5. SUPPLY TRAINING:

The following is extracted from letter, Hq Serv 2455 Supply, NATOUSA, file 400-GEN-GEN (SSEX), subject: Supply Training, dated 12 January 1944, for the information of the Commanding General concerned.

"In recognition of the importance of supply discipline in troop units, the War Department has initiated action to emphasize this subject in training, and has requested the cooperation of overseas commanders in developing increased supply discipline. In this connection, reference is made to War Department letter dated 14 December 1943, subject: "Supply Training", file AG400 (7 Dec 43) OB-5-2-M, which was reproduced and distributed to all major commands in this theater by Headquarters NATOUSA.

In the accomplishment of the grave mission with which it is charged, the War Department is obliged to fill the real needs of the several theaters of operations with promptness geared to the speed of modern warfare, and at the same time so effectively to employ the resources at its disposal that irreparable damage to the economy affecting every citizen will not occur. It is considered the duty of every uniformed member of this Command to keep faith with the officers and men of the Army elsewhere in the world by practicing rigid economy in the use of United States property.

Daily Bulletin # 20, dated 20 Jan 1944 (Par 5 cont'd)

It is directed that the training and operation of all elements of this command be conducted in such manner that supply discipline is not only repeatedly stressed in training, but also rigidly enforced in practice. Inspectors General will be directed to make appropriate inspections and investigations in this connection." (AG)
