2. If this report is true I should be grateful if you would let me know when the sitting is scheduled to take place. There are a number of cases pending for similar trial in CAMPOBASSO and we should like, if possible, to have the Officers constituting the Court proceed to that Province at the same time. I should also be grateful for information as to the persons in the Italian Army with whom the aforesaid arrangements have been made.

1. Consideration has been given to the question whether it would be advisable for a General Order to be issued from this H. C. creating additional conditions beyond those found in Italian law for the control of prostitution and collection.

2. It has been decided that such legislation would be impractical and that if the problem in such in a particular locality as to make U.S. legislation necessary it should arise from the prevention of registered H. C. If it is to be dealt with by registered legislation the proposed enactment should be submitted to the U.S. ARMY for his approval prior to consideration.

3. Your attention is called to the fact that unregistered Italian law, as found in the books of not in action, contains prohibitions of the sort which we are anxious to have removed. The prohibition or removal of any building which is used for unlicensed prostitution in violation of an offense. (Public Security Law of 15 June 1931, No. 77, Title VII, Art. 134-141). All women employed as prostitutes in licensed houses must be nationally examined and certified to be free from disease before commencing their profession. (U.S. 27 July 1940, No. 1266, approving Art. 231-34 of the Military Code). Offending in an offense under Italian law (Law of Public Security, Title VIII, U.S. 17, Art. 247).

4. Before local legislation is enacted it should be decided whether or not local law enforcement agencies should be given the power to issue Italian orders, no food, police, and judicial, property and violations of Italian law. If that effort moves forward in other laws covering the trial of violations of any or all of the Italian law mentioned above they be adopted. In any case, consideration should not be brought against unlicensed prostitution under no. 45, Art. 11 of conclusion no. 2.

1. The Italian Government has submitted a number of suggestions to us concerning the personnel of the Tribunale in FOGGIA. The suggestions are approved by the AOC, and it is felt that unless there are very strong reasons of an administrative sort against meeting the wishes of the Government we should do as they wish in this matter.
2. Giudice STRANIERO Ignazio is presently assigned to the Tribunale in FOGGIA. For personal reasons, resulting principally from the bombing of FOGGIA, he wants to transfer his post to TRIESTE where there is a vacancy on the Court available to him. The Ministry of Justice has undertaken to send Giudice C. BIANCHI Enrico, of the Tribunale at TARANTO to fill the resulting vacancy in FOGGIA.
3. Giudice CINTAPANI Giuseppe, of the Tribunale at LUCERA, for family reasons wishes to be transferred from his present post to the court at BRINDISI where a vacancy exists. The Ministry proposes to fill the vacancy which would result by sending CINTAPANI Michele, of the Tribunale at BARI.
4. It would be much appreciated if these suggestions could receive early consideration.

3. It is recommended that a comprehensive attempt be made through both AFM, Adv Alm Ech and HBS to obtain shoes and raincoats and such of the other material of which SOS NATOUSSA for the American base sections has authorized release.

1. It has come to our attention that the ration for prisoners in 100 is 100 grams of bread and a varying amount of dehydrated soup daily. In view of the total dependency of prisoners on official sources of food supply this is potentially inadequate. A similar problem is believed to exist in other institutions.

2. The fact that 100 has been described by 100 as the problem of distribution of ration cards, both from bread and dehydrated soup, is clearly your responsibility. The directive from 100 as the subject (100-1) dated 10-10-65 of 3 Jan 66 is helpful but does not cover the situation since it provides only 100 calories daily.

1. In view of recommendations received from the State Department and forwarded to this H. in **messages** recalled of 28 Jan 14, the above noted **memo** will be destroyed and its release by the following amended paragraph:

2. The following measures will be adopted in the treatment of diplomatic and consular personnel and premises unless further instructions are received from the State Department.

A. Axis and Satellite Powers

(1) The diplomatic and consular officials of Germany, Japan, Hungary, Rumania, Bulgaria and Finland will be detained. Every necessary measure to prevent their escape will be taken but they will be treated with courtesy. Instructions for their disposal will be issued by J.C.S. which must immediately be followed by their apprehension.

(2) All embassy, legation or consular premises belonging to the countries mentioned in 1 (1) above, will not be entered or searched unless given as available that diplomatic privilege is being abused. Such abuse includes hostile acts committed from the premises, use of radio transmitters, storage of war material other than the amount allowed in the mission, assembly, holding of explosive devices and similar acts.

(3) The private residences of diplomatic and consular officials of the countries mentioned in 1 (1) will neither be entered nor searched without proof that they are being used for purposes harmful to our war effort. These residences should be sealed and left until the returning owner takes them over and they will not be inhabited or requisitioned.

(4) Every effort should be made to protect from action damage all embassy and legation premises, and the private residences of officials on the embassy, legation and consular staffs. Other considerations permitting guards will be provided pending the returning owner taking over.

(5) In the case of Finland, as in state of war exists between the U.S. and that country, action outlined above should be carried out by British troops rather than Finnish.

B. Axis Occupied Countries

1. The diplomatic and consular officials will be detained as in

(1) The diplomatic and consular officials of Germany, Japan, Hungary, Slovakia, Bulgaria and Finland will be detained. Every necessary measure to prevent their escape will be taken but they will be treated with courtesy. Instructions for their disposal will be issued by . . . which must immediately be informed of their apprehension.

(2) All embassy, legation or consular premises belonging to the countries mentioned in (1) above, will not be entered or searched unless proof is available that diplomatic privilege is being abused. Such abuse includes hostile acts committed from the premises, use of the premises for the storage of war material other than the amount allowed in the mission annex, laying of explosives, and similar acts.

(3) The private residences of diplomatic and consular officials of the countries mentioned in (1) will neither be entered nor searched without proof that they are being used for purposes harmful to our war effort. These residences should be sealed and left until the protecting power takes them over and they will not be inhabited or requisitioned.

(4) Every effort should be made to protect from invasion damage all embassy and legation premises, and the private residences of officials on the embassy, legation and consular staffs. Other considerations permitting guards will be provided pending the protecting power taking over.

(5) In the case of Finland, as no state of war exists between the U. S. and that country, action outlined above should be carried out by British troops rather than ours.

B. Axis Excluded Countries.

Visiting French diplomats and consular officials will be detained as in para. A (1). No action should be taken in the case of diplomatic and consular premises or the private residences of diplomatic and consular officials which are already in the custody of the protecting power. If they are not yet in such custody the premises and private residences will be sealed pending further instructions. British diplomats and consular officials and their premises and private residences will be treated in the same way as in para. A (1) above for neutral states.

C. Neutral States.

Representatives of neutral states will be treated at all times with the greatest courtesy. They enjoy full diplomatic and consular privileges unless there is clear proof that abuse of privilege is being committed. Officials near the neutral residence of . . . will be treated as in para. A (1) above. Instructions contained in . . . shall be observed (not received here) are prohibited.

Whilst I think that Major Armstrong may be exaggerating the case when he states that alternative accommodation cannot be found in Region III, I do know that it is very difficult to get alternative quarters suitable for women and children and old persons.

With reference to my previous reports on this subject (ref ACG/14/HP of 14 Jan and ACG/15/HP of 15 Jan), on the 17th Jan, I attended a conference of officers of the CMTC in company with the CAO of Benevento City, Captain Prince, at which matters were connected with the taking over of buildings by the CMTC were discussed.

It is quite clear, in spite of what Brigadier Kensington, Director of Military Training, said on the 14 Jan (see my report of the 15 Jan) that the CMTC mean to requisition not only the four flats I have already reported on, but also the block of flats No. 49 Viale Altantici (I have no particulars yet of the number of persons involved) and a doctor's house in which 37 persons are housed, unless permission to do so is refused by higher authority.

These are in addition to a number of detached villas already taken over.

Colonel Hunt, the senior officer of the advance party, stated that he was raising the whole question to-day with the Area Commander. I pointed out that the persons to be displaced by this requisitioning could not be found alternative accommodation in the city or province, and I said that, according to my information, they could not be accommodated in any part of the Region. Colonel Hunt spoke of 800 evacuation to Sicily.

The possibility of erecting huts was considered, and I suggested that the KUSCO firm could go ahead with their preparation at once if required. The CMTC, however, appear to take the view that if they do, in fact, erect huts, the civilians at present occupying the flats I have referred to should be evacuated into them, leaving the flats for officers. I refrained from expressing any opinion on this suggestion, but I take an extremely poor view of it.

I pointed out the considerations involved in such a wholesale evacuation of civilians, including women, some pregnant, and children and one elderly man who has been bedridden for 25 years, in addition to

(2) the unfortunate effect it would have on Italian workers, particularly railway workers (there are many in Benevento) in enemy occupied territory who, by sabotage, are helping our cause;

(3) the already dangerously overcrowded state of Benevento City (I gave figures, and the possibility of an outbreak of disease.

I am entirely opposed to this wholesale evacuation of civilians so far in rear of the combat area, and I feel that it should be resisted.

The Town Major was instructed at the conference to check up on the people occupying the flats in question, with a view to ascertaining how many are working in Benevento and could not be evacuated out of the area without undue hardship.

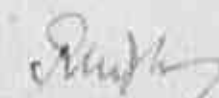

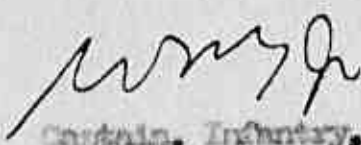
