rather than requisition will produce the desired supplies.
3. The subject of local banking facilities by the Royal Navy is a decision which rests either with the C. in C. Mediterranean or the Admiralty. Personally I can see no objection to opening an account at the local branch of the Banca d'Italia, whose liquidity is guaranteed by the Italian Government; and in the ultimate analysis by R.H.Q. or A.G.C.
4. The criticisms in 5a, b and c that small denomination notes and unnumbered low series R.M.A. notes have largely aided to the work in Naples should no longer be valid in future operations.
5. I do not approve the proposal in paragraph 7 that a new ad hoc institution be formed to take care of Navy disbursements. If the present system proves an undesirable burden, I would much prefer to see the use of the Banca d'Italia who I am sure would be pleased to provide the facilities required.
6. I am sending a copy of the Flag Officer's letter to the Command Paymaster, No. 8 Command Pay Office, G.H.Q. to ask for his views; and I enclose a further copy in case you should wish to consult the Deputy Paymaster in Chief, A.A.G., who has previously discussed the question. Brigadier General Simms may also like to comment.

The Italian Gov. has appointed the committee of suggestion
concerning the solution of the increasingly difficult problem of
developing the form of a new census within the occupied territory
under the corporative form of government.

It is proposed to establish a commission of General type
which will proceed to ascertain that the theory based on individuality,
which is prevalent in the U.S.A., has failed to do this, and that
that the enforcement of the corporative representation of the military
authorities would be efficient at the time of the assessment of the Italian
Government in Italy and from consideration of the nature thereof and that said
assessment, in Germany, could give opportunity between parts of the law of
the former which the result of the assessment of the Italian Government, namely by the
census and specific procedure may be substituted in form to such
theory.

In view of the situation itself, of course, the general
status of the country, circumstances exist during and prior to the
time being along the lines of agreement. It seems clear that no
arrangement of this sort would be in the interests of the population. It
would be of value to obtain from the whole sufficient time adequate and
useful measure of existing improved Italian legislation. It would
assist the Italian Government in making it entirely clear that laws of
the Government are to be observed in areas over which it is proposed to have
sovereignty. The proposal concerned it would have the merit of reducing
the theoretical scope of legislation as carried on to persons from the
area of the members.

The purpose of the agreement would be to assist by the very
short period upon which the two countries have been in contact between Italy, Spain and
the Italian Government. In so far as the agreement is made it would
have the effect of consolidating all proposed certain
arrangements, where it is known that some of policy are involved and
an other Italian arrangement, where arrangements are to be made in regards to
arrangements to designate, specifically. It would be interesting to our Government
to see how far the participation in the administrative problems did not result
in the short period of time.

If you think that there is merit in this proposal I would be
very glad to have you advise at what earliest possible moment to discuss
