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FOREWORD

1. When a federal agency ships government-owned materials or equipment by rail freight, rail express, air express, motor freight or inland waterway and such means of transportation are privately owned, the government and the private owner (known as a "commercial carrier") jointly execute a transportation agreement. Such an agreement, known as a U. S. Government Bill of Lading, further provides the means for the commercial carrier to be paid the amount of transportation charges due him after delivery and acceptance of the shipment at destination.

2. Under present conditions, the War Department uses a greater number of U. S. Government Bills of Lading than any other agency of the Government. Its Transportation Officers stationed in its numerous offices and field installations are issuing these documents in a volume heretofore unequalled. Under such conditions, it became apparent that all activities in connection with the preparation, distribution and use of bill of lading forms should be studied for the purpose of:

- a. Modernizing the forms to meet present day requirements;
- b. Printing the forms in such manner as to expedite preparation;
- c. By reason of a and b above, expediting the movements of materials and payments of transportation charges to commercial carriers; and
- d. Standardizing the distribution and use of copies of bills of lading to avoid an unnecessary waste of paper, manpower and office equipment.

The necessary studies have been made. The results are announced in this manual, together with such revised instructions as are considered necessary to achieve the objectives desired.

3. On 17 April 1943 the Comptroller General of the United States issued General Regulation No. 97 in which revisions in bill-of-lading forms were announced, including the creation of two new forms to be included in sets of bill-of-lading forms prepared, viz: U. S. Government Freight Waybill—Original (Standard Form No. 1105) and U. S. Government Freight Waybill—Carrier's Copy (Standard Form No. 1106). The simultaneous preparation of bills of lading and waybills offers many advantages, chief among which are: (a) the elimination of the necessity for the carrier to prepare waybills as a separate operation, and (b) at destination, the consignee and carrier have at hand the "original" waybill as a source of accurate information in the event the original bill of lading has not been received.

4. Subsequent to the receipt of General Regulation No. 97 the War Department, through the Chief of Transportation, arranged to procure the majority of its needs for government bill of lading forms in assembled carbon-interleaved sets. To accomplish this, it was necessary to study the requirements of issuing offices with respect to the quantity of bills of

lading issued and the number of copies of each. The data obtained revealed wide disparities in the use of copies and indicated an urgent need for standardizing distribution procedures. For example, (excluding the use of waybills) sets of bills of lading were prepared in as few as five and as many as forty parts. As a further example, it was found that instructions had been interpreted as requiring that the original and "property received" copies of bills of lading be mailed to the consignee in separate envelopes.

5. Outlined in this manual are standard, uniform procedures and instructions for the preparation, distribution and use of U. S. Government Bills of Lading which, on the basis of current volume statistics, will mean the conservation of at least eighteen million copies of bills of lading and six million envelopes annually; plus, of course, additional savings in carbon paper, man power, filing facilities and equipment which would normally be utilized to prepare, distribute, file and otherwise handle or process the bill of lading forms and envelopes hereby conserved.

6. These instructions become effective immediately upon their receipt. Portions of AR 55-150 and any other regulations or instructions inconsistent herewith are being modified accordingly.

7. Procedures to be followed in marking shipments will be found in AR 55-155, Section II and AR 55-150, paragraph 5. Paragraphs 5 and 13c of AR 35-6560 are being rescinded.

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PART I

General

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of assuring uniform interpretation of terms used in this manual, the following are defined:

1. "Consolidating Station"—An installation operated by the Army, for the Army and the Navy, to which are consigned less than carload shipments for consolidation into carload shipments when the ultimate consignee is located within one of several areas specified in W.D. Circular No. 49, 1943.
2. "Destination Carrier"—The commercial carrier which delivers a shipment to the consignee at the point of destination.
3. "Freight Distributing Agency"—An installation operated by the Army, for the Army and the Navy, for the purpose of expediting the distribution of freight in areas established by the Chief of Transportation.
4. "Holding and Reconsignment Point"—A War Department installation which, as the name implies, serves as a storage point for freight that will later be reconsigned to another destination.
5. "Intransit Storage Point"—A point where a shipment of freight may be stored en route for an indefinite period, from which point it will be reforwarded to final destination.
6. "Origin Carrier"—The commercial carrier which receipts for a shipment at the point from which the shipment originates.
7. "Shipment"—The movement of War Department materials and or equipment, via any type of commercial carrier, which requires the issuance of an inland government bill of lading.
8. "U. S. Government Agencies"—This term, as used in descriptive titles of specimen forms shown herein, will be defined as including the War Department, the Navy Department and any other federal government organization.
9. "War Department Installation"—This term embraces all establishments under the jurisdiction of the Army Service Forces, whether military or civil.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. A basic set of U. S. Government bill-of-lading forms consisting of the following seven parts will be prepared for every outbound shipment:

Part No.	Description	Standard Form No.

Note: Where assembled carbon-interleaved forms are used, two additional memorandum copies numbered Part 8 and Part 9 will be added to each set of bill of lading forms when assembled by the printers. Varied uses of these copies are described in the following paragraphs.

2. Certain types of shipments require the preparation of memorandum copies of bills of lading in excess of those listed in the foregoing paragraph. There follows a list of those types of shipments for which the preparation of an additional copy is authorized:

a. When a shipment is made by a contractor to or for a War Department installation—one extra copy will be prepared and furnished to the contractor.

b. When a shipment is consigned to a Consolidating Station, a Holding and Reconsignment Point or a Freight Distributing Agency—one extra copy will be sent to the consignee with the original and "property received" copies.

c. When a shipment is consigned to a destination in the Western Defense Command—one extra copy will be sent to the pertinent Regulating Station.

d. When a shipment consists of personal effects such as baggage or household goods—one extra copy will be furnished to the owner of the items shipped.

e. When a shipment is consigned to an ultimate destination through an Intransit Storage Point—one extra copy will be sent to the Intransit Storage Point.

f. At War Department installations where the War Department Shipping Document Procedure has not been installed: When a shipment of lend-lease materials is made to a port of embarkation for transshipment overseas—one or two additional copies are required as outlined in Distribution Chart C appearing on page 3.05.

In the use of assembled carbon-interleaved sets, the two utility copies herein provided will be insufficient in those rare instances where three or more of the foregoing variables apply to a single shipment. Provision has been made to furnish to all War Department installations a supply of carbon-faced single memorandum copies for such purposes. (See also paragraph 5.)

3. U. S. Government Bills of Lading prepared to convert commercial bills of lading (or express receipts) received on inbound shipments will be limited to a basic set of three parts, as follows:

Part No	Description	Standard Form No.
1	Original	1103
2	Memorandum—Property Received	1103a
3	Memorandum—Chief of Transportation	1103a

Distribution of Standard Forms Nos. 1103 and 1103a will be found in Distribution Chart D on page 3.07 of this manual.

4. The preparation of copies of bill-of-lading forms, or substitutes therefor, in excess of those enumerated in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 hereof is prohibited.

5. Assembled carbon-interleaved sets of bills of lading which have been or may be supplied with ten or more parts will be reduced to nine parts, prior to typing, in order to conform with the provisions of this manual. The parts (memorandum copies) so removed will be retained for use in those instances where a combination of authorized variations requires the addition of a tenth part to the standard nine-part set. (See paragraph 2).

6. Bill-of-lading forms and form numbers referred to in this manual are those announced by the Comptroller General in General Regulation No. 97 dated 17 April 1943. At those War Department installations where Standard Forms Nos. 1058, 1058a, 1059, 1060, 1061, 1062, 1062a and 1062b are still in use, the instructions in this manual will be interpreted as being similarly applicable to those forms for as long as they are authorized for use. Instructions herein which relate to the U. S. Government Freight Waybill — original and carrier's copy, Forms Nos. 1105 and 1106 — will apply when those two forms are placed in use.

7. The preparation, distribution and use of Temporary Receipt, Standard Forms Nos. 1107 and 1107a, and Certificate in Lieu of Lost Bill of Lading, Standard Forms Nos. 1108 and 1108a, will be in accordance with the specimen forms and standard distribution procedures appearing on pages 2.10, 2.11, 3.09 and 3.11 of this manual.

8. The preparation, distribution and use of continuation sheets, where such sheets are required, will be identical to procedures followed for the bill-of-lading forms to which they are attached.

9. The transmission of bill-of-lading forms by mail from the issuing office to the consignee will be accomplished by the use of one envelope; separate mailings are prohibited.

BILL-OF-LADING FORMS

STEP 1

INITIAL PREPARATION

Forms will be prepared and signed by the Transportation Officer on the basis of information obtained from the War Department Shipping Document. (See Army Service Forces Manual, SM 38-401.)

Where the War Department Shipping Document procedure has not been installed, data will be obtained:

- (a) From shipping tickets when shipment is made by a War Department Installation; or
- (b) From contractual documents, notices of availability and/or reports of inspectors when shipment is made by a contractor for a War Department installation.

STEP 2

ACCEPTANCE

The agent of the commercial carrier at point of origin will signify acceptance of the shipment by:

- (a) Inserting the name of the carrier
- (b) Inserting the date of acceptance
- (c) Affixing his signature

Insertion of the carrier's name and the date may be by Rubber Stamp, at the carrier's option. (See Note B.)

STEP 3

ACCOMPLISHMENT

The consignee will insert the name of the destination carrier, the actual point of delivery, the gross weight and the date of receipt; he will then complete the pick up certificate, where required, affix his signature and title and surrender the original bill of lading to the destination carrier.

NOTE A

When a shipment is made for a War Department installation by a contractor this information, or portions of same, will be inserted by the contractor.

NOTE B

Signatures on the original bill of lading will be affixed manually. On other forms which are copies of the original, carbon impressions of manual signatures will be accepted.

BILL OF LADING

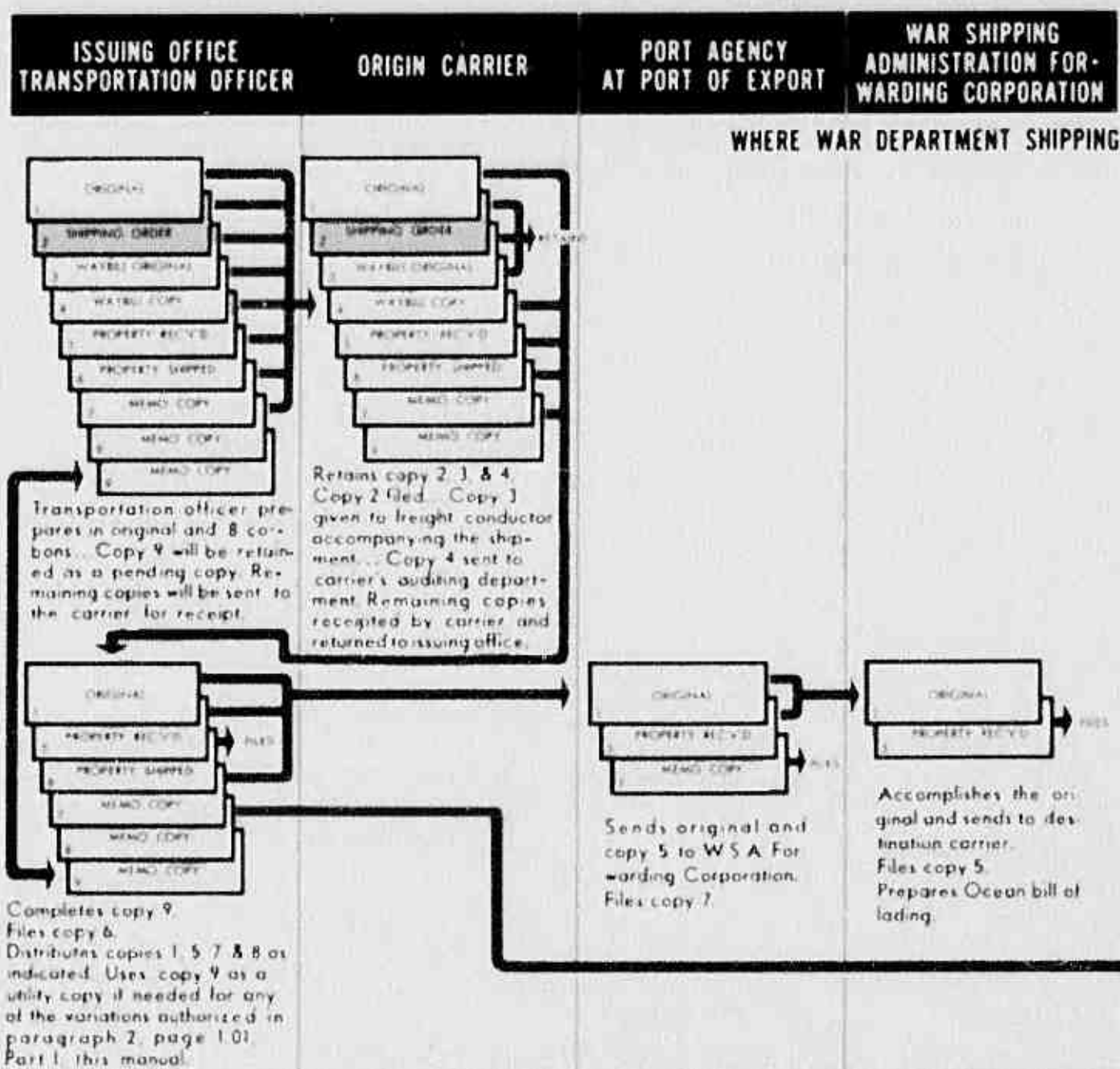

CIVIL AFFAIRS BULLETIN No. 3.

25th September, 1943

THE FOLLOWING PARAGRAPH POINTS HAVE BEEN EXTRACTED FROM REPORTS AND DOCUMENTS RECEIVED DURING THE PAST WEEK. THEY ARE FORMULATED WITHOUT COMMENT. THEY ARE GROUPED IN PARAGRAPHS CORRESPONDING TO THE SECTIONS DEFINING THE VARIOUS FUNCTIONS OF CIVIL AFFAIRS STAFF OFFICERS AS LID BOLD IN THE MILITARY MANUAL OF CIVIL AFFAIRS.

GENERAL

1. The civil population of a conquered enemy territory at first greeted the Allied troops with enthusiasm, but this quickly wore off. Complaints regarding the shortage of food, inevitable delay in restarting transportation facilities, civil telecommunications network etc., soon arose.

Although the population had accepted the need for priority of military over civil requirements with a good grace, it was considered probable that complaints would increase rather than diminish. This was because the 'liberation' propaganda had caused the population to look upon themselves as quasi-freely, and to demand things rather than come upon the occupying forces for favours.

2. Appendix A given the views of the younger Pliny on Military Government as practised in Greece in 200 A.D. They are very apposite to-day.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

3. Police

General Samino commanding the Carabinieri in Sicily sent the following letter to the G.O.C.-in-Corral and Military Governor, in reply to a letter received by him from the Military Governor.

5. It might become necessary to provide guard companies for reasons of prestige and overtly to display the authority of Military Government, in areas where troops would not be quartered when occupation was complete.

So far no combat troops had had to be used for this purpose, though patrols in rest areas had been both welcome and helpful to G.I. Staff Officers.

CIVIL DEFENSE

6. In two dock towns no agreed air or sea-raid warning existed, and the sound of a gun meant a sea-raid unless it was a dummy. In some 700 Italian harbors, taking on an average 3 hours per night - or 1470 hours per week.

There was no co-ordination between the extinguishing of lights on land in the dock-areas and lights on merchant ships alongside the quay, which frequently remained full on.

FIRE SERVICES

7. The responsibility for Civil Defence in one recently occupied territory rested entirely with G.I., and co-ordination was lacking between this and the military P.M.D.

Military units had in some cases interfered with the Civil Fire Service, vehicles and buildings had been requisitioned and the service rendered ineffective.

8. The civil Fire Brigade at one big town was efficient and fairly well equipped, but the Civil Defence organization was almost non-existent. There were no reserve services for fire-guards, no reporting and no central control.

A enemy raid punctured a petrol pipeline on a quayside, flooding the surface of the quay and filling up all the unities within it with petrol. This quay was the only one which the port possessed suitable for unloading ammunition, and while this was being done a small fire occurred.

The quay caught fire and kept burning some flames. Eventually it had to be abandoned for three days, causing a shortage of ammunition at a most critical period of operations, and delaying our advance.

Need for coordination of all fire fighting services and resources under one head was much in evidence in one Naval Port Area. In some shortages existed, which was not relieved until an Italian Fire Fleet was put into action.

The Naval Fire Marshal recommended the inclusion of a fire fleet with a Port Assault Force in all future operations.

(NOTE: A committee is now sitting to settle the future organization and exact responsibilities of the Army Fire Service.)

PUBLIC WORKS AND UTILITIES

PUBLIC WORKS AND UTILITIES

11. Roads

The Army was very eager to hand over second-class roads to G.M. traffic as soon as possible, retaining first-class roads for operational needs. Both parties thus benefited.

12. Machinery

The Army in Tripolitania removed a great deal of civilian machinery from power-houses, pumping stations etc. G.O.M. were very handicapped thereby, and had to call upon I.M.M. for assistance (which was always willingly given).

13. Salvage

In Tripoli a special municipal officer was specially detailed to make a reconnaissance and report on all bombed buildings. G.O.M. (M.M.) was then informed and arranged to collect the material, utilising the labour of civil prisoners.

14. Works Services

The G.M. Public Works Department in Tripoli controlled all gas and electrical undertakings and fixed the price of gas and electricity for the public.

All roads, railways and docks were still under military control.

15. The G.M. Public Works Department was responsible for the maintenance of Government buildings, all buildings used by the military and those administered by the Custodian of Enemy Property.

It advised on all machinery and plant and undertook repairs. It assisted any private enterprises of value to G.M.

In due course G.M. will take over all roads, railways, docks, power stations and waterworks from the military.

16. TRANSPORT

16. The following practical points are of interest regarding the G.M. organization of civilian road transport in a certain conquered territory:-

ROAD TRANSPORT

26. The following practical points are of interest regarding the C... organisation of civilian road transport in a certain conquered territory:-

(a) Transport Conditions were formal immediately.

It controlled inter-alia freight rates, checked vehicle licences and registration, and established a Road Traffic Management Control for both passengers and commodities.

(b) Customs duties only were authorized to deal in tyres and **285 1/2** parts.

(c) A rubber safety drive was arranged.

(d) A propaganda campaign was instituted emphasising the need for good vehicles and tyre maintenance.

(e) Old lubricating oil was collected and sent to regenerating plants and refineries.

(f) The use of bicycles was encouraged.

(g) A survey was made and records kept of the condition of all highways.

WILLIAM W. WATKINS, JR., AS INLET WITH IN
LETTER BY PLINY THE YOUNGER TO HIS FRIEND PLACIDUS.

My friendship for you urges me, not to give you instructions, for you have no need of a teacher, but to remind you not to forget what you already know, to put your knowledge into practice and even to improve that knowledge.

You are being sent to prison, that is to say to the very heart of Greece; the oracle, as we believe, of civilization, of literature, of agriculture; you are going to govern free cities and free men; can these very virtues, nations, climates, traditions and religion have had as their principal object the preservation of freedom, the greatest gift given to us by God.

You will agree that no man in whom is vested full authority and power will ever meet with respect unless he displays such a low and selfish soul that he forfeits even his own self-respect. A ruler makes a bad use of his power by bullying others. A rule of terror will never win respect, love in a more potent weapon than fear. For when you learn fear vanishes, but affection remains, and as fear changes to hatred, affection turns to respect. Be sure then that it be said of you that you showed higher qualities
 of humanity, integrity and ability in a province far from home than in
 the heart of the Empire; as ruler of a subject race, rather than as Governor of a
 free people, that you were sent by chance rather than specially selected,
 that you are untried and inexperienced, rather than tried and tested.

Do not forget what you have often read and often heard that it is
 more successful to lose a reputation that has been won than not to win
 one at all.

The reference to G.O. 8 is not understood as this General Order has never been printed for use in Italy. The only General Orders printed and posted in Italy are General Orders 1 and 2 and these alone should be included in the Italy Gazette.
3. The alterations set out in your letter under reference have been incorporated in Proclamations 1 and 11 (revised) and these Proclamations are now being printed for posting. Proclamation 14 is also being printed but a final proof has not yet been obtained. There are accordingly enclosed herewith for incorporation in the Italy Gazette:-

- (a) Current proof of Proclamation 1 (revised);
- (b) Specimen print of Proclamation 6 with the marginal note;
- (c) Current proof of Proclamation 11 (revised);
- (d) Typed copy of the English and Italian versions of Proclamation 14 in the form in which it has been finally settled.

4. It is desired that at least 25,000 copies of the Italy Gazette be printed. This should be enough for Regions II and III and for first distribution in Region IV. More will no doubt be needed at a later date but could be printed in Naples if your printer cannot hold his type. If possible, 50,000 should be printed, as it is quite probable that that number will ultimately be needed unless all Proclamations are again changed.

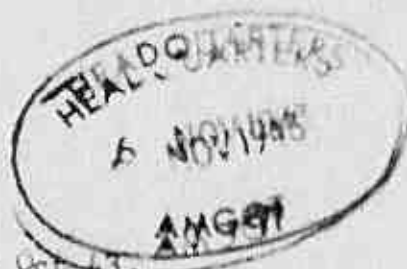

1. Receipt of your AMG/207/7 of 6th November, 1943 is acknowledged.

2. Regarding your para. 2, you request information as to how the matter dealt with in our Administrative Instruction AMG/400/L of 1st November came to us for a decision and why the instruction was sent to 15th Army HQ.

3. If you will re-examine this instruction, you will note that it is in mimeograph form as a general instruction and was not prepared in answer to Lt. Col. Shields's request at all. As a matter of fact, the question was first presented to this HQ by C.I.C. Region 2.

4. As to your suggestion that there was some impropriety in our including AMG/ 5th and 8th Areas in our distribution table for General Administrative Instructions etc., emanating from this office, I call your attention to the language contained in your para. 4 of R.O. addressed to Col. Shields dated 25th October, 1943. It had always been our understanding as confirmed by you in that letter that copies of all General Administrative Instructions etc., emanating from this HQ, would be sent direct to 5th and 8th Areas as well as to yourself for information.

5. As it is apparent from your letter of the 6th November that you now desire to reverse this policy, instructions will be given to strike 5th and 8th Areas from our distribution table and all documents of any sort will be sent direct to the legal officers of those regions for information or any other purpose.

6. In regard to the legal point as to jail sentences in default of the payment of fines, we never received a copy of your letter AMG/207/3 of 27th October to Lt. Col. Shields. We would be glad to have that letter (for information only) so that we can attempt to adjust our policy to that which you have so correctly laid down. We consider that the first consideration is that there shall be uniformity.
