SUBJECT: Material in Hands of Troops

TO : SEE DISTRIBUTION

1. References:

- a. JCS NAVJUM Ltr, 9 Jan 44, (AG 319.1 MHT), "Material in Hands of Troops".
- b. Ltr, this No, 28 Feb 44, (AG 319.1 MHT) BUDS (1 Feb 44), "Errors in Material in Hands of Troops Reports for 15 Feb 44".

2. All previous directives issued by this Headquarters on "Material in Hands of Troops" report are rescinded. The procedure outlined in this letter will govern report for 15 March 1944.

3. Each unit assigned or attached to Peninsular Base Section for administration will submit the subject report in duplicate (on forms provided) as of 1200 hours of the 15th of March. The report will be dispatched so as to reach this Headquarters (Attention: G-4) by 1200 hours on the 17th of March. Delivery of report by courier to G-4 office will be necessary in many cases to meet deadline. De line date must be met.

4. Only when commanders submit complete and accurate information regarding status of equipment may adequate Theater supplies be obtained from the United States by the Supply Services.

5. Letter of transmittal will accompany the report accurately listing all units included in the report. Detachments of the command not included (less Battalion, Company, Platoon or Detachment) will be clearly indicated. The T/O, T/E or T/F (with dates thereof) under which units are organized will be indicated in letter of transmittal.

6. Each report will comprise seven separate appendices (one for each Supply Service and Transportation). The designation of reporting organization will be on each appendix. Forms furnished with these instructions will be used, except for Ordnance section, which will be reproduced in the same form as sample provided.

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SECRET

7. If no items of a particular Supply Service are authorized or on hand, forms will be returned with the notation "No items listed on this page are authorized or on hand" placed thereon. On pages where some items are authorized and on hand the remaining lines should be filled in with "zeros". Extracts of items listed on forms, except for Ordnance items is NOT permitted.

8. All sheets of this report will be marked "SECRET". Care must be taken that all copies are complete, legible and aligned.

9. In the case of an item which is authorized per individual (or vehicle, etc.) multiplied by the authorized T/O strength (i.e., if a unit has a T/O strength of 250, and rifles are authorized per individual, the figure "Authorized by T/O" should be 250). The "On Hand" figure will show the quantity issued to using troops plus stock on hand. Do not fill in "On Hand" figure as "1 each" or "1 per individual".

10. Sets, chests or similar collective items will be carried on hand if substantially complete, a brief note being made as to degree of completeness.

11. Unit reports will be consolidated by the highest separate administrative unit of the Command.

12. Reports must show units in which items are reported, i.e., lbs, each, etc.

13. Items on which no quantity is involved should show zero except Ordnance section of report, which is governed by special instructions included with sample form.

14. Amounts listed in the "Authorized in Excess of T/O" column must be explained citing the authority for such authorization with date, Headquarters of origin and any other pertinent information.

15. Property as listed on appendices held on Memorandum Receipt (over T/O, T/A or T/BA) will NOT be listed with authorized T/O, T/A or T/BA items, but will be listed separately by Service under heading as shown on bottom of form or on reverse side thereof and described as "Property Held on Memorandum Receipt". Full and complete description of each item so held will be given.

16. Losses to be reported in appropriate column of appendices shall include losses through enemy action, accident, cannibalization, wearing-out beyond repair or any other cause.

17. If any items listed on appendices (for all Services) are in hands of Service Units (Italian) they shall be included on reports as in hands of troops, but separate notation beside item shall state number in hands of such troops.

18. Substitute item must indicate that item for which substitution has been made. Stocks on hand for substitute items will only be listed once, i.e., not as a standard item and then again as substitute item.

19. Units will not report minor items which are not called for in listing on forms, except Ordnance Major Items of Equipment and Tool Sets.

20. Hospitals with APU's attached will include such units in their report and list unit designation along with T/O, T/S or T/D (with dates thereof) for each unit.

21. The following items listed on Transportation list (Appendix "I") will include:

Item #17: All launches 50 feet or less in length marked "J", except as noted under Item #18.

Item #18: Navy type launches, which are open launches with tiller and helmsman's station in stern, length 40 and 50 feet, also marked "J".

Item #2: Tugs ST, 400 HP, 74 feet in length.

22. The new Ordnance form must be used. Special instructions governing the compilation of Ordnance section of report should be studied before preparing this part of report.

23. Each consolidated report will include all Ordnance Major Items in the hands of troops.

a. Report will be submitted in the form outlined in APPENDIX "A".

b. For convenience, Appendix "B" lists the standard nomenclature of Ordnance items. To easily identify an Ordnance item and to facilitate the consolidation of reports, the item number as listed in Appendix "B" will be used in connection with the nomenclature.

c. Any Ordnance Major Items in the hands of troops which are not included in Appendix "B" will be reported at the end of its respective group (A, B, etc.) without a number.

d. All Major Item spare or reserve replacement spares in the hands of any and all Ordnance units will also be included.

24. Should questions regarding preparation of report arise, that Service Chief under whose operational control unit functions will be consulted.

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APPENDIX "C"

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING OUT CONSOLIDATED STATUS REPORT AND BREAKDOWN REPORT OF ORDNANCE MAJOR ITEMS

GENERAL:

1. The consolidated Status Report covering Major Items of Ordnance issue and condition will be made by your command for all organizations assigned and/or attached to your command for administration as of 1200 hours on the date report is called for. Units assigned to your command but actually attached to another command for performance of their duties, such as troops assigned to Fifth Army, but attached to MES, will be reported for by the unit commander to whom they are attached. In the illustration above, this would be MES through the Commanding General, SCS.

2. Reports will be made as a consolidated list for all Major Items of Ordnance issue with units under your command in accordance with the form attached hereto, Appendix "A", using as a guide the list of Major Items shown in Appendix "B", attached hereto. Appendix "B" is to be considered a guide on the type of Ordnance Material to be listed and to provide a uniform nomenclature for submitting reports. All complete Major Items of Ordnance which may either be authorized or on hand but which are not listed in Appendix "B" should be added to the list when reporting.

3. A list will accompany each Status Report showing all units under your tactical command as of the date and hour of your report. Units are to be shown by unit number followed by the T/O and T/E or T/B numbers and dates under which they are operating on the date of report. All new units which are being reported on for the first time should be so indicated. Units which have been dropped since the preceding report will be listed separately and so indicated.

SPECIFIC: (Reference Appendix "A")

1. The name of the organization and the date and hour for which report is submitted is to be included in the heading of the first sheet. Procedure in compiling the report is as follows: (All reference numbers used are in respect to column numbers in sample sheet Appendix "A" attached)

Column 1: Major Items are to be listed by correct SMI nomenclature and broken down into groups. ("A" Group, "B" Group etc) A guide for this list is shown in Appendix "B". Certain Major Items have been grouped together in Appendix "B" to form a single combination. Example: Howitzer, 155mm, M1 and Carriage, Howitzer, 155mm, M1 are reported together as Howitzer, 155mm, M1 w/Carriage, M1. When reporting such single combinations, model number of each of the combined items will be shown. Major Items not included in this list (Appendix "B") which are either authorized or on hand, will be reported upon. Exceptions are items that

are a component part of issue with other Major Items. Example: Telescope, Panoramic, M5A2, would be considered on-carriage equipment of Howitzer, 105mm, M2.1 w/carriage M2, and is not reported separately (See Note 3).

Column 2a: Quantities authorized by T/B. Only such items as were authorized under the basic T/O and T/B. for the organization are to be included in this column. Example: An Infantry Division operating under T/O No. 7, dated April 1, 1942, and current T/B. of that time would only show authorized the items allowed under the above T/O and T/B.. It is necessary that each report of a given organization be consistent with these reports preceding it.

Column 2b: Quantities of material authorized in excess of T/B. as stated in column 2a are to be entered in this column. These would include all special authorizations which might have been granted by a higher headquarters at any time in the past and which still remain in effect.

Column 2c: These quantities will be the totals of columns 2a and 2b.

Column 3a: Quantities of all serviceable standard items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 3b: Quantities of serviceable standard items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column. "Reserve stock" is defined to include only the organizational reserve in the hands of Ordnance units attached to tactical organizations. It should not be confused with items on hand in tactical organization which should not be reported separately, but should merely be included in the quantities listed in columns 3a, 3c, and 3d. By comparison of the quantities in column 2c and 3d, those surplus stocks are reflected (but not so designated nor shown by separate quantities) as "overs".

Column 3c: Quantities of unserviceable standard items only will be shown in this column (see note 1)

Column 3d: Totals of columns 3a, b, and c will be shown in this column.

Column 4: List of any items being used as substitutes for the standard items listed in column 1 will be shown (see note 2).

Column 5a: Quantities of serviceable substitute items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 5b: Quantities of serviceable substitute items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column.

Column 5c: Quantities of unserviceable substitute items only will be shown in this column (See note 1).

Column 5d: Totals of columns 5a, b and c will be shown in this column.

APPENDIX "E"

2. List of items to be included in report will only include such items as are on hand or authorized. Other items included in Appendix "E" which are not on hand or authorized will not be shown in this report.

NOTE 1: Only such items as are in a condition where they cannot be used for combat or tactical purposes for a period of five days will be reported unserviceable. Location of such items can be simplified by reason of the fact that any item of Ordnance which is unserviceable for combat or tactical use for the period stated should be evacuated to Ordnance shop or the Ordnance Officer maintaining the equipment cited should have been notified of its unserviceability. An item will not be considered unserviceable unless it is either damaged or has missing such pertinent accessories as would definitely render it impossible to use for combat. Lack of certain accessories which will not necessarily keep the item from being used for combat or tactical use are to be noted in footnote on the listing of that item. See example footnotes (a), (b) and (c) on sample sheet Appendix "A".

NOTE 2: Quantities of substitute items shown will not be included in the total of that item when it is being used as a standard item. Example: The Rifle, caliber .30, M1, is a standard item as shown on sample sheet. It is also a substitute item for the Carbine, caliber .30, M1. In this case the four rifles shown in column 5d are not included in the quantity of rifles shown in column 3a, e, g or h, so the total number of Rifles, caliber .30, M1, as shown on the sample sheet would be 85 from column 3i plus 4 as shown in column 5d, which equals 89 (See Appendix "A").

NOTE 3: It is to be noted in Appendix "A" that sample of the list has been provided. All items reported on will be considered to be complete with all of their necessary accessories and armament unless otherwise noted by a footnote on the list of that item. In example: Medium Tank, M4A1, when listed will be considered to be complete with its machine guns, submachine guns, sights, periscopes and other accessories which are called for to make the item a complete combat weapon.

Items of fire control which are issued for use other than directly with the gun itself such as the battery, battalion, will be included in the report. Only such items as are part and parcel of the complete combat weapon will be excluded from that part of the report covering the weapon itself. Fire control major items spare in the hands of Ordnance maintenance units and organizational spares not included as part and parcel of the weapon will be reported separately as "F" Group Items.

Reports on passenger, cargo, and special purpose vehicles will include the type, model, year and manufacturer. For example: Truck 2-1/2-ton, 6x6, cargo, M3, 1/4-inch, 1942, G.E. Except for combining of major items as brought forth in 4. column 1, correct SHL nomenclature will be used when reporting other items of Ordnance issue. This is imperative due to the number of models and modifications of the various items. A footnote will be added to show:

- a. Quantities of trucks equipped with banjo type axles and quantities equipped with split type axles.
- b. Quantities of vehicles equipped with 12-volt batteries and quantities equipped with 6-volt batteries.

TO : SEE DISTRIBUTION

1. Reference: Ltr, this Hq, 7 Mar 44, (AG 319.1 MHT) HPGDS (9 Jan 44), "Material in Hands of Troops".

2. Reports received indicate that unit officers responsible for the correct submission of this report did not thoroughly read the instructions given in the reference cited in Par 1, above, especially the instructions for filling out the Ordnance section of the report.

3. The following are the more common errors found in reports received:

a. General

- (1) Deadline date of 17 March (1200 hours) was not met by many units. It is imperative that deadline date indicated be met.
- (2) Units did not submit reports in duplicate, and on the forms provided with the letter of instructions.
- (3) A letter of transmittal did not accompany all reports. Detachments of the command (what part--entire Regiment; less Battalion, Company, Platoon or Detachment) and T/O, T/E and/or E/A with date thereof were not indicated in letters of transmittal received.
- (4) Amounts listed in the "Authorized in Excess of T/A" column (or "On Hand" column for which unit has no T/A) should have been explained with a footnote on page applicable, citing the authority for such authorization (or reason On Hand) with Headquarters of origin, date and any other pertinent information.
- (5) Units are not reporting proper amounts authorized by T/A nor what is actually on hand against T/A.

b. Ordnance Section (Appendix "A")

- (1) Forms for the Ordnance section of report should have been reproduced in the same form as sample provided. Items on this sample are merely listed for instruction purposes and should not be the only items reported.
- (2) To easily identify an Ordnance item and to facilitate the consolidation of reports, the item numbers listed in Appendix "B" should have been used in connection with the nomenclature.
- (3) Reference Note 4 of Appendix "C". This is just a sample of the proper method of listing information required to be shown on the Ordnance form and should not have been on a separate sheet.

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- (4) Information required by Note 3 & 4 of Appendix "C" applies to all vehicles, i.e., Passenger cars (GI), Trucks: 1-ton, 3/4-ton, 1 1/2-ton, 2-ton, 4-ton, 6-ton, etc.

4. To preclude recurrence of the above mistakes, it is suggested that unit officers carefully study the instructions which will be issued prior to submission of next report. It is further suggested that a check sheet be initiated using this letter and a letter of instructions to check report prior to submission to insure an accurate and correct report.

5. Units not in possession of new instructions by 13 April 1944 should contact their Headquarters (Adjutant General's Department, VAHDE 397) for information regarding new instructions and forms.

1. References:

a. SOG NATCONS Ltr, 9 Jan 44, (AG 319.1 MHT), "Material in Hands of Troops".

b. Ltr, this No, 28 Feb 44, (AG 319.1 MHT) BRDGS (1 Feb 44), "Errors in Material in Hands of Troops Reports for 15 Feb 44".

2. All previous directives issued by this Headquarters on "Material in Hands of Troops" report are rescinded. The procedure outlined in this letter will govern report for 15 March 1944.

3. Each unit assigned or attached to Peninsular Base Section for administration will submit the subject report in duplicate (on form provided) as of 1200 hours of the 15th of March. The report will be dispatched so as to reach this Headquarters (Attention: G-4) by 1200 hours on the 17th of March. Delivery of report by courier to G-4 office will be necessary in many cases to meet deadline. Deadline date must be met.

4. Only when commanders submit complete and accurate information regarding status of equipment may adequate theater supplies be obtained from the United States by the Supply Services.

5. A letter of transmittal will accompany the report accurately listing all units included in the report. Detachments of the command not included (less Battalion, Company, Platoon or Detachment) will be clearly indicated. The T/O, T/S or T/BA (with dates thereof) under which units are organized will be indicated in letter of transmittal.

6. Each report will comprise seven separate appendices (one for each Supply Service and Transportation). The designation of reporting organization will be on each appendix. Forms furnished with these instructions will be used, except for Ordnance section, which will be reproduced in the same form as sample provided.

7. If no items of a particular Supply Service are authorized or on hand, forms will be returned with the notation "No items listed on this page are authorized or on hand" placed thereon. On pages where some items are authorized and on hand the remaining lines should be filled in with "zeros". Extracts of items listed on forms, except for Ordnance items is NOT permitted.

8. All sheets of this report will be marked "SECRET". Care must be taken that all copies are complete, legible and signed.

9. In the case of an item which is authorized per individual (or vehicle, etc.) multiplied by the authorized T/O strength (i.e., if a unit has a T/O strength of 250, and rifles are authorized per individual, the figure "authorized by T/O" should be 250). The "On Hand" figure will show the quantity issued to using troops plus stock on hand. Do not fill in "On Hand" figures as "1 each" or "1 per individual".

10. Maps, charts or similar collective items will be carried on hand if substantially complete, a brief note being made as to degree of completeness.

11. Unit reports will be consolidated by the highest separate administrative unit of the command.

12. Reports must show units in which items are reported, i.e., lbs, each, etc.

13. Items on which no quantity is involved should show zero except Ordnance section of report, which is governed by special instructions included with sample form.

14. Amounts listed in the "Authorized in Excess of T/O" column must be explained citing the authority for such authorization with date, Headquarters of origin and any other pertinent information.

15. Property as listed on appendices held on Memorandum Receipt (over T/O, T/A or T/B) will NOT be listed with authorized T/O, T/A or T/B item, but will be listed separately by Service under heading as shown on bottom of form or on reverse side thereof and described as "Property Held on Memorandum Receipt". Full and complete description of each item so held will be given.

16. Losses to be reported in appropriate column of appendices shall include losses through enemy action, accident, cannibalization, wearing-out beyond repair or any other cause.

17. If any items listed on appendices (for all services) are in hands of Service Units (Italian) they shall be included on reports as in hands of troops, but separate not then beside item shall state number in hands of such troops.

18. Substitute item must indicate that item for which substitution has been made. Stocks on hand for substitute items will only be listed once, i.e., not as a standard item and then again as substitute item.

19. Units will not report minor items which are not called for in listing on forms, except Ordnance Major Items of Equipment and Tool Sets.

20. Hospitals with APU's attached will include such units in their report and list unit designation along with T/O, T/E or T/B (with dates thereof) for such unit.

21. The following items listed on Transportation List (Appendix "E") will include:

Item #17: All launches 50 feet or less in length marked "J", except as noted under Item #18.

Item #18: Navy type launches, which are open launches with tiller and helmsman's station in stern, length 40 and 50 feet, also marked "J".

Item #2: Tugs ST, 400 HP, 74 feet in length.

22. The new Ordnance form must be used. Special instructions governing the compilation of Ordnance section of report should be studied before preparing this part of report.

23. Each consolidated report will include all Ordnance Major Items in the hands of troops.

a. Report will be submitted in the form outlined in APPENDIX "A".

b. For convenience, Appendix "E" lists the standard nomenclature of Ordnance items. To easily identify an Ordnance item and to facilitate the consolidation of reports, the item number as listed in Appendix "E" will be used in connection with the nomenclature.

c. Any Ordnance Major Items in the hands of troops which are not included in Appendix "E" will be reported at the end of its respective group (A, B, etc.) without a number.

d. All Major Item spare or reserve replacement spares in the hands of any and all Ordnance units will also be included.

24. Should questions regarding preparation of report arise, that Service Chief under whose operational control unit functions will be consulted.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING OUT CONSOLIDATED STATUS REPORT
AND BREAKDOWN REPORT OF ORDNANCE MAJOR ITEMSGENERAL:

1. The consolidated Status Report covering Major Items of Ordnance issue and condition will be made by your command for all organizations assigned and/or attached to your command for administration as of 1200 hours on the date report is called for. Units assigned to your command but actually attached to another command for performance of their duties, such as troops assigned to Fifth Army, but attached to MES, will be reported for by the unit commander to whom they are attached. In the illustration above, this would be MES through the Commanding General, SCS.

2. Reports will be made as a consolidated list for all Major Items of Ordnance Issue with units under your command in accordance with the form attached hereto, Appendix "A", using as a guide the list of Major Items shown in Appendix "B", attached hereto. Appendix "B" is to be considered a guide on the type of Ordnance Material to be listed and to provide a uniform nomenclature for submitting reports. All complete Major Items of Ordnance which may either be authorized or on hand but which are not listed in Appendix "B" should be added to the list when reporting.

3. A list will accompany each Status Report showing all units under your tactical command as of the date and hour of your report. Units are to be shown by unit number followed by the T/O and T/S or T/B numbers and dates under which they are operating on the date of report. All new units which are being reported on for the first time should be so indicated. Units which have been dropped since the preceding report will be listed separately and so indicated.

SPECIFIC: (Reference Appendix "A")

1. The name of the organization and the date and hour for which report is submitted is to be included in the heading of the first sheet. Procedure in compiling the report is as follows: (All reference numbers used are in respect to column numbers in sample sheet Appendix "A" attached)

Column 1: Major Items are to be listed by correct SMI nomenclature and broken down into groups. ("A" Group, "B" Group etc) A guide for this list is shown in Appendix "B". Certain Major Items have been grouped together in Appendix "B" to form a single combination. Example: Howitzer, 155mm, M1 and Carriage, Howitzer, 155mm, M1 are reported together as Howitzer, 155mm, M1 w/Carriage, M1. When reporting such single combinations, model number of each of the combined items will be shown. Major Items not included in this list (Appendix "B") which are either authorized or on hand, will be reported upon. Exceptions are items that

are a component part of issue with other Major Items. Example: Telescope, Panoramic, M542, would be considered on-carriage equipment of Howitzer, 105mm, M211 w/carriage M2, and is not reported separately (See Note 3).

Column 2a: Quantities authorized by T/B. Only such items as were authorized under the basic T/O and T/B. for the organization are to be included in this column. Example: An Infantry Division operating under T/O No. 7, dated April 1, 1942, and current T/B. of that time would only show authorized the items allowed under the above T/O and T/B... It is necessary that each report of a given organization be consistent with those reports preceding it.

Column 2b: Quantities of a material authorized in excess of T/B. as stated in column 2a are to be entered in this column. These would include all special authorizations which might have been granted by a higher headquarters at any time in the past and which still remain in effect.

Column 2c: These quantities will be the totals of columns 2a and 2b.

Column 3: Quantities of all serviceable standard items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 3b: Quantities of serviceable standard items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column. "Reserve stock" is defined to include only the organizational reserves in the hands of Ordnance units attached to tactical organizations. It should not be confused with items on hand in a tactical organization which should not be reported separately, but should merely be included in the quantities listed in columns 3a, 3c, and 3d. By comparison of the quantities in column 2c and 3d, these surplus stocks are reflected (but not so designated nor shown by separate quantities) as "overs".

Column 3c: Quantities of unserviceable standard items only will be shown in this column (see note 1).

Column 3d: Totals of columns 3a, b, and c will be shown in this column.

Column 4: List of any items being used as substitutes for the standard items listed in column 1 will be shown (see note 2).

Column 5a: Quantities of serviceable substitute items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 5b: Quantities of serviceable substitute items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column.

Column 5c: Quantities of unserviceable substitute items only will be shown in this column (See note 1).

Column 5d: Totals of columns 5a, b and c will be shown in this column.

APPENDIX "C"

2. List of items to be included in report will only include such items as are on hand or authorized. Other items included in Appendix "B" which are not on hand or authorized will not be shown in this report.

NOTE 1: Only such items as are in a condition where they cannot be used for combat or tactical purposes for a period of five days will be reported unserviceable. Location of such items can be simplified by reason of the fact that any item of Ordnance which is unserviceable for combat or tactical use for the period stated should be evacuated to Ordnance shop or the Ordnance Officer maintaining the equipment cited should have been notified of its unserviceability. An item will not be considered unserviceable unless it is either damaged or has missing such pertinent accessories as would definitely render it impossible to use for combat. Lack of certain accessories which will not necessarily keep the item from being used for combat or tactical use are to be noted in footnote on the listing of that item. See example footnotes (a), (b) and (c) on sample sheet Appendix "A".

NOTE 2: Quantities of substitute items shown will not be included in the total of that item when it is being used as a standard item. Example: The Rifle, caliber .30, M1, is a standard item as shown on sample sheet. It is also a substitute item for the Carbine, caliber .30, M1. In this case the four rifles shown in column 5d are not included in the quantity of rifles shown in column 3a, b, c or d, so the total number of Rifles, caliber .30, M1, as shown on the sample sheet would be 85 from column 3d plus 4 as shown in column 5d, which equals 89 (See Appendix "A").

NOTE 3: It is to be noted in Appendix "A" that sample of the list has been provided. All items reported on will be considered to be complete with all of their necessary accessories and armament unless otherwise noted by a footnote on the list of that item. In example: Medium Tank, M4A1, when listed will be considered to be complete with its machine guns, submachine guns, sights, periscopes and other accessories which are called for to make the item a complete combat weapon.

Items of fire control which are issued for use other than directly with the gun itself such as the battery, battalion, will be included in the report. Only such items as are part and parcel of the complete combat weapon will be excluded from that part of the report covering the weapon itself. Fire control major item spares in the hands of Ordnance maintenance units and organizational spares not included as part and parcel of the weapon will be reported separately as "F" Group Items.

Reports on passenger, cargo, and special purpose vehicles will include the type, model, year and manufacturer. For example: Truck 2-1/2-ton, 6x6, cargo, LEB, 5/4-inch, 1942, GMC. Except for combining of major items as brought forth in 4, column 1, correct SNL nomenclature will be used when reporting other items of Ordnance issue. This is imperative due to the number of models and modifications of the various items. A footnote will be added to show:

1. Quantities of trucks equipped with banjo type axles and quantities equipped with split type axles.
2. Quantities of vehicles equipped with 12-volt batteries and quantities equipped with 6-volt batteries.

1. Reference: Letter SOS, MATOUSA, 28 November 1943, (319.1 Misc (SSEX)), "Periodic Reports Required by Headquarters SOS, MATOUSA".

2. All previous directives issued by this Headquarters on subject report are rescinded. The procedure outlined in this letter will govern current and future reports.

3. Each unit assigned or attached to the Peninsular Base Section for administration will submit the subject report in duplicate as of 1200 hours of the 15th of the month. The reports will be dispatched so as to reach this Headquarters (attention G-2) by 1200 hours on the 17th day of the month. Delivery of reports by courier to G-2 office will be necessary in any cases to meet deadline. Deadline date must be set.

4. Only when commanders submit complete and accurate information regarding status of equipment may adequate theater supplies be obtained from the United States by the Supply Services.

5. Each report will comprise six separate appendices (one for each Supply Service).

6. Sets, chests or similar collective items will be carried on hand if substantially complete, a brief note being made as to degree of completeness.

7. All sheets of this report will be marked "SECRET". Care must be taken that they are complete and legible.

8. A letter of transmittal will accompany the reports accurately listing all units included in the report. Attachments not included will be clearly indicated. The T/O-S, T/SA (with dates thereof) under which units are reported will be indicated in the main letter.

9. Indicate on each Appendix the name of the reporting organization.

10. Appendices will be reproduced as necessary.

11. Each unit will submit report for all types of supply, i.e., Quartermaster, Ordnance, Signal, etc. If no items of a particular supply service are authorized, a sheet for each supply service will be included with a notation to the effect that no materiel of that supply service is authorized or on hand. In the event forms are reproduced it will not be necessary to reproduce the nomenclature lists in their entirety, but only those items on hand or authorized for unit submitting the report. The items will be grouped as shown on published forms and number assigned each item on published list will be used. In the case of an item which is authorized per individual (or vehicle, etc), the quantity "Authorized by T/BA" will be the allowance per individual (or vehicle, etc) multiplied by actual strength or quantity thereof (i.e., if a unit has T/O strength of 200 with an actual strength of 190, and rifles are authorized per individual, the figure "Authorized by T/BA" should be 190). The "On Hand" figure will show the quantity issued to using troops of the unit plus stock on hand. Do not fill in "On Hand" figure as "1 each" or "1 per individual".

13. Unit reports will be consolidated by highest separate administrative unit of the command.

18. Substitute item must indicate that item for which substitution has been made. Stocks on hand for substitute items will only be listed once, i.e., not as a standard item and then again as substitute item.

19. Units will not report minor items which are not called for in listing on forms, except Ordnance Major Items of Equipment and Tool Sets.

20. The new Ordnance form must be used. It is recommended that special instructions governing the compilation of Ordnance section of report be studied before preparing this part of report.

21. Each consolidated report will include all Ordnance Major items in the hands of troops.

a. Report will be submitted in the form outlined in Appendix "A".

b. For convenience, Appendix "B" lists the standard nomenclature of Ordnance items.

c. Any Ordnance major items in the hands of troops which are not included in Appendix "B" will also be reported.

d. All major item spare or reserve replacement spares in the hands of any and all Ordnance units will also be included.

22. Should questions regarding preparation of report arise, that Service Chief under whose operational control unit functions will be consulted.

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Appendix "C"

INSTRUCTION FOR FILLING OUT
CONSOLIDATED MAJOR ITEM STATUS REPORT - ORDNANCEGENERAL

1. The Consolidated Status Report covering Major Items of Ordnance issue and condition will be made by your command for all organizations assigned and/or attached to your command for administration as of 1200 hours on the date report is called for. Units assigned to your command but actually attached to another command for performance of their duties, such as troops assigned to Fifth Army, but attached to LBS will be reported for by the unit Commander to whom they are attached. In the illustration above, this would be LBS through the Commanding General, SCS.

2. Reports will be made as a consolidated list for all Major Items of Ordnance issue with units under your command in accordance with the form attached hereto, Appendix "A", using as a guide the list of Major Items shown in Appendix "B", attached hereto. Appendix "B" is to be considered a guide as to the type of Ordnance Material to be listed and to provide a uniform nomenclature for submitting reports. All complete Major Items of Ordnance which may either be authorized or on hand but which are not listed in Appendix "B", should be added to the list when reporting.

3. At the end of each Status report will be shown all units under your tactical command as of the date and hour of your report. It will further show units for which report is included in the consolidation so that in the case of the delinquency of a report of an individual unit under your command it can be forwarded at a later date. All new units which are being reported on for the first time since the previous report was made should be so indicated, also any units which have been dropped since the preceding report should be listed separately and so indicated. Units being included in the report are to be shown by unit number followed by the T-O and T-SA numbers and dates under which they are operating on date of report.

SPECIFIC (Reference APPENDIX "A")

1. The name of the organization and the date and hour for which report is submitted is to be included in the heading of the first sheet. Procedure in compiling the report is as follows: (All reference numbers used are in respect to column numbers in sample sheet "Appendix A" attached).

Column 1.

List of standard items using correct SLL nomenclature and group, A Group, B group, etc. A guide for this list is shown on Appendix "B". The only difference from standard nomenclature list is a grouping of major items to form a single combination. Example: Howitzer, 155mm M1, and carriage.

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Appendix "C"

Howitzer 155mm M1, are put together as Howitzer and Carriage, 155mm M1. Attached Appendix "B" indicates various types of Ordnance material which is to be reported. Items over and above this list which might be either authorized or on hand should be included in the report. The only exception to this is where the item is a component part of issue with another major item such as a panoramic telescope M5A2 to 105mm Howitzer and carriage M2. See Note 3.

Column 2 a.

Quantities authorized by T/BA. Only such items as were authorized under the basic T/O and T/BA for the organization are to be included in this column. Example: An Infantry Division operating under T/O No. 7, dated April 1, 1942, and current T/BA of that time would only show authorized the items allowed under the above T/O and T/BA. It is necessary that each report of a given organization be consistent with these reports preceding it.

Column 2 b.

Quantities of material authorized in excess of T/BA as stated in column 2a are to be entered in this column. These would include all special authorizations and which still remain in effect.

Column 2c.

These quantities will be the totals of columns 2 a and 2 b.

Column 3 a.

Quantities of all serviceable standard items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 3 b.

Quantities of serviceable standard items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column. "Reserve Stock" is defined to include only the organizational reserve in the hands of ordnance units attached to tactical organizations. It should not be confused with items on hand in a tactical organization which should not be reported separately, but should merely be included in the quantities listed in columns 3a, 3b, and 3d. By comparison of the quantities in column 2c and 3d, these surplus stocks are reflected (but not so designated nor shown by separate quantities) as "overs".

Column 3 c.

Quantities of unserviceable standard items only will be shown in this column. See Note 1.

Column 3 d.

Totals of columns a, b, and c will be shown in this column.

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Appendix "C"

Column 4.

List of any items being used as substitutes for the standard items listed in column 1 will be shown. See Note 2.

Column 5 a.

Quantities of serviceable substitute items in active use with the troops will be indicated in this column.

Column 5 b.

Quantities of serviceable substitute items in reserve stock for replacement purposes are to be entered in this column.

Column 5 c.

Quantities of unserviceable substitute items only will be shown in this column. See Note 1.

Column 5 d.

Totals of columns, 5a, b, and c, will be shown in this column.

2. List of items to be included in report will only include such items as are on hand or authorized. Other items included in Appendix "B" which are not on hand or authorized will not be shown in this report.

NOTE 1.

Only such items as are in a condition where they cannot be used for combat or tactical purposes for a period of five days will be reported unserviceable. Location of such items can be simplified by reason of the fact that any item of ordnance which is unserviceable for combat or tactical use for the period stated should be evacuated to ordnance shop or the Ordnance Officer maintaining the equipment cited should have been notified of its unserviceability. An item will not be considered unserviceable unless it is either damaged or has missing such pertinent accessories as would definitely render it impossible to use for combat. Lack of certain accessories which will not necessarily keep the item from being used for combat or tactical use are to be noted in footnote on the listing of that item. See example footnotes (a), (b) and (c) on sample sheet Appendix "A".

NOTE 2.

Quantities of substitute items shown will not be included in the total of that item when it is being used as a standard item. Example: The Rifle, caliber 30, M1, is a standard item as shown on sample sheet. It is also a substitute item for the carbine, caliber 30, M1. In this case the four rifles shown in column 5d are not included in the quantity of rifles shown in column 3 a, b, c, or d, so the total number of Rifles, caliber 30, M1, as shown on the sample sheet would be 85 from column 3d plus 4 as shown in column 5d, which equals 89. See Appendix "A".

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Appendix "C"

NOTE 3.

It is to be noted in Appendix "A" that sample of the list has been provided. All items reported on will be considered to be complete with all of their necessary accessories and armament unless otherwise noted by a footnote on the list of that item. In example: Medium Tank M47/1 when listed will be considered to be complete with its machine guns, submachine guns, sights, periscopes and other accessories which are called for to make the item a complete combat weapon.

Items of fire control which are issued for use other than directly with the gun itself such as the battery, battalions, will be included in the report. Only such items as are part and parcel of the complete combat weapon will be excluded from that part of the report covering the weapon itself. Fire control major item spares in the hands of ordnance maintenance units and organizational spares not included as part and parcel of the weapon will be reported separately as F-Group items.

Reports on passenger, cargo and special purpose vehicles will include the type, model, year and manufacturer. For example: Truck 2-1-2 ton, 6x6, cargo, LWB, w-winch, 1942, GMC. Except for combining of major items as brought forth in 4 column 1, correct S&I nomenclature will be used when reporting other items of ordnance issue. This is imperative due to the number of models and modifications of the various items. A footnote will be added to show:

- a. Quantities of trucks equipped with banjo type axles and quantities equipped with GMC axles.
- b. Quantities of vehicles equipped with 12 volt batteries and quantities equipped with 6volt batteries.
