1. Section I, War Department Circular 345, 1944, provides for the award of a Meritorious Service Unit Plaque, with accompanying sleeve insignia by a commander of the grade of major general or higher.

2. The circular does not require that similar awards now in existence be superseded. However, it is considered that only one service unit award should be granted a unit for a given period.

3. The Commanding Generals, Fifth Army, Seventh Army, Sixth Army Group, SOS NATOUSA, AAF/MTD and Replacement Command, NATOUSA will establish procedures governing such awards within their respective commands. For this purpose the Replacement Command, NATOUSA is considered the appropriate command of a major general.

4. Commanders listed in paragraph 3, above will, as soon as practicable, forward an estimate of requirements to Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA for meritorious services performed during the period shown:

1. I wish to express my appreciation for the highly commendable cooperation rendered the 6713th Blood Transfusion Unit by many of the organizations and individuals of Peninsular Base Section.

2. At the present moment, with our brothers-in-arms engaged in a great offensive to crush the Nazi military might, there is a more imperative necessity than ever before for a continuous flow of donations to the blood bank for the front-line fighting troops. Many allied lives must be sacrificed to attain final victory, but many of these lives can be saved by keeping the reserve supply of whole blood built up to its peak of effectiveness, and the blood bank is totally dependent upon voluntary contributions.

3. Every member of Peninsular Base Section with "O" type blood is urged to enroll immediately for blood contributions. Organizations are asked to list all "O" type volunteers and submit their names to the 6713th Blood Transfusion Unit at the 15th Medical General Laboratory, telephone Variety 154-R-2, which will arrange a time and place for receiving donations.

1. The following paraphrased personal radiogram dated 11 March 1944, received from General H. M. Wilson, Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean Theater, is published for the information of all concerned:

"To all concerned: please convey my congratulations on the success achieved in forwarding supplies to the beachhead. For the 4 days ending March 9 the average of ~~over~~ tons and a final figure of ~~over~~ tons on March 10 is a magnificent achievement and reflects the greatest credit on the skill and determination upon which these vital operations are being conducted."

2. Tonnages of supplies forwarded to and unloaded at the beachhead subsequent to March 10 have continued at the same high level attained during the preceding five days.

3. The Commanding General desires to convey his personal appreciation for this excellent accomplishment which reflects great credit upon the Peninsular Base Section.
