OFFICE MEMORANDUM:

SUBJECT: Soviet Member of A.C.C.

1. Major General MEDVED SOLDOVNIK, an appointed Soviet Member on the A.C.C. and her office in Room 37 Evacuata Building, Naples. Senior Lieutenant MIKHAIL GOLUBEV is his aide.

2. Major Sir Philip Magnus will not be conducting officer to Major General Solodovnik.

3. Major General Solodovnik is attached to the Commission in a consultative capacity. He will attend the periodical meetings of Vice Presidents. He will work on the Vice President's and Director level. If he or any member of his staff wishes to contact any person outside that level, he will request either the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner) or the Vice President or Director, concerned accordingly.

4. If General Solodovnik or his aide wishes to contact any regional or other headquarters or office or to leave Naples he will refer his request for arrangements to be made for his tour or visit, to the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner) through the Secretary-General.

5. At the discretion of Vice Presidents, Directors or Chiefs of independent sub-commissions, copies of reports and correspondence which they consider of interest to General Solodovnik will be forwarded daily to the Secretary-General, for onward submission to the conducting officer.

6. No unparaphrased copies of telegrams will be circulated to Major General Solodovnik. The conducting officer will be informed by the Secretary-General of any important telegrams and will either inform Major General Solodovnik verbally of their contents or prepare a paraphrase for him.

7. The conducting officer will arrange for the following channels of official correspondence to be available to Major General Solodovnik:

a. With Advisory Council - through the Secretary-General and the Political Section.

He will not go to the Vice President's and Director level. If he or any member of his staff wishes to contact any person outside that level, he will request either the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner) or the Vice President or Director concerned accordingly.

4. If General Solodovnik or his aide wishes to contact any regional or other headquarters or office or to leave Naples he will refer his request for arrangements to be made for his tour or visit, to the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner) through the Secretary-General.

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7. The conducting officer will arrange for the following channels of official correspondence to be available to Major General Solodovnik:

a. With Advisory Council - through the Secretary-General and the Political Section.

b. With higher Russian authorities - through the Secretary-General, thence to AFHQ (MOS).

c. With M. Vichinsky, in Russian cipher if desired, direct or through AFHQ (MOS) for onward transmission to M. Vichinsky (authority C. in c. 1439 cable 4411).

selected to represent the Soviet Union on the
Allied Control Commission.

2. This representation no doubt refers to the Soviet
