1. By direction of Colonel Poletti this division ceases active operation in the field of Movement Control and becomes an advisory unit as of this date.

2. In the organization of Ente Nazionale Autotrasporti di Cose (E.N.A.C.) a Control Office is provided which will function as a counterpart of this Division. Eng. Saul Graco is the head of that Control Office with offices in the Ministry of Communications Building, located in Piazza Croce Rossa. Telephone installation is not completed at present.

3. From this date all application for civilian road transport should be made directly to Ufficio Trasporti di Roma (U.T.R.) by the person, organization or Division using the transport and paying for it. Time is lost rather than saved if a Division submits a request for transport on behalf of a civilian organization. When the request is unusual or out of the ordinary it would be well for the Division concerned to endorse the request and explain the need or urgency of it.

4. A certain amount of paper work and record keeping is necessary for the Control Office to properly function. Therefore, emergency requests should be restricted to honest emergencies and not include lack of foresight in getting application filed in reasonable time.

SUBJECT: Counter Intelligence Corps.

1. This letter sets forth the basic policies and principles which govern the organization, training, supply, and operation of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel.

2. The counter Intelligence Corps was authorized by letter, AG 320.2 (12 Dec 41) MR-M-B, 13 December 1944, subject: "Redesignation of the Corps of Intelligence Police".

3. The mission of the Counter Intelligence Corps is to contribute to the successful operations of the Army of the United States through the detection of treason, sedition, subversive activity and disaffection, and the detection and prevention of enemy espionage and sabotage.

4. The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, establishes War Department policies concerning the Counter Intelligence Corps.

5. The Commanding General, Army Service Forces (Director of Intelligence) exercises supervision of administration and operation of the Counter Intelligence Corps throughout the military establishment under policies established by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff. The principal functions of the Director of Intelligence, Army Service Forces, in this connection, include:

a. To supervise procurement and assignment of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel and to pass upon qualifications of applicants.

b. To supervise specialized training of personnel procured in the continental United States for Counter Intelligence Corps duty.

c. To determine and arrange for supply of specialized investigative equipment that cannot be handled through normal supply channels.

d. To supervise administration and operation of the Counter Intelligence Corps.

e. To arrange undercover status for agents when requested by field agencies.

6. ORGANIZATION.--Counter Intelligence Corps detachments are organized in accordance with T/O & E 30-500, 24 January 1944.

7. PROCUREMENT.

a. The procurement of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel is in accordance with Section I, War Department Circular 379, 19 September 1944.

b. Personnel will not be released from the Counter Intelligence Corps except for a specific reason, and such releases will be reported promptly through channels to the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: Director of Intelligence.

c. Surplus Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be reported, for assignment elsewhere, to the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: Director of Intelligence.

8. TRAINING.

a. The training of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel is in accordance with War Department Memorandum Number 350-44, 7 September 1944.

b. Each using organization will give Counter Intelligence Corps personnel such additional training as may be required to qualify them for Counter Intelligence Corps work with that organization. The detachment commander is responsible to insure that each Counter Intelligence Corps officer and enlisted man maintains a high standard of physical condition and a high state of training as a soldier, that each secures and maintains proficiency in the use of technical equipment and firearms, and that each gains a useful knowledge of a foreign language required in the area of operation.

9. ASSIGNMENT.

a. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are assigned to Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces, Theaters of Operations, Caribbean Defense Command, Alaskan Department, and Base Commands.

b. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel on duty with the Air Transport Command are assigned to Headquarters, Army Air Forces, and are subject to the provisions of current War Department policies pertaining to the Air Transport Command.

10. UNIFORM.--Authorization for the wearing by Counter Intelligence Corps personnel of such military and civilian clothing as is required for accomplishment of the Counter Intelligence Corps mission is a command responsibility. The appropriate command will issue directives from time to time concerning the type of clothing to be worn by Counter Intelligence Corps personnel.

11. CONFIDENTIAL FUNDS.

a. The administration of confidential funds will be in accordance with letter, AG 123 (8 May 1944) OB-S-E-M, 10 May 1944, subject: Use of Military Intelligence Funds, to the Commanding Generals Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces; Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area; the Commanding Generals, Theaters of Operations, Defense Commands, Alaskan Department, First thru Ninth Service Commands, Northwest Service Command, Military District of Washington, and Independent Base Commands.

b. The missions to which Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are assigned are often exceptional in character, requiring unusual and unforeseen activities and expenditures. The G-2, A-2, or the S-2 of any command to which Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are assigned or attached, is authorized to furnish to Counter Intelligence Corps detachments Military Intelligence funds necessary for the accomplishment of their mission. Supervision over the expenditure of the Military Intelligence funds will be maintained to the end that expenditures are justified by expected results.

c. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be reimbursed from confidential funds in accordance with existing War Department regulations and directives.

d. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel operating privately owned vehicles on government business will be reimbursed for mileage in accordance with existing War Department directives.

12. RATIONS AND QUARTERS.--When required, Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be authorized separate rations or monetary allowance in lieu of rations and/or quarters in accordance with Army regulations.

13. CIVILIAN CLOTHING.--The purchase of civilian clothing for, and the use of civilian clothing by Counter Intelligence Corps personnel is in accordance with letter, AG 420 (26 Aug 44) OB-S-E-M, 29 August 1944, subject: Civilian Clothing for Counter Intelligence Corps Personnel as amended to the Commanding Generals, Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces; Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area; the Commanding Generals, Theaters of Operations, Defense Commands, Alaskan Department, First thru Ninth Service Commands, Northwest Service Command, Military District of Washington, Ports of Embarkation, Independent Base Commands, the Commanding Officers, Ports of Embarkation. The purchase of articles of the civilian uniform will be handled in the same manner as civilian clothing.

14. CREDENTIALS.--The preparation, issue and accounting of badges and credentials for Counter Intelligence Corps personnel is in accordance with letter, AG 200.2 (10 Aug 44) OB-S-E-M, 12 August 1944, subject: Issuance of Credentials and Badges to Counter Intelligence Corps personnel to the Commanding Generals, Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces; Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area; the Commanding Generals, Theaters of Operations, Caribbean Defense Command, Alaskan Department, Independent Base Commands; Chief of Engineers.

15. SUPPLY.

a. Counter Intelligence Corps detachments are equipped in accordance with the following War Department publications:

- (1) Table of Organization and Equipment 30-500, 24 January 1944.
- (2) Letter, AG 460 (27 Nov 43) OB-S-SPDEL-M, 29 November 1943, subject: Special List of Investigative Equipment and Supplies for the Counter Intelligence Corps.
- (3) War Department Circular Number 203, 23 May 1944, subject: Supply of Overseas Commands. (paragraph 9b).

b. All organizational equipment listed in T/O & E 30-500 will be requisitioned through the regular supply channels of the unit to which the Counter Intelligence Corps detachment concerned is assigned or attached.

c. Items in the Special List of Investigative Equipment and Supplies will be requisitioned through channels from the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: Director of Intelligence. The transmission of requests for investigative equipment to the above address from overseas Counter Intelligence Corps units is authorized by War Department Circular Number 203, cited above.

d. Items in the Special List of Investigative Equipment and Supplies are for the use of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel only.

e. Responsibility and accountability for Counter Intelligence Corps property whether organizational or investigative is in accordance with existing Army Regulations.

f. If damaged technical investigative equipment cannot be repaired by existing army facilities available to the Counter Intelligence Corps detachment such unserviceable equipment should be returned to the following address:

A covering letter explaining the circumstances should accompany the equipment. If any item of investigative equipment is damaged beyond repair, lost, or destroyed, it will be salvaged or surveyed in accordance with existing Army regulations.

g. Firing with weapons authorized for the Counter Intelligence Corps is carried out in accordance with provisions of AR 775-10. If .38 caliber special ammunition, including steel jacket ammunition for overseas use, cannot be secured from a local supply unit it may be requisitioned as set forth in paragraph 15c above.

h. Supplementary gasoline and tire purchase permits for the use of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel operating privately owned automobiles on official business will be made available in the Zone of the Interior. The procurement and distribution of rationed items will be governed by appropriate directives issued by the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, to the headquarters of the interested commands.

16. CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION.

a. In all cases where the time element is vital, direct communication between Counter Intelligence Corps detachments is authorized, such communication being reported promptly to the G-2, A-2, or S-2 involved.

b. All communications relating to the Counter Intelligence Corps and intended for the War Department will be dispatched through Channels to the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D.C., Attention: Director of Intelligence.

17. ADMINISTRATION.--Administration of Counter Intelligence Corps detachments will be the responsibility of the Commanding Generals, Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces; Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area; Commanding Generals, Theaters of Operations, Caribbean Defense Command, Alaskan Department, and Base Commands. The detachment commander is responsible to the appropriate commander through the G-2, A-2, or S-2, concerned, for the internal administration of the detachment.

18. PUBLICITY.

a. When operating in civilian clothing or the civilian uniform Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be addressed as "Mister" and rank will not be revealed in orders.

b. With the exception of Identification Card, WD, AGO 65, identification cards issued to Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will not bear a military title.

19. REPORTS.

a. Monthly Reports will be submitted to the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: Director of Intelligence, in accordance with War Department Memorandum Number 380-44, 5 October 1944.

b. The counter Intelligence Corps detachment commander will accomplish such other reports as may be required by the appropriate G-2, A-2, or S-2.

c. All records and reports which tend to establish the identities, locations, or activities of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel, will be given a classification sufficiently high to insure adequate safeguarding the information contained therein.

20. POWER OF ARREST.

a. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel on duty in the United States has only that power of arrest which all citizens of the United States possess and those powers of arrest granted to military personnel by the Articles of War and existing Army Regulations.

b. Subject to policies established by the appropriate overseas command, Counter Intelligence Corps personnel on duty overseas have full power and authority to arrest or detain any person who violates military security or whose detention is otherwise deemed necessary for the accomplishment of the counterintelligence mission.

21. JURISDICTION.

a. The jurisdiction of the Counter Intelligence Corps detachment is limited by the counterintelligence jurisdiction of the command with which it is serving. The extent of this jurisdiction in the Zone of Interior is determined by current War Department directives.

b. In overseas commands, jurisdiction is limited by the counterintelligence responsibility of the command and by existing international agreements.

22. OPERATIONS.

a. In commands with which Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are ordered to duty, the G-2, A-2, or S-2, assisted by his counterintelligence staff officers, is responsible to his commander for general supervision of, and advice pertaining to, the employment of such personnel. Actual employment, however, is a function of command to be exercised through the commanding officer of the Counter Intelligence Corps detachment.

b. The commanding officer of the detachment is responsible for detailed planning regarding the employment of his detachment personnel. Necessary counterintelligence information upon which such planning is to be based will be provided by the G-2 or A-2 counterintelligence staff concerned.

c. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be encouraged to exercise initiative to the fullest extent, and, in the performance of their duties they will be permitted to operate with minimum restrictions of movement. When consistent with the policies of the appropriate Commander, Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will not be delayed in the execution of their assigned duties by the observance of standard military customs or prohibitions nor by the Military Police or other military agencies. Counter Intelligence Corps badges and credentials will be honored at all times.

d. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will be employed only on tasks involving a counterintelligence interest. They will not be employed on combat intelligence missions, routine Prisoner of War interrogations,

black market investigations, criminal investigations, investigations of cases involving only moral turpitude, irregularities not concerned with subversion, counterintelligence, sedition and similar matters, nor other work which is properly the function of another agency and which may retard or interfere with the performance of counterintelligence duties. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will not be assigned to kitchen police, fatigue, guard, or other duties of comparable nature.

23. DUTIES IN THE ZONE OF INTERIOR.

a. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel assigned to units of the Army Air Forces, Army Ground Forces, and Army Service Forces in the Zone of Interior will perform the following duties as directed by command authority:

(1) Investigate and prepare reports upon the following within the investigative jurisdiction of the unit with which the Counter Intelligence Corps personnel are ordered to duty, and in accordance with TM 30-215 and other appropriate War Department directives:

(a) Military and civilian personnel gravely suspected of disaffection, of engaging in subversive activity, of espionage, sabotage, treason, or sedition.

(b) Incidents and activities in which violations of security regulations are apparent or suspected.

(c) Certain civilian personnel to be employed by the War Department.

(2) Conduct surveys to determine the security of military installations and offices, and make recommendations to prevent leakage of information.

(3) Conduct surveys and make recommendations regarding the security of contemplated movements of troops and material.

(4) Deliver lectures to troops and present demonstrations on the security of military information and activities.

(5) Conduct surveys to determine compliance with and assist in the enforcement of the provisions of AR 380-5 "Safeguarding Military Information". Investigate to determine the responsibility for violations of these regulations.

(6) Participate in a continuous Counter Intelligence Corps training program and in the parent organization's training program. The appropriate Commander will determine the extent to which Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will participate in the organization's training program if such training conflicts with Counter Intelligence Corps duties or training.

(7) Perform such other duties as command authority shall determine are within the Counter Intelligence Corps mission.

b. In addition to the duties listed above, Counter Intelligence Corps detachments assigned to Army Air Forces units in the Zone of Interior will investigate incidents involving aircraft or aircraft material under the jurisdiction of the Army Air Forces to determine the presence or absence of sabotage.

24. OPERATIONS IN OVERSEAS COMMANDS.

a. It is of the utmost importance that effective counterintelligence coverage be maintained continuously in large or important towns and areas where United States military forces are in operation or occupation. Counterintelligence coverage for such locations by Counter Intelligence Corps personnel will include developing informant systems outside the United States military establishment, making investigations of suspected persons and becoming acquainted with and gaining confidence of influential local persons whose cooperation will be helpful. It is highly desirable that Counter Intelligence Corps personnel who inaugurate this counterintelligence coverage continue to maintain it until relieving Counter Intelligence Corps personnel has become sufficiently acquainted with the local situation to permit efficient assumption of control. Only when it becomes apparent that control can be relinquished without jeopardy to the counterintelligence coverage should the original group depart.

(1) The above will be considered in planning, and when necessary, request may be made for the temporary attachment of one or more Counter Intelligence Corps personnel from a higher headquarters, to be left in charge of a specific town or area.

(a) Whenever practicable Communications Zone and Air Force Counter Intelligence Corps personnel, specially trained in port and airport counterintelligence duties, will be made available to tactical commands required to establish initial counterintelligence coverage for ports and airports.

b. When the situation demands, detachment commanders by oral orders may place personnel under their command on temporary duty with other detachments upon approval in each case by the appropriate G-2, A-2, or S-2.

c. The appropriate commander is authorized to direct members of his command to lend such assistance to Counter Intelligence Corps personnel as may be required for the accomplishment of the Counter Intelligence Corps mission.

d. Liaison between counterintelligence personnel and all other allied intelligence agencies is the responsibility of counterintelligence staffs. However, members of the Counter Intelligence Corps will work in closest cooperation with:

- (1) Allied Civil Affairs Organizations.
- (2) Naval, Air Force, and Communications Zone counter-intelligence personnel.
- (3) Military Police and Provost Marshal personnel
- (4) Document collection and evaluation teams.
- (5) Prisoner of War personnel.
- (6) Allied counterintelligence staffs and personnel.
- (7) Other United States counterintelligence agencies.

25. DUTIES IN THEATERS OF OPERATIONS.--Pursuant to the general plan of the theater commander the operational duties of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel include:

a. Primary Duty in Forward Combat Areas. The primary duty of Counter Intelligence Corps personnel is to secure counterintelligence targets in the area of the objective. Foremost among these targets are:

- (1) Known and suspect enemy agents.
- (2) Known enemy collaborationists, sympathizers, and other persons whose presence menaces the security of the allied forces.
- (3) Offices formerly occupied by the enemy intelligence services or enemy police organizations and any documents they contain.
- (4) Offices of local semi-military organizations and collaborationist bodies and their records.
- (5) Centers of communications.
- (6) Buildings, billets, and installations known or suspected to contain documents of counterintelligence value.

b. Secondary Duties in Forward Combat Areas.

- (1) Making security checks in cooperation with the Military Police who are marshalling refugees and other civilians arriving from enemy occupied territory.
- (2) Contacting local authorities and persons known to be friendly to the allied cause in order to secure all possible counter-intelligence information.
- (3) Advising upon and assisting in securing against all public and private installations, the continued operation of which is essential to the allied forces.

(4) Checking upon the observance by civilian population of all security provisions contained in the proclamations and orders issued by Civil Affairs detachments.

(5) Assisting in the discovery and collection of any hidden armaments or equipment which have not been surrendered or reported in accordance with ordinances.

(6) The seizure of civil communications and arranging for their protection against sabotage until taken over by authorized Signal Communications personnel as provided in operational orders. The records of such installations are of prime importance and should be secured, guarded, and turned over to the proper authorities.

(7) Seizing and impounding all civilian and captured enemy mail.

(8) Advising on the immediate establishment of guards at all captured ordnance and ammunition dumps, especially those which may be accessible to the local population.

(9) Stopping publication of newspapers and other periodicals.

(10) Taking measures necessary to prevent looting and destruction of enemy documents and material by our own troops.

(11) Transmitting to Civil Affairs, Provost Marshal and Military Police personnel all information on matters within their purview, such as civilian controls, adequacy and extent of cooperation of civil police, and the extent of disorder, looting, and sabotage.

c. Investigative Duties. The Counter Intelligence Corps will be employed in investigations of:

(1) Espionage.

(2) Sabotage.

(3) Subversive activity, including rumor mongering and surreptitious issue of enemy propaganda.

(4) Disaffection, treason, and sedition within the United States Forces.

(5) Violations of security regulations.

(6) Personnel of governments of occupied territory who are retained in their official capacities. (In certain instances involving a counterintelligence interest.)

(7) Certain civilian personnel to be employed by the United States Government.

d. Miscellaneous Duties.

(1) Cooperating with the Corps of Military Police and other military and civil authorities in exercising control at frontiers of territory under the jurisdiction of the Armed Forces of the United States. This action will include the recommending of the establishment and the assisting in the maintenance of controls and control systems over the entrance of persons, goods, and information into territory occupied by this command.

(2) Assisting port counterintelligence officers in the discharge of their duties.

(3) Performance of security surveys to determine the safety of communications, transportation lines, storage and supply facilities, and other United States installations and offices.

(4) Delivery of security lectures to the troops and other provisions for general indoctrination of all United States military personnel in security principles.

(5) Surveillance of establishments frequented by United States military personnel, and located within or near the area occupied by United States troops to determine the security of military information therein.

(6) Establishing informant networks outside the United States military establishment.

(7) Keeping the G-2, A-2, or S-2, of the respective commands informed of internal politics, political parties, or subversive groups.

e. Duties in the Event of Evacuation or Withdrawal.

(1) Searching evacuated headquarters, bivouac areas, supply depots, and other installations to insure that documents or any material that might be of intelligence value to the enemy have been completely destroyed or removed.

(2) Checking the control of refugees along the routes used by troops to prevent the possibility of enemy infiltration.

f. Duties of Special Groups. Duties of special groups will be in accordance with the needs of their particular assignment in addition to the duties enumerated above.

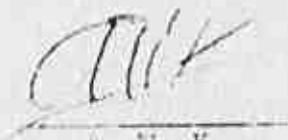
26. War Department Technical Manual 30-215, 22 September 1943, subject: Counter Intelligence Corps, is hereby rescinded.

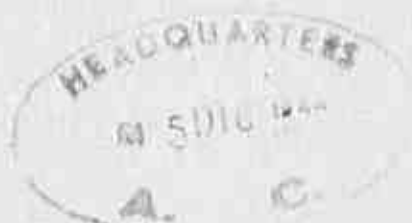

1. Reference proposed withdrawal of Allied Garrison from Sardinia, the following points arise:

- a. Source of supplies and rations.
- b. Movement of A.P.O.
- c. Reduction of A.C.C. strength.
- d. Communications.

2. Supplies and rations may be drawn from Naples or the near vicinity from either American or British sources. This will be arranged by this Headquarters between Region VI and Southern Region.

3. Official and personal mail can be routed through Southern Region Headquarters at Naples and taken from there by courier to Sardinia. This also will be arranged by this Headquarters.

a. There are, at present, Italian cruisers that run, on alternate days, from Naples to Cagliari, Sardinia, and these could be used for transportation of mail, supplies and rations.

4. The total strength of A.C.C. officers and enlisted personnel left in Sardinia when the Allied Garrison has been removed will not exceed twenty.

5. Signals have previously been handled over the Naples-Cagliari cable by military personnel. With the departure of all military personnel, it is understood that the cable will be handed over to the Italian Government, and although we may use the cable, the question of security arises. All messages sent over this link must thereafter be sent in the "clear".

6. Due to the fact that (a) the "cruiser" communications will be slow and (b) that all signals will be sent in the clear, it will be necessary in some instances to request a special courier plane for urgent messages.

7. Paragraph 6 above seems to be the only instance in which your Headquarters can be of service to us. It is requested that you advise us as to the possibility of such special courier service should the need arise.

ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF DIRECTOR OF HARBOR CRAFT,
WESTERN MEDITERRANEAN

General Order Number 11, this Headquarters, co. is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The Office of the Director of Harbor Craft, Western Mediterranean, is hereby established as a Staff Section of this Headquarters for the purpose of establishing an agency to accumulate data, maintain records, and submit recommendations to appropriate commanders and staff agencies on harbor craft in this theater. The Director of Harbor Craft, Western Mediterranean, does not have executive authority and is not empowered to issue instructions as to the use or movement of craft belonging to any of the services.

2. The Director and Deputy Directors of Harbor Craft will be members of the Mediterranean Shipping Board.

3. The duties of the Director of Harbor Craft are:

a. To study the ports and port operations within this theater in order to advise the appropriate higher authority relative to more efficient use of harbor craft.

b. To make recommendations to appropriate higher authority relative to more expeditious repairs to harbor craft.

c. To advise appropriate higher authorities relative to the progress and efficiency of the assembly of knockdown harbor craft.

d. To investigate and make recommendations to proper authorities for the development of local facilities for building harbor craft.

e. To consolidate and keep up to date the reports of various services on all harbor craft within the theater and submit a monthly report to the Mediterranean Shipping Board on harbor craft which will include statements as to the number of each type of craft, their current location, and state of repair.

f. To coordinate demands for harbor craft other than Naval craft on Washington and London for present and future operations.

1. Information received at this office indicates the desirability of removal of APO 397, currently servicing Region VI (Sardinia) to some location north of Rome. The situation is that subsequent to a routine postal inspection of APO 397, the inspector stated that quite probably the APO would be dissolved, since other APO's existed in the neighborhood which were set up to handle the mail for Region VI, since Region VI was too small a unit to warrant having an APO of its own.

2. It is believed that a considerable step in the direction of bettering the American postal service for personnel of Region VIII and IX (and other newly formed Regions in the same area) might be taken by the transfer of APO 397 to Hq Region IX.

3. This transfer will necessitate the naming of a Class B Agent Finance Officer, to assume responsibility for the APO. This might well be given to an American officer engaged in administrative duties, as an additional duty.

4. Will you please inform this headquarters as soon as possible if this proposal is acceptable to you, and if so, furnish the name of the officer to be placed in charge of the APO.

The time involved in transit render these rosters useless due to the many intervening changes. The transfer of the service to a local MRU would obviate the unnecessary delays and enable all concerned to maintain up-to-date records of the constantly changing strength of the organization. Changes that accrue during the month can be quickly processed and reflected on the Monthly Roster which could be delivered by the 5th of the month.

3. It is expected that the approximately 94 enlisted men and an unknown number of officers (see cable No. 51678 from MGS to MacFarland) will shortly be called forward, all to our present forward headquarters. If it is believed that it would be necessary for continuity of regimental records, request you forward minimum necessary officers and men by air.

4. If there is no valid objection to the above, request you take immediate action to accomplish it through Hq. Command, Allied Force.

1. The following changes in command and organization of the Army, Navy, and Air Force, effective 1 January 1947, are proposed for information.

2. Changes in Command and Organization:

a. General Sir Harold Alexander will be the representative in Italy of the President, Allied Control Commission and will also continue as Military Governor of occupied territory under the terms of the Armistice.

b. Lt. Gen. Sir Noel Mason-Pearce, while serving as Deputy President, will be Chief Commissioner, ACC, and will continue as Civil Affairs Branch of HQ, ACC.

c. Lt. Gen. Sir Noel Mason-Pearce will be under direct control of Army Commanders and under technical and administrative control of HQ, ACC.

d. The Army VI is still under command and control, but is expected to come under HQ, ACC.

3. Implementation of New Organization:

a. The new combined Headquarters will be located at Headquarters, Allied Control Commission (HQ, ACC).

You will have heard that Lt. Col. 15th Army Group has been abolished and that the Chief Commissioner, Lt. General Sir Noel Mason MacFarlane, U.S.A. M.C., M.C., now controls all aspects of military government and control in liberated Italy.

I should like you to know that I am U.S.A. M.C. suggested the abolition of Lt. Col. 15th Army Group as a separate entity in the interest of coordination and continuity of administration in this country as a whole - it was the only solution of the problem.

The Chief Commissioner has entrusted me as Executive Commissioner with the job of coordinating the work of the Regional Control, which will continue, and of seeing that his orders and the advice of the Administrative and Economic Sub-Commissioners are executed throughout the Regions. 5th and 8th Armies will continue, as heretofore, under the command of their respective Army Gs. looking towards the U. S. and U. S. Section for direction on policy and administration. I have merged the personnel of my late Lt. Col. 15th Army Group in order that continuity in respect of 5th and 8th Army and Regions III and IV may be maintained.

An official directive is being issued on the functions of the U. S. and U. S. Section and I will only add that it is to this section that the Chief Commissioner wants you to look, and that although there may be initial difficulties, particularly over channels of communication, with give and take in all sides these can be overcome.

Finally, I want you to know that the staff of this section are imbued with the principle that their duty is to serve the Command AGC and the Regional organisations and to all they can to help them in their problems.

1. The organization of the 2075th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) as indicated by General Orders 1 and 2 herewith, and directives pertaining to its administration, present several problems in this Headquarters.

2. It is the opinion of your staff that the following records must be retained at Headquarters Allied Military Government Detachment:

 Form 20 (Service Record and Allied Papers)
 Form 1 (Manning Report)
 Form 3 (Sick Book)

In this connection see letter AHO, AG 307, -I AGO-AGO of 3 November 1943, Subject: Organization of 2075th Regiment (U.S. Contingent) and its British Counterparts, paragraph 5, inclosed herewith.

3. It will be necessary that all reports, posters, and returns from all companies and detachments in the field either:

- a. be forwarded to Regimental Headquarters through Headquarters, Allied Military Government (AMG), or,
- b. indicate copies be sent to this Headquarters.

This is necessary in order to plan for required assignments and replacements of personnel and the supply of equipment and transportation to regions.

4. No apparent reason exists for making the 5th and 8th Army Detachments into a company separate from the 15th Army Group Detachment. It is believed that for convenience all personnel within the 15th Army Group should be included in one company. The entire group is a small, mobile unit which when completely organized will remain intact except for normal casualties.

5. It must be understood that transfers of personnel in the field will be made by the Adjutant General of Headquarters, Allied Military Government, (AGO) "By command of Major General Joyce", similar to transfer by Division Group.

6. In view of the foregoing, it is suggested that if approval is given to the inclosed General Order No. 1 and General Order No. 2, that Regimental Headquarters be instructed:

- a. to issue an amending order to General Order No. 2, incorporating Headquarters 15th Army Group, 5th and 8th Army Detachments into one company, -Company "G".

1. Reference is made to General Order No. 1, this Hq, dated 23 October, 1943, announcing the redesignation of certain AMG units into the 2675 Regiment, Allied Commission (U. S. Contingent) (Provisional).

2. The following instructions will apply for all detachments comprising this command:

a. Morning Reports. Morning Reports will be prepared promptly on WD AGO Form No. 1, Company Morning Report, and forwarded in duplicate (AMH and Unit Personnel Copies) to this Hq by the most expeditious means available.

b. Strength Returns. Strength Returns will be submitted to this headquarters daily with copies of Morning Report on attached mimeographed Headquarters Command Allied Force Form No. 1. These forms will be reproduced locally, exactly as per attached copies.

c. Sick Report. Sick Reports will be maintained in accordance with the provisions of AM 345-415 and will be available at detachment headquarters.

d. S-1 Reports. (1) S-1 Reports will be submitted in duplicate as of the first Saturday of each month with a complete annex attached, and then weekly during the month as of 0001Z each Sunday with an abbreviated annex attached.

(2) Initial report will be rendered for the week ending 2400 hours, 30 November 1943 and will be dispatched so as to arrive at this Hq as soon as possible. The provisions of NATOUSA Circular 191 will govern in the preparation of this report.

3. Travel Orders. Authority is delegated to detachment commanders to publish travel orders, covering travel of personnel required for the operation of the region, which do not obligate funds. Attachment and detachment of personnel of sub-divisions of the regiment, to headquarters, or units within the theater will be accomplished only by regimental order. Sufficient copies of all orders issued will be forwarded to this headquarters to take care of personnel requirements, i.e., one for 201 file of each officer concerned, one for file this Hq, etc.

4. Promotion. a. Officers. Recommendations for promotion of officers will be submitted only over the signature of detachment commanders.
