MEMORANDUM:

CORRESPONDENCE DISPATCH PROCEDURE.

1. The procedure outlined below will be effective Monday, 8 May 44.

2. (a). BEFORE delivery to the Message Center departments will envelope all correspondence for dispatch outside Main HQ., A.C.C., with the exception of unclassified material to the following formations:

A.F.R.Q. (M.G.S.)
HQ., A.A.I.
Reer Hq., A.C.C.,
AMC/ACC Regional Hqs.
AMC Army Hqs.
Peninsular Base Section.

(b). Classified material to the above formations will be enclosed in one envelope only. Vide sub-para (c) and para 4 below.

(c). Many departments correspond with the formations mentioned in sub-para (a) above, and all dispatches are transmitted from the Message Center in bulk under one cover. Double enveloping of classified material and single enveloping of the unclassified is therefore not only uneconomical but unnecessary.

3. Every package or envelope must be fully addressed and at the bottom left hand corner bear the reference number(s) or the enclosure(s). A suffix or prefix identifying the department of origin will always form part of the reference. Failure to conform with the instructions will only result in delay in transmission.

4. The following additional security requirements will be particularly noted.

(a). TOP SECRET and SECRET communications will be sent in two envelopes. To assist the recipient in verifying that there has been no tampering in transit, the inner envelope will always be a new one. The inner envelope will be marked and marked with the security category of the enclosure; if TOP SECRET it will also be marked "To be opened personally by" the holder of an appointment or the individual named. The outer envelope will not be marked with the category of the enclosure but will be blue crossed and the word "REGISTERED" written centrally at the top of the envelope. (but see sub-para 2(b) & (c) above)

1. The procedure outlined below will be effective Monday, 8 May 44.

2. (a). BEFORE delivery to the Message Center departments will envelope all correspondence for dispatch outside Main HQ, A.C.C., with the exception of unclassified material to the following formations:

(b). Classified material to the above formations will be enclosed in one envelope only. Vide sub-para (c) and para 4 below.

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(a). TOP SECRET and SECRET communications will be sent in two envelopes. To assist the recipient in verifying that there has been no tampering in transit, the inner envelope will always be a new one. The inner envelope will be sealed and marked with the security category of the enclosure; if TOP SECRET it will also be marked "To be opened personally by" the holder of an appointment or the individual named. The outer envelope will not be marked with the category of the enclosure but will be blue crossed and the word "REGISTERED" written centrally at the top of the envelope. (but see sub-para 2(b) & (c) above).

(b). CONFIDENTIAL communications will be enclosed in two envelopes and the inner marked CONFIDENTIAL but not sealed. The outer envelope will be treated as described in preceding sub-para 4(a).

(c). RESTRICTED and other unclassified communications will be dispatched in accordance with para 3 above (subject to sub-para 2(a)).

5. (a). The Message Center will give and take receipts for all TOP SECRET, SECRET, and CONFIDENTIAL packages. Receipts will NOT be given for packages or documents classified as RESTRICTED or unclassified.

(b). Departments should enclose with, and attach to, all TOP SECRET communications a receipt for signature and return by the recipient. Receipts may also be enclosed with any other documents, in respect of which a department may desire direct acknowledgment by the recipient. Suitable forms of receipt may be obtained on application to the Adjutant's Department (Misc Section).

6. Without detriment to the needs of security (e.g. see para 4(a) above) no effort will be spared to exercise the strictest economy in the use of envelopes, by using gummed labels. In this way it will be possible to prolong the life of envelopes by their use again and again.

7. It will be appreciated that a most important and desirable result of the introduction of this procedure should be limitation of information to the minimum number of personnel and result in a standard of improved security.

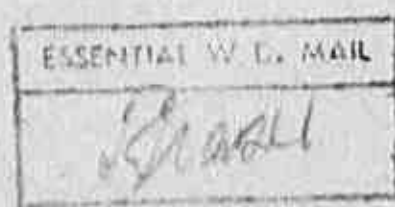

1. Attached hereto is proposed revision of directives contained in subject publications.
2. The adoption of this revision is urged, for the following reasons:
 - a. An incorrect impression of the activities of the RC and MG Section (Civil Affairs Branch) has been created.
 - b. If followed out literally, the Civil Affairs Branch would be required to do the work of the Miscellaneous Section, Adjutant's Department, since some 50% - 60% of all incoming official mail is now addressed, regardless of subject, to RC and MG Section. This approaches absurdity when letters, replying to a letter originating, for example, from Public Safety or Public Health, are so addressed.
 - c. In actual practice, the directive which it is proposed to amend has become a dead letter, since the Civil Affairs Branch have informed Miscellaneous Section, Adjutant's Department, that they are to route incoming correspondence addressed to Executive Commissioner or RC & MG as suits the subject of the letter.
 - d. Adoption of the revision will lessen the possibility of error, and make for more efficient handling of administrative matters.

Reference is made to our MGS: 311.7 of 5 April, in particular
to para 2 thereof.

1. It has been agreed by the authorities concerned that official communications to and from the Allied Missions attached to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission may be subjected to censorship, and that this procedure should be adopted. The British Resident Minister at AFHQ has drawn the attention of all representatives of the United Nations in Algiers, excepting the French and Russian, whose Governments are also represented with the Sub-Commission, to the regulations governing the despatch of communications addressed to representatives of the United Nations Governments with the Sub-Commission. The regulations referred to are contained in para 3 of this Headquarters letter AG 353.7-5 MGS-AGM of 29 October 1943. No approach has been made to the UNRL or to the Russian representative since both nations have representatives in Italy other than with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, and thus have alternative means of communication available. Indeed, so far as this Section is aware, no communications to the representatives of these Governments with the Sub-Commission have ever passed through this Headquarters or through the Director of the Sub-Commission, and it is considered impolitic to raise the issue at this time.

2. In the future communications intended for the Allied Missions with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission will be received in this Section in open envelopes which we shall enclose in an outer cover addressed to Civil Censorship Group, APO # 394, for censorship and onward transmission to the Director of the Sub-Commission. In order to expedite the delivery of these communications you may wish to make special arrangements with the Civil Censorship Group for their onward transmission from Salerno.

In the reverse direction it is requested that you will arrange for representatives of the United Nations Governments with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission to deliver communications in open envelopes to the Director of the Sub-Commission, and for the latter to despatch these communications to the Military Government Section through the Civil Censorship Group, to whom separate instructions are being issued by IMC.

(Attention: Chief Commissioner, ACC)

ATTACHED

1. Attention is drawn to our Message 44015 of 28 January 1944 authorizing direct communication on matters of routine between Headquarters Allied Control Commission and the British and American Governments. This directive was issued in pursuance of the policy of decentralizing the problems of civil affairs arising in Italy - to which policy this Headquarters still adheres. (In this connection reference is made to AFHQ letter on "Exercise of Certain Functions of President, Allied Control Commission, to the G.O.C. in C., ACOMF, 28 January 1944.") Since the despatch of Message 44015 cogent reasons have been advanced by certain Staff Sections at this Headquarters why the authority to communicate directly upon "matters of routine" should be more accurately limited. Supply and personnel, in particular, are matters which must be dealt with through AFHQ. Insistence has been put upon the principle that all matters of real substance must be referred through this Headquarters to the Combined Chiefs of Staff - which represents the sole authority under which AFHQ operates - and not to a particular department of either the American or the British Government. In order that this vital principle of Allied action may certainly be observed in practice, it has been decided that Message 44015 should now be supplemented by a more specific directive.

2. The matters of routine on which direct communication between the ACC and the two Governments is authorized are for the present limited to the following:

Inquiries as to the whereabouts and welfare of individual civilians.

Listing of displaced persons

Condition of private property

Civil postal administration

Procurement of publications

Statistical and like technical information

e.g., public health records

criminal records

industrial reports

agricultural reports

Routine reports required by AFHQ to be periodically submitted, as

directed by AFHQ

Where such direct communication takes place it should be authorized by the appropriate Vice President or Director of the ACC.

3. Headquarters ACC is invited to examine promptly the subject of 399 present letter, and to communicate to this Headquarters its recommendations, whether as to defining the scope of "matters of routine" or otherwise.

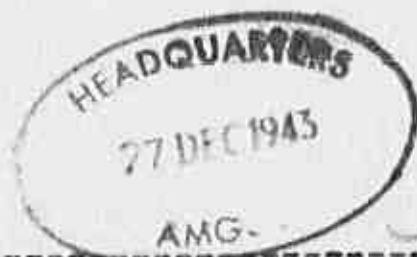

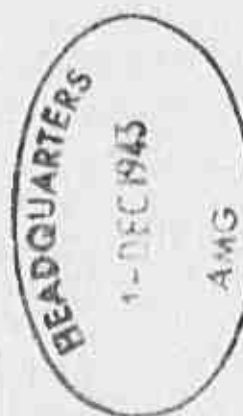

Your letter of 19 October was received and we have also received SO 26C, NATOUSSA, transferring Walterick and Wood to HQ Comd for duty with MGS. In my previous letter, I suggested to you that it would be necessary to provide suitable replacements before these enlisted men could be relieved. To date suitable replacements had not been received and yet you have come ahead and had orders issued relieving them of duty here. Walterick and Wood will be sent back to AFHQ as soon as possible, in spite of the fact that they are very badly needed over here.

We have received most of the 74 enlisted men from Seventh Army that Colonel Parkman "thought" but, unfortunately, about 55 of these men are basics--the remaining 16, along with clerks from this HQ, have already been assigned to duty with HQ Region I and II and it has also been necessary to provide clerical personnel for some of the planners that come over from Tizi Ouzou.

I can appreciate that you people at MGS and Tizi Ouzou are operating on an unusually strong basis and the work that we are trying to do is not important. If there is anybody else over here, officer or enlisted personnel, that you require just have the necessary orders issued transferring them to your section as I fear that the shock of running on to anything coming out of North Africa that has been properly coordinated would be too much for me.

2. The volume of cryptographed traffic now being handled makes it increasingly important that stereotyped phraseology, especially at the beginning or end, be avoided in drafting messages.
3. Publication of a comprehensive list of permanently stereotyped beginnings and endings of messages is not considered to be feasible as the type of signal traffic and the writing habits of personnel drafting messages vary in different areas. Therefore, the list of permanent stereotypes indicated in paragraph 5 below has been kept as small as practicable.
4. It is believed that a universal system rather than a universal list must be employed to eliminate, or at least to reduce to a safe minimum, the dangers to cryptographic security resulting from the use of stereotyped phraseology. The code room at each individual headquarters will periodically compile a list of words considered stereotyped at that headquarters. This list will be supplementary to the list appearing below, and will be distributed to originators of messages for their information.
5. Certain words (as numerals, phonetics, designations of rank) extremely stereotyped and should never be used at the beginning or end of a message. A list of these words follows:

NOTE - Communications to American higher formations

(c) For signature by or for Heads of Divisions

All communications on Divisional subjects not covered by
(a) and (b) above.

(4) In certain cases of correspondence emanating from various
US Army Headquarters, it may be advisable to use the
American procedure of replying by means of the indorsement.
In this form of reply the message is typed on the original
of the basic letter which is then transmitted either to
the originator of the basic letter or to any addressee
desired. A copy of the indorsement is made on the copy
of the basic letter and is retained as the file copy.

10. (2) The CCAG in charge of a Province is responsible for the
satisfactory working of all Allied Military Government
activities within his Province except in the case of certain

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specific matters to be handled by H.Q. Officers, which will be the subject of a separate memorandum) and therefore must have knowledge of all orders and advice sent by Heads of Divisions to their offices in his Province. All communications between HQ Divisions and their officers assigned to Provinces will take place through the SDAO's.

(iii) Correspondence to be passed through the SDAO's will be addressed:-

through SDAO Province

(iii) Ordinary official correspondence will always be addressed to an officer by his official title and not by his name.

(iv) When sending out a memorandum care must be taken that sufficient copies are provided to avoid the recipient having to retype the letter for further distribution.

(v) More detailed instructions on correspondence are being issued to the C.R. - copies to all offices for information.

In the latter case the file will automatically return to the initiator on the date initialed.

13. OUTGOING MEMORANDUM FILE

In addition to the number of copies of a memorandum required for issue and the file copy, a further copy will be made of all except MOST SECRET correspondence and put each day into an "Outgoing Memoranda" file. Each morning this file will be circulated to SDAO, DCO, Heads of Divisions etc., who will thus be able to keep in touch with all ordinary AMST HQ business. This file will be marked DOMESTIC as the whole object of it will be deferred if it does not circulate within a day to all those who have to use it.

(iii) Ordinary official correspondence will always be addressed to an officer by his official title and not by his name.

(iv) When sending out a memorandum care must be taken that sufficient copies are provided to avoid the recipient having to retype the letter for further distribution.

(v) More detailed instructions on correspondence are being issued to the G.S. - copies to all officers for information.

11. Outgoing correspondence will be typed either by the G.S. or by the Divisional Clerks. In either case, the signed correspondence with the file from which it is to issue, must go to the G.S. despatch clerk for registration and despatch.

12. Before dispatch of a letter the file copy will be initialed and the file returned to the G.S. The file will not be returned to the originator of the letter unless (a) the G.S. considers that there is further action on the file or (b) the file is marked "E.U." 18/5 (or whatever date required) and initialed. In the latter case the file will automatically return to the initiator on the date indicated.

13. ENTERING MEMORANDA FILE

In addition to the number of copies of a memorandum required for issue and the file copy, a further copy will be made of all except MOST SECRET correspondence and put each day into an "Outgoing Memoranda" file. Each morning this file will be circulated to OMAF, DOWA, Heads of Divisions etc., who will thus be able to keep in touch with all ordinary MAFHQ business. This file will be marked DEFERRED at the whole object of it will be defeated if it does not circulate within a day to all those who have to see it.

14. SECRET FILES

These files will be subject to the procedure outlined above, but they will be kept in a separate registry and correspondence for them will be filed under special arrangements made by the Chief Clerk. Only clerks designated by the Chief Clerk will type secret correspondence and the files will only be passed by the head of officers, the Chief Clerk or Staff Sergeants designated to see them.

15. CLASSIFICATION OF CORRESPONDENCE

It is the duty of every officer to decide whether any official correspondence which he has to sign should be given a security

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classification. The classifications which will be used are as follows:-

- "American RESTRICTED" = British CONFIDENTIAL
- "American CONFIDENTIAL" = British SECRET
- "American SECRET" = British MOST SECRET

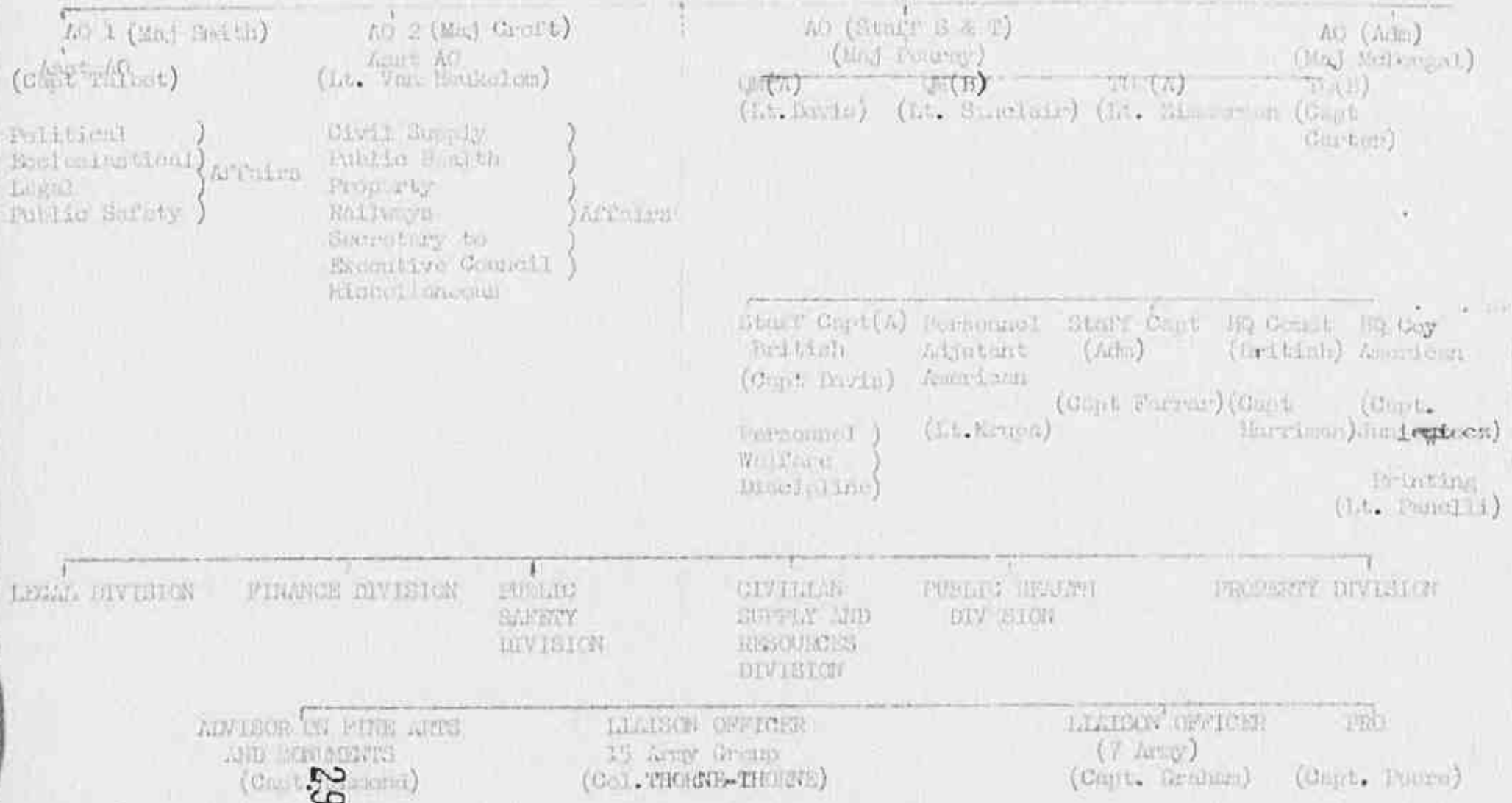

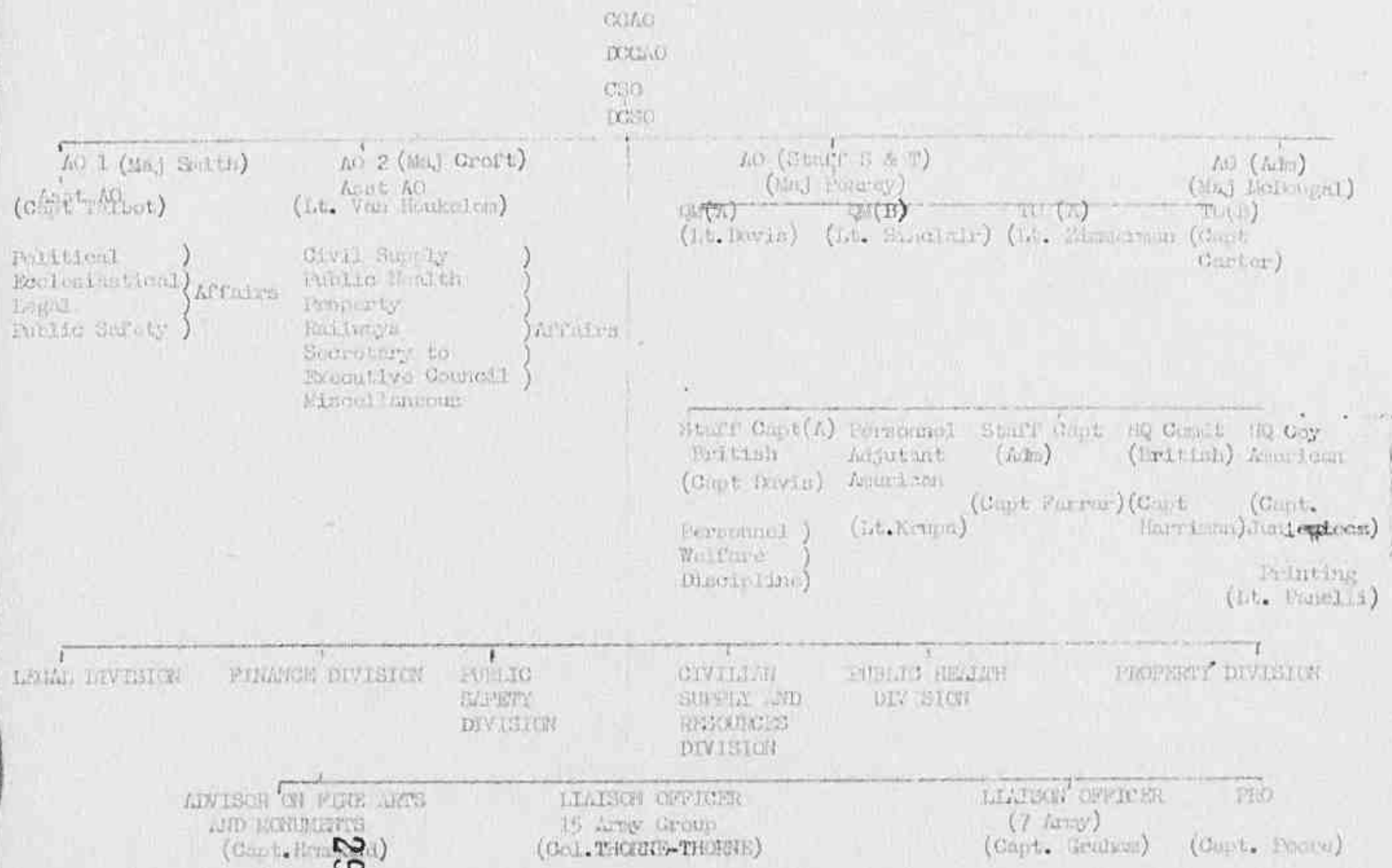

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR DEALING WITH CORRESPONDENCE
AT ARSOI H.Q.

The following procedure for dealing with correspondence at ARSOI H.Q. will be adopted forthwith.

1. INCOMING CORRESPONDENCE

- (i) All mail coming into ARSOI H.Q. will be opened by DSO or in his absence, AO 1, AO 2 or the Chief Clerk. It will then be passed to the Central Registry for logging and insertion in the correct file.
- (ii) The officer opening the mail will mark with a cross the correspondence requiring the most urgent action and this will be given priority over all other filing. All correspondence must be filed immediately upon receipt. If the pertinent file is not available, it must be submitted on a temporary file.

2.

- (i) All papers on files will be promptly referenced and recorded on the minute sheet inside the front cover of the file before the file leaves the Registry. The file will then be passed to the appropriate Division or AO for action as necessary.
- (ii) All files for action by Divisions will go to the Heads of Divisions except when the latter direct otherwise.
- (iii) In the Administrative side all files for action will go to A.S.1, A.O.2, A.S. (Staff 3 & 4) or the officers under A.O. (Admin.) according to the subjects with which they deal - see chart attached.

3. No papers will be removed from the file without prior reference to the Chief Clerk.

4. Papers will not be dealt with until placed on the proper file. Adherence to this rule will avoid loss of the papers.

5. OFFICE PROCEDURE

If it is necessary to submit a matter to another Division, the C.S.C, DCMO or DCMC for comments or decision, this will be done wherever practicable by means of a minute on the pertinent file. Minutes will be written at the foot of the last page entered in the file or on a sheet of paper inserted in the file and numbered as a page of the file.

6. Files moving from one Division to another must pass through the Registry for entry in the circulation register. Central Registry Clerks will visit each office at least once a week to

files will be given priority over all other filing. All entries must be filed immediately upon receipt. If the pertinent file is not available, it must be submitted on a temporary file.

2. (4) All papers on files will be properly reformed and recorded on the minute sheet inside the front cover of the file before the file leaves the Registry. The file will then be placed to the appropriate Division or A.C. for action as necessary.

(41) All files for action by Divisions will go to the heads of Divisions except when the latter direct otherwise.

(411) On the Administrative side all files for action will go to A.O.1, A.O.2, A.C. (Staff 3 & 7) or the officers under A.O. (Admin.) according to the subjects with which they deal - see chart attached.

3. No papers will be removed from the file without prior reference to the Chief Clerk.

4. Papers will not be dealt with until placed on the proper file. Attendance to this rule will avoid loss of the papers.

5. OFFICE PROCEDURE

If it is necessary to submit a matter to another Division, the C.S.O., (CCAO) or CCAC for comments or decision, this will be done wherever practicable by means of a minute on the pertinent file. Minutes will be written at the foot of the last page entered in the file or on a sheet of paper inserted in the file and numbered as a page of the file.

6. Files moving from one Division to another must pass through the Registry for entry in the circulation register. Central Registry Clerks will visit each office at least once an hour to bring and/or remove files, but if greater speed is required, there is no objection to the use of Divisional clerks or the office orderlies stationed in the passages, provided that they take the files via the C.S. and report where the files are going.

7. Booking slips will be provided for passing files from one office to another. Where immediate action is required, an urgent slip will be used.

8. Whenever in doubt, the C.S. will consult Divisions or AOs as to the file in which a document should be placed and the title of new files. But there will be mistakes, and Divisions or AOs

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should instruct the Registry whenever an improvement can be made. This particularly applies in the case of general files which tend gradually to cover a large number of subordinate subjects arising from the main subject. The result is a mass of correspondence being dealt with in one file, which means delay all round. Breaking down the file into a number of files will remedy this.

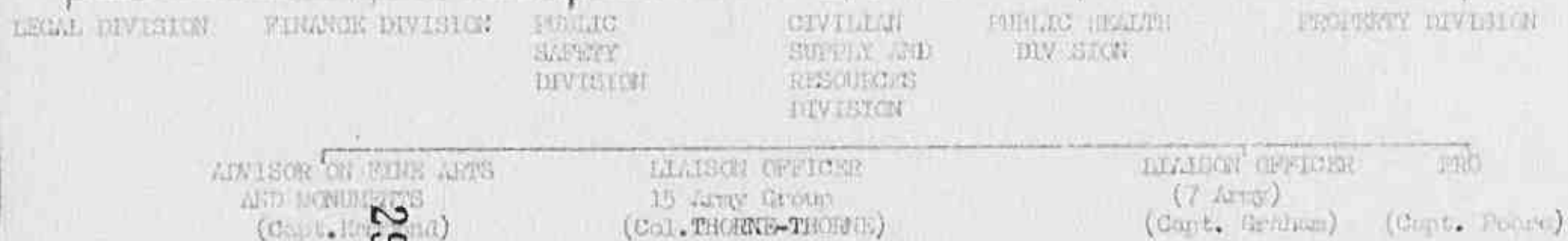
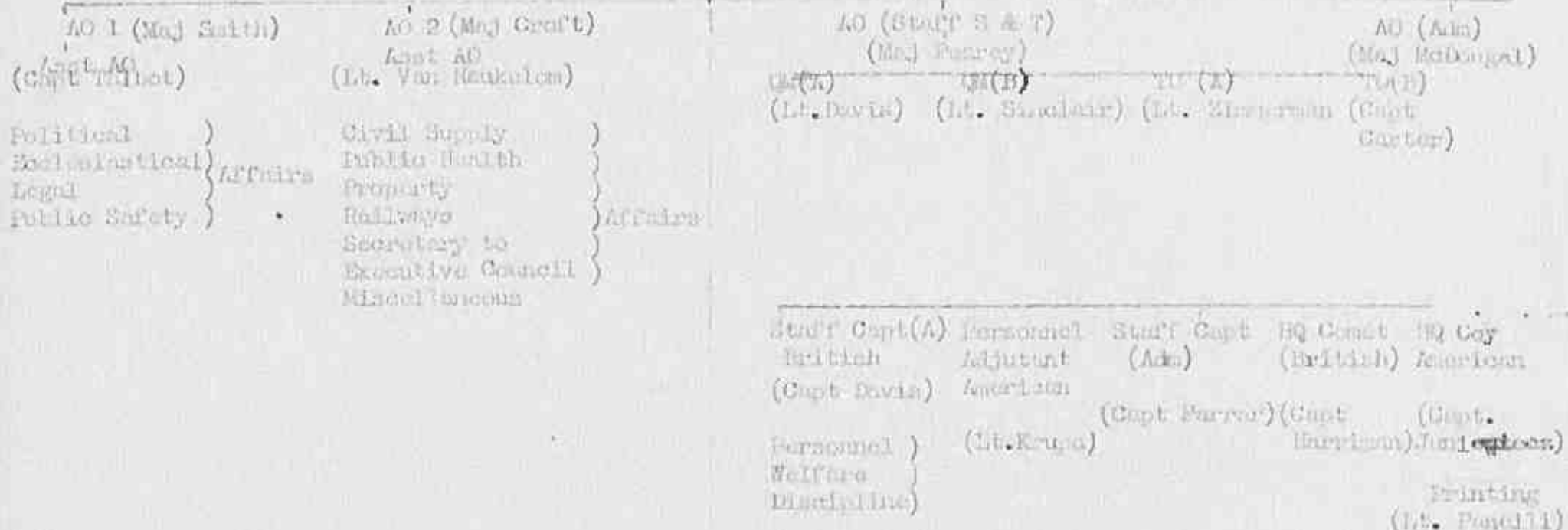

1. The following information regarding the operation of the Adjutant's section of this Headquarters is published for the guidance of all concerned.

2. The section is divided into six sub-sections as follows:

a. Miscellaneous - here incoming mail is received, routed, and dispatched to other offices within the Headquarters.

b. Officers - in this sub-section are maintained all records pertaining to officers, such as vouchers, rosters, and personnel records.

c. CW/EM - maintains all records of enlisted men.

d. Publications - this sub-section operates the stenographic pool, typing pool, translating pool, and does all mimeographing and printing.

e. Records - operates the general files of the Headquarters.

f. Communications - operates the message center and AGO, all couriers, dispatch riders, and messengers for distribution of correspondence within and without the Headquarters.

g. Incoming correspondence - is registered, a "track-slip" is attached indicating the Sub-Commission or office to which the document should go and whether it is for information or action. If the officer who handles the correspondence makes further information or background material he sends to the Records sub-section for the files on the subject. This may be done by messenger or by writing a track-slip requesting the files.

h. Outgoing correspondence - of a routine nature or relating only to the operations of the Sub-Commission involved will be handled within the Sub-Commission and sent to the Message Center for forwarding. All other correspondence will be handled as follows:

a. Drafts will be submitted to the Adjutant for approval prior to dispatch.

b. Sufficient copies will be prepared to allow one copy for filing in the Records Sub-section and one with the pertinent file of the Sub-Commission.

c. All communications will go forward in duplicate.

d. Replies will be made in the form of memoranda on the basic communication.

e. Correspondence addressed to subordinate headquarters, of a routine nature, will be prepared for the signature of the head of the Sub-Commission originating the correspondence, using the phrase "By

 - a. Drafts will be submitted to the Adjutant for approval prior to dispatch.
 - b. Sufficient copies will be prepared to allow one copy for filing in the Records Sub-section and one with the pertinent file of the Sub-Commission.
 - c. All communications will go forward in duplicate.
 - d. Replies will be made in the form of indorsements on the basic communication.
 - e. Correspondence addressed to subordinate headquarters, of a routine nature, will be prepared for the signature of the head of the Sub-Commission originating the correspondence, using the phrase "By Command of Brigadier General KOSTER" (See model attached).
 - f. All correspondence other than that referred to in "e" will use the phrase: "For the Commanding General".

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- c. List all inclosures on the flap of the letter, below the body and at the left margin of the page.
- d. All correspondence addressed to a higher headquarters will be prepared for the signature of the Commanding General.
- e. Correspondence ruling on questions of policy will be prepared for signature of ~~the Commanding General~~ *Chief of Staff* - Secretariat.
- f. Each letter should refer to only one subject.
- g. Stationery of uniform size will always be used.
- h. Officers of the Secretariat are available for advice on the form and preparation of correspondence. Consult them at any time.
- i. Mailings and memoranda will be published from time to time for the information of the command. Matters of general interest will be forwarded to the Adjutant for publication therein.
- j. All papers which are classified as "SECRET" will be returned to the office of the Adjutant after the necessary action has been taken. A cross reference sheet may be placed in the files of the Sub-Commission concerned.

D. UNIFORMS AND CHIEFS.

Owing to the congestion of wireless communications, it is essential that cables for transmission by this means should be kept to a minimum. The following procedure will be adopted in regard to the despatch of cables through A.G., I.S.S.

Cables must NOT include stereotyped phrases either at the beginning or at the end of the message. The address to and from including the originator's name, should be included in the text. Cables must NOT be signed. This will be done by A.G., I.S.S. The last copy, i.e. the fourth copy, of the cable will be authenticated by one of the following officers:

7. All papers which are classified as "SECRET" will be returned to the office of the Adjutant after the necessary action has been taken. A cross reference sheet may be placed in the files of the Sub-Commission concerned.

8. COMMUNICATIONS:

On account of the congestion of wireless communications, it is essential that cables for transmission by this means should be kept to a minimum. The following procedure will be adopted in regard to the despatch of cables through A.S., I.B.S.

Cables must NOT include stereotyped phrases either at the beginning or at the end of the message. The address to which the message is sent, including the originator's name, should be included in the text. Cables must NOT be signed. This will be done by A.S., I.B.S.
