On 12 Jan 44 Reuters' correspondent in Cairo issued an unauthorized statement, headed "Typhus rages in Naples": this is exaggerated, incomplete and unfair to all concerned. The following observations were made personally by me in Naples on my recent visit from 8 to 11 Jan 44.

Extent of Epidemic.

From 1st July to 11 Dec 43 the number of cases officially reported was 125. From the 1st to 10th Jan 44 when a large number of highly trained experts were searching for cases the total number was 444, i.e. 46 to 50 a day. These numbers are not increasing and the curve is already flattening out. In the city there is the normal incidence - that is practically nothing owing to protective inoculation.

Anti-Typhus Campaign.

The following steps have been taken by A.S.S.:

Control has been placed in the hands of the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer, Major-General Sir Brian Robertson who has appointed an official committee consisting of the Chief Medical Officers, representing the American and British Commissions concerned; the Italian Civil authorities are dealt with through him.

The conduct of the campaign will be handed over to him at a later date.

The Committee has been strengthened by the assignment of Brigadier General Leon A. Fox, Director of the Typhus Commission at Washington for temporary duty in this theatre.

The arrangements are being coordinated by the D.S.S. Mr. Fox, A.S.S., and civilian arrangements are being carried out by him on the advice of the Director of Public Health.

This is the best organized and equipped anti-typhus campaign the world has ever seen. All the devices and resources that modern science knows have been placed at the disposal of the authorities. The matter of cases is small; there is no prospect of the disease spreading beyond control.

PLAN OF CAMPAIGN

The plan embodies:-

(1) The employment of eight teams of Italian speaking Army Medical Officers, who examine contacts and make early diagnosis. Six more M.O.s. have been requested from the States.

(2) Disinfecting Teams who deal with contacts.

(3) Mass Disinfection of civilians in the affected parts of the City. Disinfecting Stations have been organized, staffed by Italian Medical Officers and Nurses who blow a loose killing powder in to the loosened clothes of people being disinfected. On the 9th Jan 50,000 and on the 10th Jan 70,000 civilians were passed through the Disinfecting Stations. (Major French Fifth Army has photographs.) The powder is a new product only recently made available and revolutionizes disinfection.

(4) Hospitalization.....

(1) Hospitalization - is arranged by AGC. The City Lever Hospital has been taken over and an Army M.D. placed in charge of the staff of Italian doctors and nurses. Some British Army Nurses have volunteered for duty and are now at work. There are approximately 300 civilian cases under treatment today. Accommodation for a further 2000 cases will shortly be available at this hospital will be employed for the treatment of convalescents. (Notes graphs taken by Maj. French).

(2) Protection of Essential Personnel.

Nurses, doctors, and those closely concerned with the sick are protected by machine.

(6) A watch is kept on movements of civilians. Naples has been placed out of bounds of limits to other than essential troops.

1. Reference your cable R/115 of 5 Jan 44.
2. For imported commodities, costs of transport of civil supplies in areas under this HQ will be handled as outlined below, subject to change by action of the Central Economic Committee. Since transportation costs on imports are already included in the prices as supplied to you, any transportation charges incurred by movement of imports from port to final destination by rail, schooner or motor transport, will be paid by AMC and not added to the cost of the goods. This is not true in the case of coal, where prices supplied by Central Economic Committee do not include transportation, and all such costs must be borne by the consignee.
3. For locally produced supplies, transportation charges will be added to the price of the commodity to the recipient. Where military motor transport or schooners are used, the charges will be figured on the basis of railway freight rates for a similar haul. The same basis will be used for private motor transport if such rates have not been established in the area.

11. Sussidi Militari assistance is not available to families of officers of the Italian Army above the rank of Sergeant Major who are away from home on service or who are prisoners of war. It has been decided to allow such families to receive communal relief as a matter of right at the same rate as Sussidi Militari without the necessity of establishing need through the Podesta's Commission. When the usual channels of remittances for officers' and prisoner of war allowances are restored such payments of relief will cease.

2. Any vaglia now in the Post Offices remaining unpaid may now be paid by the Post Offices, where such vaglia is a formal remittance such as money order, payment of war allowance, officers allowances, etc. Vaglia drawn on a bank is subject to the rules laid down for the encashment of assigned circolori by the banks, that is, vaglia dated prior to a particular date must have the supporting certificate approved before payment. Vaglia not drawn on banks and in excess of 5000 lire should be referred to the Finance Officer, if possible, if not, to the Civil Affairs Officer, before payment to ascertain the correctness of original payee, etc.

3. The necessary instruction should be issued to the Communist and Post Offices to implement the above.

1. A copy of a manifesto issued by the Provisional Committee for the IVth International has reached this B. The manifesto is signed by one H. C. W. as Secretary of the Provisional Committee for the IVth International and dated 13 December 41, 1941.

2. In the course of the manifesto, which is addressed to all workers, the Anglo-American owners are accused of waging an imperialistic war whilst the Soviet Union is stated to be carrying on the war for neo-revolutionary ends and for the benefit of the imperialistic Anglo-Americans. The promises of a democratic peace of economic well-being and liberty, made by the so-called Anglo-American Government and accepted by the Italian Government are described as "a deceitful lie as in 1914-18 and cannot lay the foundations of proletarian peace".

3. In the event of permission being given to the Communist Party to hold meetings in your region the proceedings will be carefully watched and, if any attempt is made to distribute manifestos or appeals such as this, the responsible parties will be arrested and prosecuted.

G.R.G. 16 of 1944 lays down that the use of churches, cathedrals, shrines or other houses of worship in Italy by the armed forces is absolutely prohibited except in cases of extreme necessity when they may be used temporarily to shelter wounded personnel awaiting evacuation. In the circumstances it does not seem necessary to take further action with regard to any of the ecclesiastical buildings included in your list.
2. As regards the remainder, it is recommended that you take action as indicated in para. 1(c) of G.O. No. 68 pending the result of a memo from this HQ to AFM suggesting these places for inclusion in the lists referred to in AFM/601/68 and 70 of 10th and 12th Jan. 44. There is not time for the Home Handbooks to be amended.
3. It must be emphasized that the smaller the list of non-ecclesiastical buildings that commanders are given the greater the chance that the buildings will be respected.
4. The Cistercian Abbey of CASANARI has been scheduled for special protection by AFM and will be added to the list forwarded under AFM/601/70 of 12 Jan. 44 when a reply to that memo has been received.

5. Neither the Bank of Italy nor the Bank of Naples should pay out the above-mentioned currencies. Once having received them they should be held out of circulation.

1. It is regretted that there has been delay in replying to you with reference to the above-mentioned subject.
2. There is no apparent uniformity of system and this H.Q. is proposing a plan to remedy this.
3. Meanwhile it is suggested that you use either an Alimentation Commission created by you or the Consorcio as a civilian agency to distribute supplies and to arrange for their payment. For the moment proceeds of sale should be deposited in a bank account in each commune or in an account in the Post Office in the absence of a bank. Proceeds of sales of monopoly products should be kept separate from proceeds of sales of other supplies. Withdrawals should be permitted only to pay for new shipments coming into a commune. Appropriate records of transactions will have to be kept by the communes.
4. Financing of the stockpile should be done through the Alimentations or the Consorcio with A.M.G. funds. Payment to the supplier should be by Post Office vaglia.
5. Permanent instructions will be forwarded later when an overall plan is adopted.

1. Your exceedingly helpful suggestions concerning the draft instructions on Military Court procedure have been noted. When the other comments have been received I shall embody the great majority of your suggestions in the final draft.

2. I have read carefully your interpretation of Article IV of Proclamation No. 2. It seems to me, however, that the final "and" in that provision is to be read in its literal, permissive sense. If the other interpretation is accepted irreconcilable difficulties arise. A great number of offenses against Italian law prescribe a minimum penalty substantially in excess of what we should consider to be appropriate in a particular case. Similarly there might well arise occasions in which the Italian minimum penalty might seem inadequate. If we are bound by Article IV to accept the Italian penalties we should, I suppose, be bound also to follow the exceedingly elastic and, to us, manifestly bewildering provisions concerning the effects of prior convictions, aggravating circumstances, and extenuating circumstances. (See Articles 99-100, 99, 112). These considerations lead us to feel that every consideration of convenience suggests the adoption of the entirely reasonable interpretation of Article IV which I suggested. If we are not liberal in our construction of that Article, I fear that rather than face the problems which the Italian law of punishment will present the attempt will be made to extend the meaning of such sections of Proclamation 2 as number 10 to entirely unwarranted lengths.

1. Enclosed herewith is a copy of an Order issued by the Podesta of ISENTIA which was sent to us by the SCAG with the French Expeditionary Force at PRATA SAINITA.

2. The SCAG reports that the Order, purporting to apply to "Comuni dipendenti" on ISENTIA was sent to PRATA SAINITA by the Carabinieri for local publication and enforcement, that this was done without prior consultation, and that it is not proposed to allow the Order to be enforced in PRATA SAINITA.

3. To avoid confusion, it is most important that the rule stated in Paragraph 6 of AMG 15th ARMY GROUP Administrative Instruction No. 4 of 12 December 1943 (AMG/56/5) be carefully observed. That rule provides as follows:

"Where any instructions affecting both parts of a divided Province or Comune are required to be given to the Prefect or Podesta, or where military legislation is required in a divided Province or Comune, the SCAG or CAO, who is the proper officer to give such instructions or make such legislation, will BEFORE acting consult with the officer of the adjoining Region or Army area having jurisdiction over the remainder of the Province or Comune".

4. It would be desirable that officers in the area affected be reminded of the importance of strict observance of this directive.

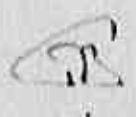

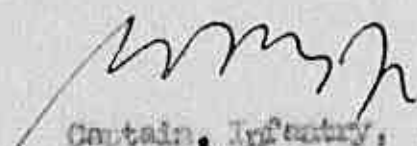

1. The D.C.S.A.C. has considered the question raised in your M/LA/O of 17 Jan 44, and it has been decided that the Rules of Procedure in translation should be made generally available, without restriction, to the Italian War.
2. The translation of which you have obtained a copy was based upon the first Revised Edition of Sicily. Accordingly before reprints are made certain alterations in the Italian text will be necessary. There are set out below the English versions of the original Italian texts which have been changed in the Second Revised Edition. From a comparison of these earlier texts with the corresponding passages in the Rules as printed in the Manual it will be easy to determine at which points new translations are called for.
- Rule 2 (a), last sentence: "No officer who has any personal interest in a case being tried or who is an officer in the Civil Police shall sit as a member of the Court."
- Rule 2 (c), last sentence: "If an accused is not represented, an officer of the Allied Forces will be appointed to represent him if the nature of the case makes it desirable that the accused be represented."
- Rule 2 (d), "Any officer of the Allied Forces may appear and prosecute an accused in any Allied Military Court."
- Rule 3 (b), "Every interpreter shall be required to take the following oath:
"I will to the best of my ability truly interpret and translate as I shall be required to do."
- Rule 3 (e), "In interpreting a pointed generally by a Court need not be obliged to take an oath at the commencement of every case before such Court."
- Rule 5 (e), "All persons convicted for an offense with or without warrant, will be brought as soon as practicable before a Summary Military Court, except that the Chief Justice, or an officer appointed by him, may order that any particular case or cases of cases shall be brought directly before a Superior or General Military Court for trial."

Rule 5 (a), "All persons arrested for an offense with or without warrant, will be brought as soon as practicable before a Summary Military Court, except that the Chief Clerk, or an officer ordered by him, may order that any particular case or classes of cases shall be brought directly before a Superior or General Military Court for trial."

Rule 7 (b), "If the Court decides at any time during the trial of a case that it should be tried by a higher Court, the Court may thereupon commit the accused for trial in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding paragraph."

Rule 7 (c) (1), "Make an order directing that the accused be held in custody or released on bail pending trial. Before making such order the Court shall call upon the prosecution for its recommendations and have regard thereto, and the order shall be entered in the record of the case."

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Rule 14. Two or more persons may be tried jointly for the same offense where the charges arise out of the same set of circumstances."

Rule 16. "An Allied Military Court shall admit such evidence as is relevant and material to the charges before it and shall, in deliberating on the judgment in each charge, take into consideration the nature of the evidence produced and the degree of reliance which can reasonably be placed upon it."

Rule 19 (b) "All films shall on receipt be transmitted to the Office of the Chief Legal Officer, or as he may direct."

3. In addition to the charges indicated above it should be noted that the exceptions listed in Rule 8 of the earlier text are no longer stated. Furthermore, Rule 12 should be printed to include the amendment of 6 Jan 44. That Rule as in force in Italy provided: "A complete record of every case will be kept by each court and will (subject to any other provision of these rules) be sent to the Office of the Chief Legal Officer, or as he may direct, at the conclusion of the proceedings. The record in a General and Superior Military Court shall include all the material evidence of every witness, which shall be recorded in narrative form except when a stenographer is present, in which case a stenographic record will be made. In a Summary Military Court only the essential material evidence need be recorded."

4. It would be very greatly appreciated if you could take care of having the necessary alterations in the translation made and could see to the printing of copies for the whole area of this HQ's responsibility. It is believed that the foreseeable needs will be satisfied if 3000 copies are printed.

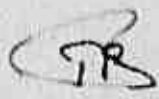

2. I feel sure that there will be no question about the delivery to their addresses of all the items listed, except perhaps (a) and (f). Technically the King's pardon of a resident of occupied territory is ineffective, but since the case was originally tried by a Court dependent upon the Bari Court of Appeals, and was in fact reviewed by that Court, it does not seem to be an occasion upon which the technicality should be called to the attention of the Italian Government.

3. Document (f), as you will see, concerns the wish of the Procuratore Generale of Bari to conduct an investigation into the circumstances of an assault in which a judge of the lazzero Tribunale was involved prior to the date of occupation. The CLO, ACC, is anxious for us to facilitate the investigation in all ways possible.
