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1. Attention is invited to paragraph 13a (2), War Department letter, AG 370.5 (10 August 1944) OP-S-SPMOT-M, dated 16 August 1944, as reproduced in letter, this headquarters, file AG 370.5/796 Pers-0, dated 6 October 1944, subject "Procedure for Return of Individuals".

2. Inasmuch as absences for rehabilitation, recuperation, and recovery of personnel on temporary duty in the United States are not chargeable against accrued furlough credit, a remark substantially as follows on page 15 (Remarks - Administrative) of the Service Record will be made prior to departure of the personnel:

3. No entry of furlough on page 6 of the Service Record will be made.

SUBJECT: Foreign Service.

TO : Company Commanders, this Regiment.

1. An inspection of the WD AGO Forms 66-1 at this Headquarters reveals that the date of entrance upon foreign service has not been recorded in the vast majority of cases. It is desired that you interview each officer at your station and secure the following information:

- a. Date of departure from the United States.
- b. Date of entrance into North Africa.
- c. Date of entrance into Sicily.
- d. Date of entrance into Italy.

2. This information will be used as a basis for battle participation awards as provided in letter, file: AG 200.6/263 P-0, subject: "Battle Participation Awards", MATCUSA, dated 27 March 1944.

3. In order to expedite the receipt of information, Company Commanders may forward information as received and not wait for complete returns of all officers before submission.

SUBJECT: Disposition of Personnel Records.

TO : See Distribution.

1. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that many unit commanders are forwarding to Eastern Base Section, Service Records and allied papers of personnel evacuated from Italy.

2. The following paragraph from NATOUSA Circular 167, 1943 is quoted for your information and compliance:

"3b. Whenever personnel who are patients in hospitals and absent or expected to be absent from their units more than 30 days -

"(1) Unit commanders will -

"(a) Transfer them and forward their personnel records to the Detachment of Patients, when they are at known U. S. Army station, convalescent or general hospitals.

"(b) Drop them from their rolls and forward their records to the Central Service Records Branch of this headquarters, when they are at other types of hospitals or their location is unknown.

"(2) Hospital commanders will -

"(a) Notify unit commanders promptly and will request, and when necessary repeat such requests, that individuals be transferred and personnel records be forwarded. Copies of such requests will be sent to the Central Service Records Branch.

"(b) Whenever personnel arrive at any station for permanent or extended detached duty unaccompanied by their personnel records, the unit commander will promptly initiate and follow up action to secure such records by communicating with the individual's last unit and/or place of hospitalization and/or the Central Service Records Branch."

Attention is further directed to the provisions of Circular 215, Headquarters, NATOUSA, 6 November 1943.

3. All records of personnel absent in unknown hospitals will be forwarded through this headquarters. Letters of transmittal will indicate whether individuals are or are not battle casualties.
