2. Attention is invited to AAI Routine Order, Part II, Paragraph 21, Orders 15-31, Serial 3, dated 24 March 1944, and Establishment Memorandum #19, this headquarters, dated 22 July 1944.

3. It is requested that investigation be made by your headquarters in this case and a reply be forwarded this headquarters, attention the Adjutant so that a satisfactory reply may be made to the Officer Commanding British Troops, Rome Area Allied Command.

SUBJECT: Issue of Gasoline from Vehicle Refueling Point in Peninsular Base Section.

TO : See Distribution.

1. The following instructions will govern operation of PBS Motor Fuel Refilling Points and establish identification necessary for authorized vehicle to possess in order to be refueled. All instructions of this Headquarters on this subject at variance with the following are rescinded.

2. Vehicles from the following organizations will be permitted to refuel at all PBS Refueling Points:

a. UNITED STATES

- (1) All Army, (including Air Force), Navy, Red Cross and War Shipping Administration vehicles which have convoy orders or authorized trip tickets (War Department Form 48) dated as of the day that vehicle is being refueled or covering definite period of time for specific trip.
- (2) Vehicles operating in their home area are expected to refuel at their organizational motor pool, if one is operated. Gasoline, lubricants and greases for these motor pools are requisitioned from P.C.L. bulk or package depots. Refueling points will not refuse to refuel vehicles because of this reason, but all organizations are requested to comply in order to reduce congestion at refueling points.

b. U.S. - ITALIAN

- (1) No U.S. - Italian vehicles will be refueled unless they possess convoy orders or trip ticket (War Department Form 48) dated as of the day that vehicle is being refueled or covering definite period of time for specific trip, signed by a U.S. *[initials]*

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son Officer operating with the U.S. - Italian unit and endorsed with a rubber stamp or red ink as follows:

"ENTITLED TO DRAW POL FROM ALLIED MILITARY STOCKS"

- (2) U.S. - Italian vehicles operating in their home area will refuel from their organizational motor pools, if one is operated. Stocks of gasoline, lubricants and greases from their motor pools are requisitioned from POL bulk or package depots by the U.S. Property Accountability Officer of the particular service to whom the U.S. - Italian unit is assigned. Vehicles of small organizations which do not operate motor pools will refuel in accordance with par. 2b (1).

c. ALLIED FORCES

- (1) All Army (including Polish Forces), Royal Navy, Royal Air Force, Union Defense Forces Institute, New Zealand Philanthropic Bodies and Canadian Auxiliary Service Organization vehicles having authorized trip ticket (War Department Form 48), Work Tickets (AFG 3518), convoy orders or similar documents authorizing that particular vehicle to be operated by the driver on the date that vehicle is being refueled or covering definite period of time for specific trip.
- (2) Casual vehicles from certain organizations, list below, will be refueled only at Refueling Points 8L51 Leghorn, 8P66 Venturina and 8P64 Salino. All other PBS refueling points will instruct drivers of these vehicles to go to the nearest British Patrol Point.

3. BRITISH - ITALIAN

- (1) British - Italian vehicles having Work Ticket (AFG 3518) authorized by a British Liaison Officer and clearly endorsed by a rubber stamp or stamp ink as follows:

"ENTITLED TO DRAW FUEL FROM ALLIED MILITARY STATIONS"

c. ALLIED COMMISSION, ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT

- (1) Vehicles driven by U.S. Military, British Military, U.S. civilian, British civilian or Italian civilian personnel which have convey orders, authorized trip ticket (War Department Form 48) or British Work Ticket (AFG 3518) dated as of the day time vehicle is being refueled or covering definite period of time for specific trip.

3. No Italian Army (except those covered by par 2b (1) and 2d (1)) Italian Navy or Italian Red Cross vehicles will be refueled.

4. Any vehicle which stops for gasoline and fails to have trip ticket correctly dated and authorized, will not be refueled.

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5. Vehicles will not be refueled while engines are running. No smoking or open fires will be permitted in the vicinity of refueling points.

6. Positively no cans or other type of containers will be filled at the refueling point without special authority from POL Section, PBS. Persons desiring containers to be filled will be advised of location of the nearest POL package depot.

a. This action is taken to relieve congestion at the refueling points and to insure that all package and bulk gasoline not being placed directly into vehicle tanks is properly requisitioned.

This H.Q. has been informed that *AS* has been drawn on behalf of vehicles of this Commission from C.I.P.

It is intended that C.I.P. shall supply W.D. vehicles when no W.D. source of supply is available, but this should be avoided whenever possible.

P.O.L. supplies are laid down by C.I.P. at selected points in such quantities as are necessary to meet the known demand, which normally consists of allocations made by Petrol Section A.P.H.Q. for civilian purposes.

It is therefore essential that except in emergency this formation should only draw from C.I.P. stocks when previous warning of the demand has been given in time to allow C.I.P. to make the necessary increase in demand.

All Regions etc. who expect to draw from C.I.P. stocks will give C.I.P. notice of the anticipated demand and will forward copy of such demand to this H.Q.

Any Region etc. which is at present operating such an arrangement with C.I.P. is requested to inform this H.Q. of the amount of the demand or in the case of Sicily Region to confirm that figures given in cable 311825 of 24 June 1944 are unaltered.

1. Circular No. 222, this headquarters, dated 13 November 1943 is being rescinded.
2. Effective at once, the following periods during which fuel, other than wood, may be used for space heating, except in hospitals, are established. Hospitals are authorized to use fuel for space heating as required for patients:
  - a. Coastal Region - 1 December to 15 April.
  - b. Mountainous Regions - 1 October to 1 May.
3. Requisitions for fuel, other than wood, for space heating will be submitted so as to reach this headquarters through normal supply channels sixty (60) days in advance of the period for which required. They will contain sufficient information to permit editing.
4. Requirements for wood will be submitted as determined by the Commanding General, SOS MATOUSA.
5. The requirements for stoves and their distribution will be determined by the Commanding General, SOS MATOUSA, based upon climatic conditions and the strength present in the several localities of the theater. The issue of stoves and return to stock will be arranged between the Commanding General, SOS MATOUSA, and other headquarters concerned.

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5. Conservation of heating equipment and fuel.

SUBJECT : POL Supplies and Vehicle Permits.

TO : ALL R.C.'s. Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII.  
R.C. Poggia Province.

1. Petroleum Section AFHQ have again expressed grave concern at the failure of ACC/ALS effectively to screen and submit POL bids on time and at the lack of drive in enforcing the restrictions on the circulation of motor vehicles.

2. Inter alia AFHQ say "Many bids do not arrive on time. Some do not arrive at all. Many that do arrive are obviously fraudulent and are not based on a study of facts. Others reflect exaggeration in the issue of circulation permits. It is obvious that Petroleum Section cannot discharge its responsibility as the screening agent of world supply sources and keep releases of POL for civilian consumption at a justifiable level unless necessary information is properly prepared by ACC/ALS Regional organizations and is received in time."

3. This state of affairs calls for immediate corrective action in your Region and your attention is drawn to Executive Summary No. 21 and to the directive on the subject of release of petrol 194/25/21 of 13 May 1944. Instructions contained in these two documents must be scrupulously observed and enforced.

4. All petroleum products have to be imported and with the greatly increased demands of the African and liberated populations for civilian purposes in newly liberated territory, it is now even more necessary for POL bids to be carefully prepared and reasoned and unauthorized motorizing suppressed. POL bids are due at this HQ by 10th of the previous month with a copy to Petroleum Section. They must be on time.

5. Petroleum Section have also written to this HQ complaining that Regional Supply Officers are in some cases ordering CIP to release supplies of POL in excess of Petroleum Section allocations. Petroleum Section endeavours as far as possible to build up stocks at local OIP Depots to provide a buffer against shortages occasioned by transportation difficulties and non-arrival of supplies. Regional Commissioners must ensure that their Supply Officers do not withdraw POL from OIP in excess of the Petroleum Section's allocations. The Italian Government are being requested to instruct Prefects to the same

screening agent of world supply sources and keep releases of POL for civilian consumption at a justifiable level unless necessary information is properly prepared by AGS/AM Regional organizations and is received in time."

3. This state of affairs calls for immediate corrective action in your Region and your attention is drawn to Executive Memorandum No. 34 and to the directives on the subject of release of petrol 194/24/04 of 13 May 1944. Instructions contained in these two documents must be immediately observed and enforced.

4. All petroleum products have to be liquidated and with this greatly increased demands of the Allies and additional requirements for civilian purposes in newly liberated territories, it is more than ever necessary for POL bids to be carefully prepared and forwarded and unauthorized marketing suppressed. POL bids are due at this HQ by 10th of the previous month with a copy to Petroleum Section. They must be in time.

5. Petroleum Section have also written to this HQ explaining that Regional Supply Officers are in some cases ordering CIP to release supplies of POL in excess of Petroleum Section's allocations. Petroleum Section endeavours as far as possible to build up stocks at local CIP Depots to provide a buffer against shortages occasioned by transportation difficulties and non-arrival of supplies. Regional Commissioners must ensure that their Supply Officers do not withdraw POL from CIP in excess of the Petroleum Section's allocations. The Italian Government are being requested to instruct Prefects to the same effect.

6. There is no doubt that there are still many vehicles circulating on black market petrol. Regional Commissioners will report to this HQ any cases which come to their notice and, if the offender is an AGS/AM Official, will state that disciplinary action has been taken. AGS and Petroleum Section take a very serious view of this matter and I rely on R.O's to take active steps to improve the situation in accordance with instructions already laid down.

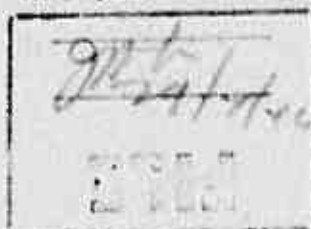

ISSUE OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS FOR CIVILIAN USE

Administrative Memorandum Number 55 (Corrected Copy), and Section II, Administrative Memorandum Number 93, both this headquarters, 1943 are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. Civil Requirements for Military Account.

a. With effect from 1 May 1944, no further letters authorizing Military contractors to obtain petroleum products will be issued. Supplies will be obtained through normal French channels.

b. No issues of petroleum products will be made from Allied stocks to civilian owned motor vehicles except as provided for in paragraph 2 below.

2. Essential Civilian Requirements

a. Releases for civilian consumption will be made only on authority from this headquarters, which will publish allocation letters specifying to whom releases are to be made.

b. The releasing agencies, as nominated in the letter of allocation referred to in a above, will submit to Petroleum Section, this headquarters, a report for each calendar month of all releases effected. This report will be supported by a consolidated receipt in triplicate, signed by a responsible official of the civilian agency receiving the products. It will be forwarded to Petroleum Section, this headquarters, by the 12th of the month following delivery.

Petroleum Bulletin No. 1

SUBJECT: Italian Civilian Petroleum Organization.

1. As of November 4, 1943, a group was formed by members of the Italian petroleum industry to represent that industry collectively vis-a-vis military or other organized authorities. It is called the Comitato Italiano Petroli (short name C.I.P.).

2. The C.I.P. has constituted itself so as to be able to contract on behalf of its members for services rendered to military organizations, as well as to receive and account for the disposition of products placed at its disposal to meet Italian civilian requirements. As Italian petroleum personnel and property are increased by the further occupation of territory, their inclusion in C.I.P. becomes automatic.

3. The organization of C.I.P. consists of a Board of Directors of five persons by whom Dott. G. Zola of Naples has been elected president. Auxiliary duties have been divided into five sub-groups dealing specifically with (a) general administration, (b) technical administration and planning administration, (c) lubricants, asphalt, wax and emulsifiers, (d) motor fuels and fuel-oil, (e) accounting and auditing. The headquarters of C.I.P. are at Via del Colosseo, 9, Rome.

4. To facilitate field contacts and operations, the Directors of C.I.P. have divided the area presently under control into three zones. Zone A covers Sicily with headquarters at Palermo, transfer to be announced. Zone B with

DISTRIBUTION OF CIVILIAN PETROLEUM PERMITS.

1. It is essential that civilian use of petroleum products be controlled so as to assure the minimum consumption compatible with military necessity and a sound civilian economy. Such control must be uniform in all portions of the Kingdom of Italy, than far exceeded and similarly extended to other areas as they fall under Allied influence.

Motor Vehicles

2. All civilian motor vehicles, whether publicly or privately operated, shall be allowed to circulate only on permit and shall be furnished petroleum products only upon presentation of coupons valid for the month of issue. Petroleum coupons and circulation permits will be issued only against applications properly made on Form PET-PUL No. 1, copy of which is attached. Circulation permits must be numerically synchronized with petroleum permits.

Civilian circulating permits shall be made only in accordance with Form PET-PUEL No. 2 (copy attached) and will be issued alternately with coupon Form PET-PUEL No. 3 or 4 (for petrol or diesel oil respectively) 2965 copies attached. Form Nos. 3, 3, and 4 shall be valid only for monthly periods or such other periods as may from time to time be determined by Petroleum Section, PLAGE.

Industrial and Off-The-Road Users

7. Applicants for petroleum products destined for non-vehicular use will submit application Form PET-PUEL No. 5, copy attached. Such applicants include, but are not limited to, non-military agricultural users, mining and fishing users,

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dealers in Germany, was to demonstrate petroleum products for distribution to individual retail consumers. Private household consumers of these products should not submit application Form PET-FUEL No. 5. Their demand will be satisfied in the allocations made to the dealers supplying them. 8. The procedure for handling applications as outlined in paragraph 7 above will be the same as that described in paragraph 5.

Petroleum Issues to Civilians.

1. The following categories of civilian petroleum users are eligible for issue of petroleum products.

- a. Agricultural vehicles or machinery.
- b. Commercial fishing boats.
- c. Common carriers of goods and passengers.
- d. Public utilities, including essential vehicles. (water, gas, electricity, postal, telephone, telegraph, etc.)
- e. Public health and safety. (physicians, fire, police, ambulance, motor hearses, etc.)
- f. Essential state and municipal government officials.
- g. Industrial vehicles or plants considered essential to a minimum public economy. Each included industry will be reported to this Headquarters by A.C.C. Headquarters, A.C.C. and A.M.G. 15th Army Group.
- h. Dealers in kerosene, wax, candles, and pharmaceutical oils essential for household consumption.

2. Not all applicants in the above categories will necessarily be given petroleum permits. Individual cases must be scrutinized for essentiality and quantity applicable to such instances.

3. Every effort shall be made to conserve fuel by the local pooling of vehicles.

SUBJECT: Italian Civilian Petroleum Organization.

1. As of November 1, 1943, a group was formed by members of the Italian petroleum industry to represent that industry collectively vis-a-vis military or other recognized authorities. It is called the Comitato Italiano Petroli (short name C.I.P.).
2. The C.I.P. has constituted itself as is to act to contribute on behalf of its members for services rendered to military organizations, as well as to receive and account for the disposition of products placed at its disposal to meet Italian civilian requirements. Its Italian petroleum personnel and property are increased by the further occupation of territory, their inclusion in C.I.P. becomes automatic.
3. The organization of C.I.P. consists of a Board of Directors of five persons by whom Dr. G. Gola of Naples has been elected president. Functional duties have been divided into five sub-groups dealing specifically with (a) general administration, (b) technical distribution and refining administration, (c) lubricants, asphalt, waxes and specialties, (d) motor fuels and fuel-oils, (e) accounting and auditing. The headquarters of C.I.P. are at Via del Principe, 9, Napoli.
4. To facilitate field contacts and operations, the Directors of C.I.P. have divided the area presently under control into three zones. Zone A covers Sicily with headquarters at Palermo. Zone B covers the mainland with headquarters at Rome. Zone C covers the area presently under control.

...as well as to the live and account for the dissemination of propaganda placed at the disposal to meet Italian civilian requirements. In Italian petroleum products and property are increased by the further occupation of territory, their inclusion in C.I.P. financial statistics.

3. The organization of C.I.P. consists of a Board of Directors of five persons of whom Delfo, 3. Cola of Naples has been elected president. Functional duties have been divided into five sub-groups: (a) administrative with (a) general administration, (b) technical distribution and training administration, (c) industrial, especially taxes and specialties, (d) motor fuels and oil, (e) accounting and auditing. The headquarters of C.I.P. are at Via del Principe, 9, Napoli.

4. To facilitate Italia controls and operations, the Directors of C.I.P. have divided the area presently under control into three zones. Zone 1 covers Sicily with headquarters at Palermo, managers to be announced. Zone 2 with headquarters at Bari covers Puglia and Umbria, manager Mr. L. Margherita. Zone 3 with headquarters at Naples covers Campania, Calabria, Lazio, and Romagna, manager Dott. G. Cola. For the time being the C.I.P. representative on Sardinia will report direct to the Board. In territorial or operational circumstances warrant additional zones will be established and designated for C.I.P. needs.

5. C.I.P. is generally prepared to represent the interests of the colonies on any matter affecting the petroleum field or endeavor. Attention invited to Administrative Instruction No. 6 dated 10 November, 1943 with headquarters as paragraph 1, through Technical Section, 12th Advance Administrative Division is included in the coordination office for contact with C.I.P.

1. Attention is invited to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 20 (Revised 4 November 1943) dated 12 February 1943.

2. A Petroleum Section has been set up as a staff section of this headquarters to supervise the importation of petroleum products and their containers, to coordinate the storage and distribution of these products and to advise the DCAO in all matters affecting them. The organization of this staff section does not relieve the service organizations of their ultimate responsibilities. e. Recommend petroleum engineering projects.

f. Recommend the allocation of bulk storage facilities to product and user.

g. Recommend the allocation of rail tank cars.

h. Set up consultant on technical petroleum matters and coordinate, thru channels, land and mobile laboratories.

i. Request through local representative of C-in-C, Med, the movement of tankers assigned to shuttle service between Italian Mainland ports.

j. Plan for petroleum products availability and distribution to meet new conditions and for future operations in conjunction with future planning staffs.

k. Control civilian distribution, production and refining.

PETROLEUM REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ALLIED MILITARY AND CIVIL USES.

#### I. Military Requirements.

1. Army units serving with Allied armies will be supplied with petroleum products, as required, by the Allied Army Commanders with whom they are serving. These personnel, records of losses will be maintained and transmitted monthly to the Petroleum Section, FI-130.

2. Army units not located in paragraph 1 above, will be supplied petroleum products as follows:

a. The British Military Mission will submit monthly to the Petroleum Section, FI-130, estimated requirements for the four surrounding months.

b. The British Military Mission will submit to Petroleum Section, FI-130, by the 20th of each month the list requirements for the following month. These demands will go by territorial departments and will show the number of vehicles for which required.

c. This headquarters will transmit monthly to FI-130, FI-130, and the O.E.P., FI-130, all allocations authorizing the release of approved quantities to the O.E.P. (Central Italian Petroleum)

d. FI-130, FI-130, and the O.E.P., FI-130, will report monthly to this headquarters the releases made against these allocations and transmit to the Petroleum Section, FI-130, the receipts of the O.E.P., and an agent for the Italian Army.

2. Any units not included in paragraph 1 above, will be supplied petroleum products as follows:

a. The British Military Mission will submit monthly to the Petroleum Section, FL 400, detailed requirements for the four successive months. These demands will be by territorial headquarters and will show the number of vehicles for which required.

b. The British Military Mission will submit to Petroleum Section, FL 400, by the 20th of each month the firm requirements for the successive months. These demands will be by territorial headquarters and will show the number of vehicles for which required.

c. This Headquarters will transmit monthly to R.I.L.F., FL 400, and the C.I.F., P.3.3, allocations authorized, the value of approved quantities to the R.I.L.F. (Comitato Italiano Petrol)

d. R.I.L.F., FL 400, and the C.I.F., P.3.3, will report monthly to this Headquarters the releases made against these allocations and transmit to the Petroleum Section, FL 400, the receipts of the C.I.F., aimed at credit for the Italian Army.

e. The C.I.F. will deliver to the Italian Army on a contractual basis charges for the cost of services only and not for the cost of the products.

f. The Navy and Air Force will be issued special petroleum products as directed by C-in-C, Mediterranean and C-in-C, S.W.A.F., respectively. Records of issues will be reported monthly to the Petroleum Section, FL 400.

g. The Navy and Air Force will be issued Army EUL on the request of C-in-C, Mediterranean and C-in-C, S.W.A.F., respectively, through the same procedure as detailed in paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 5 above, for the Army.

II Oilfield Requirements

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3. Division requirements for petroleum products will be submitted by Petroleum Section, FL 400, in conjunction with Headquarters, S.W.A.F., and C.I.F., 15th Army Group.

6. Allocation for civil use will be transmitted monthly by the Headquarters to the D.D.S.T., D.D.S.C., and the C.I.P. for distribution to the relevant of the civil quantities to the C.I.P. These allocations will specify the sole agency authorized to release in particular area.

7. D.D.S.T., D.D.S.C., and C.I.P. will obtain requests from the D.I.C. which will be transmitted at the end of the month to the Petroleum Section, W.D.S.C. Consolidated requests will be transmitted to the Headquarters, D.D.S.C. for collection from the D.D.S.C. Headquarters, D.D.S.C. will be sent to the Petroleum Section, W.D.S.C.

8. These local stocks are controlled by the allocations to civil use, or where other quantities are in particular allocation, the other will be referred to this Headquarters for decision.

9. D.D.S.T., D.D.S.C., and the C.I.P. will submit to Petroleum Section, W.D.S.C. a report each month of all releases to C.I.P. In addition to release made in accordance with paragraph 6 above, the report will include all such products as have been released at the disposal of D.D.S.T., W.D.S.C. or C.I.P. by the C.I.P. Headquarters or any other source in accordance with allocations issued by this office.

# 10. Civil Requirements for Military Account.

a. Requirements of civil contractors working for military account will be drawn from C.I.P. No direct issues to contractors or to civilian owned motor vehicle working for military account will be made from Allied military stocks.

b. The D.D.S.T., W.D.S.C. and C.I.P., D.D.S.C. after verification of requirements, will submit to the contractor a letter authorizing him to draw petroleum products during the current month in a limited quantity.

c. The contractor will present this letter to the regional administrator of C.I.P. who will in turn, make arrangements for the delivery of the required volume at the official civilian price, including such Government taxes as may be authorized by the Allied Government.

d. The regional administrator of C.I.P. will forward monthly to the Headquarters of W.D.S.C. detailed summary of quantities delivered against authenticated letters. The summary of regional reports will be forwarded in triplicate to Petroleum Section, W.D.S.C. on or before the 10th of the month. This summary will be used as a basis for the allocation of an amount equal to the amount issued.

Working with Italian Civilian Petroleum Companies

1. Petroleum Section, Advanced Administrative Section, AFM, is designated as the coordinating office for handling all Italian Civil Petroleum industry.
2. Petroleum Section, Advanced Administrative Section, AFM, will:
  - a. Review all future contracts to be made with the various companies of the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, either individually or collectively, before consummation thereof.
  - b. Review all contracts previously consummated with the various companies of the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, either individually or collectively.
  - c. Make proper actions as to change, alterations, or amendments to these contracts which are indicated as necessary to revise the contracts with regard to established petroleum functions in Italy.
3. Properties and facilities belonging to the Italian Civil Petroleum companies shall not be requisitioned, occupied, or sequestered by arm or service other than petroleum service personnel without prior reference to Petroleum Section, AFM.

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1. Petroleum Section, Bureau of Administrative Services, will be designated as the coordinating office for matters relating to Italian Civil Petroleum Industry.

2. Petroleum Section, Bureau of Administrative Services, will also

3. Review all permits submitted to be issued with the various requirements of the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, and their individual or collective, before consumption.

4. Review all contracts submitted by companies of the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, other individuals or collectively.

5. When provisions are to be made, alterations, or amendments to these contracts which are indicated as necessary to meet the requirements of the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, other individuals or collectively.

6. Develops all facilities belonging to the Italian Civil Petroleum Industry, which are not to be regulated, controlled, or restricted by any or service other than petroleum or other petroleum without any reference to petroleum industry, etc.
