My dear General MacFarlane:-

I would be grateful to you if you could intervene in a secondary matter, but which for us has a certain importance. Lately, in Spain the enemy tries to infiltrate and take control of important Italian activities. Our Embassy at Madrid, in strict collaboration with the Embassies of Great Britain and the United States, has taken effective steps to frustrate such attempts. In December last our Ambassador, in accord with his British and American colleagues, sent to Brindisi Mr. Italo E. Verrando, First Commercial and Financial Councillor of our Embassy, to report on the situation and to make some suggestions.

Thanks to the British Embassy and with the approval of the American Embassy, Mr. Verrando arrived at Brindisi on January 8th last; after completing his Mission and receiving his instructions, he intended to return to Madrid at the earliest possible time and made request through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, for air transportation from Italy to Gibraltar, to the A.C.C. (at Brindisi). The request was made on January 15th and further requests for quick compliance proved fruitless.

I understand perfectly that at present there may be extraordinary limitations in the granting of air transportation to Italian civilian Government Employees. Is it nevertheless possible to facilitate this, in view of the circumstances? It would prove useful to us if Mr. Verrando could carry on his beneficial activities in Spain.

Mr. Verrando is a loyal, trustworthy servant of the State and a sincere supporter of collaboration with the Allies. He is an employee of Grade IV, similar to the rank of Minister.

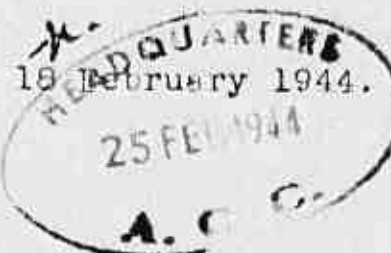

Dr. RAIMONDO MANZINI is an official of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs with the rank of Consular Attache.

He is the diplomatic courier who shall deliver to the Italian Embassy in Madrid instructions and codes to put into operation the new system of communications between the Italian Government and the Royal Embassy in Madrid, as devised by Allied authorities.

On January 13th Captain Stone of the A.C.J., who had approved/said codes should be delivered to the Madrid Embassy by Dr. Manzini, undertook to obtain from the proper Allied authorities transportation to Spain for Dr. Manzini.

So far no transportation has been arranged for him.

As it is very urgent to start the new system of communications between the Italian Government and the Royal Embassy in Madrid devised by Allied authorities, it is suggested that Dr. Manzini be given a passage by airplane to Algiers from where he will easily find transportation to Gibraltar.

2. - His inward journey by air was arranged through the British Embassy in Madrid, in agreement with the American Embassy, and Mr. Verrando was granted Priority No. 2, via Gibraltar, Algiers, Palermo, Catania, Taranto.
3. - It will be greatly appreciated if Mr. Verrando will now be furnished air transportation back to Gibraltar, either via Taranto or Bari.
4. - Mr. I. E. Verrando returns to his post in Spain to carry out official instructions directed towards frustrating enemy covert action with aims at the possession of substantial Italian assets in that country; therefore it could be very helpful if he could be speeded on his errand.
5. - The Official in question ranks First Commercial Counsellor to the Italian Ambassador and Senior Commercial Attache'.
