- a. Number of lines required (minimum).
- b. Name of Section or Headquarters.
- c. Directory information of Officers to be served.
- d. What, if any, civil lines now in place?
- e. Exact and accurate location by address and map coordinates.
- f. Whom to contact for further information.

3. Applications for Telephone Service for civilians.

a. It is recognized that in many cases civilians of all nationalities in Rome Area perform essential duties for the Allied Forces. 3. Applications for Telephone Service for civilians.

b. In all cases where a commissioned officer can vouch for the necessity of telephone service for civilians, these requests will be considered by this office.

c. The following procedure will govern:

(1) For civilian office and duty telephones, commissioned officer, certifying the need for telephone service, will submit in writing the following information to the Signal Officer, RAAC:

- a. Full name of civilian.
- b. Directory listing for telephone requested.

c. Exact address of the telephone.

d. Telephone number of instrument in place, if any.

e. How many outgoing calls per day are necessary (incoming calls not rationed)?

f. Reason for making request.

(2) For civilian billet installations or increased calls, same as sub-par (1) except, add:

g. Number of calls presently authorized per day (if any).

(Note: Care should be exercised in forwarding such requests, since it is not the intention to assume responsibility for payment of personal service).

(3) For civilian telephone service not essential to the military, requests are submitted by the civilian, direct to TETI, 203 Corso Vittorio Emanuele, Rome. Statements from members of the Allied Forces in this respect are meaningless.

4. Additional information on Real Estate requisitions.

a. Requisitions on billets do not include telephone service.

b. To obtain military priority for billet telephones (unlimited calls and the responsibility of the accounts), a definite need must be established for:

- (1) General Officers.
- (2) Chief of Sections.
- (3) Key personnel requiring 24 hour contact (calling).

c. The following information will be furnished to the Signal Officer, RAAC, for billet telephone service:

Part I—GENERAL STAFF

234. Use of Long Distance Telephone Facilities in ITALY

1. There are now several large naval, military and air force HQ established in ITALY, which are distributed over a comparatively narrow but very deep area. This has produced many problems in connection with the «long distance» telephone service. The term «long distance» includes direct long line circuits between the switchboards of major headquarters, and is not limited to calls placed through the NAPLES or ROME long distance exchanges.

2. In order to obtain the maximum efficiency from the available telephone facilities, it is essential that all telephone users should co-operate. The following will be brought to the notice of all concerned—

(a) «Long distance» facilities are limited and will not be used when the subject could equally well be covered by a message.

(b) If a «long distance» call is essential, it must be as brief as possible. Notes should be made before-hand of the subjects to be discussed in order to prevent waste of time. When a call has been booked, the caller or an officer deputised by him must remain immediately accessible to the telephone, or the call must be cancelled.

3. All telephone users are notified that a monitoring service is being established. Violation of the above principles will be reported to the commanders concerned for corrective action.

235. Civilian Passes

1. If the security control of civilians is to be effectively exercised, it is essential that civilian passes should be issued on a uniform basis.

2. There are three standard pass forms in use in this theatre, viz.,

(a) The ACC/AMG Pass—(See para 3 below)

(b) The Brown Military Permit. This is for strictly limited use by intelligence staffs of higher HQ to persons employed on special intelligence duties.

(c) The White Military Permit. This is for issue to Allied civilians employed with the Allied Forces (e.g. EFI or CVWW, etc.).

3. (a) Passes for civilian movement, exemption from curfew, circulation of motor vehicles, etc. will normally be issued by ACC/AMG.

(b) The latter will be the ONLY issuing authority in respect of passes required by civilians for private, business or civil administrative purposes.

(c) If any responsible Allied military authority has occasion to employ a civilian or group of civilians on a particular operational or intelligence task requiring the issue of a pass, and if it is impracticable, owing to the time factor or other circumstances, for the appropriate ACC/AMG pass to be obtained, the military authority concerned may make out a temporary pass for the purpose.

(d) Any such pass must:—

(i) Be properly identified with the person to whom it is issued; i.e., the latter's name, identity card number and signature must be shown on the pass.

(ii) State precisely what the holder may do and where he may go.

(iii) Bear the legible signature of the issuing officer.

(iv) Show the limited period of validity.

(e) ACC/AMG passes issued to public utility workers, etc. may be endorsed either by the issuing officer or by the unit employing them, to cover any particular aspect of their work, as may be considered requisite.

4. All irregular passes already issued will be withdrawn and, where necessary, replaced by others issued or made out in accordance with this order.

Part II—ADJUTANT AND QUARTERMASTER GENERALS' BRANCHES

236. ITALIAN Co-operators — Disposal Ex-Hospital

1. Reference AFHQ GRO 242 of 1944 and Pamphlet "Administration of ITALIAN PW Co-operators in BRITISH Hands" notified in AFHQ GRO 612 of 1944.

2. The following will be the procedure for disposal of co-operators admitted to hospitals in ITALY.

(a) Co-operators detained in hospital for 21 days or less.

Co-operators detained in hospital for 21 days or less will on discharge be returned to their former units.

(b) Co-operators detained in hospital for over 21 days.

Co-operators detained in hospital for more than 21 days will, on discharge, be returned to their former units even though there are no vacancies for them within the WE of these units. In the case of those surplus to WE, unit concerned will apply to GHQ 2nd Echelon for disposal instructions.

3. In certain cases, e.g. move overseas or disbandment of a unit, it will not be possible to return ex-hospital personnel to their former units. Such personnel will be attached to another co-operator unit under arrangements of the appropriate District. This unit will apply to GHQ 2nd Echelon for disposal instructions.

4. All units to which ex-hospital personnel are sent will ensure that appropriate casualties, e.g. taking on strength or attachment, are rendered in accordance with procedure laid down in Chapter III, para 10, of the pamphlet referred to above.

5. AFHQ GRO 242 of 1944, para 11, and pamphlet "Administration of ITALIAN PW Co-operators in BRITISH Hands" Chapter III, para 26, will be modified in accordance with the above mentioned procedure.

237. Food Poisoning

1. Cases of food poisoning have occurred due to the consumption of food from "blown" tins.

2. All tins will be carefully examined before being opened and in any cases of doubt, they will not be issued until the opinion of a Medical or Hygiene Officer has been obtained.

3. Blown tins are those of which the ends are convex, bulged or domed, instead of being concave or drawn in.

238. Rabies and Keeping of Dogs

AAI RO 196 of 1944 will be amended as follows:—

Delete existing para 2 and substitute:—

"2. Individuals for anti-rabies treatment, in accordance with para 5(b) of the above quoted GRO will be sent to:—

48 (Br) General Hospital—for troops in forward units and in ROME Area.

92 (Br) General Hospital—for other troops in Western ITALY.

98 (Br) General Hospital—for other troops in Eastern ITALY.

Individuals for treatment must be sent to hospital by the most rapid means available. Delay on the journey may have very serious consequences for the patient."

239. Discipline — Illegal Seizure of Arms

1. It is reported that numbers of firearms, particularly sporting guns and pistols, have been removed by officers and ORs from Carabinieri Stations and private houses and retained for personal use.

2. Such removal of private property is irregular and an offence against military law.

3. COs will ensure that firearms which have been irregularly obtained in this way are handed over forthwith to the nearest Carabinieri Station with details of the place where and date when they were taken, the latter information to be repeated to Claims Commission, HQ AAI.

240. Bounds — CASSINO Monastery

1. AAI RO 213 of 1944 will be amended as follows:—

Delete all reference to «55 Area» and substitute «64 Garrison.»

241. Emergency Rations

The following amendment will be made to AAI RO 38 of 1944.

Delete para 3 and substitute the following:—

«Owing to the extreme shortage of these emergency rations no issues will be made without the authority of HQ

AAI. Demands will be submitted through normal channels and full reasons for requirements will be stated.»

242. AFV Tracks

1. Facilities exist for re-rubbing used rubber tracks from the following AFVs:—

- (a) SHERMAN Tanks (All Mks)
- (b) STUART Tanks (All Mks)
- (c) 105-mm SP Gun Carriage M7
- (d) 3"SP Gun Carriage M10

2. Tracks suitable for re-rubbing are those of which the cross tubes are not deformed, or the track pins bent or broken.

3. Inspection as to suitability will be carried out:—

(a) In forward areas, by the REME unit which removes the track.

(b) In L of C and Base Areas, by REME Workshops replacing tank tracks.

4. Tracks suitable for re-rubbing will be marked in paint with a green bar and consigned to MT RSD 557 AOD, PONTECAGNANO.

5. Unsuitable tracks will be marked with a red bar and consigned direct to the nearest Base Salvage Depot.

6. AAI RO 174 of 1944 is hereby cancelled.

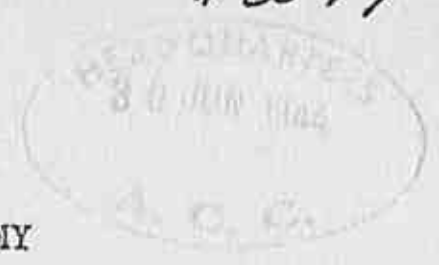

TELEPHONE SECURITY

1. It is absolutely necessary that strict security measures be observed in using the telephone, since practically all telephones are linked with civilian exchanges. The following rules will be observed when using the telephone:

- a. Secret matters should never be discussed over the telephone.
 - b. Confidential matters should be discussed by reference to file numbers and dates in such a manner as to guard the content.
 - c. Care must be exercised in order to avoid indentifying names of telephone exchanges with locations of headquarters or Army units, i.e., if a person wishes to telephone to an Army headquarters or unit, he should ask for the exchange concerned (Fatima, Broadway), and never mention place names.
2. It is directed that all officers and men be notified of these rules.

1. There have been several instances of telephone calls being connected to the wrong numbers, with the result that busy senior staff officers have been needlessly interrupted. The causes are partly due to mistakes on the part of switchboard operators, but also largely due to subscribers themselves. The instances solely attributable to faulty operating are relatively small, and every effort is being made to reduce the number still further.
2. Subscribers can help the telephone service generally by ensuring they ask for the right numbers. If in doubt they should ask to be connected to "Information", who will give them the necessary particulars. Subscribers are also asked to listen carefully to the repeat back of a number by the exchange operator, and to correct it if necessary. A proper use of the phonetic numerals will assist materially in the prevention of wrong connections.
3. Subscribers are also reminded that there are two experienced Supervising Officers at the exchange (Extension 189), who are on duty during the busy periods. If they have difficulty or trouble in getting connections, the Supervising Officers are there to help.
4. There is still a number of instances of subscribers booking trunk calls and leaving their telephones before they are put through. If it is necessary to leave the telephone after booking a call, the call should be cancelled or, alternatively, arrangements made for another subscriber to accept it.

Subject: Damage to Main State Telephone Cable.

To : See Distribution.

1. Instances have occurred of the Main State Telephone Cable being damaged by units engaged in laying water mains, construction of culverts, etc. along the road which the cable follows. This has caused very serious interruptions of existing communications.

2. The cable follows the NAPLES - CASERTA - PEGNATARO - AVERSA - FERENTINO - ROMA highway. In the future no work involving digging will be undertaken by any unit along this road without first consulting the Signal Officer, P.B.S.

3. Particular care will be exercised by units repairing bridges where the cable is suspended. If the cable at such places shows signs of damage the exact location of such damage will be reported immediately to the Signal Officer, P.B.S.

4. If in spite of the above instructions or for any other reason the cable is damaged the fact will be reported immediately to the Signal Officer, P.B.S., giving exact location and type of damage.

Subject: Telephone message from Brig. Gueterbock to Captain Stone.

1. AMG 15th Army Group appear to be trying to move us out of the Province Building. They require space for Rome planning.
2. With considerable difficulty we have established ourselves in the Province Building which we have repaired. We are also repairing various office accommodation in surrounding buildings, all of which are required for our rear party from Salerno. We have at considerable trouble secured and repaired (or are repairing) various accommodation near these offices for the housing of officers and other ranks. This work has been proceeding actively since the first of December.
3. We had in addition secured the Ospedale Militare and Scuole Elementari at Acerra, but have had to give that up for a French hospital on the demand of FMH. We had also secured in Naples the Institute de Filles de Popolo as an office, but have given that up to Region III on their urgent demand. We have thus given up two big buildings which we had secured. While we have been actively seeking and repairing fresh accommodation with some success, it would appear that the local AMG Headquarters, subordinate to AMG 15th Army Group might have secured additional accommodation for Rome planning had they acted with equal energy.
4. I must emphasize that we from the Province Building are carrying on the actual government of Regions I and II. This work has necessarily been interrupted severely during the move from Salerno for a period of nearly a month. Should we have to make another move there would again be a serious interruption of work.
5. We are at the moment doing our best to cooperate with AMG 15th Army Group and the Central Economic Committee regarding the economic government of the mainland of Italy. We have provided a number of officers for combating typhus in Naples. We have had to assist the III Region in the receipt, warehousing, and movement of several hundred tons of public health stores with which they were unable to cope.
6. General Robertson agreed when I came here on the 3rd of December, that we should establish our Economic and Communications Sections and our housekeeping staff at Naples. This has been done.
7. Working on the above plan I have made arrangements at Salerno for only a portion of the whole Headquarters AMG and for the Italian Government. There is now no room at Salerno to establish the rest of Headquarters AMG there.

8. If we have to move out of Naples altogether, we should have to take on the accommodation at Salerno which has been reserved for the Italian Government, and this would upset the move from Brindisi completely.

9. If we have to move out of the Provincia Building into other accommodation in Naples, there will be a serious break of say three weeks in our functioning of economic government. Furthermore, we shall be permanently unable to carry on as efficiently at Naples as we could have done with our present compact setup.

10. Finally as I have stated, the necessity for Rome planning is no new matter. I had agreed with Brig. Inch to leave Region IV occupying the whole of one floor of the Provincia Building in order to enable them to do Rome planning there. Had they required any further accommodation they could themselves have secured another office, for example the Istituto de Figlia di Popolo which we only found in the first week in January.

11. I propose to refuse to move out of the Provincia Building without direct orders from the Deputy President AGC, and I should like him to be aware of the above factors before he makes any decision which may be officially requested.

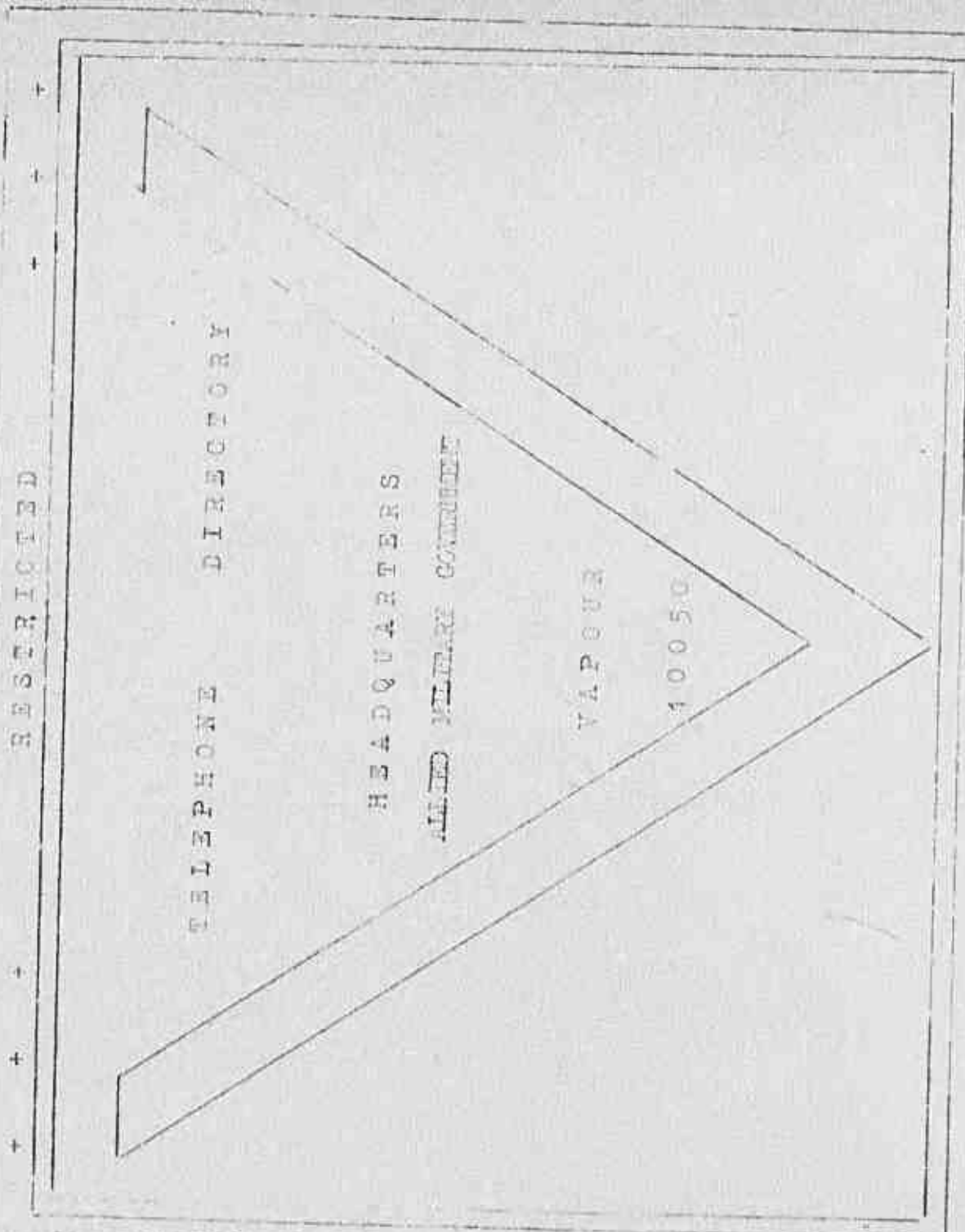

TO: Ing. Cusina', Societa' Esercizi Telefonici, Palermo

1. The following information and directives are issued to effect the transfer on 1st Oct. 1943 of certain telephone facilities from Allied Army operation and maintenance for the purpose of providing local telephone service to military and civilian customers.
2. You are hereby authorized and directed to open all S.E.T. telephone exchanges in the Provinces of Palermo, Agrigento, and Caltanissetta except those located in the cities or towns of Palermo, Porto Empedocle, and Licata, under the following conditions:
 - a. Telephone exchanges are permitted to provide only local telephone service to civilian customers.
 - b. Such steps as are necessary shall be taken to prevent subscribers from placing telephone calls on trunk circuits.
 - c. All interurban pole lines, wires, cables, and control office switchboard equipment are reserved for Allied military use only, and will be operated and controlled by Allied military personnel until further notice.
3. You will, on 1st October 1943, begin the operation and control of telephone exchanges within the limits stated above by regular civilian S.E.T. personnel.
4. You will undertake at once to restore urban cable, wire and control office facilities to as near normal conditions as possible.
 - a. Particular emphasis shall be placed on work necessary to protect cable facilities from further damage by the coming rains or other hazards.
5. Allied military requirements shall receive first priority in the establishment and/or maintenance of commercial S.E.T. facilities used by them.
6. No priority is established for S.E.T. civilian customers at this time; however, essential services will be given priority if a shortage of material or facilities make such action necessary.
7. You will prepare as soon as possible a minimum estimate of material required to restore to workable condition and maintain the telephone facilities in your territory for a period of six months beginning 1st October, 1943.

8. Billing and collection methods for civilian subscribers and other actions to be taken by S.E.T. during the restoration period shall be in accordance with the attached supplement No. 1, to these instructions dated 1 Oct. 43.

PROCEDURES FOR S.E.T. (WESTERN SICILY) TO FOLLOW.

1. Technical.

a. Inspect the telephone control offices as rapidly as conditions will permit to determine status as to use and condition.

(1) S.E.T. will proceed with restoration of urban exchanges upon receipt of permission to do so from proper military authorities.

(a) Wherever deemed advisable spare parts or complete exchange switchboards may be removed from one place to another more important office.

(b) Should an automatic exchange be irreparable, manual equipment shall be substituted until new automatic centrals can be installed.

b. Inspect urban cables and lines within the towns and communes as rapidly as possible.

(1) S.E.T. will proceed with repair of these facilities as permission is procured from military authorities.

(a) Repairs to damaged cables particularly underground if it exists shall be made before other outside lines are taken care of.

(b) Rapid repairs to least damaged zones will restore service to the greatest number of civilian telephone subscribers in the shortest time.

(c) Inventory of materials needed to make repairs shall be necessary to properly organize this repair program. Wherever possible, material will be salvaged and repaired locally.

c. Reconstruction and use of interurban cables and lines shall be undertaken after their release from military service.

(1) Civil personnel shall not work on any lines carrying military circuits until special approval for such work has been granted by proper military authorities.

(2) Signal units of the Allied Armies will make repairs to interurban

(2) Signal units of the Allied Armies will make repairs to interurban lines wherever required for military use.

2. Administrative.

a. Subscriber Service.

(1) Using last billing put out by the General Office in Naples for the 2nd trimester 1943 as a basis, prepare the billing for the 3rd trimester (July, August, September) and for 4th trimester (October, November, December) in order to be able to collect the money as lines are put back into service.

(a) Where telephone service has been interrupted or discontinued appropriate adjustments should be made in billing.

(2) Control the subscribers; installations (names, addresses, amount to be paid, classification regarding taxes, etc.)

(a) If a shortage of materials makes rationing of telephone service necessary at any exchange, military needs shall have first priority and other priorities shall be approved by the local military officer concerned.

b. Cash Service.

- (1) Collected money will be deposited daily at a bank or in a postal account and credited at Palermo or Catania as appropriate.
- (2) To meet current operating expenses the provincial directors will receive a monthly allowance from their headquarters.

c. Inventories.

- (1) Make inventories of materials in warehouses.
- (2) Make inventory of telephone facilities, including offices, furniture and fixtures, stationary supplies, etc.
- (3) Make inventory of telephone installations.
- (4) Set up bookkeeping system if required of pick up use of former system of accounting.

d. Personnel

- (1) Staff at each telephone office or agency to be in accordance with actual needs.
- (2) Organize the preparation of payroll and paybooks (they were formerly made up and kept in General Office at Naples).
- (3) Make provision for pay deductions as required by State laws now in force.
- (4) Make up and organize a Mutual Sicilian Cash Benefit arrangement as a temporary substitute for the existing before the Allied occupation which had its headquarters in Naples.
- (5) Wages and salaries shall be in accordance with wage policy established by AMSCOT.
- (6) Arrange for contracts and proper economic treatment of personnel in charge of small agencies which operate on such a basis.

- (2) Require rapid reconstruction of central office buildings such as the one at Palermo which has been damaged.

- (4) Make agreements or contracts as required between S.E.T. and other pole line and wire using organizations such as telegraph and railroads.
- (5) Arrange for S.E.T. subscribers use of government or state circuits or lines and appropriate accounting procedure after release of such circuits by military forces.
- (6) No new construction or appropriation of routes terminal equipment or changes of circuits will be made by civil authorities without the consent of the Signal Officer concerned.
