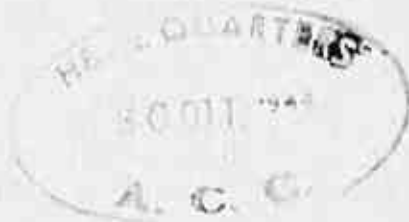
The following, from Army School of Education (CMF), through HQ

SUBJECT: Education Post-Armistice Policy

1. The prospect of a cessation of hostilities in Europe, though it may not immediately materialize, does, nevertheless, raise the problem, soon to confront Commanders and Commanders of Officers, of the provision of amenities for troops under their command, e.g., Entertainment, Welfare, Education and the policy of constructive "time-killing" aimed, once the initial and general change over has been made from present conditions to those of an Armistice.

2. The adage "The Devil finds work for Idle Hands to do" is unfortunately not always considered with the degree of thought it warrants. Planning for Welfare and Entertainment therefore remains its importance but the subject of this letter - Education - must take priority in the minds of unit commanders more than it has done in the past.

3. To this end a series of Courses for Unit Education Officers or their Deputies are now commencing at the Army School of Education, PERUGIA. Courses are of 15 days duration.

4. It is the Army policy to ensure that vacancies allotted are filled and that every unit is capable of meeting its responsibilities to its men in the reconstruction and rehabilitation that will follow the cessation of hostilities, during the period of mental readjustment.

5. Commanding Officers will shortly be allotted vacancies for Officers and Other Ranks of these Courses, which will have to be accepted in spite of all difficulties that now exist due to the manpower situation.

6. Commanding Officers must accept the fact now, that surrender of vacancies for Educational Courses will not be permitted and that candidates are urgently and necessarily required to attend these Courses.

7. All units should at once review their internal situation and earmark, where necessary, suitable officers to act as Unit Education Officers together with likely NCOs and CJs to fill such vacancies as may be allotted.

5. Commanding Officers will shortly be allotted vacancies for Officers and Other Ranks of these Courses, which will have to be accepted in spite of all difficulties that now exist due to the manpower situation.

6. Commanding Officers must accept the fact now, that surrender of vacancies for Educational Courses will not be permitted and that candidates are urgently and necessarily required to attend these Courses.

7. All units should at once review their internal situation and, where necessary, suitable officers to act as Unit Education Officers together with likely NCOs and CJs to fill such vacancies as may be allotted.

8. The fact is stressed, that putting off until tomorrow that which is due today will not help either units or the prestige of the British Forces in occupied countries. Therefore, to assist units by extending as much notice as possible, the undermentioned procedure will be adopted:-

(a) Unit Education Officers and potential Unit Education Officers will be earmarked now for Courses at the Army School of Education, PERUGIA.

(b) Units will submit dates or approximate periods most suitable for the acceptance of vacancies allotted.

(c) Dates and approximate periods suitable will be advised to this Headquarters NOT LATER THAN 8 Oct 46.

9. The cooperation of Commanding Officers in this matter is at this time of great national importance.

1. ALLIED FORCE LOCAL RESOURCES (ITALIAN) BOARD:

The following is extracted from adm Circular #1, Local Resources Section, AFHQ, adv adm Echelon, dated 12 January 1944, for the information of all concerned:

"In accordance with para 2(b) AFHQ, adv adm Echelon, adm Order # 2 of 2 January 1944, the Allied Force Local Resources (Italian) Board is instructed to notify that the following fruits and vegetables may be purchased in unrestricted quantities by individuals and Messes, subject to the official prices not being exceeded:

(a) In the Compartments of APULIA, LUCANIA, CALABRIA, and CAMPANIA

CARROTS	CALIFLOWERS
CELERY	TURNIPS
LEMONS	NUTS OF ALL KINDS

(b) In 15 Army Group, excluding any part of CAMPANIA - all fruits and vegetables other than

POTATOES
ONIONS
CABBAGES

The following may not be purchased by Messes in APULIA, LUCANIA and CAMPANIA, but individual officers and men may buy for their personal consumption quantities not exceeding 2 Kg. in any one week -

Efforts are being made to get all WD AGO Forms 56-1 cards in order prior to departure of any officer from this headquarters. It will be impossible to get these cards completed if officers continually enter the Personnel Office to make inquiries concerning their cards. Request that no further inquiries be made regarding these cards at the present time. (AG Pers)

6. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR ITALIAN ROUTES 7-2 & 67 (U.S. ROUTES "P" and "E"):

The following is extracted from Circular # 10, Hq PMS, dated 15 January 1944, for information and guidance of all concerned:

" The above routes serve the majority of PMS Installations and constitute the major highway links between the Base Section and installations within the Army Area.

Traffic conditions on these routes are such that all existing interferences must be minimized as a consequence of which the following restrictions are imposed effective upon installations of appropriate signs on said routes.

a. All hand and animal-drawn vehicles, as well as bicycles, are prohibited from using these routes between points as follows:

(1) Italian Route 7-2 (U.S. Route "P"): From junction at Via Roma to Army Rear Boundary 2 miles north of Aversa.

(2) Italian Route 67 (U.S. Route "E"): From junction of Italian Route 7-2 (U.S. Route "P") at La Rotonda northward through Casoria to Army Rear Boundary south of Caserta.

b. Crossing of these highways by vehicles which are prohibited from moving thereon is authorized to permit said vehicles to reach secondary roads leading to their objectives.

c. All traffic entering these highways between the points in question will come to a full stop and give right-of-way to vehicles operating along subject routes as indicated by standard type signs." (AG)
