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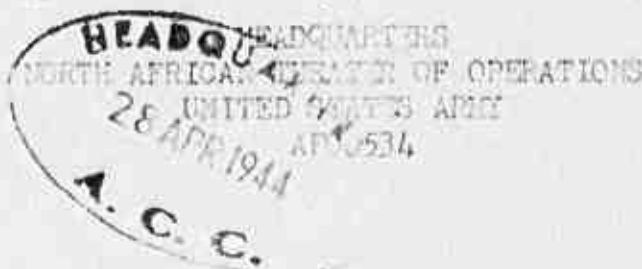

SUBJECT: Self-Teaching Materials.

TO: Assistant Adjutant, HQ, Allied Military Gov, APO 394,
U. S. Army.

1. Under recent ruling of the War Department, self-teaching texts are distributed to individuals on the same basis as all Armed Forces Institute correspondence courses. Enrollment blanks, WD AI Form 1, must be made out and forwarded to this headquarters with a money order for \$2.00 made payable to the Treasurer of the United States.

- a. If the individual concerned is already enrolled with the Armed Forces Institute, he must so state on the enrollment form. In such instances an additional \$2.00 fee is not required.
- b. Enrollment carries with it the opportunity for an "End of Course Test" and "Accreditation Service" which will help the individual to get school or college credit for the work completed.
- c. Officers are permitted to enroll for self-teaching courses by payment of \$2.00 for each subject. In addition, they must pay a \$2.00 fee for accreditation and examination service for each subject.

2. Under additional ruling of the War Department, self-teaching materials may be issued for group instruction without payment of fees. The order for material must be accompanied by a signed statement from the officer redistributing the material, or the officer directing the issue of the material to the effect that it is to be used for group instruction.

- a. A group is defined as not less than five (5) individuals.
- b. All members of groups are advised to enroll as outlined in par. 1. No "End of Course" Test or "Accreditation Service" can be secured without enrollment.
