2. In order to introduce to you these men in an all important and appropriate manner, and still informally so, though I had hoped to do it personally, a brief synopsis is given on each man showing the type of work he has been doing since being assigned to the Adjutant General Department at the Hq ACC, then at Brindisi, Italy and to the Adjutant's Section at Rear Hq ACC in Salerno. This brief introductory note also shows what type of work the individual is capable of doing, his educational background, experience in civilian life, and general adaptability.

a. Pte Boyes, W. (NMI), 4399486 (B), has been on duty with the Adjutant Section, Rear Hq ACC since February 1943, as a messenger and mimeograph operator. Pte Boyes has expressed his desire to continue his work as a mimeograph operator. He is a willing, capable and efficient worker.

b. Pfc Kenig, Louis (NMI), 33776987 (A), joined Hq ACC at Brindisi in November 1943 as official mail despatcher and has held the same job here at Rear Hq ACC ever since change of station occurred. He is a good, steady, reliable worker. A high school graduate; main experience and work in civilian life for over 6 years has been in warehouse work at the Quartermaster Depot in Philadelphia. He has a general adaptability in clerical work. If no suitable assignment can be found for him, it is recommended that he be transferred to some Section or Sub-commission needing personnel in warehousing experience. Suggestions - Food Sub-Commission or Industry & Commerce - (Clothing).

c. Pfc Kruger, Saul (NMI), 32882728 (A), joined the Allied Military Mission at Brindisi, Italy on 5 October 1943 and was assigned as Distribution Clerk and cable typist. Here at Rear Hq, Pfc Kruger has excellently handled Message Center work, including distribution, registration, cable typing, mimeograph work, etc. He has an excellent educational background, holding a Master's Degree in Music & Education. His main work in civilian life has been in Federal Civil Service for a period of 14 years as a foreman of a mimeograph unit. Pfc Kruger is a very capable individual, possessing a high sense of responsibility, excellent morals, character and industriousness. However, Pfc Kruger wishes to be transferred to work in Legal Sub-Commission. I have not denied him this but for the fact that the movement of personnel has been so fluctuating that it has been impossible to dispense with any personnel at this time. A recommendation that he be transferred to the Legal Sub-Commission is favorably considered.

d. Pfc Marchiondo, Charles R., 38348025 (A), joined the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi on 11 November 1943 and was originally assigned as file clerk but subsequently placed at information and reception desk because of his ability to interpret and translate Italian. Since his assignment at Rear Hq ACC, Pfc Marchiondo has worked on Special Orders, Daily Bulletins, Mimeograph operating and general typing, besides interpreting and translating whenever the need for such work arose. He is a high school graduate. He has a good and solid business and commercial background, his family owning several chain stores in New Mexico. He has an excellent knowledge of clerical and supply work and would be fully capable in some capacity with the Food Sub-Commission, Industry & Commerce, or any Section needing personnel experienced in Supply and Warehousing. Pfc Marchiondo has clean cut manners and a fine approach. His neat and orderly work and general adaptability to any assignment is quickly noticeable.

e. Fus Marks, A. E., 6981632 (B), was assigned to the Adjutant Section, Rear Hq ACC on the 2nd of June 1944 during which time he has done messenger work. Fus Marks has had experience in Radio and Signal work having been trained for it. He has expressed his desire to get back to Signals if possible.

f. Pfc Rodriguez, Augustin (NMI), 32803180 (A), joined the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi, Italy, on 28 November 1943, and assigned as file clerk, which work he has continued to do here at Rear Hq ACC. He has worked diligently and industriously, almost alone on the tremendous amount of filing that had to be done and redone in the first four months at this Headquarters, when the files from Brindisi Hq were in a very malignant shape. He has managed to separate useless papers from important ones, doing away with endless cross-indexing, always employing the Dewey Decimal Point System. His work is accurate, neat and orderly and has a very flexible method of

filing. Pfc Rodriguez in civilian life is an experienced Accountant and Bookkeeper, having worked in the commercial field for several years. He has had 3 years of college education, graduating in 1924 majoring in Accounting. He would be most beneficial in the Finance Sub-Commission or Industry & Commerce Sub-Commission, if no suitable assignment exists for him in the Adjutant Section. He is a reliable, trustworthy person, full of good, staid qualities and character highly recommendable.

g. Pfc Romero, Mario S., 38363951 (A), joined the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi on 28 November 1943, and was assigned as typist for cables and general correspondence. His business experience in civilian life has been clerical work in the Export and Importing field. Pfc Romero has had 3 years of college, majoring in Law. Recommend that he be transferred to Legal Sub-Commission or Public Safety Sub-Commission.

h. Pfc Sousa, Benjamin A., 32272619 (A), joined the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi on 1 December 1943 as Registry Clerk and has performed the same type of duty here at Rear Hq ever since. He is a very capable typist, neat and orderly in his work; a conscientious worker. He has had 1½ years of Business College and business experience in the Export and Importing field. A person to assume large responsibilities. He could continue his work as Registry Clerk and typist. If no suitable assignment can be found, recommend that he be transferred to Industry & Commerce Sub-Commission dealing with Foreign Trade. Pfc Sousa is a person with a high sense of duty, possessing excellent qualities of character, efficiency and diligence.

i. Pfc Younginer, Furman R., 34652085 (A), joined the Allied Control Commission at Brindisi on 2 December 1944 as a file clerk and performed such duty until the move the Hq to Salerno where he was assigned as mail clerk, which position he has held to date performing an excellent job. He is experienced in auditing in the Railroad Department and has been so employed for 2 years. Pfc Younginer is a high school graduate. Recommend that he continue working in U.S. Post Office or a change to filing would be suitable.

3. I hope the above information on these men will be of use not only to you who will be their immediate officer, but to the men themselves. A great deal can be obtained from them if a little is known about them and their work.

4. I will be coming with the remainder of our Section at Rear Hq and I can assure you that these men are of the same excellent qualifications and better than some of the Advance Group which I am rightfully holding here temporarily.
