SUBJECT: Establishment of Currency (United States) Destruction Committee

TO : All Concerned.

1. Pursuant to authority contained in War Department letter dated 1 May 1944, file AGOB-P 123.1 (28 April 1944), a Currency (United States) Destruction Committee is appointed consisting of a representative from each of the following Sections:

Fiscal Director, NATOUA
Judge Advocate General, NATOUA
Inspector General, NATOUA

And the Senior United States Treasury Representative.

2. The committee will meet at the call of the Fiscal Director, NATOUA, to accept, examine, and destroy, such United States Currency as is no longer fit for circulation in accordance with instructions of the United States Treasury.

3. The necessary instructions to accomplish destruction will be furnished United States Army Disbursing Officers and members of the committee by the Fiscal Director.

1. Information has been received from The Adjutant General that an examination for appointment as 1st Lieutenant, Medical Corps, Regular Army, will be held, under provisions of AR 605-20, in this theater from 24 to 27 January 1944, inclusive.

2. To be eligible for the examination an applicant must be:

a. A male citizen of the United States whose age at the time of examination is between the ages 22 9/12 and 31 9/12 years.

b. Graduate of an acceptable medical school legally authorized to confer the degree of doctor of medicine, and must have had at least one (1) year's hospital training in an approved hospital subsequent to the completion of a four (4) year course of instruction in such medical school, or its equivalent in practical professional experience, as determined by The Surgeon General in each case.

3. Applications will be forwarded through military channels to this headquarters so as to arrive not later than 15 December 1943. Applications will be prepared on TD AG Form No. 62 (Application for Commission in the Regular Army), and will be accompanied by:

a. Evidence of citizenship if the applicant is of foreign birth.

b. A recent photograph of the applicant, head and shoulders type, of not less than 4 x 5 inches.

c. Certificates based upon personal acquaintance from at least three reputable persons as to citizenship, character, and habits.

d. A complete statement of military service.

e. Evidence of completion of at least one year's hospital training in an approved hospital subsequent to the completion of a four year course of instruction in such medical school, or its equivalent in practical professional experience.

f. The names of medical schools attended, date of graduation, post-graduate work completed, and time spent in the practice of medicine.

4. Boards of officers will be appointed by this Headquarters within the several separate commands and base sections to conduct the examination.
