SUBJECT: - Emergency Disinfection of the
Water Supply System.

TO: - Commandant, AM/NS/AM

1. It has come to the attention of this Directorate that gross
contamination of the local water supply by bacteria, suspected to be typhoid,
has been found by a local Army unit. This contamination is reported to have
been detected at three Army installations in Africa.

2. Such an occurrence is to be expected in view of the facts that
a. salt water from ships increases the chance of surface con-
tamination into ground water intended for fresh water usage.
b. there exists many broken water pipes, no water main
drains in those proximity, cross connections, and leaking water valves, and
c. water is shut off at night and there is probable back-
wash due to surface runoff by negative pressure in the water mains.

3. The following recommendations are made:

- a. all water used by ships, aircraft and other units in salaried
should be chlorinated until further notice.
- b. water should be obtained for use from a 1st Army water
point, should be taken from a chlorinated source in water
tanks or should be used from individually chlorinated supplies
in canteens.
- c. the supply officer should draw and issue necessary chlorine
and chlorine disinfectant.

4. This directive will furnish, through the AM/NS medical Officer,
Captain [redacted], and the Sanitary Corps officers, each organization as may be
appropriate to carry out these instructions.

1. 50 tons of lead are required in Sicily for repairing water mains and for lining certain containers at the "Arenella" citric acid plant.
2. It is understood from Lt. Col. Roehrig that 4,000 tons of lead are ready for shipment in Sardinia.
3. Will you please inform this AG if shipment can be arranged from Sardinia, what prices are quoted and how payment should be effected. Present supplies of lead will be exhausted by 1 December.
4. Will you please also say how much zinc, if any, is available in Sardinia.

Subject: Laws to be put into effect by the Italian Government.

To: Economic Director.

This Sub-Commission wishes to offer the following:

We have asked that the Palermo Water Company be authorised to send representatives into inhabited buildings for the purpose of checking water leaks. They advise us that they have no authority to do so. We do not know what the laws are, either local or national, on such subjects but, under present conditions, it must be obvious to anyone that the A.C.C. should be able to direct, and Italian law should permit, entering any residence anywhere in an effort to carry out the functions of restoration and conservation etc. whatever they may be and what ever be sought.

1. It has come to the attention of this Directorate that gross contamination of the local water supply by bacteria, suspected to be typhoid, has been found by a local Navy Unit. This contamination is reported to have been detected at three Navy installations in Palermo.

2. Such an occurrence is to be expected in view of the facts that:
a. Fall rains have increased the seepage of surface contamination into ground areas traversed by broken water mains.
b. There remain many broken sewer lines and water mains running in close proximity, cross connections, and leaking water valves, and
c. Water is shut off at night and there is probable back-siphonage of sewage caused by negative pressure in the water mains.

3. The following recommendations are made:

- a. All water used by AMG Officers and other ranks in Palermo should be chlorinated until further notice.
- b. Water should be obtained for messes from a 7th Army Water Point, should be taken from a chlorinated source in litter bags or should be used from individually chlorinated supplies in canteens.
- c. The Supply Officer should draw and issue necessary equipment and chlorine compounds.

4. This Directorate will furnish, through the Unit Medical Officer, Captain Price, and its Sanitary Corps Officers, such consultation as may be requested by those carrying out these instructions.
