1. Reference is made to War Department Circular 214, dated 15 September 1943. Chief of Special Service Section, this headquarters, in collaboration with Director, Special Service Division, Army Service Forces, will conduct a series of Soldier Show conferences, according to the following itinerary:

IV. Casablanca	24, 25, 26 January 1945	Headquarters, 1260th AAF Base Unit, NAFL, ATC, APO 396
V. Florence-Leghorn Area:	(To be announced later)	

2. The purpose of these conferences is to instruct conferees, by demonstration and dramatization, in every phase of soldier show organization and production, including presentation of colorful shows with little preparation and improvised equipment.

3. Each command will designate unit representatives, on detached service for entire conference period, to attend one of these conferences, as follows:

a. Each unit down to and including regiment, group, separate battalion, or similar unit: 1 Officer and 2 enlisted men.

b. Each company, squadron, or similar unit, with strength of 100 men or more: 1 enlisted man.

c. Tactical or other units engaged in combat operations may defer attendance of representatives, but will report same to this headquarters, to permit provision for supplementary field conferences, to be announced later.

SUBJECT: Theater-Wide Athletic Competitions.

TO : All Concerned.

1. A Theater Basketball Championship for all American forces, both Army and Navy, is announced. Finals will be held 20 March to 25 March 1945.

2. The theater is divided into four (4) zones for the semi-final playoffs as follows:

a. North Africa Zone. This embraces all United States Army forces in North Africa, including North African Division, Air Transport Command; Mediterranean Base Section; and United States Navy personnel, including Naval Operations Base, Oran; Eighth Amphibious Force, Bizerte; Commander, Moroccan Sea Frontier; and Naval Operations Base, Casablanca; Fleet Air Wing 15, Port Lyautey; Naval Air Station, Port Lyautey; Naval Air Facilities, Agadir; Eighth Fleet Salvage Base, Dellys, Algeria; and Naval Detachment, Algiers. The zone championships will be conducted by Commander-in-Chief, Eighth United States Fleet.

b. Tyrrhenian Zone. This embraces all United States Army forces in Sicily, Sardinia, Corsica and Peninsular, and United States Naval forces, (including Naval Detachment, Naples), in vicinity of Peninsular. The zone championships will be conducted by Commanding Officer, Peninsular Base Section.

c. North Italy Zone. This embraces all United States Army forces in Peninsular Base Section, Rome Area; TOUSA; Fifth Army Area; and all United States Naval forces in vicinity of Peninsular Base Section. Zone championships will be conducted by Commanding General, Twelfth Air Force.

d. Adriatic Zone. This embraces all United States Army forces east of the Apennines, including Adriatic Depot and elements of Twelfth and Fifteenth Air Forces. All United States Naval forces in the Adriatic are included. The zone championships will be conducted by Commanding General, Fifteenth Air Force.

3. Commanders conducting zone championships will be responsible for inclusion of and coordination with all United States forces in the zone. Direct communication with all forces concerned is authorized, in connection with determination of championship.

4. Rules of play are those set forth in TM 21-220 "Sports and Games". The Theater championship will be a double elimination tournament. Site of theater finals will be announced later. Prizes will be awarded theater champions.

5. Teams in Theater finals will be limited to ten (10) players, and one (1) officer or coach in charge of the zone team. All competition will be by unit teams which have played a complete schedule, and not by all-star teams. Zone champion teams will be certified on or before 1 March 1945, to this headquarters, by cable, giving names of team members.

6. Necessary travel for zone and theater finals is authorized.

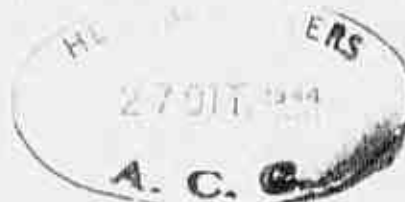

1. Attention is invited to the authority for the NATCUSA Branch, Armed Forces Institute, contained in AR 350-3100, 30 July 1943, and NATCUSA General Order Number 81, 1944.

2. Commanding officers will actively promote all services of the NATCUSA Branch, Armed Forces Institute to the end that:

a. All personnel will be informed of their rights and opportunities as set forth in this letter, and references cited herein.

b. Counseling service will be provided to assist enrollees in the selection of study programs, and the satisfactory compliance with enrollment procedures.

3. The provisions of Section III, WD Circular 377, 18 September 1944, which refer to Education will generally apply in this theater except as set forth herein:

a. Enrollment procedure in USAFI Correspondence and Self-Teaching Courses will be as described in the NATCUSA Branch Catalog, First Edition, October 1944 and the fees, when required, will be paid by individual \$2.00 money orders made payable to the Treasurer of the United States drawn on the Postmaster, Washington, D. C.

b. The procedure for requisitioning of textbooks and educational materials for group study will be as stated in NATCUSA Branch Catalog, First Edition, October 1944.

c. Sample self-teaching texts may be furnished upon receipt of approved requisitions which indicate use to be made of the texts.

d. Reference libraries of fifteen (15) copies each of self-teaching texts may be furnished general hospitals upon approved requisitions which indicate that the Information and Education Officers request their issuance for this purpose.

4. The USAFI Catalog (2d Edition) Madison, Wisconsin, will be issued as it arrives in this theater and will be distributed to Information and Education Officers for reference use.

1. Ref this Headquarters AG 353.5 dated 30 Sep 44 which called for return from all Allied Units and Sub Units of the strength by type of Italian Police employed.

2. Due to operational exigencies which cannot be over-ruled or avoided, all Carabinieri, Metropolitan and Finance Guards will be withdrawn from all Allied installations in Rome Allied Area Command to which they are now assigned, with the exception of certain establishments already and separately nominated.

3. The establishments referred to are, in the main, Embassies and Diplomatic Missions to which Police Guards are allocated as an international obligation by the Country to which they are accredited.

4. Date of withdrawal will be advised later.

Letter this headquarters, AG 353/531 A-0, dated 5 May 1944, subject, "Parachute Training"; as amended by letter AG 353/531 A-0, dated 3 July 1944, subject, "Parachute Training"; letter AG 353/531-P, dated 31 July 1944, subject, "Parachute Training"; and letter AG 353/036 A-0 dated 2 August 1944, subject, "Parachute Training", is rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

2. Officers and enlisted men of this theater who desire to volunteer for training and duty with Paratroopers may make written application to the Commanding Officer, Airborne Training Center, through military channels.

3. Qualifications

- a. Age. Officers: Not more than 32 years old.
Enlisted Men: Not more than 30 years old.
- b. Grade. Officers, other than Medical Corps: Not higher than 1st Lieutenant.
Officers, Medical Corps: Not higher than captain.
- c. Weight. Not more than 185 pounds nor less than 135 pounds. Waivers may be granted in special cases.
- d. Height. Not more than 74 inches nor less than 66 inches.
- e. SERVICE. A minimum of 1 year.
- f. Physical Condition. A generally excellent physical condition and a rugged physique.
- g. Character and Efficiency. A character rating of excellent and an efficiency rating of not less than very satisfactory.
- h. Disciplinary Record. A record of no convictions by courts-martial.

4. Applications. Applications will be approved or disapproved by commanders of major commands and disposed of as follows. In the case of units assigned to this headquarters or to Allied Force Headquarters, action will be taken by brigade and commanders of corresponding units.

a. Approved applications will be forwarded direct to the Commanding Officer, Airborne Training Center.

- (6) Records of no courts-martial convictions.
- (7) Character rating of excellent. Efficiency rating of very satisfactory or better.
- (8) Possess a rugged physique and generally excellent physical condition.
- (9) Officers qualifications will generally be the same as for enlisted men except in age limits. 2d Lieutenants will not exceed 29 years of age, 1st Lieutenants, 30 years of age, captains, 30 years of age, and field officers, 32 years of age.

b. A physical examination taken at time of application and completed in TD AGO Form 53, will be included with the application for parachute training.
