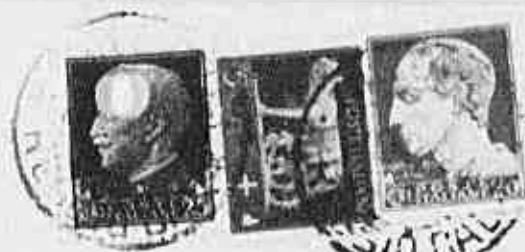

1. Inclosed herewith, request that Carlo G. Catania, a citizen of the United States, now residing in Palermo, Sicily, be enlisted in the United States Army which was submitted by Colonel JOHN T. ZELLARS, Acting Director of Economics and Supply Division.

2. Catania was born in New York City on 10 March 1926, as attested by the inclosed birth certificate.

3. This American citizen left New York City with his family on 1 August 1936 for the purpose of visiting relatives in Sicily. Catania states that after spending two years in Sicily he and his family were unable to secure passage back to the United States because of the imminence of the war.

4. Request that this headquarters be advised as to whether it is possible to effect the enlistment of this citizen of the United States into the Army.
