2. Although no quota has been established for military personnel, each officer or enlisted member of the Army who can possibly do so will initiate a class "B" allotment, and, wherever feasible, present allotments will be increased.

FIFTH WAR LOAN DRIVE

1. In connection with the \$16,000,000,000 Fifth War Loan drive recently announced by the Secretary of the Treasury, the War Department drive will be in 1 June 1944 and end 31 July 1944. The securities to be sold will consist of Series E War Savings Bonds; Series F and G Savings Bonds; Series C Savings Notes; 2½ percent Bonds of 1965-70; 2 percent Bonds of 1952-54; 1½ percent Notes of 1947; and 7/8 percent Certificates of Indebtedness.
2. The Secretary of War desires that this drive be actively supported throughout the Military Establishment and all commanding officers are hereby directed to conduct a vigorous campaign within their commands to secure maximum participation. The attention of commanding officers is directed to the provisions of Memorandum No. W850-42-43, 30 August 1943, and Circular No. 345, War Department, 1943, with respect to their responsibilities in the establishment and maintenance of a War Bond organization adequate for effective action.
3. The Secretary of War further desires that during this drive, as between cash purchases and regular pay roll deductions, major emphasis be placed upon the initiation of new or increased Class B allotments and Class A pay reservations by military and civilian personnel.
4. The Interdepartmental War Savings Bond Committee has assigned to each Federal agency a quota equal to 40 percent of the April 1944 gross pay roll of eligible civilian employees. Bonds purchases by civilian employees by means of Class A pay reservations, Class B allotments (where applicable to civilians), and cash, during the period 1 June to 31 July 1944, inclusive, will be credited against quotas. While no quota has been assigned for military personnel, it is expected that each officer and enlisted member of the Army, who can possibly do so, will initiate a Class B allotment or increase that now in effect. All civilians, commissioned officers, warrant officers, and enlisted personnel are urged to buy at least one extra bond for cash during the drive, but it is expected that such purchases will be made as an adjunct to rather than in lieu of maximum purchases by means of regular pay roll deductions. The War Department will receive credit for all bonds purchased during the period by both military and civilian personnel regardless of the method of purchase; that is, Class A pay reservation, Class B allotment, and cash.
 - a. The total of cash purchases during the Fifth War Loan drive will be based upon certificates to be executed by individuals (officers, enlisted personnel, and civilians) and delivered to Minute Men or corresponding War Bond representatives.
 - b. Such certificates will be prepared locally in accordance with previously established procedure. 3853
 - c. Cash purchases (at cost price) made through any sources within or without the Military Establishment will be reported separately as to military and civilian.

d. Reports of cash purchases will be made as a supplement to the regular monthly report of War Bond activities and forwarded by installation War Bond officers to service command or similar headquarters. Military installations not now reporting regularly will report through their respective headquarters for the same periods. Reports will be submitted in sufficient time to permit consolidation and inclusion in "Report of War Bond Activities" (Control Approval Symbol FG-31) which will be transmitted to reach the Office of the Fiscal Director, War Bonds and Savings Promotion Branch, Washington 25, D.C. not later than 20 July 1944 and 20 August 1944, respectively.
