There is a little matter in connection with the Rome advance detail, which if taken care of may be quite helpful. Major Drage has suggested to Lt. Col. Robinson that the (Drage) would like very much to include Lieut. V. L. Grottanelli, I.C. #155 SMC, of the Italian Liaison Section, this headquarters, as a member of his advance party.

Col. Robinson has no objection but pointed out that instructions had been received from your office that no Italian officers were to go into the Rome area at present, therefore he does not feel he can add Grottanelli's name to the nominal roll of the party.

It is Major Drage's thought and I agree with him that since Grottanelli is on duty with the ACC, speaks perfect English and being a Roman knows the city intimately, he (Grottanelli) would be most helpful in assisting Drage in carrying out his mission. As virtually a member of ACC now, the general rule against Italian officers would not appear to be applicable.

If you agree, perhaps you will direct that Grottanelli's name be added to the list of names to be included in the party.

MEMORANDUM ON MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS

TO: The Acting Chief Commissioner.

1. The Military Railway Service has occupied several offices in the Ministry of Communications, number unknown but thought to exceed 50.
2. Included in these, are the offices of the Minister of Communications.
3. The offices of the Secretariat of the Ministry are not occupied, but have been completely stripped of furniture.
4. The Minister and his Secretariat are at present occupying the offices of the Director General of Railways, consisting of 3 rooms.
5. It is stated that the only offices in the building suitable for the Minister and his Secretariat are those designed for that purpose.
6. It would appear that this occupation of a Government Ministry has not received any official approval.
7. There seems no good reason why an exception should be made in this case; the M.R.S. is an executive railway organisation that should get its accommodation in railway offices by the station, not in Ministerial offices.
8. Should it be considered that the M.R.S. requires accommodation in the Ministry of Communications, it would seem that the former Director-General of Railways' offices should be taken rather than the Minister's and his Secretariat's.

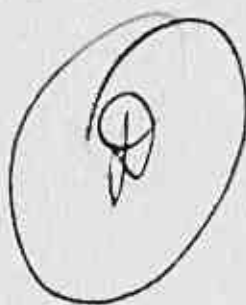

1. In a recent memorandum I urged that the Italian Government and A.C.C. be allowed to install themselves in Rome as soon as possible. I recommended strongly that permission should be given in time to enable them to commence functioning in Rome on 1st July.
2. The Allied Armies are advancing at such speed that they should be at least up to the general line, PISA-RIMINI, at an early date and A.A.I. have already moved to the Rome area. The Italian Government is still in Salerno where it is most inadequately accommodated and where the bulk of the civil servants and records are not available. A.C.C. is split up between Salerno and Naples. The three Italian Service ministries together with the corresponding A.C.C. Sub-Commissions are at Taranto, Lecce and Bari. I wish to make it very clear that under these conditions the administration of Italy has already become most difficult and is fast becoming increasingly so. I am in fact most seriously handicapped in ensuring adequate support both direct and indirect to the Allied operations.
3. I realise that there may be other considerations which might be held to justify postponement of the move of the Government to Rome. I am, however, convinced that operational considerations should come first. By postponing the move of the Government to Rome we will be gravely handicapping the administration and control of the country. The potential repercussions of such a postponement on our operations are serious.
4. I have to leave the theatre personally for an uncertain period in the very near future and before leaving I wish to place on record most emphatically my opinion that the return of the Government to Rome should be sanctioned at the earliest possible moment.

1. In consequence of the way in which operations have developed, I wish to make the following proposals regarding future transfers of territory to Italian administration and the location of Italian Government.

(i) Transfers of Territory.

(a) Campania (Provinces of Naples, Benevento and Avellino) to be transferred to the Italian Government on 24th June.
(If necessary special reservations will be made regarding the port of Naples which will in any case be left as a military zone)

(b) The Provinces of Foggia and Campobasso to be transferred to the Italian Government on July 10th.
(In both cases all A.M.G. personnel will remain at their posts in A.C.C. capacity at any rate until the Amasse has been completed.)

(c) The Provinces of Rome, Littoria and Prosinone to be transferred to the Italian Government on July 20th.
(Whether or not it will be possible to transfer one or more additional Provinces East of the Appennines on this date depends upon the rate of progress of the 5th. Army in the Adriatic Sector.)

(ii) The Italian Government.

As regards the move of the Italian Government, I had hitherto envisaged that it would not be possible to start moving it to Rome for at least a month or six weeks after Rome fell into our hands. It was naturally to be anticipated that we would find a very disorganized capital.

This has not been 4346.

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this has not been the case and with public utilities and communications of all kinds functioning adequately and with ample accommodation available there are now no material reasons why the Government should not be installed in Rome at once.

The only local difficulty in this connection lies in the fact that Rome must be kept under Military Government for, at any rate, a long enough period to enable me to decide that an administration which is of necessity, and must of necessity, be dislocated and purged is capable of functioning efficiently.

I have asked Sig. Bonomi and Sig. De Nicola whether, should the situation arise, the Italian Government would find it awkward or, from their point of view, undesirable to function in Rome while the city was still under Military Government. They were most emphatic that they would have no objection whatever.

2. As regards efficiency of administration with all its resultant advantages; and as regards the prestige of the new Government and of the Lieutenantcy, there is everything to be said for installing the Government and the Lieutenant in Rome at as early a date as possible.

All the Ministries are available in Rome and could be occupied at very short notice. More important still large numbers of civil servants are available and ready to step into their appointments. They will naturally be subject to normal epuration but it seems clear that the bulk of those with bad Fascist backgrounds have fled the city.

Conditions in Salerno are extremely difficult. There are no proper Government offices, there is a desperate shortage of living accommodation, and there is an extremely limited staff of civil servants whose numbers cannot be increased for reasons of accommodation alone. Working in Salerno, the Government will be functioning under very grave handicaps and its efficiency will be infinitely less than it would be in Rome.

3. Taking all the above into consideration I consider that while adhering approximately to the dates I have suggested in Para. 1 for the successive transfers of territory to the Italian Government I would like to urge strongly that the Italian Government should be permitted to return to Rome as soon as this can be conveniently arranged. Unless unforeseen circumstances intervene I should be able to get the Italian Government functioning in Rome by the 1st July. This depends, however, on the date on which my proposal is approved.

4. I would be grateful if you would let me know as soon as possible whether you approve my above suggestions. In anticipation I am having the necessary Transfer Documents prepared on exactly the same lines as those which were used in effecting the transfers last February.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL

Salerno, 3 June 1944

My dear General:

I call your particular attention to a problem which appears urgent and important to me.

I refer to the question of the various State Administrations which have offices in the Capital; their equipment, services and above all, their personnel.

Taken as a whole it may be calculated that the State employees of the various categories residing in Rome, including their respective families, constitute a total of over 200 thousand persons. We do not know what proportion of them are still in the Capital; it is certainly, however, a very considerable part and will constitute a mass of individuals almost certainly disorganized, who will present themselves almost immediately to the respective Administrations to obtain directives, advice and, last but not least, material assistance.

Still more are we unaware of the state in which the Neo Fascist Authorities first and the German Authorities in retreat later, will have left the central Administration setups of the individual Ministries. However, it may be forecast that, above all, at the last moment, they will have made every effort to disarrange them, particularly in the executive branch. At the same time we will undoubtedly find at Rome officials and employees who avoided the clutches of the German police and who had specific functions and tasks within the individual Administrations, who are completely uncertain of their present situation and their specific tasks and duties; and who will even believe it to be to take the initiative or carry on activities which will not coincide with the directives or intentions of the Government and who nevertheless would be outside of its control.

Under these circumstances, pending and foreseeing the transfer of the Government to the Capital, it seems necessary, in the interest not only of individual officials and employees and the rapid reorganization of the Italian Administrations, but also in the interest of the Allied Occupation Forces, to provide urgently for contact with these elements and their reassignment and organization. In this way we would obtain as a result the tranquility of several tens of thousands of persons and a notable contribution to the normalization of civilian life, at a time in which maintenance of public order is absolutely essential in the interest of all.

Having examined the matter with the help of technical agencies of the various Administrations, I believe that the best and also easiest solution would be that of sending immediately to Rome, even in the first days of the liberation of the city, at least two trusted and competent men for each Ministry, with the specific assignment of assuring these first contacts and to issue at least some first elementary directives. The fundamental concept should obviously be that all the offices and services of the individual Administrations remain, until further orders, centralized exclusively in the agencies of the

These Departments at the offices of the Royal Government in Salerno. Along with this task of a negative character so to speak, the above mentioned authorized representatives should, each for his own department, proceed with a summary ascertainment of the situation, as regards the respective offices, the services possibly still operating, the personnel present in the Capital, etc., and assemble the elements so as to formulate an idea on the successive and progressive measures to be taken to solve the most urgent problem.

If this proposal, as I warmly hope, meets with your approval, it will be easy to agree upon the instructions to be given to these officials in regard to directives and limits of their mission. What is important, I repeat, is that their departure be authorized as soon as possible and thus we can shorten, if not prevent altogether, eventual inconveniences which would be much more difficult to eliminate later.

Therefore, my dear General, kindly take this matter under the urgent study which the situation demands and let me know your opinion in regard thereto.

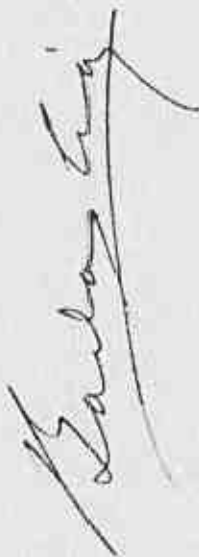

My dear General MacFarlane,

Following the kind communication of March 5th received from Captain Ellery Stone by which assurance was given me that the Allied Authorities would examine with the greatest benevolence the problem of the establishment of the Government in Rome, there kindly came to confer at the Presidency of the Council the Messrs. Major Boechino, Major Showe, and Wickersham of the Allied Control Commission. Together with them, the problem has been reviewed of establishing in Rome the central Government offices, as also those provincial offices concerned with the Rome area, and finally, some of the most important agencies of national character.

According to what was discussed in the course of the meeting and subject to the final decisions of the Command of the Allied Forces in Italy, the buildings listed in the attached roster (inclosure 1) would be reserved for the Italian Administration. If, on the other hand, these buildings were to be wholly or in part destroyed, the Government might, in accordance with preliminary agreement arrived at, avail itself of space in the Museums and Galleries.

As regards the provincial chiefs of the Roman area, I have greatly appreciated the assurance given by the above Allied officials concerning the general provisions, according to which these offices would retain their original quarters, and I have taken note that the Rome Army Corps Command will have to be established in an office other than that of Via delin Pilotto. In the attached list (inclosure 2) are indicated, for whatever purpose, the main provincial offices.

During the meeting, also the problem of the eventual establishment of Italian troops was taken up. In this connection I inform you, dear General, that it has appeared necessary to maintain in the Capital:

(i) For the Army, 13,000 men, who would be located, as per attached memorandum (inclosure 3) in two alternative ways, providing, that is, that considerations relative to the declaration of "Open City" of the Capital do or do not advise the Allies to keep in Rome our outside Rome, the operational troops and Commands;

(ii) For the Navy, about 1000 men, for whom the barracks at Largo Pandaccio, near Largo Gonzaga, called Grazioli-fante, would be required;

(iii) For the Air Force, a force not exceeding 800 men, for whom would be required the barracks Rosagnoli and Cavour.

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the buildings listed in the attached roster (inclosure 1) would be destroyed for the Italian Administration. If, on the other hand, these buildings were to be wholly or in part destroyed, the Government might, in accordance with preliminary agreement arrived at, avail itself of space in the Museums and Galleries.

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(iii) For the Air Force, a force not exceeding 800 men, for whom would be required the barracks Romagnoli and Cavour.

(iv) As to the Police Forces, in view of the fact that for the Royal Carabinieri and for R. Finance Guards, specific agreements have already been taken between the Allied Authorities and the Commands of the respective Corps, I limit myself here to indicate the relative requirements for the establishment of the Public Security Agents. The strength of said Corps in Rome should be around 5000 men and, therefore, the minimum of necessary quarters is represented by the following small buildings which have been used for such purpose for many years. Those indicated represent less than half of the total available;

1. Quarters for agents of P.S. - Via Statilia;
2. " " " " - Via Simeto;
3. " " " " - Via Penisperna;
4. " " " " - Via Colto;
5. " " " " - Via Tasso;
6. Technical School for Police - Via Guido Reni;
7. Barracks for agents of P.S. Campitelli (near Piazza Venezia);
8. Barracks for agents of P.S. Transpontina (near Via della Conciliazione);
9. Barracks for agents of P.S. Sant'Eustachio (in piazza of the same name);
10. Barracks for agents of P.S. in Via Flaminia.

Nevertheless, I must point out to you, dear General, another important requirement; namely, that to members of the Government and officials who now render service at the temporary seat of the various Ministries, and who already have their homes in Rome, assurance be given of exemption from any form of requisition of their homes. You will no doubt take into full consideration the necessity that, as soon as arrived in Rome, the members of the Government and the officials resume immediately their assiduous work in the interest of the common war effort.

The Allied officers delegated to the handling of this matter have believed to be able to give prompt assurance of acceptance of this particular request and, therefore, within the shortest possible time, I will send you a list of the above residences.

Finally, I believe necessary to state that in the 1942 yearbook edited by the Publishing Firm Carlo Colombo there are indicated on pages 456 to 497 the agencies of national importance; of these, only three--specifically the Istituto Nazionale delle Assicurazioni, the Banca d'Italia and the Istituto Nazionale della Previdenza Sociale--have already been included in the list which comprises inclosure 1; for the others, instead, the Ministries which respectively perform supervision of these agencies will forward to me within the shortest possible time, a list of those whose regular operation is considered strictly indispensable for the administration of the State from the first entrance into the Capital; I will transmit this list to you as soon as possible.

In thanking you, my dear General, for this new proof of amiable collaboration, I beg of you to favor me with a kind note of agreement in the matter.

Dear General MacFarlane:

Through Captain Ellery W. Stone I received and examined the list of public buildings which the Allied Authorities intend to reserve for the Italian Government, in Rome.

While I thank you for your courtesy, I feel that I should point out several facts in order to produce a more satisfying systematization of State offices in the Capital.

As a preface, allow me to inform you that, besides the ministries and other departments already listed, there are in existence other public agencies of national character, whose work integrates that of the Government in an essential manner: such are the Deposits and Loans Fund, The National Institute of Social Security, The Bank of Italy, and numerous others, the need of which were not held in due account by the Allied Authorities. On the other hand, the ministries themselves, numbering fourteen, were assigned only eleven buildings, while no space at all was allotted to the public institutions and agencies, which upon the return of the Royal Government to Rome, would have to take up their functions once more: such as the Chamber of Deputies, the Senate of the Realm, the State Council, the Court of Accounts, the State Attorney's Office, etc.

In regard to the Departments, the Allied Control Commission, as you know, requested estimates of space and service needs. These estimates were sent by this Presidency to the Commission, and it should therefore be acquainted with the respective requirements. I would wish that, in regard to the systematization plans for the Central Administrations of the State now in existence, those duly prospected needs be given proper consideration. In particular, it seems to me indispensable to include also in the first group of buildings which form part of the list sent at present (buildings needed immediately), in regard to the Ministries, the buildings to be used as seats of the Air Ministry (Viale dell'Università), of the Ministry of the Navy (Via Flaminia), of the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor (Via Vittorio Veneto), of the Ministry of Italian Africa (Via Venezia 433), of the Ministry of Exchanges and Values (Via Genova), and of the Ministry of Popular Culture (Via Vittorio Veneto). In reference to this last building, may I bring to your attention that, in relation to the similar wish of Mr. George W. Edman (P.W.B) Naples, in the name of General Crane, the Ministry of the Interior will be very glad to keep in close contact with P.W.B. for press services, and, to that purpose, has already informed Mr. Edman that the building of the Ministry of Popular Culture in Via Vittorio Veneto (Balustrade Palace) shall be equitably divided into Italian and Allied Offices.

1. It is most desirable, in the interests of peace, order, and the speedy economic and administrative recovery of Italy, that the Italian Government should firmly establish itself in Rome as soon as possible after its date of occupation. To enable it do so with maximum efficiency, it must be established in conditions of dignity and prestige. How far this will be possible will depend to a large extent on whether the Ministry and other National Government buildings are kept free of troops and offices of Allied Force Units. Among the buildings deemed necessary are those of the Royal Household. While it is most desirable that all National Buildings be reserved for the use of the government, the attached list indicates in Section I the maximum required for efficient functioning if all buildings are undamaged and in Section II the additional buildings previously used by the Ministries which will be needed for expansion and in case those in Section I are badly damaged.

2. It is, therefore, requested that a directive be issued to the authority responsible for allotment of accommodation in Rome that all the buildings shown in Section I of the attached list and as many as possible of those in Section II be reserved for the use of the Italian Government.
