SUBJECT: War Department Code Names and Abbreviations.

TO : Commanding General, North African Theater of Operations,  
U. S. Army, c/o Postmaster, New York, New York.

1. Government Agencies in the United States have contacted the War Department for information concerning alphabetical abbreviations used in communications and other official documents emanating from overseas theaters. In the majority of these instances it has been found that these abbreviations were not authorized by Army Regulation.

2. To avoid unnecessary delays which inevitably follow, it is requested that in communications issued by United States forces or by confirmed United States and British forces, the words, for which no abbreviation is authorized by IM 21-30 and AR 650-100, be spelled out in full the first time they appear in such and every communication, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses.

1. I am writing to you about one of these awkward personnel matters, and should be grateful for your help.

2. We have set up a Security Intelligence Section at Headquarters AMG/ACC. This is headed by a most experienced home office official of the special investigations branch. It deals with such matters as security of the operations and personnel of the Commission itself, screening Italian officials, and doing general MI5 work. The actual executive work is done, of course, by the ordinary executive agencies such as Public Safety. You will appreciate that for this security work one requires an especially selected personnel who are extremely difficult to find among the officers at our disposal. It is by no means every police officer who has the background, training, and tact for a job of this nature.

3. Sometime ago we asked for the release of Major Armstrong from Region III, and Major Mattei from Region IV. I believe that you have in mind to make Armstrong an S.C.A.O. I should like to put in a plea for Armstrong's release for this security job, as it is comparatively easy to find good S.C.A.O.s and it is extremely difficult to find personnel for security. We are told that Mattei was requested for police work in Rome, but now I hear he has gone to an I(b) job at Headquarters No. II District. I am rather concerned about this as Mattei ought to be in a better position than a purely local I(b) appointment. I should very much like to get Mattei, and should be glad of definite information as to whether he has in point of fact left you or not. If he has left you, I propose to take the matter up with **188** if he is still with you I hope that you will be able to release him.

4. In our Public Safety sub-commission we are extremely short of good British officers. It is very undesirable for any

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sub-commission to be overweighted with one nationality or the other. The man I should very much like is Major Wilcox. I understand that in Region IV you already have a first class police officer in Major Chambers who is doing another job. Could you see your way to letting us have Wilcox? If you want to put Major Chambers in instead of Wilcox, perhaps you can replace him from the personnel coming out with Regions V, VIII, and IX. Alternatively, if you will let me know the type of appointment which Chambers is at present filling, I will do my best to provide a good officer to replace him. It may well be that you will be prepared to let us have Wilcox without interfering with Chambers.

5. I am waiting to hear from you regarding the details of personnel you want from us for Rome. I told Gerry that I would not do anything until I had exact details. In particular, do you want Monfort or French as Supply Officer?

6. I should be most grateful if you would do your best to meet us over this security personnel question.

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2. The Chief of Staff is responsible to the Deputy President for the efficient working of the Allied Command as a whole. The orders of the Deputy President are issued in his name to the Chief of Staff or by officers to whom he has delegated his authority.

3. The Chief of Staff is responsible in particular for the direction of the work of (a) the General Staff, (b) the Joint Staff, (c) the Public Relations Staff, (d) the Industrial Planning Staff and (e) the Executive Staff. He will be responsible for the coordination of the work of all other staffs.

4. Each Executive Officer is responsible for:

- (a) the co-ordination of work within his Section and between his Section and other Sections; to ensure that there are no gaps or overlaps and that work is carried out in accordance with superior instructions, orders, and instructions; and, if applicable, conduct of conferences between Sections; and the direction of the work of any divisions within his Section.
- (b) seeing that the problems of Subcommittees are adequately studied.
- (c) drafting and controlling all material produced by his Subcommittees to higher authority.
- (d) issuing orders, through the A.C. if necessary, in accordance with the wishes of the head of his Section and to further the work of the Commission.
- (e) Co-ordinating replies to the head of his Section, regarding the functioning of his Section.

- (f) the organization of intelligence work within his Section.
- (g) the organization of his office and the transmission of correspondence.
- (h) the allocation of duties to, and the supervision of the work of his staff; and ensuring that they keep themselves informed on reports which affect them.
- (i) responsibility to the head of his Section regarding the organization, development or re-organization etc. of his staff or other officer concerned, and the appropriate action in the case of circumstances which require the removal of subordinates subordinated to him.

5. In accordance with Part 1, "Staffing" includes "Directorate" (or Sub-Staff).

6. It is the duty of every staff officer to assist their Executive Officers in the performance of his duties.

7. All matters of policy and, to extend, important questions affecting the staff of the Subdivision will be dealt with through staff channels.
8. Chiefs of Subdivisions will, however, be responsible for decisions in-olved with other Subdivisions' concerns and for drawing the attention of the staff to questions of policy or to questions affecting other Subdivisions.
9. Correspondence between the Allied Commission or any portion of it and higher or parallel authority or the Italian Government will be dealt with through the Secretary-General, unless that requires correspondence with A.E.C. regarding internal administration of the Allied Commission. Such correspondence will be dealt with through the Adjutant General.
10. Correspondence between the HQ Allied Commission and its subordinate M. G. will be dealt with through the A.E.C., unless it is a technical matter which con-cerns only one Section of the Commission.
11. Functional correspondence between one Section of the HQ Allied Commission and another in Regions will be dealt with through the staff of that section unless it is a purely technical matter concerning one Subdivision only. In such cases, the Subdivision will correspond direct, except in the case of Economic or Ad-ministrative Subdivisions which will correspond in all cases through the staff of their Directorate.
12. In personal contacts, staff officers should in general deal with opposites number of their rank. But an Executive Officer will always have right of access to his next superior Chief Staff Officer.
13. Chiefs of a Subdivision will not deal with his Vice President or Director, or their deputies, on any matter of principle or policy without first informing the Executive Officer or the Vice-President of Director concerned.
14. These instructions will apply also to Headquarters, Allied Control Commission when it is officially set up.
