1. Effective 1 February 1945 the new Morning Report Form (WD AGO Form 1) dated 1 May 1944 will be used by all units in this theater instead of Headquarters Morning Reports Form 1 and Company Morning Report Form 2.

2. This new form will be prepared in accordance with AR 345-400 dated 1 May 1944, and changes thereto as supplemented by letter, this headquarters, reference 330.33/430 A-D, 26 September 1944, subject: "Morning Reports".

3. A single Morning Report will be prepared for the Headquarters and Headquarters Company when organized under the same table of organization.

4. New Morning Report forms may be requisitioned as at present from the AG Depot, Penbase South, APO 782.

1. GENERAL

a. Initial and Final Rosters, Morning Reports, Special and General Orders are the basic source documents used to report changes in status of personnel and organizations to Machine Records Units and The Adjutant General. These basic records serve to bring status, location and strength files up-to-date and serve as a record of events for the history of an organization.

b. The accuracy and correctness of serial numbers, spelling of names and reporting of basic status (assigned, attached unassigned or attached from other organization) is of vital importance and every precaution must be exercised in reporting aforementioned data to machine records units, because mechanical processes involved in machine records accounting depends upon correct serial numbers and name-spelling. Cases of incorrect serial numbers, misspelled names and inaccurate basic status, as reported to machine records units, cause undue delay in the preparation of reports for the War Department and higher echelons, and in many instances require needless correspondence with units serviced.

c. The preparation and submission of Morning Reports is governed by AF 340-400, changes thereto, and instructions authorized in this theater of operations as outlined in the following paragraphs of this memorandum. All general or special orders should be so phrased as to conform with the requirements of this letter.

2. REQUIREMENTS

a. Day, month and year will be entered in the appropriate spaces to indicate the effective date of the report. 1275

b. The designation of the reporting unit or headquarters will be entered on the appropriate line and will be exactly as shown in the designation of the Table of Organization, Manning Table, or other War Department authority under which the headquarters or unit is operating.

c. The station of the reporting unit at the end of the Morning Report day will be entered. The station will be indicated by using the actual location with coordinates, i.e., name of the nearest town or city (foreign spelling will be used). APO will not be used.

d. Column headed "Code" is for the use of Machine Records, and will be left blank.

e. Manning Report will be authenticated with the full signature of the officer signing the report.

3. DEFINITIONS

a. Assigned. An individual is reported as assigned when he fills a position vacancy authorized by a Table of Organization, manning table, or other War Department or Theater authority under which the headquarters or unit is operating.

b. Attached unassigned. An individual will be reported as attached unassigned when he is not accounted for in the strength of any other unit and is not assigned as defined in paragraph 3 a. above. Current theater policy authorizes this status only in replacement organizations and to personnel who are unassigned in a hospital detachment of patients.

c. Attached from other organizations. An individual will be reported as attached from another organization when he becomes attached to the reporting organization for duty and/or administration, but remains as an assigned or attached unassigned member of another organization and is included in the strength of the latter organization.

d. Special duty. An individual is on special duty when performing duty for another unit and reporting daily to the unit to which assigned, attached unassigned or attached from another organization. Individuals on special duty will be carried as present for duty in the strength section on the Manning Report of the unit to which assigned, attached unassigned, or attached from other organizations.

e. Detached service. An individual will be reported on detached service when performing duty for, and being administered by an organization other than that to which assigned or attached unassigned. When an officer is placed on detached service it will be indicated as to whether or not the officer has been relieved of his duties. This must be done in order to prevent reporting two officers performing the same duties. Written orders must be published placing the individual on detached service.

f. Temporary duty. An individual is on temporary duty when absent from the unit or station of assignment performing duty incident to regular duties within the purposes for which the organization of assignment has been established, and being administered by the organization to which assigned or attached unassigned. Temporary duty will not be converted to detached service except upon issuance of proper orders.

4. REMARKS

a. Each and every time an individual's name is reported on a Manning Report, the last name, first name, middle initial, Army serial number and grade will be shown in the order indicated under the appropriate headings.

b. Arm or Service will be shown each and every time an officer's name is reported on the Morning Report. The Arm or Service for enlisted men will be shown only when it differs from that of the reporting unit.

c. When an individual's basic status is attached unassigned, or attached from another organization, the basic status will be shown in parenthesis before the remark each and every time that the individual's name is reported on the Morning Report.

d. Remarks reporting personnel gained as assigned or attached unassigned, will include:

- (1) Full name of individual.
- (2) Military occupational specialty code number (officers, TM-12-406 or TM-12-407; enlisted men, TM-12-427). (Air Force, A.A.F. Manual No. 35-1, Military Personnel Classification and Duty Assignment).
- (3) Statement that the individual is assigned or attached unassigned.
- (4) Whether the individual has joined the organization.
- (5) If not joined, the reason not joined.
- (6) Unit from which transferred.
- (7) Duty of each individual. When not known, a statement will be made on the Morning Report that information will be submitted when available. Use same codes as for military occupational specialty.
- (8) Date of current grade (officers only).
- (9) Listed service, when applicable.
- (10) Race.
- (11) Component (officers only).
- (12) Arm or Service.
- (13) Authority (headquarters, special orders number and paragraph number).
- (14) Main civilian occupation (officers, TM-12-406; enlisted men, AR 615-28 or TM-12-425).

e. Remarks reporting individual attached from other organization, will include:

- (1) Statement that the individual is attached and name of organizations to which assigned or attached unassigned.
- (2) Whether the individual has joined the organization.
- (3) If not joined, the reason not joined.
- (4) Purpose of attachment.
- (5) Duty, if known, at time of attachment.
- (6) Date of current grade (officers only).

f. Remarks reporting personnel relieved from assignment or attachment, will include:

- (1) Statement that individual is relieved from assigned, attached unassigned, or attached from another organization.
- (2) Statement indicating unit to which transferred or returned, as attached or assigned.
- (3) Arm or Service.
- (4) If the individual has not departed, reason not departed and status.
- (5) Authority (headquarters, special order and paragraph number), Section III, par. 14, AR 345-400.

g. In the case of units attached to another unit for administration, the names of individuals will not be listed on the Morning Report of the unit to which attached. A separate Morning Report will be prepared for such units. Personnel of units so attached will not be included in the strength section of the Morning Report of the unit to which attached.

h. Remarks pertaining to special duty will not be entered on any Morning Report. (See par. 4 d)

i. Remarks reporting personnel on detached service will include:

- (1) Statement that individual is ordered to detached service.
- (2) Organization where detached service is to be performed.
- (3) Statement indicating relief from principal duty, if applicable.
- (4) For return from detached service, the organization where detached service has been performed.

(5) Authority (headquarters, special order number and paragraph number).

j. An individual absent on temporary duty will be reported on the Morning Report of the unit of assignment and will be accounted for as absent in the strength section.

k. An individual on temporary duty with an organization and present at the close of the Morning Report day, will be reported as attached for rations and quarters only.

5. RECORD OF EVENTS

a. The Record of Events consists of basic data from which the history of the organization is compiled. The following are changes that would affect the status of an organization:

- (1) Activations.
- (2) Reorganizations.
- (3) Redesignations.
- (4) Inactivations (including disbandments).

b. One of the above-mentioned changes in paragraph 5 a, the following information is necessary and will be entered on the front side of the Morning Report: immediately following the last remark, the heading "Record of Events" will be used. This will also be accompanied by a copy of the order authorizing such changes.

- (1) Organization designation (for redesignation include and identify both old and new designation).
- (2) T/O number and date and last change number.
- (3) Race (enlisted/ser).
- (4) Authorized strength by type of personnel--officers, warrant officers, nurses, enlisted men, etc., total.
- (5) Date of action.
- (6) Authority of action.
- (7) Detailed explanation for variation, if any, between actual strength and T/O strength.

c. An initial Morning Report for a newly-activated organization will be prepared on the day personnel actually join the organization either as assigned, attached unassigned or attached from other organization. Record of Events will include:

- (1) If the organization was activated on a date previous to the date personnel actually joined, a statement to that effect will be made.
- (2) A statement to the effect that the Morning Report containing the above information is the first Morning Report submitted by that organization.

d. Whenever an organization is inactivated or disbanded, or in any way loses the identity under which Morning Reports were submitted, except through redesignation, the authority therefore will be entered in the record of events of the final Morning Report and the following statement will include: "No personnel assigned, attached unassigned, or attached from other organizations effective _____."

(hour)

- (1) When an organization is temporarily depleted of all personnel but the organization is not inactivated, the Morning Report will include the above statement. Morning Reports will be submitted for organizations for which no personnel is assigned, attached unassigned or attached from other organizations.
- (2) When an organization is redesignated the final Morning Report will be submitted as of 2400 hours under the old designation. The final Morning Report submitted under the old designation, and the initial Morning Report submitted under the new designation will show the necessary information as listed in paragraph 5 b, above.

e. Morning Reports for detachments. Personnel of detachments will be carried as individuals on detached service. Personnel of platoons or sections which are organized under Tables of Organizations will be carried by the parent organization as individuals on detached service, unless the platoons or sections are attached to another organization, in which case a separate Morning Report will be submitted.

f. Garrison prisoners. Garrison prisoners on duty with disciplinary training centers will be shown on the Morning Report as attached and as absent from the parent organization.

g. General prisoners. General prisoners will be transferred to a disciplinary training center, as designated in the court-martial order published after the prisoner has been convicted and sentence declared, and will be assigned to the prison detachment as attached unassigned.

h. The foregoing instructions under paragraph 5, "Record of Events", also apply to detachments, platoons, sections, lots, etc., operating alone and submitting a Morning Report.

6. STRENGTH

a. Gains and losses as well as basic status changes and changes in grade, will be substantiated by corresponding changes in the strength section. All changes in strength section will be substantiated by entries in the remarks section. Computation of strength totals for the current day will be made by adding gains and subtracting losses from the Morning Report strength of the previous day. All personnel assigned, attached unassigned and attached from other organizations will be shown either as present, present not for duty or absent (note exceptions) without regard to basic status.

b. Personnel will be considered present for duty:

- (1) When present and performing duty.
- (2) When capable of performing duty but authorized by competent authority, without formal leave or furlough, to be temporarily absent, i.e., verbal orders of commanding officer.
- (3) Enlisted personnel on pass for not more than three (3) days.

c. Personnel will be considered as present not for duty when not capable of performing duty but present with the organization, i.e., enlisted personnel in arrest in quarters or sick in quarters.

d. Personnel will be considered as absent:

- (1) When authorized formal leave or furlough.
- (2) Personnel sick in hospital on or off the post or in confinement on or off the post, other than in quarters.
- (3) Personnel on detached service and temporary duty.
- (4) Personnel AWOL (see MATOUSA Circular 36, dated 17 March 1947)

7. ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES, THIS THEATER

a. Units arriving or departing will attach one (1) copy of their movement orders to the Morning Report and indicate under Record of Events the shipment number of the organization and number of convoy on which arrived in this theater, and will forward same to Machine Records Unit servicing the base section or staging area where unit arrived or staged prior to departure from this Theater.

b. Hospitals in this Theater which evacuate personnel outside this Theater for further hospitalization, without the personnel being processed through a replacement installation, will attach a copy of the special order authorizing the evacuation to the Morning Report and forward it to the Machine Records Unit servicing the hospital.

c. Personnel arriving by air who by-pass a replacement installation, will be picked up on the Morning Report of the Headquarters reporting to. In addition to what is required in accordance with AR 340-400, the following information will be shown: Unit designation, shipment number, mode of travel, date of arrival, Theater from which personnel was furnished, strength of personnel by officers, flight officers, nurses, enlisted men, and total.

d. Personnel departing from this Theater by air, who are to by-pass a replacement installation, will be shown on the Morning Report as departing for the United States, indicating unit designation and date of departure. Shipment number will not be required as personnel departing this Theater by air only receive air priority without shipment number.

9. DISPOSITION

a. Transfer and details (officers only). When an officer is transferred or detailed to an Arm or Service as defined in AR 605-145, the fact of transfer or detail will be reported. Remarks will include:

- (1) Statement indicating transfer or detail.
- (2) The Arm or Service to which detailed or transferred.
- (3) Authority for transfer or detail.

b. General or limited assignment. A record of change from or to general or limited assignment for each individual will be made to include the previous and present designation.

c. Changes of military occupational specialty. A Record of changes of military occupational specialty code will be made. Remarks will include:

- (1) Military occupational specialty title and code before change.
- (2) Statement of changes indicating new military occupational specialty.

d. Changes of principal duty. A record of the assignment to, change, or relief from principal duty will be made for officers and enlisted men. An officer can be assigned to only one principal duty. Any other duty which runs concurrently is considered additional. When an officer performs two or more duties, only the principal duty will be reported, except when the additional duty involves command. Remarks will include:

- (1) Statement of duty assignment, change or relief.
- (2) Whether principal or additional command duty (officers only).
- (3) Description of duty and duty code.

d. Classification of Morning Reports. "Morning Reports originating in combat zones and Centers of Operations are to be classified restricted. A higher classification will be established by appropriate authority when warranted by the information contained in these reports". (Authority: Information Circular, The Inspector General's Office, Washington, D. C., dated October 1943. Memorandum No. 3345-24-43, TAC, 11 September 1943).

e. Corrections. To correct a remark on a previous Morning Report, the word "CORRECTION" (in capital letters) will precede the remarks correcting an error, followed by the date of the Morning Report on which the erroneous remark appeared. The complete erroneous remark will then be stated, followed by the correct information and prefaced by the words "SHOULD BE" (in capital letters).

- (1) Under no circumstances, except in case of correction of a final report of an inactivated or disbanded unit, will a corrected copy of a Morning Report be forwarded to the Machine Records Unit to replace a Morning Report previously submitted. All corrections will be made in the above manner.

f. Morning Reports will be dispatched daily by the most expeditious means available.

g. The foregoing supersedes letter this headquarters, file AG 330.33/400-S, dated 29 July 1943, subject: "Adoption of New Morning Reports"

1. All units of this formation will submit casualties in respect of Italian Military Personnel, on their strength, to this office in precisely the same way as for British personnel i.e. on A.C.C. Form R.3. This form, when used to submit these casualties, will be clearly marked "ITALIAN".
2. Casualties in respect of Italian Military Personnel will include Births, Marriages, Deaths, Change of Location, Sickness, Battle Accidents, Battle Casualties, Punishments, Awards, Absences and Next of Kin, etc.
3. All casualties will be rendered immediately they occur.
4. It is most important that the correct matriculation number of Italian personnel is quoted in every case.
5. This does not apply to Carabinieri.

SUBJECT: Returns.

TO : V.P. Admin. Section
V.P. Economic Section.

1. Several letters have recently been received from Regional Commissioners complaining of the number of returns asked for by this Headquarters. The difficulties experienced by Regional and Provincial Staffs in compiling the various returns and reports asked for from this Headquarters is fully understood and it is the constant concern of this Section to endeavour to regulate and control returns, so as to cut down the number to the minimum.
2. There are however two distinct approaches to this question. The administration of this country calls for certain information, often detailed, which must be supplied to enable that administration to be carried on. Requests for much of this information originates from higher formations, often from the Combined Chief of Staff, Washington. On the other hand the collation of this information takes up a great deal of time of the Regional Commissioners, who with their diminished staffs, are finding increasing difficulties in complying with requests made upon them. As much as possible of the detailed collection of such information should be, and is, passed on to the Italian officials but the supervision required to obtain the efficient compliance of these officials entails nearly as much work as compiling the returns themselves.
3. I should be grateful if Administrative and Economic Sections would continue to coordinate and scrutinise all such demands with this object in view.
