SUBJECT: Reserve of Carabinieri from PW Camps.

Reference is made to the attached copy of a letter from HQ., AMG, 15 Army Group.

1. In view of the reported disbandment by the Germans of Carabinieri units in Rome, and the likelihood that the same policy will be adopted by them elsewhere in Northern Italy, it is considered important that every endeavour should be made to form a reserve of Carabinieri under Allied control.
2. The organisation of such a reserve, and the transportation of CC.RR personnel from North Africa to the Italian Mainland, will require an appreciable time, and it is therefore requested that this Section may be informed, as a matter of urgency, of the numbers of Carabinieri held in North Africa who can be transferred to Italy.

This is especially true not only because of the season of the year but because of the urgent epidemic situation in Naples and the need for observing any signs of spread.

Dear Colonel Kirk,

I enclose for such action as you may deem necessary four documents which have been brought to this Head-quarters by Gen. Piecho's liaison Officer, Capt. Brunch.

All of these concern Legion II but in view of our proximity to Gen. Piecho's Headquarters he finds it more convenient to bring them to us rather than to communicate with you through official channels.

No. 1 and 2 relate to the transfer of a non-commissioned staff over which the higher command of the C.G.R.R. wish to make, for reasons stated, but which is opposed by the S.C.A.O. Masters.

No. 3 concerns the refusal of the local military police to allow the removal of a certain motor car from Latvia.

Gen. Piecho wishes to say that he agrees with this suggestion and is taking action accordingly. Although he does not raise the question, you may not altogether approve the peremptory tone of this letter.

For your information I may add that the I.D.C.U.C. has instructed me to prepare a directive for units operating in this Army Group area indicating the procedure to be followed regarding appointments, transfers and removals of N.C.O. personnel. #906

SUBJECT:- Milk Rations.

1. Milk is not indicated as a relief food for the population as a whole, nor would it probably be accepted by the Italians.
2. Where milk has been rationed in Italy, priority has been given to babies, expectant and nursing mothers, the sick, and certain individuals in hazardous occupations.
3. The provisions in the AMGOT Manual are for milk to all children up to 12 years, expectant and nursing mothers, and the sick. This seems to be an impossibly generous range at the present time.
4. The daily ration is generally considered to be one pint or its equivalent in condensed milk, evaporated milk, or milk powder.
5. From the medical standpoint milk is most needed as a supplementary food during infancy, adolescence, and pregnancy and lactation. Cheese is accepted by the older age groups and from the standpoint of shipping provides more food value (1 lb cheese = 2,200 calories; 1 lb evaporated milk = 670 calories).
6. If milk is to be distributed to the Italian population, this should be given out by priority groups in adequate amounts (1 pint or equivalent per day). The following priority groups are recommended:-
  - (a) Infants 0 - 5 years.
  - (b) Nursing and Pregnant Mothers.
  - (c) Sick and Invalids.
  - (d) Children 3 - 5 years.
  - (e) Children 10 - 15 years.
7. When small quantities of milk are being distributed, local authority should have the option of deciding who shall receive them.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of a list of buildings in Italy which the G.I.C., A.G.C., has sent me. Those under heading "A" enjoy diplomatic immunity under the Lussern Treaty. The G.I.C. advises me that AGHQ is issuing an order with respect to these properties which will provide that they are under no circumstances to be occupied or interfered with in any way except for reasons of absolute military necessity in actual battle.

2. The buildings listed in List "B" are enumerated in Article 16 of the Lussern Treaty and are exempt from taxation and expropriation by the Italian Government under Article 16 of the Lussern Treaty. That fact would under International Law seem to remove them from our power of requisitioning, but it is understood that the C.H.F. Directive will also deal with this matter.

This Headquarters was called upon yesterday by Col. King of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission in Bari who was in search of delousing powder and equipment for Jugo Slav refugees.

1. At the present time these refugees are disembarking at Bari, as many as 2000 in a day and after an over-night stop go on to Brindisi for sorting and disposition. Not all of these can be expeditiously shipped to Brindisi and a portion is therefore lodged in a P.G.W. Camp here.

2. From the medical standpoint these refugees should be disinfected before mingling with other population groups. Therefore, the request seems justified, there being no other available facilities for their care.

There is an error in the owner's address, which is printed as "57 and 56, Lower Thames St" instead of "56 & 57 Lower Thames Street". False bottom permits it to contain oil to a depth of 1.5". The lower part of the tin is filled with HB. The bomb is set off by a detonator inserted in the HB and connected to an electrical dry-battery through a clock delay device.

2. Information from a source recently in contact with the enemy, which has proved reliable in the past and which it is of paramount importance to safeguard, indicates that this device is likely to be used behind allied lines, most probably in Italy. It is requested that the necessary warning be issued.

3. If any instances of the device being used come to notice, it is requested that this be informed by signal, and that a copy of the investigation report, together with photographs if possible, be forwarded to this B. as soon as practicable thereafter.

The following is a paraphrase of Signals No. 33287 of 12.Jan.64, and No. 33288 of 14.Jan.64 on the above subject.

1. The following measures will be adopted in the treatment of diplomatic and consular personnel and premises unless further instructions are received from the State Department.

2. DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR OFFICES.

(1) The diplomatic and consular officials of Germany, Japan, Hungary, Bulgaria, Poland and Finland will be detailed. Very necessary steps to prevent their escape will be taken but they will be treated with courtesy. Instructions for their disposal will be issued by S.C.A.O. which must immediately be informed of their apprehension.

(2) In embassy, legation or consular premises belonging to the countries mentioned in (1) above, will not be entered or searched unless proof is available that diplomatic privilege is being abused. Such abuse includes hostile acts committed from the premises, use of W.A. transmitters, storage of war material other than the amount allowed in the mission currency, laying of explosive charges and similar acts.

(3) Private residences of diplomatic officials of countries mentioned in (1) will not be entered or searched except if abuse of diplomatic privilege can be proved. The private residences of consular officials may be entered and searched and papers of interest may be impounded. Domestic archives found on the premises must, however, be considered insure, only papers of interest can be removed from such premises which will not be requisitioned or seized, but will be sealed and left pending taking over by the protecting power.

(4) Every effort should be made to protect from wanton damage all embassy and legation premises, and the private residences of officials on the embassy, legation and consular staffs. Other considerations permitting guards will be provided pending the protecting power taking over.

(5) In the case of Finland, as no state of war exists between the U.S.A. and that country, action outlined above should be carried out by British troops rather than Finns.

(5) In the case of Finland, as no state of war exists between the U.S.A. and that country, action outlined above should be carried out by British troops rather than liaison.

2. Occupied Countries.

Diplomatic privilege is not held to be operative in the case of Vichy France or the puppet National Government. Officials will be treated as in peace. A (1) and premises may be requisitioned and searched.

C. Neutral States.

Representatives of neutral states will be treated at all times with the greatest courtesy. They enjoy full diplomatic and consular privileges. Unless there is clear proof that abuse of privilege is taking place not under the officials nor the personal interests of officials of neutral countries will be entered.

## 3. (c) Short history of several recent incidents.

- (i) The convolution of recent history occurred twice very recently. First, the FBI was traditionally suspicious, and too soon. They wanted to be working well and analysis had not yet come. The leading factor has been shown to be information from outside sources. This directly links both historically because in the case previously mentioned, prior to which the former agents were local and prepared for their immediate investigation, it was suggested to FBI, and the local agent went off to interview informants in order to get information from the FBI and to continue research. In contrast, or conversely, there was no direct information from the FBI and to some extent, not necessarily because of their capabilities, since local members of their type do not often interface with them. It is also important to note that during this period, the FBI was not necessarily informed, although the central police, the FBI became increasingly suspicious during the duration of the case, and more FBI. The FBI has tended to have been beyond the control of local police forces.
- (ii) There is evidence of civilian military personnel in the Army whom an informant knew (name of informant). In spite of the only available information concerning these areas,

1. The necessity of removing colored troops from Naples.  
In this city, due to the great poverty, there is a great deal of  
prostitution. The colored soldier who is able to possess a  
white woman will be a dangerous element for your country, when he  
returns to the United States.

If colored troops constitute labor battalions, employ  
them right behind the lines.

2. Up to date 15,000 Italian soldiers are still employed  
as port workers. It would be more convenient not to avail ourselves  
of these soldiers, but to employ civilians; such a move would alleviate  
to some extent the great unemployment problem which exists in Naples.

3. Col. Kinkaid pointed out to me that, with a certain  
amount of work, the hotels of Naples could be put back in order. I  
believe that the Society of Grand Hotels should be contacted so that this  
may be done; the state would help out with loans. There would thus  
be available billets for the Allies, consequently decreasing the burden  
upon the inhabitants.

- In the last few days there has been a steady increase in the number of Welsh refugees who have had to be evacuated from the forward areas of the 5th Army front. Plans must be made to meet a considerable increase on both army fronts in the future.
2. The arrangements I have made and the steps I have detailed for the orderly handling of this flow can only function if adequate accommodation and transport facilities are forthcoming. These are as follows:
    - a. It will be appreciated that quite apart from the historical and political considerations which make it imperative that my refugee organization should be in a position to meet with accommodation and catering both operational and hygienic requirements more than satisfactory provision of the facilities required of permanent importance.
    - b. The plan evolved by my Chief Transportation Officer includes the utilization of staging accommodation in the forward areas with a capacity of 2000 and two base camps with a capacity of 1000 each, one at Pwllgarn, and the other in the Llanelli area within easy striking distance of the railway, or, if required, be reached to feed with a flow which may exceed the rail capacity, within reach of an embarkation point.
    - c. The most suitable, indeed the only accommodation available at present, is the listed camp now occupied by 309 G. O. S. unit. This has at present a refugee capacity of about 2000 which will have to be enlarged by the provision of tents.
    - d. In the Rhondda area are two sites which could be used. One is **No. 2 Post Office** which I understand is slightly to become a "A" hospital and the other is the **Abertillery Hospital** which is to be converted into a refugee hospital. If one of these two were made available the amount of tentage required would be reduced by several thousands. Realizing this, tentage will be required for the full 10,000 for erection on a site outside the town and **all** stores and services will be required to supply the units.
    - e. In the Rhondda area forward staging accommodation is at present being provided by **•** cages at Cwrtcauau, Cwrtcauau and Llanelli, but no officers are to any extent using these facilities on sufficient occasions, and the

1. A re-organization of the Italian Police has recently been effected in German occupied Italy. There has been created a centralized police force which is to replace the various independent "police" organizations. This force is known as the National Republican Guard and has been formed by merging the U.V.S.N., the C.R.R and the P.A.I. (Italian African Police.)
2. The task of this new force, which is to co-operate closely with the Guardia di Finanza Sicurezza is "to defend the constitution of the State against internal enemies, and to ensure the personal safety of Italian citizens, and to see to the orderly development of private and collective activities".
3. In order to carry out these functions with greater facility a proposed decree has been drawn up for the re-constitution of the notorious Public Tribunals for the defence of the State. Moreover, the old "Squadre d'azione" (militia Squads) which were used in the early days of Fascism to burn out opponents of the party, particularly the Communists, with carbon oil and gasoline, have been revived by Savolini, the Fascist Party Secretary.
4. It is not anticipated that the National Republican Guard will prove a very successful expedient since it is composed of elements that are bound to conflict. The C.R.R because of their tradition and prestige; and the special prerogatives given them by the Crown, cannot feel the same sense of loyalty to this new organization, nor can they feel disposed to co-operate willingly with the militia whom they have always regarded with a certain degree of disapprovement. Those Carabinieri who have been drawn into this new organization were probably mainly influenced by the fear of losing their employment or of persecution, and it is likely that they are mostly merely acquiescent to the new state of affairs. In any case they are not trusted by the Germans to carry out any duties other than those of public order.
5. Many of the C.R.R have been arrested and put into concentration camps while many escaped into the mountains with arms and ammunition. Reports state that large numbers of the Carabinieri of Tuscany, Umbria and Val d'Aosta have reported to this exiled.
6. In Rome as in other major cities, the C.R.R have been completely relieved

Those Carabinieri who have been drawn into the new organization were probably mainly influenced by the fear of losing their employment or of persecution, and it is likely that they are mostly merely "convenient to the new state of affairs". In any case they are not trusted by the Germans to carry out any duties other than those of public order.

5. Many of the G.C.A.s have been arrested and put into concentration camps while many escaped into the mountains with arms and ammunition. Reports state that large numbers of the Carabinieri of Italy, Turkey and Val d'Aosta have resorted to this expedient.

6. In Rome as in other major cities, the G.C.R.K. have been completely relieved of their duties, and SS Troops, aided by Fascist police units, are responsible for the normal police functions. It is known that the P.A.I. are taking part in the administration of public order in Rome, and from ~~other~~ sources it would appear that they are carrying out those duties with energy and zeal.

7. TASSONI has been appointed chief of police in Rome. He is a ruthless Fascist and very pro-German, but was held in disavour by Mussolini. Since his appointment as chief of police 60 prominent Fascists, including the Secretary of the party in Rome, have been rounded up by the P.A.I., and imprisoned because of their lukewarm attitude and non-cooperation.

The Carabinieri (CC.RR) have for the most part performed their functions as the only effective police force in Sicily and Italy remarkable well since the occupation. They have maintained their state of efficiency (according to Italian standards) and loyalty to their country as opposed to any particular party and have worked in close cooperation with A.M.G. officials. It is largely due to them that order has been maintained.

2. It is essential that they should receive from the Allied Forces all the support and assistance which can be given to them. This unfortunately has not always been afforded and there have been many instances in which troops have either obstructed them or diminished their authority by thoughtless actions. There have been many cases of where the Carabinieri barracks in towns have been occupied by troops and the Carabinieri forced literally to live from hand to mouth.

3. I propose to deal with the first difficulty by an explanatory article in the Allied newspapers but I would ask that in the combat areas the Carabinieri barracks should not be occupied except in emergency and that on the L.C. they should not be occupied at all. Unless this is done, it will be impossible to reorganise the Carabinieri into an effective force for the preservation of law and order, a duty which will then have to fall on to troops who should be otherwise engaged.

The record of proceedings of the General Military Court which sits at Santa Maria di Vico on 6 and 7 January, 1947, and convicted the three defendants of the offence of spying and communicating with the enemy has been examined and reviewed by the General Officer Commanding in Chief, 15 Army Group, and Military Governor of Occupied Territory.

2. The findings of the court have been confirmed, as have the death sentences imposed upon SERROLI Mario and CALABRIE Luigi. The sentence of death imposed upon CIVILLI Giovanni has been commuted to a sentence of twenty (20) years imprisonment. The record together with the confirmation and communication of sentence is enclosed herewith.
3. I understand that the responsibility for the execution of the death sentence is that of Fifth Army. You will please inform the Commanding General of the decision of the Military Governor in order that an order for the execution of sentence may be promptly prepared by Fifth Army and carried out. A copy of the order and the certificate of execution should be attached to this record and the record so completed should be returned to this Headquarters.
4. As soon as the death sentence have been executed I shall inform the Italian Government of the fact and will ask them to transmit the news to the parents. Accordingly you will please inform me by signal as soon as the sentences have been executed.

2. The findings of the Court have been confirmed, as have the death sentences imposed upon ARTHUR SHAW and CONRAD LINDEN Leidig. The sentence of death imposed upon CYRUS MULCAHY has been commuted to a sentence of twenty (20) years imprisonment. The record together with the confirmation and commutation of sentence is enclosed herewith.
3. I understand that the responsibility for the execution of the death sentence is that of Fifth Army. You will please inform the Commanding General of the decision of the Military Governor in order that in order for the execution of sentence may be promptly prepared by Fifth Army and carried out. A copy of the order and the certificate of execution should be attached to this record and the record, so completed, should be returned to this Headquarters.
4. As soon as the death sentences have been executed I shall inform the Italian Government of the fact and will ask them to transmit the news to the parents. Accordingly you will please inform me by signal as soon as the sentences have been executed.

1. The Commitment Form (No. 6) in use by Allied Military Courts does not call for a specification of the date upon which the accused shall be released. That omission creates considerable complication under Italian law.
2. It will be advisable for you to inform all officers sitting on Military Courts that they should always insert at the end of the order of Commitment an explicit statement of the date upon which the accused is to be released from prison.
3. In order that there may be uniformity of practice, the following rule for the computation of the date of termination of all sentences of imprisonment which are put in terms of months shall hereafter be followed:

In determining the duration of every sentence of imprisonment the date of the commencement of sentence shall be included in the term and the date of release shall be excluded. When the sentence is put in terms of months all months shall be considered to be 30 days in length.
4. Under this Rule, if an accused is arrested on 7 January and tried and committed on the 15th, under a sentence of 6 months imprisonment, the commitment form should state that the accused is to be released on 7 July or that he is to be released on 15 July, depending upon whether the Court chooses to have the sentence begin to run from the date of arrest or from the date of judgment.

2. We are advised by Rear H.Q., Eighth Army, their reference R.2566 Q, 17 Jan 44, that a new form is being issued for signature for the A.M.G. officer receiving supplies. Copies of the letter and form are no doubt in your possession.
3. The above mentioned form for occupied territory administration need no longer be used and as not originally intended for this theatre of operations.
4. It is suggested you use whatever form of authorization to the AMG officer to receive supplies as best suits your own needs.

SUBJECT: Order for evacuation of premises of the Juvinial prison of Lucern.

The Juvinial prisons of Lucern are early situated in premises which since 1866 have been transferred by the State to the Holy See. On October, however, a few years ago, asked for re-transfer of the premises on behalf of the Franciscan brothers.

The Minister of War and Justice (no 1st) as the Director of prisons in Lucern was able to find out, just once my decision on the subject until the end of the war.

In October 1944 the Bishop of Lucern transmitted to the Ministry of War and Justice a application for a speedy consideration of the record in this matter.

For the Franciscan brothers of Lucern using a copy of the above mentioned application, have contacted the English Governor of the city without the knowledge of the Bishop, have obtained also, in order enjoining the Director of the prisons to evacuate the premises within a very short period of time.

The Bishop having learned about the matter, has many roved the action taken by the Franciscans, intervened with the said Governor and obtained a temporary suspension of the order of evacuation.

It is requested

that the Allied Command please issue a suitable instruction for the revocation of the above said order, which if executed would prejudice the functioning of the Juvinial prisons due to the fact that the premises in question form a unit with the rest of the prison establishment.

With reference to your 1/21/48, of 20 Jan 48, it is understood from the U.S. 7th Cavalry Regt that 200 U.S. and Infantry referred to in para 1 are casualties who are being demobilized and, presumably, to be repatriated.

2. Gen. T. G. S., when interviewed on this subject on 14 Jan was unaware of the order and promised to take the matter up with the Ministry of War which he next visited on 15. It would appear, however, that the Ex-Corps Instruction was issued prior to the U.S.C. 7th's representations to the Italian Government.

3. The action to be by the U.S. Govt. indicated in para 4 of your minute is endorsed.

4. With regard to the question of additional CCRR for POGI-L 2nd, Gen. Risso agrees he is unable to allocate any additional personnel to the province beyond the 10 already sent to 2nd S. 0300 as mentioned in his order to 441/22 of 2 Jan 48.
