SUBJECT: Officers' Mess Grant

TO: Distribution Below.

1. A sum of 3,76 pounds has been drawn by HQ ACC as an initial Mess Grant for the purchase of crockery, glass, etc., for Officers' Messes.
2. Of this 35,000 Lira has been expended as a grant to the Officers' Messes of HQ ACC at NAPLES and SALERNO.
3. In addition advances of 120,000 Lira have been made. Of this the sum of 100,000 Lira has been repaid already.
4. It is proposed to hold this money in a Fund which can be used to help Officers of Regions, etc., to start new Messes as required.
5. At Appendix "A" to this letter is a draft of the proposed Rules for the operation of this Fund. This initial Mess Grant is applicable only to British Officers and to Officers' Messes of Units which were formed before 1 Nov 1943.
6. It is hoped to draw the balance of the grant due, i.e., 2 pounds 5 shillings per Officer, when it has been ascertained for how many Officers this grant has been received in addition to the amount (for 224 Officers) already received.

Appendix "A"

PROPOSED RULES FOR BRITISH OFFICERS' ACC CENTRAL MESSING FUND

1. Fund to be styled the British Officers' ACC Central Messing Fund.
2. The Fund to be administered by a Committee composed as follows:

President: Senior British Officer in ACC.

Members: Senior British Officer of each Region and AMO
FIFTH and EIGHTH ARMIES.

A British Officer nominated by the Executive Commissioner.

Senior British Financial Officer.

Secretary: An Officer (British) nominated by the Executive Commissioner.

Treasurer: An Officer (British) nominated by the Senior Finance Officer.
3. Form of assistance to be given:

Assistance to be given to any authorized Officers' Mess of an ACC Formation.

Assistance to be in the form of either

(a) A Grant or

(b) A Loan
4. (a) Grants will not be repayable and will be limited to an amount equal to one pound per head for all Officers (A & B) who are members of the Mess concerned.

(b) Loans will be repayable at the rate of 1/10th of the total loan per month. First payment to be made two months after receipt of the loan.

Loans to be limited to an amount equal to two pounds per head for all Officers (A & B) who are members of the Mess concerned. No interest will be charged on loans.
5. Money received as a Loan or a Grant will be expended only on glass, crockery, and linen required to start the Mess.
6. Messes which receive a loan will institute a Sinking Fund from which instalments will be repaid. The Central Messing Fund will have prior claim on the assets of any mess still in debt when the mess is broken up.
7. Disposal of any Balance Credit of the Fund after a necessity for it has finished will be at the discretion of the Committee.

RULES FOR (A) AND (B) OFFICERS' MESSSES, HAPLES

1. Membership of Officers' Messses at Haples will be restricted to Allied Officers and Civilians of Officer status, of both sexes, belonging to ACC. Only Allied Officers of both sexes (including Nursing Service) may be invited as guests. Special guests may be invited with the agreement of the Mess Council.
2. The Mess Council will consist of five elected officers who have power to co-opt. The Headquarters Commandant will be a member ex officio, and act as Executive to insure the operation of the Messses in accordance with the directions of the Mess Council.
3. The Mess Secretary and Treasurer and Mess Officers will be appointed by HQ ACC (Establishment Branch).
4. The Council will frame the policy and control of Headquarters messsing.
5. Maximum daily charge for messsing for all members will not exceed twenty five lire. Visitors and transient officers will not be charged a sum in excess of ten lire per meal.
6. Mess Officers are authorized to collect an advance either by the sale of books of tickets and chits to members or by means of a cash deposit. Members on leaving the mess will be entitled to a refund for all unused tickets and chits or any unused balance of the cash deposit.
7. The Mess Council will meet twice monthly on or about the 10th and 24th day of the month.
8. General Mess Meetings will be called monthly. All Mess Officials will attend these meetings.
9. The Council will carry out a rough check of the Mess accounts at their first meeting in the month, this in addition to the complete audit laid down in Regulations, which will be carried out quarterly on the orders of HQ ACC. They will also satisfy themselves that the system of handling and safeguarding cash, books, tickets, etc., is sound and that responsibility in regard thereto is defined and not delegated to those who should not be called upon to shoulder it, in accordance with regulations and the practice and custom in the British and American Armies.
10. The maximum number of guests a member may introduce will be limited to two in any one week.
11. Times of meals will be in accordance with the orders of the HQ Commandant and will be posted on the notice Board. Alterations in times of meals may be requested by vote at a General Meeting. Any such requests will be referred by the Mess Council to HQ ACC.

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12. No singing, music or switching on of radio will be allowed in the mess premises after 2300 hours, without the authority of the Mess Council.

13. The Mess Secretary is authorized to purchase incidental items for Mess use up to a sum of 500 lire. Such purchases should not exceed 2000 lire in any one month.

14. Warning out and Guest Books will be provided in (A) and (B) Messes. Officers intending to be absent for one or more meals or to invite guests will notify to this effect in the appropriate book.

"In recognition of the importance of supply discipline in troop units, the War Department has initiated action to emphasize this subject in training, and has requested the cooperation of overseas commanders in developing increased supply discipline. In this connection, reference is made to War Department letter dated 14 December 1943, subject: 'Supply Training', file AG400 (7 Dec 43) OB-S-3M, which was reproduced and distributed to all major commands in this theater by Headquarters MATOUSA.

In the accomplishment of the grave mission with which it is charged, the War Department is obliged to fill the real needs of the several theaters of operations with promptness geared to the speed of modern warfare, and at the same time as effectively to employ the resources at its disposal that irreparable damage to the economy affecting every citizen will not occur. It is considered the duty of every uniformed member of this Command to keep faith with the officers and men of the Army elsewhere in the world by practicing rigid economy in the use of United States property.

1. Previous References.
Reference is made to Memorandum on Officers' Messses, Nos. 1 & 2, issued on limited circulation.
2. Authorized Messses.
The following Messses are hereby authorized for Naples. No additional Messses will be opened without sanction from the Executive Officer.

<u>Name of Mess.</u>	<u>Membership and Remarks.</u>
a. Toledo Hotel (Main Mess)	For all Officers billeted in the Hotel - all meals.
b. Santa Brigida (Main Mess) Restaurant.	(1) For all Officers stationed in Naples not members of a, c, d and e Messses - all meals. (2) For all Officers not members of a and b Messses - <u>Lunch only.</u>
c. Chief Commissioner's Mess, Villa Guilla.	Membership - 3.
d. Senior Officers' Mess, 17 Santa Strada.	For Officers of the rank of Colonel and above. (Membership - 14).
e. Mr. Grady's Mess.	For Vice President, Economic Section, and Civilian Staff. (Membership - 7).

3. Availability of Messses to Non-Members.
 - (a) It will be appreciated that Officers must eat in the Mess to which they are assigned, otherwise the correct computation and allotment of rations would be impossible.
 - (b) All Officers will, however, be members of both a and b Messses in all other respects - i.e. they may use the Bar and Ante-Rooms of both Messses.

Ref. Para. 5(a) of Memorandum No. 1. Lt. Jones was subsequently relieved as Mess Officer, Palermo by Capt. Pascal (a), Tele-communications Sub-Commission, and is now at Naples.

3. Special Fund.

Ref. Para. 5(c) of Memorandum No. 1. The recommendation regarding the £476 has been agreed to. The sum has been lodged in a special account in the Banca di Napoli, Naples.

Until administration can be handed over to British admin. Hq. on their arrival here, the Executive Officers, Colonel Albright and Colonel Rathbone have power to sign. Further instructions regarding this fund will be issued at a later date.

4. Organization of Messes.

Ref. para. 4(c) & (d) of Memorandum No. 1.

- a. Messes at Naples will be run entirely separately from those at Salerno.
- b. Two messes have been opened at Naples - a small Senior Officers' Mess at 17 Santa Siro, and a main mess at the Toledo Hotel. At a later date it will probably be necessary to open a third mess.
- c. There will be two messes at Salerno.

5. Management. (See para. 6(a), Memo. No. 1)

- a. Salerno. See Memo. No. 1, para. 6(c) and para. 2 of this Memo.
- b. Naples. Toledo Mess (American Nations).
 - (1) Lt. Broadhead will act as Mess Officer, & Capt. Marshall as Mess Secretary, for the time being. The Mess Secretary's duties will be part time only. At a later date Lt. Broadhead will be assisted on the messing side by Lt. Jones. This will be in addition to Lt. Jones' other duties.
 - (2) Lt. Col. Richards, Hq. Commandant is appointed ex officio member of the Mess Council.
 - (3) The following officers are appointed members of the Mess Council, subject to confirmation at a general meeting, which should be convened as early as possible:

Lt. Col. Legge (Interior) - Chairman
Major Humphries (Industry & Commerce)
(See c below)

c. Naples. 17 Santa Siro (American Nations)

Major Rushmore (Public Health) is appointed Mess Secretary, but as regards funds & property, this mess comes under the same management as the Toledo Mess. Major Rushmore will apply to Mess Secretary,

Toledo Mess, for funds for capital expenditure & working expenses as required. He will account for such monies to Mess Secretary, Toledo Mess.

d. Salerno.

- (1) Major Baxter (Pinnock) is appointed Mess Officer (whole time) for both Salerno Messes for the time being.
- (2) Lt. Col. Moss-Vernon (Hq. Comdt) is appointed Ex Officio Member of the Mess Committee.
- (3) A general meeting should be convened as soon as possible after main Hq. is established at Salerno to elect a Mess Council, which should be representative of both messes. A Mess Secretary, or Assistant (part time) from each Mess should also be appointed if considered necessary.

e. General.

Major Humphries will assist in the setting up, organization, making of contracts, engaging of staff, etc., first for the Toledo Mess and subsequently for the Salerno messes. When all messes are properly organized & running smoothly, Major Humphries will be relieved of all duties in connection therewith other than under (b) (3) above.

f. Funds

(See paras. 5(a) & (b) & 7 of Memo No. 1, & para. 3 of this Memo.)

- a. The sum actually brought to Naples by Major Humphries as an advance on the share of the Naples Mess from Palermo Mess Funds was 5000 lire. Of this, 1500 lire has been handed over to Major Baxter to start the Salerno Messes, and 10,000 lire to Major Andrews for the Senior Officers' Mess, Naples. The 1500 lire is on loan and will be repaid (see (b) below). Major Baxter will open an account at a Bank in Salerno & deposit the 1500 lire therein. He will report the name of the bank to this office. The balance of the 55,000 lire will be deposited in the Banca di Napoli, Naples, and an account opened.
- b. Mess Officers/Secretaries, Naples & Salerno are hereby authorized to apply to Lt. Warner, Mess Secretary, Palermo, for further funds as may be required of advance against their shares, for the Naples and Salerno Messes respectively under para. 5(c) (III).

of Memo. No. 1. Lt. Warner will forward such funds in the following manner:-
 He will draw cheques on the Mass account and present them to ADPA, Palermo & obtain a receipt. ADPA Palermo will advise ADPA Naples, who in turn will advise Mass Secretaries that they can draw the cash. Lt. Warner will, in this manner, transfer forthwith the sum of 20000 lire. This is for the Salerno Branch, & will be drawn by Major Dexter as soon as he is advised it is available. On receipt, he will reply to Mass Officer Naples, the sum of 15000 lire. (See (c) above).

- c. When the Palermo Mass is closed down, Lt. Warner will dispose of the final balance as in para 5(a) (III) of Memo. No. 1. He will forward the Naples and Salerno shares in the manner prescribed in b above. He will also forward to the Mass Officer, Naples & Salerno, a statement of accounts showing the final balance, the balances due to each group of masses, & the advances drawn against the total shares under (a) & (b) above.
