1. Notification has been received from Allied Forces that Officers of the Commission have been arriving at the War Office without sufficient warning of their arrival having been given beforehand.
2. This has meant that certain Administrative Detail - ration cards, clothing coupons, accommodation etc - has not been arranged and has caused considerable inconvenience to all concerned.
3. In future, all the Heads of the Sections, Sub-Commissions and Branches concerned should submit the estimated dates of departure and arrival to G-1 (1) in respect of any such visits contemplated by officers under their control. G-1 (1) will then signal A.F.H.Q. and "Troopers".
4. In the case of air travel the officer concerned must obtain his own ticket from H.Q. Air Transport Services and will report the particulars thereof to G-1 (1), who will take any further necessary action.

SUBJECT: Visits of Officers to Hq ACC

TO :

1. On recent occasions, officers have arrived at Hq ACC from Regions without travel orders from competent authority, and requested billeting accommodations.
2. Due to the crowded conditions in Rome, and due also to the fact that on several occasions, officers not entitled to accommodations have managed to get them, the following policy will go into effect immediately.

No ACC officer arriving at Hq ACC without competent orders directing his presence in Rome will be afforded billet accommodations or messing facilities.
3. In all cases where parties of officers or EM/ORs are proceeding to Rome, advance notice will be given.

My dear Brigadier:

Reference your letter on visits of Headquarters officers to Region VI and the unnecessarily strict requirements. I set the restriction because we were unable to control these people in their visits to you. I felt and still feel that a strict regulation is better and a bit of leniency in the enforcement will get the correct results.

It places the onus on our Adjutant to make decisions but I have instructed him to consult me in doubtful cases. His general instructions are that if no Headquarters officers are in your Region to permit the travel after a 3 day interval. If 2 or 3 are already there, to hold up the other applicants until return of some.

I am particularly anxious not to have you bothered during the reorganization necessitated by our sudden withdrawal of a considerable number of officers. Thereafter we will encourage visits. With so much new territory for our officers to visit, you will probably see little of us for a time.

I do not expect to be forced to call for any more CAOs or CAPOs from you for a long time.

City of Rome.

TO : Distribution below.

1. The attached instructions are forwarded. (Not to all)
2. Until further orders, no member of this Commission, except those assigned to Rome Sub-Region, Region IV, AMG 5 and 8 Armies, will be permitted to visit the city of Rome without the express permission of the Chief Commissioner.
3. Applications for such permission will be submitted in writing to the Security Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section by heads of Sections, Independent Sub-Commissions, Branches and Regions concerned, certifying that the visit of the member is essential in the interests of this Commission, stating his name, rank, serial number, and appointment and specifying the inclusive dates and purpose of the visit.
4. If the Chief Commissioner approves, a permit in a special form will be forwarded to the Adjutant of this HQ. who will issue the necessary Travel Orders and forward them, with the permit, to the member concerned. Without this permit, the Adjutant will not issue Travel Orders to Rome. On completion of the visit, the permit will be returned to the Security Branch.
5. Any member to whom a permit is granted will report to the S.C.A.O. Rome Sub-Region upon arrival and departure and, at the conclusion of his duty, will return immediately to his proper station.

2. Until further orders, no member of this Commission, except those assigned to Rome Sub-Region, Region IV, AMG 5 and 8 Areas, will be permitted to visit the city of Rome without the express permission of the Chief Commissioner.

3. Applications for such permission will be submitted in writing to the Security Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section by heads of Sections, independent Sub-Commissions, Branches and Regions concerned, certifying that the visit of the member is essential in the interests of this Commission, stating his name, rank, serial number, and appointment and specifying the inclusive dates and purpose of the visit.

4. If the Chief Commissioner approved, a permit in a special form will be forwarded to the Adjutant of this HQ. who will issue the necessary Travel Orders and forward them, with the permit, to the member concerned. Without this permit, the Adjutant will not issue Travel Orders to Rome. On completion of the visit, the permit will be returned to the Security Branch.

5. Any member to whom a permit is granted will report to the S.C.A.O. Rome Sub-Region upon arrival and departure and, at the conclusion of his duty, will return immediately to his proper station.

To : Regional Commissioners,

1. The C-in-C has directed that only Allied flags should be flown together.

2. If an Italian Headquarters is located in the same building as a British and/or American Headquarters, there is no objection to the flying of the Italian flag to mark the location of the Italian Headquarters. In this case the Italian flag must be flown by itself in a less important position and under no circumstances should the arrangement give the impression that British, American and Italian flags are now being flown together.

"C.C.S. has ruled that visits shall not be made to SICILY by Officers without authority, and has appointed 15 Army Group as the authority to give permission for such visits. G.(SD) has informed AMGOT Liaison that it may authorize such visits by AMGOT Officers provided (a) that AMGOT HQ agrees to the necessity of such visits, and (b) that AMGOT Liaison notifies G.(SD).

This procedure will apply to all future visits from officers outside the island."

SUBJECT: Order No. 11

TO : Senior Civil Affairs Officers

1. With reference to Order No. 11, Art. 2, it should be clearly understood that while persons and vehicles may travel from one commune to another throughout Sicily without a special permit from the Allied Military Government, the order as for all vehicles are concerned applies only to those vehicles for which a permit is in force in accordance with General Order No. 7.

2. The above should be brought to the notice of Prefects and Police Organizations and published in local newspapers.
