AMG ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 1.

Administration of areas under
AMG H.Q. 15 Army Group.

1. Under the original arrangements AMGOT 15 Army Group (Forward AMGOT) was to have consisted of only the two AMGOT detachments with Fifth and Eighth Armies and the headquarters detachment at H.Q. 15 Army Group. The area to be administered by AMGOT 15 Army Group was to have consisted of the occupied territories in the two army areas. The southern boundaries of the two army areas were then the same as the northern boundary of No. 2 Military District, namely, the northern boundaries of the Italian provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Bari.

2. Recently in order to provide for the occupation of further territory personnel from AMG Region IV has been called forward and has in fact taken over the administration of Foggia province under the command of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army. On the west side Fifth Army AMG personnel with additional staff called forward has been divided into AMG Fifth Army and Region III. Moreover, the southern boundary of Fifth Army area has been moved north of Naples and AMG Region III is installed and operating in the provinces of Campania (Naples) Benevento and Avellino.

3. It is anticipated that in the near future the southern boundary of Eighth Army will be moved north. When that occurs Foggia province will be excluded from the jurisdiction of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army and it is my intention to add this province to Region IV.

4. In view of the decision to hand over AMG Regions I and II to the Italian Government under the Allied Control Commission, the question arises of disposing of those occupied areas which are neither in Fifth and Eighth Army area, nor in the area to be handed over to the Italian authorities. It may here be stated that it is not the intention to hand over any one territory than that which is south of the line described (namely, the northern boundaries of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari) for some time to come.

5. After discussion with Brigadier General J. Holmes (H.Q.S. A.E.H.Q.) and C.G.S. 15 Army Group, and with the concurrence of GOC-in-C 15 Army Group, AMG 15 Army Group will take charge of all occupied territories north of the Bari - Salerno line, whether these territories are within or behind Fifth and Eighth Army areas. In effect therefore AMG 15 Army Group will have control under the Military Governor of S.C.A.O.s Fifth and Eighth Armies (subject to the standing arrangements whereby G.C.O. Fifth and Eighth Armies have full jurisdictional control of C.A. personnel and current affairs in the two Army areas) and of S.C.A.O.s Regions III and IV.

Recently in order to provide for the occupation of further territory personnel from AMG Region IV has been called forward and has in fact taken over the administration of Foggia province under the command of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army. On the west side Fifth Army AMG personnel with additional staff called forward has been divided into AMG Fifth Army and Region III. Moreover, the southern boundary of Fifth Army area has been moved north of Naples and AMG Region III is installed and operating in the provinces of Campania (Naples) Benevento and Avellino.

3. It is anticipated that in the near future the southern boundary of Eighth Army will be moved north. When that occurs Foggia province will be excluded from the jurisdiction of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army and it is my intention to add this province to Region IV.

4. In view of the decision to hand over AMG Regions I and II to the Italian Government under the Allied Control Commission, the question arises of disposing of those occupied areas which are neither in Fifth and Eighth Army area, nor in an area to be handed over to the Italian authorities. It may here be stated that it is not the intention to hand over any more territory than that which is south of the line described (namely, the northern boundaries of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari) for some time to come.

5. After discussion with Brigadier General J. Holmes (M.C.S. A.P.H.Q.) and C.G.S. 15 Army Group, and with the concurrence of GOC-in-C 15 Army Group, AMG 15 Army Group will take charge of all occupied territories north of the Bari - Salerno line, whether these territories are within or behind Fifth and Eighth Army areas. In effect therefore COMS 15 Army Group will have control under the Military Governor of S.C.A.O.s Fifth and Eighth Armies (subject to the standing arrangements whereby C.O.C. Fifth and Eighth Armies have full jurisdictional control of C.A. personnel and current affairs in the two Army areas) and of R.C.A.O.s Regions III and IV.

6. The two S.C.A.O.s and the two R.C.A.O.s will deal with personnel and administrative matters affecting their detachments as follows:

S.C.A.O.s Fifth and Eighth Armies will send their casualty returns etc. direct to S.C.A.O. 15 Army Group where they will be consolidated and submitted as a whole to the appropriate authorities together with returns for AMG 15 Army Group divided into American and British administrative matters. The British returns etc. will then be submitted to A.P.H.Q. (M.C.S. or M.S.) or to G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon as appropriate directly. The American returns will be forwarded to AMG H.Q. Palermo until such time as these are sent to (M.S.) A.P.H.Q. direct.

R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will compile and consolidate their own personnel and administrative returns as separate units and forward them to HQ AMG 15 Army Group for onward transmission as has been laid down in the preceding paragraph.

7. On matters of administrative policy relating to the territories under administration S.C.A.Os Fifth and Eighth Armies will receive general directions from C.O.A.O. 15 Army Group but remain as heretofore directly under C.O.C. Fifth and Eighth Armies. R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will refer directly to and come under C.C.A.O. 15 Army Group for all purposes until their territories, or parts of their territories, have been handed over to the Italian Authorities under the direction of the Allied Control Commission.

8. All accounts in the areas under AMG 15th Army Group will be maintained in the name of the appropriate region; and will be submitted monthly through normal channels to the C.P.O. 15 Army Group. The accounts will be examined and forwarded to the Chief Accountant of the Region concerned. Care must be taken to ensure that Finance Officers of 5th and 8th Armies operating in forward areas maintain a different set of books for each region.

9. A further order will be issued defining the boundaries.

Responsibilities in Provinces and Communes
divided by Army boundaries.

1. With the establishment of Regions in the immediate rear of Army boundaries it becomes necessary to make provision for the indirect government of Provinces and Communes where part of the Province or Commune is in one Region or Army area, and the remainder is in another Region or Army area.
2. The boundaries of Army areas are fixed, wherever possible, to coincide with the boundaries of Italian administrative Provinces or Communes, but military requirements often make this impossible. AMG must, therefore, be organized in such a manner that the wishes of the C.G. or C.O.G. in an Army area are fully met and also in such a manner that the division of authority between Army areas does not hinder the functions of Italian local government in divided Provinces and Communes.
3. Where a Province or Commune is partly in one Region or Army area and partly in another Region or Army area, the Prefect or Podesta of that Province or Commune will be allowed to exercise his administration over the whole Province or Commune from the usual place of government, or, if such place is not in occupied territory, from the most convenient place for the purpose.
4. All instructions to Prefects or Podestas will be given by the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O. (as the case may be) of the place where the seat of government is located.
5. Where any military legislation of the Allied Military Government is required to be made in divided Provinces or Communes, such legislation will be made over the head of the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O. (as the case may require) of the place where the seat of government is located.
6. Where any instructions affecting both parts of a divided Province or Commune are required to be given to the Prefect or Podesta, or where military legislation is required in a divided Province or Commune, the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O., who is the proper officer to give such instructions or make such legislation, will BEFORE acting consult with the officer of the adjoining Region or Army area having jurisdiction over the remainder of the Province or Commune. If any difference of opinion arises it will be referred by both officers concerned to their Provincial, Regional, or Army Headquarters (as the case may be) and, in default of settlement to this Headquarters.

If any difference of opinion arises it will be referred by both officers concerned to their Provincial, Regional, or Army Headquarters (as the case may be) and, in default of settlement to this Headquarters.

7. It is essential that close liaison takes place between officers of different Headquarters whose jurisdictional areas are contiguous and that higher Headquarters of those officers be kept informed of matters of joint decision. Provided that the subject matter is one on which each officer concerned could make his own decision if the Province or Commune were wholly within his own jurisdictional area, there is no need to make prior reference to higher Headquarters before agreeing action, mainly because the Province or Commune is divided.

8. The Commune of ~~REVERETO~~ will be considered as inclusive to AME 5th Army and exclusive AME Region III for the purposes of para. 5 of I.O., A.M.G., 15 Army Group Administrative Instruction No. 3.

CONTROLLER OF PROPERTY.

The duties of the Controller of Property H.Q., AMG, 15 Army Group, shall be divided as follows:-

- (a) Army Areas: Duties and responsibilities of the Controller of Property in Army areas under the control of C.C.A.O., AMG, 15 Army Group.
- (b) Regional Areas: Duties and responsibilities of the Controller of Property in areas covered by Regions under the control of C.C.A.O., AMG, 15th Army Group.

 - (ii) The property of any person, company, institution or body whose activities are deemed by the C.C.A.O. to be prejudicial to the safety of Allied Forces, public order, or the fulfilment of war aims.

- (iii) Property owned by any government or any of the nationals of any government allied with the governments of the United States and British Commonwealth of Nations in the common prosecution of the war.

3. PROCEDURE IN EXECUTING DUTIES.

Operating through C.A.O.'s in the field under instructions issued to them by A.Q., A.M.G., 15 Army Group, the Controller of Property shall:-

- (a) Procure lists of allied and enemy state properties together with valuation and other minimum information.
- (b) Have necessary notices posted.
- (c) Obtain lists and reports.
- (d) Make periodical inspection.

4. PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES.

- (a) Upon receipt of the necessary information from C.A.O.'s, the Controller of Property shall maintain proper records of property taken into his control in such form as to facilitate the transfer of such records to any successor echelon of control. Such reports and records shall be classified and segregated as between or among provinces and the following classes of property:-

- (i) Residential or farm properties.
- (ii) Commercial and business undertakings.
- (iii) Bank deposits, credits and intangible assets.

The Controller of Property shall not be responsible for obtaining or preparing detailed inventories, but his records shall show the general physical condition of the property, and whether occupied by armed forces. The Controller of Property shall, so quickly as possible, take personal supervision of property which requires control, care and maintenance.

The Controller of Property shall arrange with Public Safety Division for the proper guarding and protection of property and shall arrange for the posting of notices as additional protection.

5. PREPARATION AND APPROVAL OF NOTICES.

All notices shall be approved by the Legal Division prior to submission to the C.G.A.O. for approval.

REGIONAL AREAS.

When territories previously under the control of 15 Army Group pass to AFM Regions under the control of C.C.A.O., 15 Army Group, the Controller of Property shall:-

(b) Advise and make recommendations to C.C.A.O. on all matters involving policy determinations affecting property control.

- (c) Exercise personal supervision over property control activities in the Regions to the extent necessary to assure uniformity of policy and records.

2. PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES.

In the performance of his duties the Controller of Property shall be guided by General Administrative Instruction No. 10, A.M.G. Manual, so far as the same is not inconsistent herewith, and by the Proclamations and Orders made by or under the authority of the Military Governor. Any reference to enemy state property or para-statal undertakings does not apply to property of the Italian Government or the para-statal undertakings thereof.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PERSONNEL (U.S.) PROCEEDING TO SICILY

1. MONEY.

- a. No French, Algerian or Tunisian currency will be taken into SICILY.
- b. Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company, Detachment Commanders and Section Chiefs will collect all such money from personnel on day preceding departure of each party and present it to the Finance Disbursing Officer who will change it into Yellow Seal Currency. Officers will call at Disbursing office to change their money.

2. UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT.

- a. Cotton Khaki, leggings, steel helmets and gas masks.
- b. Individual arms. Ammunition to be issued and carried by all personnel. Pieces not to be loaded except by command of an officer in event of attack.
- c. All personnel will leave this station with full water canteens and will refill them from ships supply before disembarking.
- d. Trunk Lockers will not be taken. All officers now having these in their possession will immediately dispose of them in accordance with instructions previously issued.

3. POSTAL.

- a. Two clerks from Postal Section, Headquarters Company, will proceed with 1st Echelon.
- b. There will be no change in Postal Address. Mail for personnel in Sicily will continue to be addressed to A.F.O. 777, and will be cleared through the Rear Echelon.

4. MARKING OF BAGGAGE.

Stores, equipment and personal baggage should be correctly marked in accordance with instructions previously issued.

1. The Headquarters Company is organized and exists, as such, for the purpose of serving this Headquarters. Its functions as the housekeeping unit, and its duties include quartering and messing all personnel of this Headquarters and the administration, discipline and basic training of all enlisted men.
2. The Q.M. Car Detachment and the Military Police Detachment also exist for the movement and security of this Headquarters.
3. All of these units are placed under the command of the Headquarters Commandant for all purposes with the single exception that the Military Police Detachment is controlled and directed by the Provost Marshal for Operations and Training.
4. The Headquarters Detachment (composed of clerks, stenographers, etc., in the various Sections) is a distinct component of Headquarters Company. As such, its personnel, outside of office hours, come under the control of Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company and the Headquarters Commandant for discipline, training and administration. This control is essential for the systematic functioning of this Headquarters and Headquarters Company. Rules must be laid down and must be obeyed for hours of messing, arrangement of tents, care and inspection of arms, etc. In this connection many cases have arisen of Section Chiefs pampering their men and endeavoring to have them excused from formations because they had worked an extra hour or two the night before and of officers making unreasonable demands for individual services. The men of Headquarters Company work faithfully to afford this Headquarters all the comfort possible, but it must be remembered that we are in the field and all of the conveniences found in garrison are not available and should not be demanded.
5. There is no reason whatever why this Headquarters and Headquarters Company should not function as one harmonious team.

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5. There is no reason whatever why this Headquarters and Headquarters Company should not function as one harmonious team. To this end it is desired that the policies outlined below be observed by all sections. Certain exemptions or alterations may be necessary in some sections. These should be discussed informally and openly with the Headquarters Commandant and if an agreement cannot be reached the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1, should be consulted for a decision.

R E S T R I C T E D

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6. By law and regulation certain lectures and inspections are required, such as monthly physical examinations, reading of the Articles of War, sex-hygiene lectures, etc. It is essential that all enlisted personnel attend. In order to insure minimum interference with duties in Staff Sections, such lectures will be given twice. Section Chiefs will arrange that all men attend one lecture on each subject. The Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company will inform Section Chiefs in advance as to time and place of the planned lectures.

7. To provide adequate security, authority is granted for a minimum number of enlisted men from each section to sleep in their office area if considered necessary. Section Chiefs will inform Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company in writing the names of such personnel and will also inform him in writing at least 24 hours prior to any change when this detail is rotated.

8. In view of the duty hours previously established Section Chiefs will not direct enlisted men to report to sections for duty prior to 0830 hours, except in exceptional purposes and after consultation with the Headquarters Commandant.

9. When it is essential that enlisted personnel be excused from a particular formation, sections will advise Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company in writing and over the signature of an officer of such request. Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company has been directed to return without action requests signed by non-commissioned officers. The Commanding General is most desirous that all men get a definite amount of military training each day. Section Chiefs will arrange that those to be excused will be kept to a minimum and that special arrangements are made so that they receive such training at least three days a week. Ordinarily high ranking NCOs would be excused from such training due to their long service and wide experience. In the case of this Headquarters, however, these NCOs have been promoted rapidly as a result of technical clerical experience and are in need of basic military training. Therefore, for the time being all enlisted men regardless of grade will be required to attend drill formations.

10. The noon meal is served to U.S. enlisted personnel of Headquarters Detachment at 1300 hours; an early mess for not to exceed two (2) men per section is available at 1200 hours. It is desired that this limitation be observed.

11. Officers Messes have established and published their hours for serving. All officers are enjoined to observe these hours and not to demand service at other hours.

R E S T R I C T E D

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12. All enlisted personnel other than the security details sleeping in section areas will stand a daily inspection at 0730 hours. Enlisted personnel who are excused from this formation due to having been on duty as section night guards will stand formation in the company area at 1330 hours. Sections will refrain from requesting personnel being excused from these formations. Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company will report as absent any personnel other than section night guards not present at the morning formation; he will report as absent without authority any section guard not present at the second formation. The Junior Officer in each section will be responsible that prior to 1000 hours he has inspected the arms of the section guard for the previous night.

13. For the information of all concerned the following schedule of formations and calls of the Headquarters Company is announced:

The following information relative to Courts-Martial procedure, is published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

I. FILING OF THE CHARGES.

1. Any officer or other person subject to military law who observes or has knowledge of a violation of the Articles of War or breach of military discipline will:

a. Obtain and reduce to writing all available information regarding the incident.

b. Report the incident in detail to the Commanding Officer of the violator and promptly prefer charges against the accused for such violation.

c. Forward a copy of the report mentioned in b. above to this Headquarters, (attention of the Judge Advocate).

2. In serious cases the person observing or having knowledge of the incident should file the charges. This action should be taken within 24 hours after the violation. Charge sheets must be prepared in triplicate; all three (3) copies must be signed by the accuser and sworn to before an Adjutant, Assistant Adjutant, Sum-

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3. If the accused is an Officer or Warrant Officer, the charge sheets and allied papers should be accompanied by a brief statement of the facts, with the name, rank and organization of each witness, either for or against the accused, who has personal knowledge of the offense.

4. In cases where the accused is an enlisted man, the person having knowledge of the violation will forward the charge sheets in triplicate to the Commanding Officer of the accused. These charge sheets should be accompanied by a brief statement of the facts, the name, rank and organization of each witness, and the facts within the personal knowledge of such witnesses. These statements need not be detailed, but should be sufficiently complete to advise the Investigating Officer the nature of the information possessed by each witness.

II. MULTIPLICITY OF CHARGES.

1. The attention of all officers is directed to Par. 27, MCM, and the provisions thereof, which provides, in pertinent part, as follows:

"One transaction, or what is substantially one transaction should not be made the basis for an unreasonable multiplication of charges against one person. Thus a soldier should not be charged with disorderly conduct and for an assault when the disorderly conduct consisted in making the assault *** However, there are times when sufficient doubt as to the facts or law exists to warrant making one transaction the basis for charging two or more offenses."

2. Charges indicate that frequently officers attempt to see how many separate charges can be brought, rather than to center on one logical charge covering the principal offense. A man who comes into camp and is disorderly can be given up to three months by a special court. In many instances the things that he does when coming into camp are elements of his disorderly conduct. Frequently, in such cases, his mental condition is such as to mitigate specific charges and make them an unreasonable multiplication. Drunkenness cannot be condoned. However it should not be the vehicle wherein a man is charged with several relatively minor derelictions attributable to this condition. If grossly drunk, it may well be a defense to an offense involving "specific intent" in which case, "a failure to act" rather than "a willful act" should be charged.

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III. COMPANY PUNISHMENT UNDER A.W. 104.

1. Discipline and Military Justice go hand in hand. Such disciplinary problems as may properly be handled under the 104th Article of War should be disposed of by company punishment. Army

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men who become recalcitrant to discipline and chronic offenders will, if treated firmly, promptly and justly under company punishment, prove to be tractable and efficient soldiers. Courts-Martial in all but grave offenses should be resorted to as infrequently as possible.

2. Every unit commander must read with great care A.W. 104 and Par. 105 to 109, MCM.

Punishment, as such, may only be given in two ways: (1) By the unit commander under the 104th A.W.; or (2) by sentence of a courts-martial duly approved and ordered executed.

3. Article of War 104 and Par. 105 to 109 MCM, indicate what punishments can be given under the 104th A.W. The following cannot be done.

- a. Forfeit or detain any pay.
 - b. Withdraw any privilege, granted to enlisted men of the unit generally, for more than one week. (Passes are privileges)
 - c. Award any punishment, other than in connection with reprimand and admonition, in two forms except as it be apportioned. (Thus a week's fatigue and a week's restriction would be illegal and would have to be apportioned so that no more than a week in the aggregate is awarded).
 - d. Confine under any pretext.
 - e. Fix the time for execution of the punishment to include over seven consecutive days, i.e., the punishment must be completed within seven consecutive days.
 - f. Award hard labor to a non-commissioned officer.
 - g. Reduce in grade.
 - h. Give any punishment such as double timing, guard duty, or involving a military duty the effect of which would de-grade such duty.
 - i. Award any punishment of an indefinite or uncertain nature.
4. Reduction as punishment is not authorized. A man may be administratively reduced because his conduct, as such, reflects on his ability to hold the office. Where a man is reduced for misconduct (Par. 13, A.W. 615-5) it may only be after a judicial determination of such misconduct. (An admission of a charge and acceptance of punishment under A.W. 104; a courts-martial sentence; or the determination of an investigation board will suffice).

5. No soldier may be punished under A.W. 104 until advised

- d. Confine under any pretext.
- e. Fix the time for execution of the punishment to include over seven consecutive days, i.e., the punishment must be completed within seven consecutive days.
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4. Reduction as punishment is not authorized. A man may be administratively reduced because his conduct, as such, reflects on his ability to hold the office. Where a man is reduced for misconduct (Par. 13, A.W. 615-5) it may only be after a judicial determination of such misconduct. (An admission of a charge and acceptance of punishment under A.W. 104; a courts-martial sentence; or the determination of an investigation board will suffice).

5. No soldier may be punished under A.W. 104 until advised of the specific nature of the charge against him and also advised that he may stand trial if he so desires, rather than accept punishment under the 104th A.W.

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R E S T R I C T E D

6. Company punishment is not an arbitrary right but a right that should be used in a dignified manner and in accord with the procedure set forth herein, and should normally be conducted in the unit's orderly room. The maximum use of company punishment is definitely desirable. Company punishment affords an opportunity for the unit commander to study his men and gives the man a chance to state his viewpoint, and frequently results in better understanding. Company punishment should never be administered while a man is under the influence of intoxicating liquor, or drugs.

IV. PREPARATION OF COURT-MARTIAL CHARGES.

1. Errors in the drafting of court-martial charges, which become particularly conspicuous in deletions and interlinings made by reviewers over the accuser's signature, may be avoided or minimized by following directions set forth in App. 3 and 4, MCM.
2. So far as practicable, no officer who is detailed on a General courts-martial in any capacity should sign charges or take any other action that might disqualify him as a member of the court. Any person in the military service may prefer charges, the soldier's Commanding Officer is in no way designated as the person who must prefer the charges.
3. The models of specifications to be found in Appendix 4, MCM, with necessary modifications to conform to the facts in the case, will be followed in the preparation of the charge sheet.
4. In addition to the instructions contained in Appendix 4, MCM, the following will be adhered to in the preparation of charges:
 - a. The serial number of the accused will be shown only on page one of the charge sheet, and not in the specification.
 - b. The age of the accused will be his age at the date of the charges and will be preceded on the face of the charge sheet by the word "Present".
 - c. The pay of the soldier will be his base pay, plus longevity pay, plus foreign duty pay, but in case of a Regular Army soldier, less statutory deduction of 10¢ per month for Soldier's Home, and should be entered in the charge sheet as: \$30.00 less 10¢, \$59.90.
 - d. Allotments must be shown by class and amount.
 - e. Under "Data as to service", prior service will show inclusive dates of enlistment, organization from which discharged, character and reason for discharge, e.g., (Convicted, ETS, Pur-

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 - b. The age of the accused will be his age at the date of the charges and will be preceded on the face of the charge sheet by the word "present".
 - c. The pay of the soldier will be his base pay, plus longevity pay, plus foreign duty pay, but in case of a Regular Army soldier, less statutory deduction of 10¢ per month for Soldier's Home, and should be entered in the charge sheet as: \$60.00 less 10¢, \$59.90.
 - d. Allotments must be shown by class and amount.
 - e. Under "Data as to service", prior service will show inclusive dates of enlistment, organization from which discharged, character and reason for discharge, e.g., (Conv'n Gov't, ETS, Purchase, etc.,) and the total prior service completed by years, months and days as shown by the accused's service record. In addition thereto, the place, date and term of the current enlistment will be shown.

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- f. Time lost under the 107th A.W. will not be shown.
 g. In event of joint charges, the age, pay, data as to service, and date of confinement, will be shown as to each accused on the joint charge sheet.
 h. Care will be exercised to see that the "Affidavit" on the charge sheet shows the date of its execution, and name, rank, branch of service and capacity i.e. (adjutant, Summary Court) of the officer administering the oath.
 i. Prepare copies of all statements of witnesses, certificates of previous convictions, extract copies of morning report and all other documentary evidence in sufficient number that copies of each may be attached to each copy of the charge sheet. In case of one accused three copies are necessary, and if joint charges are filed an additional copy for each accused is necessary. When only one copy is available additional "Certified True Copies", should be prepared.

5. Certificates of previous convictions by courts-martial submitted with the charges will refer only to those convictions which fall within the time limits specified in par. 79. c, MCM, of which, we quote a pertinent part:
 "Such evidence must relate to offenses committed in the case of an enlisted man during the one year next preceding the commission of any offense charged."
 (Underscored supplied).

6. Bear in mind the following rules for drafting charges.
 a. The form shown in the Specimen Charges on p. 235, MCM, will be followed so far as is practicable.
 b. Do not abbreviate. Ranks, organizations, months, etc., should be spelled out in full.
 c. Identify and describe the accused (and any other person in the military service mentioned in the specification) by his rank or grade, name and organization only. A civilian may be identified by name only, though his title or other identification may be added when significant.
 d. State values in the form "xxx value \$2.08" (when known exactly, e.g. per Government price list), or "xxx value about \$5.00" (the usual form).
 e. If money itself is involved (e.g. when money is alleged to have been stolen) describe as "xxx (about) \$3.50, lawful money of the United States".
 f. Allege dates in the form "on or about 27 June 1943".
 g. Allege sufficient details to be specific. Do not burden the specifications with details which serve no purpose but

i. Prepare copies of all statements of witnesses, certificates of previous convictions, extract copies of morning report and all other documentary evidence in sufficient number that copies of each may be attached to each copy of the charge sheet. In case of one accused three copies are necessary, and if joint charges are filed an additional copy for each accused is necessary. When only one copy is available additional "Certified True Copies", should be prepared.

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"... Such evidence must *** relate to offenses committed *** in the case of an enlisted man during the one year *** next preceding the commission of any offense charged." (Underscoring supplied).

6. Bear in mind the following rules for drafting charges.

a. The form shown in the Specimen Charges on p. 238, MCM, will be followed so far as is practicable.

b. Do not abbreviate. Ranks, organizations, months, etc., should be spelled out in full.

c. Identify and describe the accused (and any other person in the military service mentioned in the specification) by his rank or grade, name and organization only. A civilian may be identified by name only, though his title or other identification may be added when significant.

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e. If money itself is involved (e.g. when money is alleged to have been stolen) describe as "*** (about) \$3.50, lawful money of the United States".

f. Allege dates in the form "on or about 27 June 1943". Allege sufficient details to be specific. Do not burden the specifications with details which serve no purpose but only add to the difficulties of proof. It is not ordinarily necessary or proper to allege the hour of the day, or the street address where the offenses occurred, or to recite the occupation, residence, or station of persons, or detailed description of things or transactions involved.

h. In charging any miscellaneous wrongful act or omission under A.W. 96 for which no form is provided in App. 4, MCM, the word "wrongfully" should be placed before the words of the specification descriptive of the offense, or some equivalent expression used to allege expressly its wrongful character.

V. DISPOSITION OF CHARGES.

1. Charges will be prepared, signed and delivered to the Commanding General, Headquarters Force 141, (U.S. Contingent), (in the case of officers) or to the Commanding Officer of the accused (in the case of enlisted men) within 24 hours after an offense is committed. The accused's Commanding Officer will forward all charges by form letter to the Commanding General, this Headquarters. Upon receipt, examination and recommendation, such charges will be referred for trial to the lowest court which can administer adequate punishment, Par. 104, MCM.

VI. INVESTIGATION OF CHARGES.

1. In general, charges to be tried by a summary court-martial do not require formal or informal investigation.

2. Charges to be tried by special court-martial do not require formal investigation. It is customary to make an informal investigation, the purpose of which is to inform the Trial Judge Advocate of the names, location and testimony of the various witnesses.

3. Charges to be tried by a general court-martial must be formally investigated in all instances. The investigation should be conducted in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 35a, MCM.

VII. CAPITAL OFFENSES.

1. Offenses under certain articles of war are capital under all circumstances; others become capital offenses in time of war. In many cases capital punishment is optional with the court. All cases, however, charging violations of articles of War 58, 59, 61, 64, 66, 67, 75, 76, 77, 78, 81, 82, 86 and 92, will be forwarded to this Headquarters for decision as to which court the case shall

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VIII. FORFEITURE OF PAY.

1. Circular 283, W.D. 1942, provides that Class "F" allotments i.e., allotments of \$22.00 and \$27.00, which are of a compulsory

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nature, shall be deducted from the base pay, in computing the base pay on which a forfeiture up to 2/3rds of base pay be made by a Court-Martial. Thus a man with a base pay of \$80.00 and a Class "F" allotment of \$27.00 could be required to forfeit only 2/3 of the balance (\$33.00), i.e., \$22.00. Both Courts-Martial and reviewing authority should bear this in mind in order to avoid needless correction of records and Courts-Martial orders.

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IX. EXTRACTS OF MORNING REPORTS.

1. It is a common error to forward extracts of morning reports which have not been properly prepared. There are three common errors, viz.: (1) Page 3, of W.D. AGO Form #44, reads in part as follows:

" *** and that the foregoing is true and complete copy (including any signature or initials appearing thereon) of that part of the morning report of said command submitted at (station) for the dates indicated in said copy which relates to ***."

The mistake is sometimes made of writing in the blank above for "Station" the name of the station where the extract copy of the morning report is prepared or even where the case is being tried. This blank must be filled in with the name of the station at which the entry in the original morning report for the date involved was made. If this is not done, the entry may appear to be of hearsay origin and thus becomes valueless; (2) An entry in an original morning report, containing a statement of fact of which the officer making the report has no personal knowledge and which is not his official duty to know is not competent evidence of the fact so stated, e.g., "The entry in the original morning report of 1 June 1943, at Casablanca, French Morocco of events concerning the accused, occurring in Algiers, were not within the personal knowledge of the officer making the report, and therefore is only hearsay". (3) Extract copies of morning reports must be authenticated by the unit commander having official custody of the originals. This is the Company Commander.

"The Certification of the extract copy as a true and complete copy of the morning report by Lieutenant Peterson as regimental personnel adjutant is not such an authentication as makes the extract copy admissible in evidence, notwithstanding his statement therein that he is the official custodian of the morning reports ***". (CM218201 Witkowski, 1941)

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X. PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS.

1. The certificate with reference to previous convictions must be signed by the custodian of the service record, this is the personnel adjutant and not the unit commander.

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RESTRICTEDXI. DRUNKENNESS.

1. According to PMG, Circular #1, dated 18 February 1943, NATOUSSA, a person is either drunk or sober, there are no degrees of drunkenness. If the charge of being drunk cannot be supported by the necessary proof then the person should be charged with "being under the influence of intoxicating liquor".

XII. PREPARATION OF RECORD OF TRIAL BY SUMMARY COURT-MARTIAL.

1. The following errors are common in the preparation of records of trial by Summary Court-Martial:
 - a. Case number not shown.
 - b. Specifications and charges not properly indented.
 - c. Sentences awarded and approved excessive, (see Par. 104 MCM).
 - d. Form of sentences not in proper form.
 - e. Place and date of trial not shown. In blank for "place" should be shown the actual location, not APO number.
 - f. Summary Court has not signed all three copies of record of trial.
 - g. All three copies must be signed personally by the Reviewing Authority.
 - h. Record not initialed by the personnel adjutant. All three copies must be initialed.

2. A Summary Court should be cognizant of the following fundamentals:

- a. A soldier must be informed exactly and specifically, of the charges against him, and he is entitled to know who the witnesses against him are.
- b. He must be allowed the right to confront the witnesses against him.
- c. He is entitled to call witnesses and have the court obtain their presence or their testimony (by deposition) in his behalf.
- d. A soldier cannot be required to testify against himself.
- e. If found guilty, he must be so found, "beyond a reasonable doubt" (see P. 32, MCM), and if an actual doubt exists, it must be resolved in favor of the accused.

XIII. REFERENCE.

1. The Manual for Courts-Martial itself is very thorough,

XIII. REFERENCE.

1. The Manual for Courts-Martial itself is very thorough, complete and well indexed tabulation of the principles of Military Justice. The Office of the Staff Judge Advocate invites consultation in every instance where, after research, any doubt as to the proper procedure still exists. All necessary forms to be used in

The duties of the Controller of Property H.Q., AMG, 15 Army Group, shall be divided as follows:-

- (a) Army Areas: Duties and responsibilities of the Controller of Property in Army areas under the control of C.C.A.O., AMG, 15 Army Group.
- (b) Regional Areas: Duties and responsibilities of the Controller of Property in areas covered by Regions under the control of C.C.A.O., AMG, 15th Army Group.

ARMY AREAS.

1. DUTIES.

- (a) Prepare directives and instructions for issuance through channels to the C.A.O.'s operating in the field on all matters affecting property control.
- (b) Advise and make recommendations to C.C.A.O. on all matters affecting property control.
- (c) Keep and maintain a central registry of all property taken under control.
- (d) Exercise personal supervision and control over properties which in the opinion of the C.C.A.O. or Controller of Property require special attention.

2. SCOPE OF PROPERTY.

(a) Controller of Property will be responsible for the control of:-

- (i) Property owned by the Government of the United States or by any of the British Commonwealth of Nations, or of the nationals thereof, sequestered by the Italian Government.
- (ii) Enemy state property (not including state property of Italian Government), not in custody of some other Branch of the armed forces.
- (iii) Such abandoned property or property belonging to absentee owners of which no representative can be found in the occupied

ARMY AREAS.

1. DUTIES.

(ii) The property of any person, company, institution or body whose activities are deemed by the C.C.A.O. to be prejudicial to the safety of Allied Forces, public order, or the fulfilment of war aims.

3. PROCEDURE IN EXECUTING DUTIES.

Operating through C.A.O.'s in the field under instructions issued to them by H.Q., A.M.G., 15 Army Group, the Controller of Property shall:-

- (a) Procure lists of allied and enemy state properties together with valuation and other minimum information.
- (b) Have necessary notices posted.
- (c) Obtain lists and reports.
- (d) Make periodical inspection.

4. PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES.

(a) Upon receipt of the necessary information from C.A.O.'s, the Controller of Property shall maintain proper records of property taken into his control in such form as to facilitate the transfer of such records to any successor echelon of control. Such reports and records shall be classified and segregated as between or among provinces and the following classes of property:-

- (i) Residential or farm properties.
- (ii) Commercial and business undertakings.
- (iii) Bank deposits, credits and intangible assets.

The Controller of Property shall not be responsible for obtaining or preparing detailed inventories, but his records shall show the general physical condition of the property, and whether occupied by armed forces. The Controller of Property shall, so quickly as possible, take personal supervision of property which requires control, care and maintenance.

The Controller of Property shall arrange with Public Safety Division for the proper guarding and protection of property and shall arrange for the posting of notices as additional protection.

5. PREPARATION AND APPROVAL OF NOTICES.

All notices shall be approved by the Legal Division prior to submission to the C.G.A.O. for approval.

AMG 15 ARMY GROUP ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 4

Responsibilities in Provinces and Communes
divided by Army Boundaries.

1. With the establishment of Regions in the immediate rear of Army boundaries it becomes necessary to make provision for the indirect government of Provinces and Communes where part of the Province or Commune is in one Region or Army area, and the remainder is in another Region or Army area.
2. The boundaries of Army areas are fixed, wherever possible, to coincide with the boundaries of Italian administrative Provinces or Communes, but military requirements often make this impossible. AMG must, therefore, be organized in such a manner that the wishes of the C.G. or C.O.C. in an Army area are fully met and also in such a manner that the division of authority between Army areas does not hinder the functions of Italian local government in divided Provinces and Communes.
3. Where a Province or Commune is partly in one Region or Army area and partly in another Region or Army area, the Prefect or Podesta of that Province or Commune will be allowed to exercise his administration over the whole Province or Commune from the usual place of government; or, if such place is not in occupied territory, from the most convenient place for the purpose.
4. All instructions to Prefects or Podestas will be given by the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O. (as the case may be) of the place where the seat of government is located.
5. Where any military legislation of the Allied Military Government is required to be made in divided Provinces or Communes, such legislation will be made over the hand of the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O. (as the case may require) of the place where the seat of government is located.
6. Where any instructions affecting both parts of a divided Province or Commune are required to be given to the Prefect or Podesta, or where military legislation is required in a divided Province or Commune, the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O., who is the proper officer to give such instructions or make such legislation, will BEFORE acting consult with the officer of the adjoining Region or Army area having jurisdiction over the remainder of the Province or Commune. If any difference of opinion arises it will be referred by both officers concerned to their Provincial, Regional, or Army Headquarters (as the case may be) and, in default of settlement to this Headquarters.
7. It is essential that close liaison takes place between officers of different Headquarters whose jurisdictional areas are contiguous and that higher Headquarters of those officers be kept informed of matters of joint decision. Provided that the subject matter is one on which each officer concerned could make his own decision if the Province or Commune were wholly with-

AMG must, therefore, be organized in such a manner that the wishes of the C.G. or G.O.C. in an Army area are fully met and also in such a manner that the division of authority between Army areas does not hinder the functions of Italian local government in divided Provinces and Communes.

3. Where a Province or Commune is partly in one Region or Army area and partly in another Region or Army area, the Prefect or Podesta of that Province or Commune will be allowed to exercise his administration over the whole Province or Commune from the usual place of government, or, if such place is not in occupied territory, from the most convenient place for the purpose.

4. All instructions to Prefects or Podestas will be given by the S.C.A.O. or C.A.C. (as the case may be) of the place where the seat of government is located.

5. Where any military legislation of the Allied Military Government is required to be made in divided Provinces or Communes, such legislation will be made over the hand of the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O. (as the case may require) of the place where the seat of government is located.

6. Where any instructions affecting both parts of a divided Province or Commune are required to be given to the Prefect or Podesta, or where military legislation is required in a divided Province or Commune, the S.C.A.O. or C.A.O., who is the proper officer to give such instructions or make such legislation, will ESCORT acting consult with the officer of the adjoining Region or Army area having jurisdiction over the remainder of the Province or Commune. If any difference of opinion arises it will be referred by both officers concerned to their Provincial, Regional, or Army Headquarters (as the case may be) and, in default of settlement to this Headquarters.

7. It is essential that close liaison takes place between officers of different Headquarters whose jurisdictional areas are contiguous and that higher Headquarters of those officers be kept informed of matters of joint decision. Provided that the subject matter is one on which each officer concerned could make his own decision if the Province or Commune were wholly within his own jurisdictional area, there is no need to make prior reference to higher Headquarters before agreeing action, merely because the Province or Commune is divided.

8. The Commune of BENEVENTO will be considered as inclusive to AMG 5th Army and exclusive AMG Region III for the purposes of para. 5 of H.Q., J.M.G., 15 Army Group Administrative Instruction No. 3.

ORGANISATION OF AMG, 5TH ARMY & AMG, REGION III.

1. No definition of command and administrative responsibilities has as yet been made with respect to AMG, 5th Army and AMG, Region III.
2. In view of recent developments the position can now be clarified.
3. A Global War Establishment for British personnel and a Regimental Table of Organization for American personnel is in process of completion by Military Government Section, Allied Force Headquarters. As soon as these are approved British and American personnel will be posted and assigned as of appropriate dates.
4. Without prejudice to the dates upon which such postings and assignments will be made effective, AMG 5th Army and AMG Region III will operate as separate units of Military Government as from 12 Dec. 43.
5. AMG, Region III will administer those parts of the Provinces of AVELLINO, BENEVENTO and NAPLES (including the city of Naples) South of rear 5th Army boundary. All territory in 5th Army area will be administered by AMG, 5th Army subject to any operational orders that may be given by the Commanding General, 5th Army.
6. AMG, 5th Army and AMG, Region III will each report direct to AMG, 15 Army Group.
7. AMG, 5th Army is under command of Colonel EDGAR HESKINE HUME, S.C.A.O. AMG, 5th Army; Chief of Staff and Deputy S.C.A.O., Colonel J.O.M. ASHLEY.
8. AMG, Region III is under command of Lieut. Colonel KARL A. KRAEPE, R.C.A.O.; Chief of Staff and Deputy R.C.A.O., Lieut. Colonel The LORD FORRESTER.
9. Colonel EDGAR HESKINE HUME in his personal capacity will continue to direct political policy vis a vis Italians where appropriate in Region III (and Region IV where it affects 5th Army). Colonel HUME will also serve as Chief Liaison Officer between the Commanding General, 5th Army and the Regions concerned.

ADMINISTRATION OF AREAS UNDER
H.Q. AMG. 15 ARMY GROUP.

1. Since the issue of Administrative Instruction No. 1 of 17 Nov. 43 certain alterations in boundaries and in jurisdiction have taken place. These are summarized in the following paragraphs.

2. With effect from 0600 hrs, 1. December. 43 the boundary between 8th Army and No. 2 District was established along the Northern boundary of FOGGIA Province to its junction with the provincial boundary of BENEVENTO, thence West along the Northern boundary of BENEVENTO Province to the inter-army boundary at point H.550100.

3. Effective 0800 hrs. 25. November. 43. 5th Army Rear Boundary was established as follows:-

Inclusive Fifth Army coast at N. 005605 thence East along TIENTOLA road to N. 135637, thence MARCELINO N. 1465 to CASSALUCE N. 1666 to MAROLANUS N. 2470 to MADALONI N. 3270. Thence exclusive Fifth Army along Highway Number Seven to BENEVENTO thence North East along PLEBISCITA road to inter-army boundary.

4. With effect from 0001 hrs, 4. December. 43, the AMG administration of the Province of FOGGIA was handed over by AMG, 8th Army to AMG, Region IV. In view of this hand-over, R.C.A.O. Region IV has established a small Advance H.Q. at TUNO (c/o 151 Sub-area) on the Eastern side of Italy. Region IV Main H.Q. remains at NILES.

5. With effect from 0001 hrs, 3. December. 43, the entire AMG administration of SALERNO Province was handed over by AMG Region III to AMG Region II.

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AMG ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 1.Administration of areas under AMG. H.Q. 15 Army Group.

1. Under the original arrangements AMGOT 15 Army Group (Forward) was to have consisted of only the two AMGOT detachments with Fifth and Eighth Armies and the headquarters detachment at H.Q. 15 Army Group. The area to be administered by AMGOT 15 Army Group was to have consisted of the occupied territories in the two army areas. The southern boundaries of the two army areas were then the same as the northern boundary of No. 2 Military District, namely, the northern boundaries of the Italian provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Bari.

2. Recently in order to provide for the occupation of further territory personnel from AMG Region IV has been called forward and has in fact taken over the administration of Puglia province under the command of S.C.A.C. Eighth Army. On the west side Fifth Army AMG personnel with additional staff called forward has been divided into AMG Fifth Army and Region III. Moreover, the southern boundary of Fifth Army area has been moved north of Naples and AMG Region III is installed and operating in the provinces of Campania (Naples) Benevento and Avella.

3. It is anticipated that in the near future the southern boundary of Eighth Army will be moved north. When that occurs Puglia province will be excluded from the jurisdiction of S.C.A.C. Eighth Army and it is my intention to add this province to Region IV.

(a) In the case of 5th and 8th Armies the normal channel of communication on all personnel matters is through H.Q. AMG, 15 Army Group, except that routine reports and returns on American personnel required by 2675 Regt will be rendered direct to that Regiment.

(b) R.C.A.O.s Region III and IV will refer to H.Q., A.M.G., 15 Army Group only matters of policy and those requiring attention by Military Government Section, A.F.H.Q. Routine returns required by 2675 Regt., British Adm. H.Q. and GHQ 2nd Echelon will be rendered direct and not through this H.Q.

S.C.A.C. Fifth and Eighth Armies will send their casualty returns etc. direct to 15 Army Group where they will be consolidated and submitted as a whole to the appropriate authorities together with returns for AMG 15 Army Group divided into American and British administrative matters. The British returns etc. will then be submitted to J.P.H.Q. (A.C.S. or M.S.) or to G.H.Q. 2nd Expeditionary Force directly. The American returns will be forwarded to AMG H.Q. Salerno until such time as these returns are sent to (M.S.) Army Group direct.

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R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will compile and consolidate their own personnel and administrative returns as separate units and forward them to HQ 15 Army Group for onward transmission as has been laid down in the preceding paragraph.

7. On matters of administrative policy relating to the territories under administration S.C.A.Os Fifth and Eighth Armies will receive general directions from C.C.A.O. 15 Army Group but remain as heretofore directly under C.C.O. Fifth and Eighth Armies. R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will refer directly to and over C.C.A.O. 15 Army Group for all purposes until their territories, or parts of their territories, have been handed over to the Italian Authorities under the direction of the Allied Control Commission.

8. All accounts in the areas under HQ 15th Army Group will be maintained in the name of the appropriate region; and will be submitted monthly through normal channels to the C.F.O. 15 Army Group. The accounts will be examined and forwarded to the Chief Accountant of the Region concerned. Care must be taken to ensure that Finance Officers of 5th and 8th Armies operating in forward areas maintain a different set of books for each region.

9. A further order will be issued defining the boundaries.
