1. In addition to the request made by the Manpower Re-organization Committee in paragraph 22, General Order #43, dated 1 October 44, it is requested that you submit to G-1(B), within twenty-four hours of receipt of this letter, your final complete establishment of _____ Officers and _____ EM/OR as laid down by the Manpower Re-organization Committee.

2. Your first list will show the officers (American and British) and EM/OR to be retained in this Headquarters. All such lists will contain name, rank, nationality, present job, and whether officer is to be classified as a technical specialist or a general army duty officer. The Allied civilians assigned and employed will be included. Allied civilian specialists will count against your officer ceiling. Allied civilian clerks will count against your EM/OR ceiling.

3. A second list will show the prospective assignment of all officers and EM/OR who have been earmarked for other assignments but are still working in your office and counted on your strength.

4. A third list will show all officers and EM/OR personnel that are available for re-assignment.

5. The ceilings are to be placed in effect immediately and it is accordingly requested that this complete report be returned to this office not later than 1000 hours, 13 October 1944.

Commanding Generals, Theaters of Operations

* * * * *

1. Tables of Organization and Equipment for Army, Air Force, Corps, Division, and Air Force Command headquarters are being changed to include "Information - Education Officers" with necessary officer and/or enlisted assistants for the supervision and conduct of orientation, information and education functions. Orientation officers in regiments and groups are being redesignated as "Information - Education Officers".

2. Pending publication of changes in Tables of Organization and Equipment, you are authorized to provide Information - Education Officers for units under your control in accordance with attached Table No. I. For the most part, this personnel will be obtained through reassignment of personnel presently on duty in the above mentioned units with a corresponding change in strength and grades of "Special Service Sections", whose original authorizations were for the performance of both Special Services (athletics and recreation) and Information - Education (orientation, information and education) duties. Special Services Sections will be reestablished in accordance with attached Table No. II.

3. The officer provided for orientation, information and education functions and activities will be designated as "Assistant G-3 (S-3) Information-Education Officer" in Army, Corps, Division, Regiment and similar headquarters. He will be designated as "Assistant A-1, Information - Education Officer" and included in the "Personnel Section" of Air Force, Air Force Command, and Army Air Force Group headquarters.

4. Commissioned and enlisted grades in excess of Table of Organization and Equipment authorizations established by this change will be carried as surplus in grade until absorbed by normal attrition.

1. The rapidity of the advance of the Allied Armies in Italy makes it imperative to anticipate immediate occupation of all Regions up to the RIMINI-PISA Line (Regions I - VIII) and the early occupation of the whole of Italy, including Regions IX, X, XI and XII.
2. In Appendix "A" attached, Column 2 shows the proposed strengths of Regions and Army Areas in Phase II, i.e., up to the RIMINI-PISA Line. Region VIII has already been created by the reduction of other Regions as is shown in the detailed distribution in Appendix "B". Column 3 in Appendix "A" shows the figures for Regions I - XII and Army Areas if and when the whole of Italy is occupied and on the assumption that no reinforcements for ACI will be forthcoming, an assumption which is practically a certainty.
3. Column 3 is also based on the assumption that the majority of officers in Army Areas will be absorbed into the Regions, the whole territory having been occupied by the Allied Armies; also that Region III and IV and possibly Regions V, VIII and IX, will have been handed back to the Italian Government.

Chief Clerk

1. The rapidity of the advance of the Allied Armies in Italy makes it imperative to anticipate immediate occupation of all Regions up to the ANIPI-PISA Line (Regions I - VIII) and the early occupation of the whole of Italy, including Regions IX, X, XI and XII.

2. In Appendix "A" attached, Column 2 shows the proposed strengths of Regions and Army AUs in Phase II, i.e., up to the ANIPI-PISA Line. Region VIII has already been created by the reduction of other Regions as is shown in the detailed distribution in Appendix "B". Column 3 in Appendix "A" shows the figures for Regions I - XII and Army AUs in and when the whole of Italy is occupied and on the assumption that no reinforcements for AGC will be forthcoming, an assumption which is practically a certainty.

3. Column 3 is also based on the assumption that the majority of officers in Army AUs will be absorbed into the Regions, the whole territory having been occupied by the Allied armies; also that Region XII and XI and possibly Regions V, VIII and IX, will have been handed back to the Italian Government.

4. Appendix "C" shows the target figures broken down in Provincial and specialist staffs within the Regions for Phase III. (The Regional totals vary slightly from Column 3 in Appendix "A").

5. The Southern Regions have been greatly reduced in order to provide adequate staff for the industrial and densely populated Regions in the North.

6. New Regions will be formed by withdrawing Officers, EM/ORA, and transport from the Southern Regions until they have been reduced to the figures shown in Appendix "C".

7. Generally speaking, officers from Regions I, II and V will be used for Regions IX and XII while officers from Regions VI, VII and IV, and some Region, will be used for Regions X and XI.

8. If possible, Regional Commissioners will be notified previously of officers required for new Regions but when Officers, EM/ORA and transport are called forward, the order must be regarded as provisional and they must be sent forward without delay.

9. Officers for Region IX are about to be selected.

SUBJECT: Reduction of Basic Privates in Tables of Organization Units.

TO : Commanding General,
North African Theater of Operations.

1. Reference is made to the inclosed material on the above subject which is being published as a War Department Circular.

2. Effective upon receipt of the circular referred to above, personnel made surplus in table of organization units presently under your jurisdiction, or received later, will be transferred from such units to other units or installations under your control. The only exceptions will be those units in or about to engage in battle; in the case of such units requisitions for future replacements will be based on the new reduced strengths authorized and in any event all surplus will be removed prior to 1 July 1944.

3. Since the primary reason for reduction of basic privates is to increase available manpower for use as replacements and fillers and to recognize detachments of hospital patients which are chargeable to the War Department under the new policy, it is essential that the bulk of personnel made surplus by these reductions in authorized strengths be retrained without delay as infantry replacements. However, since your theater has considerable other surplus personnel which is needed in other areas, a report by radio is desired of the total number that can be transferred to the United States in June and July in addition to the 10,000 already directed. Further, the War Department proposes to suspend June and July shipments of replacements to your theater except infantry, Army Air Forces, combat crews, and specialists specifically requisitioned unless justification is submitted for other action.

4. Future revision of your Troop Basis by the War Department will reflect this reduction of basic privates.

TABLES OF ORGANIZATION AND EQUIPMENT

1. Present tables of organization and tables of organization and equipment for units other than Air Corps include basic privates. These basic privates were provided as local replacements to take care of normal "garrison" losses and are over and above the complement of personnel required to perform the functions for which the unit is designed. In general, basic privates represent an addition of ten per cent (10%) to the normal operating strength of a unit.

2. Pending revision of tables of organization and tables of organization and equipment, the number of basic privates authorized under existing tables are modified as follows, these changes being effective at once:

a. Tables for the following detachments, companies and units remain unchanged:

- (1) Medical detachment, regiment or battalion:
Tables 2-11, 7-11, 7-21, 7-25, 7-31, 7-51,
7-71T and 7-95.
- (2) Rifle company or troop: Tables 2-17, 7-17,
7-27, 7-47S-PC, 7-57 and 7-77T.
- (3) Units which are now provided basic privates in
numbers less than five (5) percent of tabular
strength less basic privates.

1. In compliance with War Department directive contained in basic communication, authorized strengths of all units in this theater with the exception of those listed in inclosure number 1 will henceforth be calculated as outlined in inclosure number 1.

2. a. Prior to 1 July 1944, all units, except those attached or assigned to Fifth Army, will transfer on paper all personnel rendered excess by this reorganization to Personnel Center Number 2, if the unit is located in AFRICA, or to Personnel Center Number 6, if the unit is located in ITALY. Thereafter, this personnel will be displaced to the Personnel Centers for retraining upon call of the Commanding General, Replacement, Command, NATOUSA.

b. If vacancies within commands occur after the transfer of men is effected and prior to call by the Commanding General, Replacement Command, NATOUSA, men transferred to the replacement system but carried on temporary duty within each Major Command will be used to fill requisitions submitted by the Major Commands before additional replacements are furnished.

4. Except for units which are 100% formed from limited assignment enlisted men, no personnel other than general assignment basic privates will be transferred to Personnel Centers as a result of this reorganization.

5. Changes in status of personnel remaining attached to units but assigned to the Personnel Centers must be promptly reported to the Personnel Centers.

These basic privates were provided as local replacements to take care of normal "garrison" losses and are over and above the complement of personnel required to perform the functions for which the unit is designed. 2. Pending revision of tables of organization and tables of organization and equipment, the number of basic privates authorized under existing tables are modified as follows, these changes being effective at once:

In connection with the attached report "What the Soldier Thinks" from the Special Service Division of the Army Service Forces, attention is invited to my secret Memorandum for Higher Commanders dated 5 July 1943, concerning the responsibility of higher Commanders for the morale or state of mind of their commands. The deficiencies in troop attitudes evidenced by this report calls for a review by all commanders of their strict responsibility for full performance of the objectives and intent of MR 1-10, March 5, 1943.

Tables of Organization and allotments will be revised to provide two special service officers per regiment and equivalent organizations. One of these officers will be specially qualified and trained for the staff supervision of athletics, recreation, and welfare activities as an assistant S-1. The other will be specially qualified and trained for staff supervision of orientation and indoctrination activities as an assistant S-3. Special service officers not now qualified in either field are to be replaced as rapidly as practicable with qualified, trained officers.

The Army Service Forces Quarterly Morale Report is being changed to a Monthly Progress Report which will be distributed to all commanders down to include regiments and equivalent organizations. All commanders will evaluate the status of the morale of their troops in the light of the conditions revealed in this and subsequent reports and take corrective action accordingly.

1. Reference is made to memorandum of the Chief of Staff, U. S. Army, dated 3 September 1943, file "DCS: 330.34 (3 Sept 43), no subject.

2. In order to effectuate the necessary changes in Tables of organization of regiments and equivalent organizations the following instructions will govern:

a. Groups and Headquarters Division Artillery will be considered as equivalent to regiments.

b. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of 1st Lieutenant will be included in each regiment or equivalent unit as assistant S-1 with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Assistant S-1, athletic and recreation officer". Where there is no S-1 provided by table of organization, this officer will be included as an assistant to the officer provided in c. below.

c. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of captain will be included in each regiment or equivalent unit as assistant S-3 with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Assistant S-3, orientation officer".

d. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of captain will be included in the headquarters of the Armored Division, in addition to the four special service officers presently provided, with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Divisional orientation officer".

e. (1) Allotments for post, camps and stations having a troop population of 2,000 or more not included in table of organization units (AG 310-60) will include not less than two (2) special service officers, branch immaterial. One will be designated as athletic and recreation officer and be in grade of not less than 1st lieutenant. The other will be designated as orientation officer and be in the grade of not less than captain. In case the number of troops is too large for the efficient functioning of these officers, the number may be increased, with commensurate distribution of ranks, as considered appropriate by the responsible commander controlling the allotment to the particular activity concerned.

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(2) In posts, camps and stations having a troop population of less than 2,000 not included in table of organization units, one officer will be designated by the post commander as special service officer in addition to other duties.

3. Officers now in the grade of captain and assigned to regiments, groups and station complements as special service officers who are qualified as athletic and recreation officers may be assigned to the new position provided for such officers and carried as surplus in grade until absorbed by normal attrition. No such officer will be relieved or reassigned solely because his grade is in excess of current authorization.

4. The Commanding General, Army Service Forces, will prepare and submit to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1, WDGS, the necessary changes to army regulations, field and technical manuals and War Department memoranda to incorporate these changes in organization and carry out the provisions of referenced directive as to functions of officers. Strict observance will be given to following sound staff procedure and established channels of command in the conduct of special service activities.

5. Changes in tables of organization and allotments and publications required by paragraph 4 above will be accomplished at an early date.

SUBJECT: Allotment of grades and ratings to 2675th Regiment, AMG.

TO : Major General Benyon A. Joyce, Acting Deputy President, AMG.

1. Mr. McCloy has carried back to the War Department your request for the utmost flexibility in the allotment of grades and ratings to the unit holding personnel for AMG, and I am sure he will do the best he can to take off all restrictions. In the meantime it is worth reviewing the situation as it now stands to see what can be done about it at this end.

2. Attached hereto is a table showing in two columns the authorized and presently assigned grades of enlisted men for service with AMG ACC in this Theatre. The authorized allotment was established by the War Department by letter dated August 25, 1943, and was based on estimates by total number only prepared by this Section for Military Government in Regions 1 to 4 plus National Headquarters. This allotment was established by the War Department by comparing it with other administrative unit requirements, and not by securing a basis for organization from AMG or ACC.

3. By NATOUSA letter AG 322/164 A-O dated 30 September, this allotment was assigned to the 2675th Regiment, which was designated as the unit to hold all U.S. personnel, officers and enlisted men, engaged in AMG-ACC activities in the Theatre.

4. This letter appears to give the greatest flexibility possible within the War Department authorization, despite the unit's being called a "Regiment", as the NATOUSA letter referred to provides that the allotment "may be sub-allotted by the Commanding Officer of the 2675th Regiment....at his discretion to a provisional headquarters and headquarters company, and to provisional letter designated companies thereunder."

5. To meet the problem raised by you, namely, the inability to make promotions in view of lack of vacancies in the first three grades and the heavy over-assignment existing in the grade of sergeant, it might be well to prepare for the following action (assuming Mr. McCloy is not successful):

- a. Request a change by the War Department in the existing authorization,
- b. Reduce the assigned number of sergeants by release to replacement pools, with replacement by Pfc and Privts.

6. With respect to 4a, attention is invited to the comment of General Sawbridge, Ass't Chief of Staff G-1, that the regiment is very heavily over-graded right now, and that the trouble originated when men were selected and sent over by the War Department on their special qualifications without regard to the authorized allotment of grades.

7. With respect to 4b., it is to be noted that G-1 NATOUSA will be reluctant to acquiesce in the release of sergeants to the Theatre replacement pools which are already overstrength in the same grade.

8. I suggest that you direct that the following steps be taken:

- a. Initiate a study of the requirements by grade for the actual duties being performed by enlisted men in AEC-ACC.
- b. Upon completion of the study forward it to this section for transmittal to the War Department through G-1, NATOUSA, in an effort to secure a change in existing authorization to conform to actual requirements.
- c. Survey the duties being performed by the 100 sergeants now assigned to see how many might be released and replaced in the lower grades.
- d. Submit the survey through this section to G.C. NATOUSA, with the request that the excess number found be released to replacement pools.

SUBJECT: Establishment

TO : All Regions, AAG Armies, and Sections, Sub-Commissions and Branches of HQ.

1. Present Position

a. The authorized strength of the 2675 (American) Regt., AAG is 829 Officers, 15 Warrant Officers and 1045 EM. Of these, 74 EM are detached on special duty, but still carried on the strength of the Regiment.

b. The authorized strength of AAGMC, the British Unit created by War Establishment No. Wa/266/1 dated 6 January 1944 is 663 Officers and 1347 OMs.

c. On the strength of the above two units is borne the whole of the personnel allotted to AAG-AAG in Italy.

d. The number of Officers scheduled to proceed to U.S. is:

American 200
British 90

The British Officers are being replaced from U.S.; similar replacements will probably not be forthcoming for the American Officers. There will be no further bulk demands for personnel of AAG for other theaters.

2. Sub-Establishment for Regions, etc.

a. The question of Sub-establishments /IOs for Regions, AAG Armies, and Sub-Commissions and Branches of Headquarters has been under consideration, and it has been decided that no attempt will be made to issue them. It is realized that this decision will cause some difficulty and uncertainty in Regions and Sub-Commissions, but the question is fraught with so many complications that it has been found impossible to arrive at any other satisfactory solution.

b. The chief reason for the decision is that conditions, and with them the weight and direction of effort are and will be constantly changing. It is therefore impossible to allot personnel on any permanent basis, and it would be useless — in fact positively harmful to issue sub-establishments /IOs which would be subject to constant amendment. Personnel will therefore be allotted by this HQ as and when required in accordance with the volume of work to the extent permitted by available numbers. All that can be said is that for the present Region I will operate with about 110 Officers, Region II with 117, and Region III will be gradually reduced to about 40 after its territory is handed over to the Italian Government.

3. Ranks and Promotion

a. The question of ranks and promotion will similarly be dealt with centrally by this HQ because it is not possible to lay down any fixed ranks for Officers or SA/OR in Regions since the total personnel will vary as territory is handed over and duties become supervisory on the one hand or operational duties increase under AMI on the other. Similarly, the volume of work in Sub-Commissions is not constant.

b. Recommendations for promotion of Officers (as to which separate instructions on the British side have been issued in Exec Memo No. 19) will therefore be submitted without regard to whether there is or is not a suitable assignment in a higher rank in the particular region, Sub-Commission, etc., in which the Officer being recommended happens to be serving at the time.

c. Instructions regarding the promotion of both EAs and OAs are being issued shortly.

1. I have caused a preliminary study to be given to your letter 233,210/3 of 4 Feb. 45.

2. The whole subject appears to have been admirably calculated in Table IX showing the war establishment for the progressive phases in the occupation of Italy. These phases are, you will remember, covered as follows:-

Situation I (Occupation of Rome)	- 1257 officers
Situation II (Rimini - Pisa Line)	- 1405 "
Situation III	- 1427 "
Situation IV (The Alps)	- 1561 "

3. Provided that these numbers are maintained, the officers will be made available for operations in other theatres, as indeed they have been in the past. At the same time I must insist on nomination of officers being made by agreement. This applies equally to key men and to the lower grades of a colonel. If you will tell me the type of officer required and the appointment which you intend him to fill I will do my best to provide the right man, bearing in mind the necessities, not only of this Commission, but of new organisations. The present system by which officers are ordered to leave the theatre without previous consultation has brought about a situation in which I have no senior American officer suitable to fill a vacant appointment of Regional Commissioner. Thus, either the parity between American and British officers is lost or efficiency will be jeopardised.

4. The problem of the enlisted men is far more difficult. Neither Colonel Harman (who has been of the greatest assistance), nor I, can find any logical reason for fixing the TO of the M at 1045. In October last my predecessor submitted a case for a TO of 2553 M. He made repeated representations subsequently that the TO be approved and the breakdown carried out in a more satisfactory manner than in the past. I understand that this TO was forwarded to the War Department with your recommendation that it should be approved but that you subsequently revoked that recommendation. I was not aware of this until Colonel Harman so informed me.

5. On the basis of the establishment for officers and British other ranks provided for in Table IX the strength of 2553 MI is logical and necessary. An organization of this type cannot function efficiently without an adequate strength of MI and RM. Whatever the extent to which Italian personnel are used there is a vast amount of clerical and transport work and of duties connected with the distribution and custody of food, cases and escorts for refugees, and all the various activities of the Commission, which must be carried out by Allied Service personnel. Lack of MI and RM will force me to demand assistance from military formations which I wish to avoid.

6. Provided the quality of the MI can be improved I am prepared, however, to accept a total number of 1600. This reduces me to a minimum, will involve the employment of Italian drivers for ACU transport for which special approval will have to be sought by you in the case of USA vehicles, and an increase in the establishment of Italian personnel.

7. I have already telegraphed my views on the move here of the MI of 2675 Regiment. It is essential that the personnel of the Regiment should be commanded by their MI here in Italy and that the records, supply, motor maintenance sections, together with their guard platoon and medical Officer, should be stationed in this theatre and not in another continent.

Volstad should be able to devote some of his time to such duties as you will have two officers for the organization and supervision of air and motor transport.

b. Is a full time Reception and Information Officer (See Para. 1 above) really required? If so, Headquarters Commandant, Salerno, should report to this Headquarters when Capt. Jones is expected to be fit for duty, and whether or not a replacement is required in the meanwhile.

c. Reference para. 11, above, The name of the officer finally selected (as to which Headquarters Commandant, Salerno should consult Major Doe, Brindisi Detachment) as Mess Secretary and Treasurer should be reported to this Headquarters as soon as possible. It is understood that Major Doe has agreed that Capt. Buckley would be a suitable officer for such duties and it is considered, in any event, that the officer detailed as Security Officer can easily undertake, if qualified to do so, the duties of Mess Secretary-Treasurer in addition to his Security duties. It was suggested at one time that an officer for Security duties in connection with classified documents in the offices would be required in addition to a Security Officer for general duties under the Headquarters Commandant. On reconsideration, this is not now considered necessary; one officer under the orders of the Headquarters Commandant can well perform both functions.

1. Reference is made to memorandum of the Chief of Staff, U. S. Army, dated 3 September 1943, file "DASA 330.14 (3 Sept 43), no subject.

2. In order to effectuate the necessary changes in tables of organization of regiments and equivalent organizations the following instructions will govern:

a. Groups and Headquarters Division Artillery will be considered as equivalent to regiments.

b. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of 1st lieutenant will be included in each regiment or equivalent unit as assistant S-1 with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Assistant S-1, athletic and recreation officer". Where there is no S-1 provided by table of organization, this officer will be included as an assistant to the officer provided in c. below.

c. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of captain will be included in each regiment or equivalent unit as assistant S-3 with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Assistant S-3, orientation officer".

d. One special service officer, branch immaterial, in the grade of captain will be included in the headquarters of the Armored Division, in addition to the four special service officers presently provided, with notation under the "Remarks" column - "Divisional orientation officer".

e. (1) Allotments for post, camp and stations having a troop population of 2,000 or more not included in table of organization units (AR 310-60) will include not less than two (2) special service officers, branch immaterial. One will be designated as athletic and recreation officer and be in the grade of not less than 1st lieutenant. The other will be designated as orientation officer and be in the grade of not less than captain. In case the number of troops is too large for the efficient functioning of these officers, the number may be increased, with commensurate distribution of ranks, as considered appropriate by the responsible commander controlling the allotment to the particular activity concerned.

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(2) In posts, camps and stations having a troop population of less than 2,000 not included in table of organization units, one officer will be designated by the post commander as special service officer in addition to other duties.

3. Officers now in the grade of captain and assigned to regiments, groups and station complements as special service officers who are qualified as athletic and recreation officers may be assigned to the new position provided for such officers and carried as surplus in grade until absorbed by normal attrition. No such officer will be relieved or reassigned solely because his grade is in excess of current authorization.

4. The Commanding General, Army Service Forces, will prepare and submit to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1, DCS, the necessary changes to army regulations, field and technical manuals and War Department memoranda to incorporate these changes in organization and carry out the provisions of referenced directive as to functions of officers. Strict observance will be given to following sound staff procedure and established channels of command in the conduct of special service activities.

5. Changes in tables of organization and allotments and publications required by paragraph 4 above will be accomplished at an early date.

1. Reference is made to letter this office dated 20 August 1943, file AG 320.2 (31 Jul 43) FE-A-M-C, subject: "Utilization of Personnel."

2. In connection with reassignment of enlisted men and surplus by reorganization of units under new Tables of Organization and Equipment, by inactivation or disbanding of units, by reduction of allotments and by reduction of strength of overseas garrisons, those men who cannot be reassigned within grade may be reassigned without regard to authorized grade and carried as excess in grade (not excess in actual numbers) until absorbed.

3. Since future shipments of enlisted men to and from overseas areas under the rotation policy will be on a grade-for-grade basis, each responsible commander must establish promotion policies for troops under his control to insure the absorption of these men without increase in surplus in grade.

4. At the time of reorganization of a unit under a new Table of Organization and Equipment enlisted men may be released when any of the following conditions are met:

a. When the actual total strength exceeds the new authorized strength. (Surplus in excess of War Department policy must be removed.)

b. When the actual number in any grade exceeds the new authorization for that grade and such surplus cannot be absorbed by promotion within the unit (company to division, inclusive).

c. When qualifications of enlisted men on hand do not meet those required and retraining is not practicable. This is not to be interpreted as authority for removal of undesirables and incompetents.

5. At the time of reduction of allotments or reduction of strength of overseas garrisons the provisions of 4b and c, above, will be applied in the selection of men to be released.

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6. The retention of surplus personnel in units in continental United States and those within overseas areas having replacement systems is not favored. This practice tends to reduce flexibility in the personnel replacement system, increase demands for stockage of replacements, involves extra administration and housekeeping for which units are not organized, stagnates promotion, encourages reliance on overstrength to accomplish normal missions and requires special consideration for transportation and movement.

1. Strongly recommend that further consideration of detailed TO/WE for HQACC be delayed until this Headquarters has been in operation for a sufficient period of time to be able to base the TO/WE on actual experience.

2. This recommendation is made because:-

a. All previous TO/WE have been formulated without experience in the field.

b. Confusion in a newly opened Headquarters will be increased by continued changes of organization.

c. It is believed that a logical TO/WE can not now be made.

3. During the period prior to formulation and approval of a TO/WE, the Headquarters and the Regions will function within the over-all total of officers, American and British, allocated for Military Government. The Headquarters of Allied Control Commission will generally conform to the chart as shown by Appendix E to PD No. 12.

4. This need not interfere with the formulation of global TO/WE.

Since I understand that the Public Safety Sub-Commission will shortly receive consideration for a decrease in establishment, I request that the following facts be borne in mind before a decision is made.

The A.C. Establishment for Public Safety was 35 and whilst planning at the Holding Centre a crisis arose on account of the lack of adequate establishment for Finance Officers. To assist A.C., I volunteered to restrict the effective strength of Public Safety to 27 only, so that the remaining 7 officers would be temporarily available for Finance. This was done entirely voluntarily to solve a general problem and in the good faith that the Public Safety Sub-Commission ultimate establishment could revive to 35 if required.

I request, therefore, on these grounds that the establishment of the Public Safety Sub-Commission be not further reduced below 27, since such a reduction would not only seriously impair efficiency but would also penalise this Sub-Commission for having made an unselfish contribution for the benefit of the Commission as a whole.

In addition, I have been instructed by General McHenry to assume control of the Political Intelligence Section, which has an establishment of three officers and which will be incorporated into the Special Police Sub-Division for the purposes of special investigation.

I request also, therefore, that this number be added to the total Public Safety strength, and that the figure of 35 should be the basic one from which reductions are to be made.

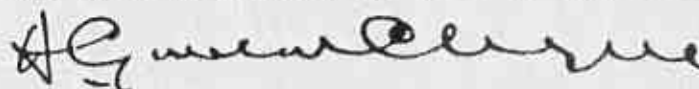

ORGANIZATION OF TABLE OF ORGANIZATION

1. REMARKS. The following is a summary of the specialized functions of ARCT for the purpose of explaining the proposed Table of Organization dated 26 June 1943. More particularly, it is to serve as a basis for determining the necessity for the highly specialized personnel, officers and enlisted men, required for this organization.
2. ORGANIZATION. ARCT is to be organized that the responsibility in connection with the operation is a joint allied undertaking; thus, the U. S. Contingent table of organization has been drawn almost parallel with the British War Establishment. At the present time, however, the personnel on the American side is considerably less. In the administration of the plan there will be a Chief Civil Affairs Officer and Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, a Headquarters and Staff consisting of chief staff officers, a Headquarters Company, and chiefs of special divisions created for the purpose of executing the mission. In addition there will be an administrative staff, educational advisors to examine texts, teachers, and teaching methods; and advisors on fire arts and munitions, who will advise with regard to the preservation of historical monuments and fine arts.
3. SPECIAL DIVISIONS. The special divisions are designated to give advice to the Chief Civil Affairs Officer on questions in their respective specialized field; to furnish special personnel for the existing administrative organization in the territory, and to provide advisors and assistants to local civil affairs officers. The divisions are as follows:
 - Legal Division
 - Finance Division
 - Civilian Supply Division
 - Public Health Division
 - Public Safety Division
 - Allied and Navy Property Division
 - Civil Affairs Division
4. LEGAL DIVISION. Headed by a Chief Legal Officer, Chief of the Legal Division, as well as a Chief Advisory Officer and a Chief Counsel, this division is responsible for the organization and staffing of

...the entire side is considerably less. In the administration of the plan it will be a Chief Civil Affairs Officer and Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, a Headquarters and Staff consisting of chief staff officers, a Headquarters Company, and chiefs of special divisions created for the purpose of executing the mission. In addition there will be an administrative staff, educational advisors to examine texts, teachers, and teaching methods; and advisors in fine arts and monuments, who will advise with regard to the preservation of historical monuments and fine arts.

3. GENERAL DIVISIONS. The special divisions are designated to give advice to the Chief Civil Affairs Officer on questions in their respective specialized field; to furnish special personnel for the existing administrative organization in the territory, and to provide advisors and assistants to local Civil Affairs Officers. The divisions are as follows:

Legal Division
Finance Division
Civilian Supply Division
Public Health Division
Public Safety Division
Allied and enemy property Division
Civil Affairs Division

4. LEGAL DIVISION. Headed by a Chief Legal Officer, Chief of the Legal Division, as well as a Chief Advisory Officer and a Chief Counsel, this division is responsible for the organization and staffing of military courts, the supervision of civil courts, licensing of attorneys, preparation of regulations, ordinances and orders, legal advice to the Chief Civil Officer and his staff, and in general is responsible for legal matters affecting AMV. The very nature of the functions charged to this division render it essential that personnel assigned to it have language ability as well as a specialized technical background. Even stenographers and clerks should be of intelligent background.

5. FINANCE DIVISION. Headed by a Chief Financial Officer, assisted by a Deputy Chief Finance Officer. This section is subdivided as follows:

Chief Accountant - accounting and auditing.
Chief Revenue Officer - taxes and receipts.
Commissioner of Customs and Excise - customs and excises and State monopolies.
Control of Finance Institutions - examination and control of banks and insurance societies.
Financial and Economic Intelligence Officers - economic intelligence from records taken into custody.

This division is responsible for all currency and foreign exchange matters, control of funds, banks, insurance companies, and other public and private financial agencies and enterprises and state monopolies. They are charged with the collection and analysis of economic and financial intelligence from records and other material; the supervision of the administration of tax and customs law; the supervision of receipts and expenditures of governmental agencies; and the handling of problems relating to governmental budgets on the control of prices and purchasing power in coordination with the Civilian Supply Division, as well as on accounting and auditing in connection with the foregoing. As will be seen, this division will require personnel highly trained and skilled technically and in language.

6. CIVILIAN SUPPLY DIVISION. Headed by a Director of Civilian Supply and Resources. The staff subdivisions will include a Civilian Supply Officer charged with providing food, fuel, and consumer goods; a Civilian Transport Officer to coordinate transport of essential civilian supplies; an Industries and Resources Officer to serve the utilities, industrial plants, and natural resources other than agriculture; an Agriculture and Fisheries Officer charged with matters pertaining to agriculture farm projects and fisheries; and, finally, a Labor Officer charged with civilian labor supply and labor relations. The officers in this division and each subdivision are specialists and will require the services of specialized personnel.

7. PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION. A Director of Public Health heads this division, assisted by an advisor on public health. This division is responsible for the direction of civilian hospitals and public health and sanitation methods; venereal control, the direction and coordination of local welfare work and relief agencies, and the coordination of such allied relief agencies as may be later represented in the territory. There is no question that this division will require the assistance of specialized personnel.

8. PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION. This division is responsible for all civil police matters, including the supervision and reorganization of existing police forces, the operation of prisons and the registration and control of civilian motor vehicles, and is charged with the responsibility for civilian fire protection and for the organization

Supply and resources. The staff subdivisions will include a Civilian Supply Officer charged with providing food, fuel, and consumer goods; a Civilian Transport Officer to coordinate transport of essential civilian supplies; an Industries and Resources Officer to serve the utilities, industrial plants, and natural resources other than agriculture; an Agriculture and Fisheries Officer charged with matters pertaining to agriculture farm projects and fisheries, and, finally, a Labor Officer charged with civilian labor supply and labor relations. The officers in this division and each subdivision are specialists and will require the services of specialized personnel.

7. PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION. A Director of Public Health heads this division, assisted by an advisor on public health. This division is responsible for the direction of civilian hospitals and public health and sanitation methods, venereal control, the direction and coordination of local welfare work and relief agencies, and the coordination of such allied relief agencies as may be later represented in the territory. There is no question that this division will require the assistance of specialized personnel.

8. PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION. This division is responsible for all civil police matters, including the supervision and reorganization of existing police forces, the operation of prisons and the registration and control of civilian motor vehicles, and is charged with the responsibility for civilian fire protection and for the organization of civil defense. A Commissioner of Public Safety is chief of this division and is assisted by a Deputy Commissioner of Public Safety. The subdivisions are as follows:

- Superintendent of Prisons - prisons and detention institutions.
- Superintendent of Traffic and Licensing - registration and circulation of civilian vehicles.
- Superintendent of civil police - general supervision of all units of national, provincial and local police organizations.
- Superintendent of Special Police - investigation of loyalty and efficiency of administrative officers and investigate into black market operations.
- Superintendent of Fire Department and Civil Defense - fire and civil defense agencies.

This division, as well as the others in the preceding paragraphs, will require personnel with language background and technical skill.

b. CIVIL POLICE. All civil police functions in the territory will be exercised by civil police officers who will be stationed in important cities and towns in the territory. Their functions will be to take over and supervise the administration and control of existing police forces and to set up patrols for security in conjunction with combat units where necessary. They are further charged with the coordination with military intelligence and military police officers, and to assist the Civil Affairs Officers in enforcing military law locally. The requirements of this particular phase of public safety is to be read in conjunction with the division as a whole.

2. ALLIED AND NEUTRAL PROPERTY DIVISION. This division is responsible for the custody of property of allied owners surrendered by the Government occupied; property of the enemy Government not in custody of some other branch of the allied forces; and abandoned property or property belonging to absentee owners. This division, therefore, consists of specialists and will require the services of personnel with language background and at least specialized in the field with which this division deals.

10. CIVIL AFFAIRS DIVISION: The local military administration of the territory will be conducted through Civil Affairs Officers who will be stationed in important cities and towns in the territory. Their functions, briefly, are to continue in operation provincial and municipal administration and essential local services; to publish proclamations and ordinances and in conjunction with civil police officers of the Public Safety Division to enforce proclamations, orders, etc., of military authority and to insure security and local order; to organize and hold military courts; to coordinate with combat units in requisitioning, procurement, and marketing in a particular local area; and to assist local unit commanders in any other matters involving the civil population. This division comprises officer personnel with administrative experience, and they will require personnel with knowledge of local dialect as well as office personnel with skill in interpreting and translating.

11. ORGANIZATION. In view of the joint responsibility involving an equal sharing of political, local and financial responsibility for both planning and continuing military government, as well as the participating by personnel on as near an equal basis as possible in

In view of the joint responsibility involving an equal sharing of political, local and financial responsibility for both planning and continuing military government, as well as the participation by personnel on an equal basis as possible in this highly specialized mission, it is requested that consideration be given to obtaining personnel for AEWG that possess language, interpreting, and translating ability, as well as technical skill for the particular division to which each will be assigned. Therefore, in preparation of the table of organization, consideration has been given to the specialized work to be performed so that ratings will be consistent with the special skills of the personnel assigned to particular divisions of AEWG.
